Indians' Hope Association.

TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL

REPORT.

The past year has been an encouraging one in the Indian work, not only to our Association, but to all those who are interested in the Indian cause. The people of the United States are being roused to feel an interest in the Indians, and year by year more is done for them both politically and by religious bodies.

The Association has taken up a new branch of work this year among the Indians of Wyoming, for whom Bishop Talbot made an appeal at one of our meetings. The Board of Missions is able to give the Bishop very little aid, and he needs every help that can be given through his friends in the East. The Indians' Hope has already sent to him \$151.

It has been found necessary to enlarge the plan of our new Chapel at St. John's School, which was to cost \$1000, and it will now cost \$1500. The Chapel was opened on May 7, 1888. As there is to be a new School building, a memorial to Mr. William Welsh, it was decided to make St. John's Chapel also a memorial to Mr. Welsh, and to build it in connection with the School, although not under the same roof.

We cannot say too much to express our appreciation of Bishop Hare's work in Dakota. He never seems to weary of well-doing, and the influence of his example not only over the Indians in his Diocese, but also over the people in the East,

who are looking from a distance at his work, becomes greater every year.

Three new Parishes have sent delegates to the Association, and the average attendance at the stated meetings has been very satisfactory. The Treasurer's Report shows receipts amounting to \$3893.94.

The Box Committee reports eighteen boxes sent to the different stations, to the value of \$1120.25. We owe our thanks to Mr. Frank M. McDowell for paper for the Report, to the Vestry of Holy Trinity Church for the use of the room for our meetings, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad Company for the free transportation of boxes to Chicago.

It is with great regret that we are obliged to announce the intended absence of our Secretary, Mrs. Markoe. Her interest in the Association and her efficiency in her duties are so well known that it is hardly necessary to state how greatly we shall miss her, and we can only hope that she will resume her work with equal spirit on her return.

With ever-growing hope for the future and gratitude for what has been done in the past, we submit our Twenty-second Annual Report.

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch
OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY
TO THE
BOARD OF MISSIONS.

Since our last annual meeting, our late beloved Diocesan, who founded this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, has been delivered from his sufferings, and entered into that rest that remaineth to the people of God. We must record our grateful appreciation of all of his loving care, he was ever ready to help and counsel us. Our loss is his great gain. Two of the noble band of our Missionary Bishops have also been called from their abundant labors—Bishops Elliott and Dunlop. As good soldiers, they bravely endured hardness, it is our bitterness to feel that they should have been more generously aided, in bearing the heavy burdens laid upon them; may we be led to succor those that are yet laboring with us, and so spare them all the weariness and anxiety that we can.

The duty of presenting to you to-day, our Fourteenth Annual Report, is a welcome one, because I can tell of increased interest in the work that it is our blessed privilege to do, of a gain of several new Parish Branches, and of the best year's work that we have ever done. We have sent away one hundred and sixty-four boxes, the value of one hundred and

sixty-one has been given to us as \$17,765.12, and the Treasurer's Report shows that \$2534.18 has passed through her hands, while various sums of money that have been sent direct from the Parish societies to their beneficiaries, would show a grand total of nearly \$21,000. Among the largest items of money sent direct to its destination, we find the gifts of the Young Ladies' Bible Class of St. Peter's Church, which amount to \$442.11.

We have sent our annual gift to the Good Samaritan Hospital at Portland, Oregon, and also to Bishop Brewer, for an addition to a Missionary stipend, as the Treasurer's Report will tell.

The response to some of the appeals that were already waiting for us, when the season of work began, has been very generous. The Denver Hospital has received \$202. We could wish that larger sums had been sent to the "Bishop Elliott Memorial Scholarship," and to the fund of the family of the lamented Bishop. But until we all offer small sums, when we cannot give large ones, and learn the lesson, that in the aggregate great is the result of such offerings, it is certainly true that many good enterprises must fail, for in large cities multitudes of worthy objects are presented and one cannot give largely to each and all.

