TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL

REPORT.

It seems advisable to begin our annual report with a short account of the foundation and object of the Indians' Hope Association. It was founded in 1868, principally through the efforts of Mr. William Welsh and a few Christian men and women who were interested in improving the sad condition of the Indian tribes of our country.

The object of the Association, according to its Constitution, is to "aid the Domestic Committee in the mission work of the Church among the tribes at present under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Nebraska, and to extend yet further, as opportunity shall offer, the same benefits to other Indians."

The mission, which at that time had been under the charge of Bishop Clarkson of Nebraska for eight years, had grown, until, in 1883, it was formed into the diocese of South Dakota. But in these years it had to pass through many severe trials. In 1862, when the savage, starving Indians arose and massacred the whites on the border, it was through the efforts of the Christian Indians that many whole families escaped the great danger, but the great prejudice aroused in the mind of the nation by the massacre made it very difficult to get money to support the missions. In 1868, as has been said, the Indians' Hope Association was formed to help with all that could be given by private subscription and private endeavor in the great and difficult work of Christianizing and civilizing the Indian. In 1871, the Domestic Committee of the Board of Missions appointed an Indian Commission to the care of the Indian Missions. There were only three at that time assisted by the

Board: the mission to the Oneidas, begun in 1825; that to the Chippewas in Minnesota begun in 1854, and the Santee Mission, founded in 1860.

In 1872, the mission to the Santees and Sioux in Dakota, had become large enough to demand a Bishop of its own. Bishop Hare was appointed Missionary Bishop of Niobrara, as the region was then called.

There are now in the territory of the United States nine general divisions of the Indian mission work, viz., the Alaska Mission, under the Rev. J. W. Chapman; Fond du Lac, under Bishop Grafton of Wisconsin; Indian Territory, under Bishop Pierce; New Mexico and Arizona, under Bishop Kendrick; Colorado, under Bishop Spaulding; Minnesota, under Bishop Whipple; Wyoming, under Bishop Talbot, and South Dakota, under Bishop Hare. Although our interest in all the missions is deep, it has been considered best that we should, while doing what we can for all, devote our special attention to South Dakota. In this division are four boarding schools, all of which have been aided by money, boxes of clothing, etc., from the Association. Last year the new building of St. John's school for girls, Cheyenne River Agency, was finished (a memorial to Mr. William Welsh), and to it the Association has added a chapel, rectory, stable, etc.

We have passed a very successful year; the number of delegates has increased, and we have added several parishes to our list, having at present fifty-five parishes represented.

In connection with the school at Cheyenne River Agency, the following commendation has been given by the U. S. Indian Agent:

CHEYENNE RIVER AGENCY, S. DAK.

My Friend Kinney:—Enclosed please find a rough copy of my report in the part connected with your school. To say that I am well pleased with your work hardly expresses my feelings. I feel as though you and your wife were doing lasting work, such as I think cannot help but bring forth much fruit. As I told you, I will repeat here that nothing is solid in this Indian work unless it is strongly spiced with our Christian religion. If we never meet in this world I want to meet you with all your scholars in the better land. Your friend,

CHEYENNE RIVER AGENCY, December 30, 1889.

Report of Special Agent George P. Litchfield, in regard to the William Welsh Mission School at this Agency.

I have visited the William Welsh Mission School at this Agency, and find it different in its nature from any that I have visited. I think it a real model home school. I there saw some new features in the school work, which will help me to assist others as I visit different Agencies and schools. To think that each of these girls has a Christian friend makes me feel as though these Indians have some friends in earnest. It is stimulating to see the Christian work done at this school. The whole reserve is feeling it in the lives of girls, now women, who have attended this school. It cannot help being satisfactory to its patrons and friends.

We owe our thanks, as usual, to Mr. Frank M. McDowell for paper for the Report, to the Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity for the use of the room for our meetings, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad Company for the free transportation of boxes to Chicago.

