Indians' Hope Association.

TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL

REPORT.

We began the year in September with the sad news, reported to the Association by Bishop Hare, of the sudden death of our valued Missionary, the Rev. Mr. Handford, at the Cheyenne River Agency. He was a diligent and very successful worker and his loss is very much to be regretted.

St. John's Memorial School and Chapel, the latter being the special work of last year, having been built, it was found necessary to refurnish a considerable part of the school, which was done by the Association. It is now in good working order and is doing an excellent work, to which the following letter of Mr. George R. Milburn, United States Special Indian Agent, is a very satisfactory witness:

"I made two visits to the School; the first was unexpected by Mr. Kinney, the Principal, and, as I immediately requested to be conducted through the institution, I had a fair opportunity to form an opinion, which was subsequently made a conviction when I visited the School on special invitation. It is an excellent institution. The thirty-six girls are apt scholars; they *understand what they learn*, and are happy in their relations with their teachers and with each other. Their decorum is perfect. The building and its appointments are maintained with superior neatness. The health of the scholars seems good."

Bishop Hare has offered us a new object of interest in the building of a rectory, at the Cheyenne River Agency, for the missionary at the station having charge of the St. John's William Welsh Memorial Church. He states the necessity of the rectory as follows:

"I should like the privilege of presenting to the Indians'

Hope a need which I have foreseen for a long while and which is now beginning to be exceedingly urgent. It is a parsonage at Cheyenne River Agency, near the William Welsh Memorial School and Church. The William Welsh School, the Government Boarding School for Boys, the post (Fort Bennett) and the agency with its employes, are all clustered here within a radius of three miles, and it is exceedingly important that we have a white clergyman here, but there is no place in which he can reside. The parsonage would cost say \$1200."

This sum was gladly promised by the Indians' Hope.

Lest the diminished number of delegates to the Association should be misunderstood, it would be well to explain the reason of it. It was found that a considerable number of delegates never responded in any way to the notice for meetings, so it was considered wise to request those who did not feel interested to take their name from the list, which has been thus reduced by nine or ten names.

In the meetings this year we have missed very much the presence of our President, Mrs. Welsh, and of our Secretary, Mrs. Markoe, but we sincerely hope that both will be in their accustomed places in the coming year.

In spite of the disadvantage of many stormy days the meetings have been well attended, and those present have shown their interest and perseverance in the efforts made to do the work well, and it is hoped that every member will endeavor this year to raise the number of *working* delegates, so that, next year, an increase, instead of a decrease, may be reported.

We owe our thanks to Mr. Frank M. McDowell for paper for the Report; to the Vestry of the Holy Trinity Church for the use of the room for our meetings, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad Company for the free transportation of boxes to Chicago.

With constant hope for the future results of present labors, we submit our Twenty-third Annual Report.

FIFTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch
OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY
TO THE
BOARD OF MISSIONS.

It seems incredible that another year has sped since we gave to you our last Annual Report. The flight of years, with ever-increasing rapidity as we advance in them, is itself a monition that "the night cometh, in which no man can work." Let us be very earnest, and "work while it is day."

I am happy in telling you that the past season has brought to us six new Parish Branches; some of them have already done a wonderful work, and all of them are most welcome to us.

We have sent away 180 boxes; the value of 179 is reported at \$19,604.63. Money has been sent direct from the Parish Branches to the amount of \$872, while our Treasurer shows us that \$1731.38 has passed through her hands. Our gifts in money and in the boxes sent reach a total sum of \$22,207.91. In the Treasurer's account we find that we have once more sent to the

good Bishop of Oregon the \$250 needed to pay the salary of the matron of the Good Samaritan Hospital at Portland. This we have done each year for the ten years just passed. And the \$500 pledged for three years to Bishop Brewer, to supplement the scanty stipend of a Montana Missionary, has again been paid to him, by the efforts of one of the members of this committee.

More than eight hundred dollars has been collected, by a special effort made, to enable the Bishop of N. Texas to furnish the dormitories in St. Mary's Institute, at Dallas, Tex. And we desire to record our gratitude to the many helping ones who so kindly responded to our appeal. The importance of Christian schools, especially in the new parts of our land, cannot be overestimated, and we are thankful to have been able to send some aid and encouragement to the noble Bishop, who has so valiantly brought to an end his great work of building in his vast jurisdiction one Church school for girls. Pray, let us realize the great need of caring for the lambs of Christ's flock, if we would have the sheep of His pasture love and follow their Great Shepherd. If our country is to continue in the list of Christian nations, we cannot relax our energies for a moment. It is ours to help forward the Church in all possible ways. Our women may not only cheer and comfort the Missionaries and those that are dear to them in their homes, they can minister to the needs of those bare Mission Chapels all over the vast missionary jurisdictions, and they can hold up the hands of their Bishops in their efforts to serve and bless the people.

Our noble band of Missionary Bishops are doing for us all their hard work. We are not doing for them, as we sometimes hear, that we have done enough for this one or that. I thank God that this committee is constantly helping in money gifts or in material ones for the Mission stations. And I trust that we shall not forget them, for now is our opportunity to do great things for our country. In reviewing the work of this committee, we are stimulated and thankful to find that since our organization, fifteen years ago, we have sent forth more than sixteen hundred Missionary boxes, valued at over

\$180,000; to add the gifts in money, would probably make a total of over \$200,000. It is most encouraging to note how the work and the interest in it is growing. Praying that the Great Head of the Church will make our labors yet more abundant, and heartily thanking our co-adjutors, we submit this Report.