I think that all who heard him will agree with me that the greatest inspiration of the year was given to us by Bishop Talbot, whom it was our privilege to have with us at the February meeting. His earnest manliness, his fresh enthusiasm, seem to have made an impression wherever he went, and I am thankful to say that he carried away with him substantial proof of the interest he created in his work. From this Committee he had the pledge of \$500 towards building a Church in a new part of his vast jurisdiction, and the promise was also made to him by delegates from St. James's, of altar vessels and linen, for another Church, built by the efforts of a few Christian women in Wyoming. The noble Parish of Holy Trinity has given all the money pledged to build the promised Church, and it will be called Holy Trinity in its honor. Christ Church Sunday School has handed \$50 to our Treas-

urer, and thus heads the list of subscriptions for a second \$500, to secure the building of another Church. Who will help to make up the sum? There is not a Missionary Bishop who could not now build, with great advantage, several Churches, and it is sad to see apathy in this regard where there is need of the greatest zeal.

In the beginning of Lent I received from the Enrolment Committee a book for subscriptions to that grand fund. I have spoken of its modest requirements and of the mighty impulse, that its contemplated sum, one million of dollars, would give, in this supreme crisis of Missions, in all the world; and although I feel as if I must ask of each one, "Are you enrolled?" I regret to say that I have not one name in my book. I hope that the reason of this is, that the Rectors in Pennsylvania have so conscientiously adopted the plan that no communicants are left out of the honorable roll, whose names have already been entered. If, however, there be those among us from Parishes that have not entered into the Philadelphia Layman's Enrolment Plan, I would rejoice to have them use the book furnished to this Committee, for just such cases, and pay through it the subscription of five dollars before September, 1889. There are not many who could not enjoy this privilege.

I must again call the attention of the members of this Committee, and beg them to do the same to the members of their Parish Branches, to the *Spirit of Missions*, the Official Organ of the Church, and issued monthly at the low price of one dollar a year. I am sure that no reader of this invaluable magazine would give it up for much more money. It has been well said, "There can be no zeal without knowledge." We can care nothing for anything, of which we know nothing. Is it not therefore our bounden duty to inform ourselves of what is going forward in the Missionary world, under the care of the Church of God?

May I not speak to all friends of the Church of the efforts that are being made to build and support schools in our Missionary jurisdictions, and may I not bespeak for them liberal gifts? While we are supine, Rome is busy. In California she has

two hundred schools, and while the good Bishop of Northern Texas, has for thirteen years, been laboring to build one modest school, Rome has built thirteen convents, averaging in cost from \$35,000 to \$60,000.

A growing need is felt by this Committee for a fund that may be always at hand to supply appeals that call only for money. To a centre like Philadelphia, the Secretary in New York naturally looks, and should be able to do so with confidence, to respond to the many letters she receives, asking for such things as involve no labor, but can be supplied at once with money to purchase them.

In a neighboring Diocese this need is met by a membership tax of ten cents annually, given by each member of every Parish society. The sum thus realized is quite considerable, while it does not absorb anything from the treasury of the Parish society. In our rich city, perhaps, a larger sum might be suggested, or the Parish Branches might send, from their General Treasury, five or ten dollars to create a fund, that could be dispensed by vote at our meetings. I would be gratified if the delegates would think of this.

One Parish has added a "Woman's Auxiliary Fund" this year to its list of offertory objects, and it has been an invaluable help to us. Cannot some other Parishes do something of this kind? Filling Missionary boxes is not the beginning and end of the work of a Parish society.

I must not fail to speak of the meeting held in Philadelphia, in October (at the time of the session of the Missionary Council), of Diocesan officers, at which eleven Dioceses were represented by thirty-one officers, and there was a large attendance of friends of the Woman's Auxiliary. The business meeting in the morning being over, we had the pleasure of entertaining the visitors at luncheon, and in the afternoon we reassembled to hear addresses from several Missionaries, which could not have failed to create new interest in the work. The offerings of the day, amounting to \$135.33, were devoted to the Board of Missions.

At this meeting a resolution was passed recommending Diocesan Reference Libraries. These have since been established

in many of the Dioceses, but Pennsylvania has as yet taken no action in the matter. We hope before another year that we may have established one.

Once more we beg for delegates from every Parish in the Diocese, and we quote from the address of the Bishop, at the late Convention, some words of commendation of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. He says:

"Large as have been the results accomplished by these faithful workers, during the year, they would have been larger if every Parish had been interested in the work. Surely the basis of the Woman's Auxiliary is broad enough for all to stand on. The ends which it contemplates are worthy every one's seeking. The methods which it pursues will approve themselves to all who will study them. I would suggest to every Rector and Missionary, whose congregation is not already identified with the Woman's Auxiliary, the importance of bringing it to their attention, that they may have a part in its good work."