With every hope that our usefulness is increasing and our work prospering, we submit our Twenty-fourth Annual Report.

SIXTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch

OF THE

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

TO THE

BOARD OF MISSIONS.

The Report that I come to give you to-day, is of a year in which the General Convention has met, and that always means a year full of Missionary awakening, and of notable events to us, some of which I desire to bring to your notice.

The Triennial Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, held in New York, on the second of last October, was the most memorable one in our history, not only on account of its size, but for the large offerings made, exceeding greatly those of any former meeting, and amounting to the goodly sum of \$2186; it is believed that more than eight hundred women were present to receive fresh inspiration from the gifted speakers and excellent papers, and to enjoy the bountiful hospitality of the New York Branch of the Auxiliary.

The All-day Meeting of our own Diocesan Branch followed soon after, held in St. Andrew's Church, in this city, which surpassed in size and importance any of our previous ones. We

shall not soon forget the well-filled church, the hearty services, our beloved Diocesan, the presiding officer of the day, and the fervent addresses with which we were favored, from Bishops Morris, Kendrick and Talbot, and the Rev. William B. Gordon and Paulus Moort. The offerings for the various Missions then presented, and for the Seamen's Home in Philadelphia, were over \$4000, by far the largest part of which was sent to the Bishop, by those whose purses were not full enough at the moment, to express the interest of their hearts. An Annual Meeting like that is our present ambition.

On the very day that our last Report was given to you, a disaster came to the citizens of this commonwealth, that has had no parallel. I have vainly endeavored to obtain some record or approximate estimate of the bountiful aid that was speedily sent from nearly all of our parishes to the sufferers in the Conemaugh Valley. We must rest content with the fact that the generosity to Johnstown proves conclusively, that to touch the heart, is the "open sesame" to the purse, and we would covet the power to show, that there are moral deluges, and waves of sorrow, to be found in many parts of this dear land, that could easily be stayed and comforted, if we could learn to feel, that the soul is of more value than the body, and so as generously pour out our treasure to do the Lord's waiting work, at all of our Mission Stations. I think that we have received new zeal from the visits to our own Committee of Bishops Morris, Hare and Talbot: I am thankful to know that they were all kindly helped and cheered by our delegates.

The past year has the honor of having known the inception of the idea of building, in the city of New York, a Church Missions House, a home for our Missionary Society. Some noble gifts to the Building fund have been made, and it looks now, as if we were soon to see a goodly building, which shall be an exponent of our faith in Missions. The Woman's Auxiliary resolved, last autumn, to make, this year, a united offering towards furnishing the rooms to be devoted to its use, and to fit up the Chapel for its sacred purposes. It is very hard for me to say, that Pennsylvania has disappointed me in anything, because this Committee is so generous in all that I

ask, but I must admit, that I wish that we could have sent more to this "united offering," and I yet hope that the autumn will bring larger help. Connecticut has pledged \$800. I was vain enough to think that we could do as well!

I cannot refrain from expressing the joy that I felt, upon reading the resolutions passed by "the Board of Managers," in regard to the Enrollment fund, and I would earnestly add my voice, and beg the women of this noble Diocese, and especially in this great city, one of whose true-hearted citizens conceived the plan, to see to it that this grand fund shall be largely augmented through their efforts. If one earnest woman in each Parish would obtain her Rector's consent to seek subscribers, a very large sum would soon be secured.

By far the most important action of the year has, in my judgment, been the organization of the Junior Auxiliary; there are thousands of young hearts, in our fold, the lambs of the flock, who lack nothing to make of them earnest church workers but the direction of their thoughts to the Missionary fields of the world. I hail with the keenest satisfaction this plan of gathering the young into an army of fresh recruits. The children's gifts last year amounted to more than \$50,000. We cannot afford to lose such a body of helpers, any more than they can, to live without doing their share of their Master's work. I am thankful to say, that a number of our Parishes have already organized branches of the Junior Auxiliary, whose reports I am happy to append.

