Indians' Hope Association.

TWENTIETH ANNUAL

REPORT.

This is the Report of our twentieth year's work. The Bishop of Central Pennsylvania, who was present at one of the stated meetings, and that not a very full one, during the past winter, expressed his surprise and pleasure at the growth and strength of the Indians' Hope Association. Some of the pioneers of the then unpopular work must look with wonder and pleasure at the change. And yet, like all pioneers, the Indians' Hope Association must feel that the hardest part of its work is over; the burden and heat of the day are gone by. For though much, very much remains to be done, more Chapels to build, more schools to start, more missionaries to be supported, and other such enjoyable duties, yet the hardest work is done. The laying of foundations deep and broad, the arousing of public sentiment, the formation of such societies as the Women's National Aid Association, the Indian Rights' Association—all these we may feel to be the result of faithful work, the answer to faithful prayers. But let us not be weary in well-doing. Much still remains to do.

It is pleasant to find in the Report of the Secretary of the Interior the following acknowledgment of good work done in the past, and appreciation of the motives of Christian associations for helping the Indians:

"I think the policy of securing the coöperation of those religious and philanthropic societies which have for so many years labored for the amelioration of the condition of the Indians should be continued. They have expended within the last

few years, in money alone, millions of dollars, and experience has shown the benefits of their aid and assistance.

I desire here to acknowledge my own obligations to these associations for their co-operation, and also my high appreciation of the aid I have derived from the counsels and sympathy of those Christian ministers who, in the spirit of their divine Master, are devoting themselves to the best and highest interests "of this unfortunate and, in some respects, noble race."

I have detailed at some length the transactions of this Bureau, in order to enable you to recommend such measures as, in your judgment, will be best for the interests involved. But it is my duty to say that I do not believe any measures of the Government or efforts of philanthropy will of themselves solve the Indian problem, but that the Christian religion must, and will, be the chief instrumentality (through its pure and holy influences upon individual character, morals, and aspirations) to regenerate and uplift this race from its present condition to a higher life and a nobler destiny."

In turning to our own work in the past year, we should like to draw the attention of all our teachers to a leaflet, issued by Bishop Hare this spring, called, "*A Review*." It shows the present state of the Mission in Niobrara, compared with its condition in 1872. Then the Churches and Chapels among Santees and Yanktons numbered five. Now there are twenty-six Churches and Chapels, besides twelve stations where there are no Chapels, but where services are held. Besides these there are four boarding-schools, with as many scholars as they can accommodate.

This is certainly very encouraging. God has surely blessed all that has been done, but one cannot help asking, "How much more might have been done if we at the East had been as faithful with our offerings and prayers, as those faithful soldiers and servants of Christ who are giving their lives to the work!" We need to feel more deeply the duty and privilege of strengthening the hands of those who are doing the work.

We have thirty-six congregations gathered from among these Indians. We have four boarding-schools doing splendid

work, and when each member of Christ does his and her duty in contributing to support the Mission, we *may* have three hundred Chapels and forty schools.

One pressing need of which Bishop Hare has spoken, and which we earnestly desire to press on the minds of all interested, is scholarships in All Saints' School for the children of the Missionaries, who are working among the Indians. These have been working faithfully and without change for years, some of them for as much as twelve years. The Bishop feels that he would like to, and ought to, be able to tell them, to have no care for their children's education. These scholarships cost \$200 per annum, and at present the Bishop would like to have three at his disposal.

A cause of very great interest and anxiety to the Association during the past year was Bishop Hare's health, which quite gave way under the strain of physical fatigue and anxieties. He came East in December suffering from nervous prostration, and, by absolute rest and great care, recovered in a measure. Through the kindness of friends he is to go abroad this summer, which his physicians hope may be the means of his entire restoration.

The Treasurer's Report shows receipts amounting to \$3188.58.

The Box Committee reports boxes sent to the different stations to the value of more than \$1225.

We have to thank our unfailing and generous contributor, Mr. MacDowell, for his usual gift of paper for the reports of all the Committees, but thanks are also due to the Rector and Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity for the use of the Parish building.

Praying for continued and increased interest, help, and, above all, prayers, from our friends and contributors, we submit our Twentieth Report.

TWELFTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch
OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

We have gone on in our usual routine of work during the past year, and the returns from the parish branches show that we have not failed in our endeavor to surpass what we have done before. Several parishes have united with us as new branches, and they must be heartily congratulated upon the success of their first venture, and we upon the acquisition of such helpful fellow-laborers.

One hundred and forty-one boxes have been filled and sent forth on their gracious ministry. The value of 134 of these has been reported to us at \$17,827.73, while the Treasurer shows that \$1188.94 has been received by her, making \$19,016.94, the cash value of our year's work.

This is a goodly sum indeed, and we may well thank God that he has so blessed our efforts.

All of the boxes sent have been good ones, prepared with loving thoughts and skill, and it is delightful to contemplate the blessings they have been in more than one hundred and forty homes. Three of them have been sent by this Committee. The salary of the Matron of the Good Samaritan Hospital, at Portland, Oregon, has also been paid, as it has been our custom to do for so many years.

The Church of the Good Shepherd, Wichita Falls, Texas, the corner-stone of which was laid by the Bishop just one year ago, was duly consecrated on the 9th of August, and has been in constant use ever since.

"The courage to begin it" came from this Committee by the special gifts made last year, so says Bishop Garrett in his

Report to the Board of Missions, and learning also from it that the Church yet lacked Font, Chalice, Paten and Altar Linen, we have been so happy as to supply all, through the liberality of the parishes whose names appear in the Treasurer's Report of the money received for that purpose. The Linen was sent by St. Clement's Altar Guild, which, though most bountiful in its gifts, is never ready to report through us; we beg, however, to express our many obligations to its members.