Report of Foreign Committee

OF THE

PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

1888-89.

It is with pleasure that we report an increased membership for the Foreign Committee. This time last year thirty-two parishes sent us delegates, now forty-two parishes are represented.

During the year seven ladies have resigned, but we have added the names of twenty-six new delegates to our roll. But we are not content, for we are anxious to add, at least, one name from each Church and Mission still unrepresented.

There has been no change in our pledges and scholarships. We have simply renewed all those of the foregoing year, and it is with much satisfaction that we can announce that all these pledges have been paid up for this year.

At our February meeting, we had the privilege of hearing from the Rev. Mr. Locke, an account of his work in Hankow, China. We promised him \$100 for a font for his new Church in that city, which sum has already been collected.

The general meeting of the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, held May 15, at the Church of the Epiphany, was extremely interesting. The large number of ladies present

listened most attentively, during the morning session, to addresses from Dr. Crummell, Dr. Langford, Rev. Mr. Bates, Mr. Herbert Welsh, and Mr. Roberts, of Shoshone Agency.

The afternoon session was devoted to the reading of reports and papers on Missionary Work, by officers and other ladies.

Last year, commencing with a balance of \$27.33, we collected for our work \$1645.22. This year, with a balance of only \$1.71, our offerings amount to more than \$2000, which does not include the value of some boxes (\$125.80).

If we may judge from increased contributions to Foreign Missions, which amount to several thousand dollars over the sum given last year, the American Church is waking up to a better realization of her duty towards the heathen, so we thank God and take courage.

REPORT

OF THE

FREEDMEN'S COMMITTEE,

JUNE 1, 1889.

Fourteen years have elapsed since, in December, 1874, the Rt. Rev. Bishop of Pennsylvania (the late William Bacon Stevens), made known in earnest words his prayerful "desire for a greater increase of missionary zeal among the women of this Diocese," and a month later a meeting was held at his house, when officers were elected to serve in the four branches of Women's Auxiliary work. About sixteen months later, the Freedmen's Committee published its first Report, showing a representation of twenty (20) parishes, forty (40) delegates, subscriptions received of \$65, and a box of clothing donated valued at \$80.

The record of the working year just closing represents a list of thirty (30) parishes, fifty-six delegates, boxes sent valued at \$2074.16, and money received and distributed to the amount of \$1688.70.

We are anxious to present these facts at this time, in order to show the exact progress of the work, and to offer convincing proof that although very much good has been accomplished (for those who do work are faithful), the number of parishes represented in the work is still *lamentably small*, and the amount of money raised not at all commensurate with the ability of the Church in this Diocese.

In looking carefully into the pressing needs of work among

the Freedmen, two facts are strongly prominent. First, that for the accomplishment of good and permanent results, the education of the youth of the South is an urgent necessity. Second, experience has shown, that for such education none are so well suited to instruct the negro as those teachers of their own race, who very naturally understanding their necessities, can reach them in a way totally unattainable by white teachers.

It cannot be said in this field, as it is of many others, that the laborers are *few*. On the contrary, it is a notable fact that the colored men and women who have acquired sufficient education to instruct others, are doing all in their power to mentally and spiritually aid their race. Many others in their midst are eager for the work, but, alas, cannot find means for their education and support.

Oh, why cannot our people awaken to the appealing condition of the poor negroes of the South! After many dark years of sorrowing toil in the bonds of servitude, they come knocking at our doors, for light and help, and we give them not. Why will not the Church *see* and *do* the work which the Master has laid at her feet, and for the neglect of which she, with her glorious opportunities, must surely hold herself accountable? While we are listless and apathetic, Rome is steadily at work. The golden harvest of many souls she claims shall be hers, not ours. Here, then, in our very midst, lies missionary work. Let us earnestly seek the light to direct us in it, knowing that we, as professing Christians, must render a faithful account to Him who hath said, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these, my brethren, ye have done it unto Me."

And while they plant and water, send Thou, O Lord, the increase ; gather in the multitude of the heathen ; convert, in Christian lands, such as neglect so great salvation ; so that Thy Name may be glorified, and Thy Kingdom come, O gracious Saviour of the world, to whom, with the Father, and the Holy Ghost, be honor and glory, world without end. Amen.

ALMIGHTY and most merciful God, the Father of the friendless and the Helper of the helpless, have pity, we beseech Thee, upon the Indian tribes who dwell in this our land. Send to them the light and comfort of Thy Holy Gospel. Bless all the means used to bring them to the knowledge of Thy dear Son, who died for the salvation of all men. Guide with Thy Spirit, guard with Thy power, sustain with Thy love, all those who minister to them in spiritual things, and bear to them the tidings of redemption. Stir up the hearts of all who profess and call themselves Christians to prayer and deeds of mercy for this perishing race. Give to our rulers a sense of honor, truth and justice in all their dealings with them, and fill this whole nation with compassion for this poor and scattered people ; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd. All of which we ask through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