You have waited long to hear the result of our year's work. We have sent away 163 boxes, 26 barrels and 9 packages, valued at \$18,566.57. Our Treasurer reports the receipt of \$3513.46; \$624.20 has been sent direct from Parishes. The Junior Auxiliary has sent 11 boxes, valued at \$202.45, and \$74.14. This makes a grand total of \$22,990.92, which exceeds all past records.

The salary of the Matron in the Good Samaritan Hospital at Portland, Oreg., has again been paid to the great satisfaction of its Diocesan. One hundred dollars has been given towards the Endowment fund of the Bishop Elliott Memorial Scholarship in St. Mary's School, San Antonio, Tex. It is

hoped that the whole sum of \$3000 will be gathered this year. It is most gratifying to note, how year by year the gifts in money of this Committee are steadily growing. It no longer devotes its whole strength to making up Missionary boxes. There are places in our wide domain, where no sum of money could supply the place of the well-filled Missionary box, but there are many calls for money, that must come to us, and no box can respond to the need. Shall we yield to any other branch of the Auxiliary, in our power to help such appeals? This leads me to say, that we expect, in the autumn, to inaugurate a new plan of work in regard to our Diocesan Missionaries, which I hope that each Parish will aid us to carry out. It is to make a fund by general contributions, that shall be sent from us to the Bishop, to be dispensed by him, who best knows the circumstances of his Clergy and so spare them the pain of disclosing their needs to strangers, and having others select for them, what they can do so much more acceptably themselves. I trust that each Parish Society will feel a pride in helping in this work, and I would beg those branches, who love best to work for our Diocesan brethren, to remember to send money to our Treasurer, as we hope to supply all their needs by this plan, which works so well in other Dioceses.

I must, in closing, call your attention to our new Branch Societies, whom it is a great pleasure to welcome. Some have come to us in their earliest infancy, others have kept us waiting and longing for them for years. We thank them all, and still call for others; we cannot rest content until every Parish in the Diocese is in union with us. Once more thanking all who have helped and cheered us, and praying that in all our works begun, continued and ended, we may glorify our Master and our King, we submit our Report.

Report of Foreign Committee

OF THE

PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

1889-90.

No one can become interested in Foreign Missions without feeling that all that he can give and all that he can persuade others to give, is not enough to satisfy him. When we look at any one of the Mission fields, its importance is such and its need so great, that we feel like saying, "Let it all be given here," but when we look at another we would say the same thing. We can only help to fill the greatest gaps, and so hasten the day when all will be filled.

For this end the Auxiliary tries each year to increase its contributions, and, for that reason, its membership. The number of parishes on the roll has had three added to its number, and an increase of interest, for the average attendance at the meetings has been one-fourth larger.

We have sent money to China, Japan, Africa, Mexico and Hayti, and have added Brazil. We hope another year to do something for Cuba, that country which, like Mexico, our other near neighbor, has the name of having a religion, and yet truly has none.

In November a special Diocesan Missionary meeting for the Auxiliary was held at St. Andrew's Church. The addresses were full of the interest which may always be counted upon when the Missionaries themselves have the opportunity to

speak of their work. The collection was large—the amount was divided among the different Branches of the Auxiliary, Foreign work receiving \$428.

In November, December and March three Junior Branches of the Auxiliary were formed, we think the first in the Diocese. If there could be more of these, it would not only increase the amount raised each year, but would give that knowledge of Mission work to the children of the Church, which now so many of riper years seem greatly to lack, and without which there can be but little interest in the cause.

In March, as most of our pledges, of which there were twelve, had been fulfilled, a new one was assumed, and one which had lapsed was renewed, the former a medical scholarship at Shanghai, and the latter a High School scholarship at Cavalla, Africa.