One of the boxes sent by this Committee contained the handsome marble Font, and another the Chalice and Paten, the receipt of both of which has been most gratefully acknowledged.

It gives me great satisfaction to say that year by year I think the boxes grow better, and kindly interest suggests ideas of adding comforts of which we have not thought before. For instance, how easy it would be, for the most of our city parishes, at least, to add one of the Kensington squares of carpet, to each box they send. A grand box, sent away from one of our noble branches, contained one of these, and the wife of the Missionary says in her joyful letter on receiving it, "It is the only sign of carpet in the house." I doubt not that many pieces of carpet from one yard, to more in size, might be collected, throughout our congregations, and we can fancy what comfort they would carry to such bare homes.

There was a time when, if books were asked for, societies rarely supplied them. I think it is very uncommon now for them not to do it. One of our parishes has sent, during the past season, four boxes of books only, in addition to the many well-filled ones for the Missionary homes.

Two classes of letters are yet difficult to place; one of them are from unmarried men, though we all say that Missionaries ought not to be married; and another, those that ask only for the needs of the Mission station, or, perhaps, for vestments for the Clergy; but I hope the time draws on when it will be easy to supply all.

By far the greatest enterprise of the year has been accomplished by a young lady, whom we are happy to count now

among our delegates. Moved by the story of Bishop Brewer, of the spiritual destitution of his vast jurisdiction, and his great need of more men, and money to support them, the cost of living being very great in Montana, she went forth alone, "the love of Christ constraining her," and she has secured the promise of \$500 annually, made up by pledges from many parishes and individuals. This surely is a great achievement, and it fills my heart with joy. Work like this would truly be helpful to the Board of Missions, of which we call ourselves an Auxiliary. The Board of Managers, crippled in all their disbursements, by the small gifts that are made to their treasury, find it impossible to respond favorably, to the pressing appeals of our Missionary Bishops; and it seems to me a most noble inspiration to help them to do so. I must remind you once more of their anxiety, lest they fail to secure the sum appropriated for the year, and beg you to think of the disaster that such failure must bring. They protest that hereafter, they will only appropriate for the incoming year what the past one has brought them; and it now looks as if they will have to do with a very much smaller sum than they need before September. Retrenchment means loss and disaster; it means the dismissing of faithful men, and taking bread from the mouths of women and children; it means the closing of Churches in the Missionary field, which is lighted and guided into ways of pleasantness and peace only by them.

It surely can never be permitted, it can never be said that our communicants will not give one dollar each, annually, for the Church's Missionary work. It must be that of our 4195 Mission stations and parishes, that more than 1720 will make an annual offering for it.

I do most earnestly appeal to the members of this Committee to come to the rescue of this dear land of ours before it shall be too late to save it from heresy, schism and unbelief. Praying God to help us to see our duty and to fulfill it, and with gratitude for His blessings during the year just passed I submit my Annual Report.

He allows us the blessed privilege of being His instruments here on earth, with the sure promise that "Those who turn many to righteousness, shall shine as the stars forever and ever." Think of it! Forever with the Lord, and shining with His reflected light!

We have the encouragement to note, that our meetings have increased in numbers and interest, though very many parishes are still unrepresented. A fact which ought not so to be!

We have been deprived through the year of the useful services of our worthy Secretary, Miss Landell, who has been sojourning abroad; one member, Mrs. Wells, has been removed by death. We have been enabled to redeem the pledges assumed for the year, to wit: Bishop Stevens Divinity Scholarship, St. John's College, Shanghai, China; J. C. Emery Scholarship, Africa; Scholarship in Boys' School, Tokio, Japan; Support of Child in Girls' Orphan Asylum, China;

for Salary of Lady Teacher; to educate Children of Missionaries.

We have assumed the support for five years of a scholarship in St. Mary's College, Shanghai; also a scholarship in St. Paul's School, Tokio, called the Anna Rumney Scholarship. A box of clothing has been sent to Mr. Ledan, Haiti, valued at \$126.21. Hymnals to China; two surplices to Bishop Ferguson, Africa; materials for fancy-work to St. Margaret's School, Tokio; an organ valued at \$20, a box of cards and French Prayer-books to Bishop Holly, Haiti. A kind old lady, aged ninety-one years (not of our Church), sent us fifteen dollars, which we gratefully acknowledge.

This is the drop in the mighty ocean of God's great work which He has allowed us to do. Let us hope and pray that He will find us ever ready to do His bidding. That He will attune our ears to listen to the slightest intimation of His will, always remembering that "to obey is better than sacrifice," and "to hearken than the fat of rams."

Since our last report, another year with its opportunities and results has rolled away, and while we are well aware of the magnitude of the work yet to be accomplished, surely we should be deeply thankful for progress already attained. Three new Parishes and seven new Delegates have been added to our list; and the attendance at our regular meetings has been largely increased. True, the total receipts of 1885-1886 (\$1371.17) are not so great as those of 1884-1885 (\$1590.77); but the large increase in value of boxes sent this year (\$1765.28), compared with the aggregate mentioned in last report, viz., \$1258.78, not only shows a gain of \$506.50, but furnishes in itself a strong evidence of a more earnest working spirit in the Parishes already represented in our work, and forms an encouraging basis on which to build a hopeful future.

Those already interested in work for the Freedmen know of their grateful appreciation of all labor in their behalf; and we

do *earnestly appeal* to all Parishes as yet not represented in this cause, to come to the aid of this comparatively helpless and benighted race, who have, by the ruling of an unerring Providence, been thrown largely on our responsibility and care, and who look to us for such aid as they can in no other way receive.

Freely as we have received, shall we not freely give? Let us pray for will and strength to "do what our hands find to do," "ere the night cometh in which no man can work."
