Indians' Hope Association.

TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL

REPORT.

Every year, in writing the Indians' Hope Report, the same temptation arises, viz: To review the whole work done for Indians in the United States during the year; but this of course is not for us to do. While every faithful member of the Indians' Hope Association must feel sincere interest and true sympathy for every effort made to help every Indian in the land, our business is to report our own work accomplished during the year.

Money for general purposes, scholarships, etc., has been raised to the amount of \$2,209.21. Sixteen boxes have been sent to different stations, to the value of \$1,269.25. Besides these, which may be considered our duties, our taxes, as it were, paid into the general fund for Indian missions through the Board of Missions in New York, we have enjoyed the pleasure and privilege of *special* contributions to a large amount.

One hears much question as to the wisdom or profit of special gifts to missionary purposes. To us in the Indians' Hope it seems as if the payment of a certain amount every year, through parish Offertories, or through the Woman's Auxiliary, to the General Board of Missions, is a very solemn duty of every baptized Christian. This is like the tribute of every Jew to the Temple—the shekel which our Master Himself paid. But after this duty is done, our taxes paid, so to speak, we may indulge ourselves in special gifts for special objects, and it is in these very specials that the spirit of love shines forth—love for the poor, hard-worked missionary who is giving

his life to the work, love to the Lord of the Harvest, Whose laborers we pray to be.

During the last year the Indians' Hope Association has shown much of that spirit, as our page for special offerings shows, in caring for and helping the living worker, and in building up the schools and chapels throughout the field. It has been the great desire of the Association to build a new chapel at a new point, and towards the sum of \$1000, necessary for its completion, the sum of \$923.75 has been raised. In this chapel a bell is to be placed as a memorial to Mrs. E. R. McIlvaine, for many years a faithful, devoted member of the Association, as a delegate from St. Andrew's Church, West Philadelphia, by some of her fellow-workers.

Before leaving the subject of special offerings, we beg to call the attention of our friends and helpers to one particular object which Bishop Hare has again and again urged upon our notice. The missionaries (ladies) working in Southern Dakota have very small salaries, and the Bishop feels great anxiety for them in case their health should break down, or, for any reason, they should be obliged to lay aside work even temporarily. He constantly urges them to put away some trifle to be invested for their future benefit. Their own contributions must necessarily be very small, this year particularly so, as even their meagre stipends were, for a time, reduced, like all the missionaries', from the want of funds in the hands of the Board, and the Bishop will be thankful to receive any sums to be used for this purpose.

We think we cannot better close our Report than by the following quotation from a book by J. B. Harrison, called "The Latest Studies on Indian Reservations:"

"I know of no man who has accomplished more for the civilization of the Indians of Dakota, or for the advancement of all improving and civilizing influences in the country adjacent to the reservations, than Bishop Hare, of the Protestant Episcopal Church, a man made up of all gentle and pure qualities; at home in 'the still air of delightful studies;' who would be a leader among the best anywhere; who unites to a soldier's fearlessness and invincible devotion, a spirituality so lofty and

tender that one shrinks from characterizing it while he is still in the flesh, who is laying the foundations of Christian civilization on broad and far-reaching lines in a region large enough to be a mighty empire. He long ago saw the need and opportunity of the time, and answered to its call. I am not a member of the Protestant Episcopal Church. It is only as a student of civilization that I have written of any of the missionary enterprises among the Indians. But this man ought to have whatever he wants of means for his work, with remembrance and honor from all good men."

Shall we who *are* members of the Church withhold what "this man wants of means for his work?"

Our thanks are due to Mr. Frank M. McDowell for paper for the Report, as usual, and to the Vestry of Holy Trinity Church for the use of the room for meetings.

With renewed thanks for the past, and renewed hopes for the future, we submit to our friends and helpers our Twenty-first Annual Report.

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Board
OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

The Report of our doings for the year just passed is to be given to you to-day. It looks as if we had been less generous than we were last year, but I still lack a number of Parish Reports, and the American Church Missionary Society has had the benefit of the coöperation of some parishes that have hitherto worked only with us, so that though it makes our statement less, we hope that the aggregate of work done is not so. One hundred and forty-nine boxes have been sent by our branch societies, valued at \$15,232.51, and the Treasurer reports cash received at \$1270.75, in all, \$16,503.36. In this is included our annual pledge to Good Samaritan Hospital, Portland, Oregon, and the sum promised Bishop Brewer for a missionary. Had we never done better than this we might rest satisfied, but we do not like to chronicle any failing to reach former standards.

In the review of the year just passed, the general meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary at Chicago, held the day after the assembling of the General Convention, and our own meeting which was held on the 11th of March, in the ever hospitable parish building of Holy Trinity, stand as the most prominent events to us.

I had the pleasure to be in Chicago, and was present both at the meeting of the officers of the Auxiliary and at the general meeting. What a wonderful gathering it was, of church women; so remote from eastern centres of work, and so generously welcomed by the members of the Auxiliary of Chicago. The Philadelphia ladies would have felt very proud, as I did, at the honorable mention made of this city, and of the pleasant

memories carried away from the previous general meeting, which was held here.