The whole amount collected for the year is \$2418.41—\$373.81 more than that for last year. Added to this, four boxes of clothing have been sent to Mrs. Brierly, for the use of the children in St. John's School at Cape Mount, Africa, one containing boys' clothing only, the others containing mixed clothing.

Our Missionaries are often left alone to do their work, struggling under the burden of an adverse climate, with its ever-returning fever—contending with "Africa's heart disease," the slave trade—never quite sure, that parents will let them keep the children in their schools long enough to be educated, and their unheeded calls for help, money to build, money to repair, yes, money to give their Missionaries a slight increase in salary, and men and women to do the work, are causes sufficient to break hearts and wear out bodies.

If we could increase our number of delegates, we would not only increase our funds, but the *knowledge* of the foreign work would be extended, for no one can attend the meetings without becoming wiser on this subject. The subscriptions from each might be small, yet the *indirect* result might be many dollars of which the Auxiliary itself would never know.

REPORT
OF THE
FREEDMEN'S COMMITTEE,

JUNE 1, 1890.

The Freedmen's Committee closes its work for the winter of 1889 and 1890 with some feeling of satisfaction that, at least, it has not fallen behind the record of former years, but with great regret that more has not been accomplished.

In view of the almost unlimited field presented by the work among the colored population of the country, it is a subject of unceasing concern that the church in the diocese does not take more interest in the matter.

There is cause for encouragement, however, in the fact that the number of delegates has increased in the past year from fifty-six to seventy, showing that the rectors of parishes are at last responding to the many appeals made to them that each parish in the diocese should be represented on the Committee.

There are still fifty-four parishes which send no representatives.

The average attendance has also been better. This is an important point, as it is a help towards awakening interest in a parish, if its representatives attend the meetings and know what is being done by this Committee.

Much is indeed being done through the length and breadth of the land. Such institutions as Dr. Jaeger's orphanage, Mrs. Buford's hospital, Rev. Mr. Perry's work in Tennessee, schools and churches in many obscure neighborhoods, testify to the generosity of our people, but it is not enough.

At the monthly meetings of the Committee, letters from many quarters are received—urgent appeals for help of every sort which in many cases, we are forced, with sad hearts, to ignore.

We hear of hard-working missionaries, both white and colored, bravely working in spite of discouragements, obliged at last to give up for want of assistance; of a young clergyman walking the streets of Philadelphia, foot-sore and weary, unable to obtain more than a few dollars for the cause he presented; and of the eager, almost pathetic desire for education which there are no funds to supply.

These things make us feel that what *has* been done is as nothing to what *might* be done, and to trust that God will put it into the hearts of His people to give to the cause of the Freedmen a larger portion of their gifts, their interest and their prayers.

Preserve them from all dangers to which they may be exposed: from perils by land and perils by water; from the deadly pestilence; from the violence of the persecutor; from doubt and impatience; from discouragement and discord; and from all the devices of the powers of darkness. And while they plant and water, send Thou, O Lord, the increase; gather in the multitude of the heathen; convert, in Christian lands, such as neglect so great salvation; so that Thy Name may be glorified, and Thy Kingdom come, O gracious Saviour of the world, to whom, with the Father, and the Holy Ghost, be honor and glory, world without end. Amen.

ALMIGHTY and most merciful God, the Father of the friendless and the Helper of the helpless, have pity, we beseech Thee, upon the Indian tribes who dwell in this our land. Send to them the light and comfort of Thy Holy Gospel. Bless all the means used to bring them to the knowledge of Thy dear Son, who died for the salvation of all men. Guide with Thy Spirit, guard with Thy Power, sustain with Thy love, all those who minister to them in spiritual things, and bear to them the tidings of redemption. Stir up the hearts of all who profess and call themselves Christians to prayer and deeds of mercy for this perishing race. Give to our rulers a sense of honor, truth and justice in all their dealings with them, and fill this whole nation with compassion for this poor and scattered people; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd. All of which we ask through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