Commending this endorsement to your notice, and with gratitude for the noble band of workers already enlisted, and for all that the dear Lord has permitted us to do, in His Name, we submit our Report.

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY
TO
FOREIGN MISSIONS.

Quickly have sped the nine months of our work for Foreign Missions. If with equal speed our number of Parish representatives had increased with what joy could we announce in this our Fourteenth Annual Report that one hundred Parishes had delegates sent by their Rectors instead of thirty-two! There are many still who require a balance sheet to convince them, that God's Word is true; we have still to fight the old prejudice, the misquoted adage, that "charity begins at home," and yet we believe some have had their zeal quickened, their interest increased, and have expressed their determination to work for Foreign Missions. Yet, we must still wait for the return of some faithful watchman from the distant tower, to tell us "what of the night," to make us believe that God's Spirit is doing His work, and that there are *Chinamen* whose souls have been redeemed in their own Empire, even if our country refuses to let them live in its blaze of Gospel light.

Our money table shows less in dollars and cents than last year's credit; we miss the generous gift of \$1000 for Hospital needs, but our pledges have been redeemed and the amount for a teacher's salary almost doubled, and we have taken great delight in sending a new set of robes to Bishop Channing Williams, of Tokio, Japan.

NEEDS.

We *want* a double portion of the Pentecostal gift. We *want* every Clergyman in the Diocese to send us a delegate from his Parish. We do not ask the least diversion of Parish collections, which should go to the Board as annual offerings, we only beg the *fragments* which woman's zeal and tact can often gather. We *want* every member of the Church to realize how very soon the privilege of working for Japan will be deprived them by its own native Church and Ministers.

And we *want* the Church to realize that sealed-up China is fast opening to Gospel influence, and that Christians now numbering thousands can be increased to tens of thousands, if we will give our prayers and increase our offerings to carry on the work.

One word for neglected Africa, whose cry for help has been long and loud. We *want* for this benighted land, not more martyr's names to engrave on the brazen tablet of a Jerusalem chamber, but more earnest pleadings, increased offerings and hearts touched with sympathy that may strengthen our struggling Missionaries.

We regret that ill health has caused the resignation within the year of two of our Officers, always faithful to their trust, but are thankful to say the vacancies have been filled. We give our grateful thanks to them and our Treasurer for work "well done."

With thankfulness for God's blessing on our work in these past years, and with strong hopes for "strengthened stakes" and "enlarged borders" for the years to come, we submit our Report.

The Freedmen's Committee maintains its work steadily from year to year, the value of the Missionary boxes sent this year being almost precisely the same as last year, and the amount of money collected slightly larger. Thus it tries to do its share in maintaining the work of the Church already undertaken among this large class of our people. But how small is that work, how few are our stations and Missions among the millions in our Southern States, how little is our Church really doing for them! The Committee cannot begin to answer all the appeals that come to it, much less do anything adequately to reach that vast population which is in such need of educational and religious influences. It is true that there are special difficulties and perplexities connected with this work, but why, when there are workmen ready and willing to enter into it, should they not be received and sustained, and the means provided which they need to carry on their work? Why will not

the women of the Church rouse themselves to labor in this department of Missions? The Woman's Auxiliary has become a power in our Domestic and Indian Missions; why should it not be also in this most needy and neglected field? Each year we appeal to the women of our Diocese to come to our help, "the help of the Lord against the mighty;" each year we ask the several Rectors to send us delegates from their Parishes, and yet out of our two hundred Parishes not more than an eighth are represented. If the Clergy would see that there was at least one member of our Society from each of their congregations, our work might be increased eightfold. The ladies attending the meetings of the Committee become interested in the work as they could not be otherwise. They hear the reports and appeals coming directly from the workers in the field, and vote the money they collect for the objects which seem to them most pressing. And we are sure the Clergy will find their delegates only the more interested in Church work generally, and better workers, from the part they take in this work.

By reading this Report any one can see what Parishes are represented and what amounts are contributed, and no one can feel that they are commensurate either with the ability of this Diocese or the needs of the work.

While therefore we are thankful for what we have been able to accomplish in the past, we cannot help hoping each year that fresh interest will be aroused and more may be done in this great department of Missionary labor.