At our own meeting in March, we were unusually favored in the speakers, and had even the honor of the presence of a Foreign Missionary Bishop. No committee was, however, more ably represented than our own, by the Assistant Bishop of Pennsylvania. His earnest, telling words must have made us all, of the Domestic Committee, feel how grand was our opportunity, and how precious our privilege, to serve our beloved country now. We had too the pleasure of the presence of the Rev. Dr. Langford, the General Secretary of the Board of Missions; his earnest address gave us all new confidence in the wisdom, and energy, and zeal of the members of the Board, and it was easy to see how acceptable it is to the women of the Church, to be thus brought, as it were, into direct communication with the Board. We think that a great impetus would be given to the Auxiliary if some plan could be devised by which its lines of work could bear the official sanction of the Board of Managers, for we believe that the earnest aim of the members of the Auxiliary is to be what its name implies, helper to the Board of Missions.

Many of you may have read, which I heard in Chicago, that "Connecticut is the banner Diocese of the Woman's Auxiliary." I confess that it sounded strange to my ears, and when I compared its offerings with those of our own Diocese the wonder grew; it was not until some time after that I learned that this proud distinction came from the fact that eighty-seven per cent of its parishes are branches of the Auxiliary. With us I regret to say that we do not count fifty per cent. Can not this be changed before the time comes for another Annual Report? Every one of us can do something towards bringing in new parishes. There can be no reason for the work to be so much more general in Connecticut than in Pennsylvania. Pray let us try if we may not increase our number of working parishes. Our ambition cannot rest satisfied until we count every parish in the Diocese one of our branches. Grateful for what has been done in the past, and hopeful for the future, we submit our Report.

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY
TO
FOREIGN MISSIONS.

We are pleased to inform our friends, and those who have aided us, that the pledges assumed last year were continued, and we were also enabled to take up several new ones, to wit: A boys' scholarship in Japan; a scholarship in Miss Wong's Orphanage, Shanghai, China, which was paid by the Chinese class in the Sunday School of the Church of the Epiphany; a scholarship called "Faith Scholarship" in the Jane Bohlen's school, Wuchang, China, paid by a lady of the Church of the Covenant; a scholarship in a boys' school, China, by the Sunday School of Christ Church, Germantown; also a gift of thirty-five dollars (\$35) from same Church for Japan; also a gift of one thousand dollars (\$1000) for establishing Christ's Hospital, China, from a lady, through St. Peter's Church, Germantown; two scholarships in Africa, under Bishop Ferguson, one for Boys' High School, Cavalla—\$40—called in memory of Rev. Richard Newton; one in St. John's Mission, Cape Mount, Africa, for boys—\$40—called for Bishop Whitaker; and one in the same school for girls—\$30—called the Anna C. Stephens Scholarship. We have commenced, and are now doubly anxious to complete, an endowment fund to establish a William Bacon Stevens scholarship in St. John's College, Shanghai, as a memorial to our dear departed Bishop. How better could

the women of the Church honor his memory than by contributing to this fund?

We have furnished four clergymen with surplices and stoles. We have sent smaller gifts to cheer those who are bearing the "burden and heat of the day," the sum total of all which we calculate to represent \$2529.71. We have met together monthly, and in a spirit of prayer asked the Great Head of the Church not only to send "laborers into His vineyard," but that He would put it into the hearts of His people to realize the sacrifices His missionaries are making, and enable us to help and comfort them.

We are encouraged that our meetings are growing in size and interest, and have been cheered by visits with addresses from Bishop Boone and Mrs. Schereschuskey, from China; Mrs. Graves, of the Church of England, who is laboring in the Zenana work in India; Rev. Mr. Campette, of Dublin, Ireland, and from our own townsman, Rev. Mr. Graff. These have bidden us take courage, and we mean with the weapon of prayer to parry the darts of the evil one, by keeping from the heads and hearts of His laborers, those discouragements which come from a feeling of forgetfulness and neglect at home.

We will let the death of such faithful servants as Miss Jesse A. Purple incite us to new vigor, that we may try to attain her submission, who, with a happy, cheerful spirit, faced death upon the ocean, upon which she had embarked, in order to reach her native land. She was buried at sea. And though dead, must continue to speak to her sisters. Can any communicant feel she fulfills her duty who is not a helper in this cause—a member of the "Woman's Auxiliary?"

In reviewing the work of the Freedmen's Committee for 1886-7, while it would seem that the result in money received and disbursed—viz., \$1887.72—and value of boxes sent—viz., \$1662.05—does not indicate any rapid growth, it is still encouraging to feel assured that the work goes steadily on; and that the Church itself has, through its House of Bishops, shown a re-enwakened interest in the Freedmen's cause, by pledging the sum of \$20,000 for the bettering of its general condition throughout the South. And here we would add a word of *deep appreciation* of those in our midst, who in the sweet humility of their quiet giving, are ever doing so much to relieve the necessities of those toiling souls who are bearing so patiently in this great work the heat and burden of the day.

At the last regular annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary the thought was presented by a clergyman experienced in the work, that the cause could be much advanced in the South, if the clergy there, instead of depending for aid on the *established missions*, scattered far apart and burdened with

much work and funds not commensurate with their responsibilities should hold regular services for the *colored people* in their vicinity; thus making them feel themselves *not forgotten* in the dispensing of the sacred offices of the House of God; and awakening in them an interest, which they in turn would extend to others of their race.

Amidst our deep thankfulness for the blessings of the past year, we record with sadness the passing away of our dearly beloved Bishop, Rt. Rev. Wm. Bacon Stevens. Of *none* can it be more truly said, "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord, for they rest from their labors and their works do follow them."

We cannot close this report without once more urging on our people the *pleading, pressing* necessities of the Freedmen of the South, and pray that God may put it into the hearts of all Christian people to do what they can for this suffering race who have the influence of centuries of spiritual darkness to overcome, and who are earnestly evincing their desire to become true followers of the Divine Master.
