TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL

REPORT.

During the winter of 1890-91 there has been a very serious uprising among the Indians of South Dakota, the immediate cause of which was the long delay of the Government in paying for Indian lands, which were opened to the whites for occupation before the agreement had been carried out. With this as an irritating spur to their hostile feelings, the discontented among several tribes rose in what we may almost hope was an expiring effort of heathenism against civilization, for it was the old conservative heathen party of the Indians who made one last attempt to retain the freedom of savage life. When the motive of resistance to oppression was strengthened by a superstitious belief in the approach of a Messiah who should cause a sudden upheaval of all the new customs and a return of the old, it became well nigh irresistible to the uncivilized and un-Christian Indian. The two points in this event to be especially noted, with reference to our work, are: First, that the Christian Indian withstood not only the attraction towards a wild life which, one would suppose, must be inherent in his inmost being, but also braved actual danger to life and property which might have fright-

ened him into at least quiescence. Throughout the times of greatest danger our Indian clergy and catechists, as well as our white missionaries, stood boldly and courageously to their posts, and this is surely a source of great encouragement in our work. The second point is, the great change in public feeling as expressed by the newspapers, etc. Instead of calling the Indian treacherous, bad and impossible to civilize, as has been the custom for so long, the press and the public have begun to seek the reasons for their conduct, and now, surely, the good times we have long looked for must be beginning.

During the year from May, 1890, to May, 1891, \$5624.86 have been given in money and boxes to the Indian work through our Association.

Bishop Hare has left the missionary jurisdiction of South Dakota temporarily, for other duties in Japan, and we have greater responsibilities than ever towards our special charge, Rosebud Agency. We sincerely hope that next year we shall have a large increase in our receipts, so that we may be able to build the three new chapels which have been asked for by some of the Indian chiefs through Bishop Hare, and are so urgently needed.

A new school, which had been started in Standing Rock Reserve, St. Elizabeth's, was kept in session throughout the dangerous times, although it was forty miles from the nearest white men and only twenty-five miles from Sitting Bull's camp. For this school scholarships of sixty dollars are earnestly asked for in order to support its useful work.

The field for Indian work in Alaska is very large, and a new missionary, Rev. Jules L. Prevost, has lately been sent out by the Board. We have also a new direction for our efforts in the mission about to be established among the Navajoes in Arizona and New Mexico, so that there are great opportunities for us in the coming year.

We owe our thanks to Mr. Frank McDowell for the paper for the report, and to the Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity for the use of the rooms for meeting, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad for transportation of boxes to Chicago.

The following extract from Mr. Herbert Welsh's article in *Scribner's Magazine* for April, 1891, seems fitly to close our report :

"No more abundant results have been obtained in building up the party of Christianity and civilization among the Sioux than have rewarded the long labors of Bishop Hare and the little band of earnest workers who, for a period of more than seventeen years, have labored under his direction, and who now have their boarding-schools and mission chapels scattered over every part of the Sioux Reserve. At this date from 7000 to 8000 among the people are counted as attendants upon the Episcopal Church. There are 1700 communicants, 40 native catechists and 9 native ministers, 40 branches of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions. Among Indians of this denomination alone, during the past year, about \$3000 has been raised for religious purposes."

With these encouraging results before us as we look over the work of years, we submit our Twenty-fifth Annual Report.

SEVENTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch
OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY
TO THE
BOARD OF MISSIONS.

We do deplore sending our Report to the printer with several Parishes not heard from, but it is our misfortune not our fault. It certainly is their right to be properly reported, but their Secretaries must see to it that they be not neglected; we are as anxious as they can be that, they have justice done them, but we cannot make their reports. The rule ought to be an invariable one, that as soon as the season's work is ended a full report should be sent to the President.

Although no Diocesan organization of the Junior Branch of the Auxiliary has as yet been established, the number of Parishes increases where the blessed work of interesting the young goes on. I wish that each Parish had its Junior Branch; wherever there is one we hear only of gratifying success in interesting young hearts, that are so impressible, that it seems sad indeed to allow them to grow older and become callous to such vital interests as the Missionary cause. I am most happy to append the reports from the Junior

Branches, that have reached me, although I am painfully sensible that they are, perhaps, not a tithe of the Parishes at work.

The review of the departed year of our work, and its record for us, is what we must apply ourselves to give to you to-day. We have added new Parish Branches to our growing list, for which we are very grateful; our meetings have been interesting and well attended. We have sent away 159 boxes, the value of 154 of which is estimated at \$15,318.80. Our Treasurer shows that \$1432.04 has passed through her hands, and \$1741.28 has been sent direct by the Parish Treasurers to the various objects designated, and the Junior Auxiliary reports 11 boxes, valued at \$334.50. Their gifts in money have been generous, but have gone into the hands of the Diocesan Treasurer, and cannot, therefore, be repeated here. Our total showing for the year is, in money and boxes, \$18,786.62. We must not be disappointed to fall below our last year's record. The tremendous calamity at Johnstown called forth unprecedented gifts, which largely swelled our receipts. We do not regard the falling off as any unfavorable symptom, nor as showing any decreased interest in the cause so dear to us all.

I note once more, and with sincere satisfaction, that the Matron's salary at the Good Samaritan Hospital, at Portland, Oreg., has been paid, and I beg that the faithful Parishes who for so many years have been helping to provide for the care of the sick and suffering, nearly three thousand miles away, will accept my personal thanks as well as the gratitude of the good Bishop of Oregon, who never fails to send us very touching expressions of it.

Very many appeals for the aid of this Committee have been presented at its meetings during the season, and most generous has been the response to them. I am proud to say that an old-time custom among the delegates, of absenting themselves from the meetings, because their Parishes "did not want letters," is entirely abolished, and that we have become as helpful a body, in the matter of gifts in money, as if we sent no boxes at all.

Again, I venture to call your attention to the Enrolment Fund. Only fifteen months remain in which to collect the \$850,000 required to complete the million, so urgently needed in all of our Missionary fields. In order to secure in Pennsylvania a full quota of her share of this sum, without impairing our ability to give also in other directions, I applied to the Board of Missions for one thousand Mite Chests for distribution, all of which, I am thankful to state, have been taken by the faithful. When we consider that one cent daily deposited, with a trifling additional offering at Christmas and Easter, would bring a gift of five dollars from each by September, 1892, and that the communicant roll of our beloved Church is more than half a million of souls, I refuse to entertain for a moment the idea of failure in so grand a scheme. In Philadelphia there ought to be a real enthusiasm in the effort to honor the memory of the good man who proposed the plan, and who was one of our best citizens. I hope that every member of this Committee will count it a duty, as well as a great pleasure, to aid in the matter in every way in her power. It has always seemed remarkable to me that there has been such halting and delay in raising this million of dollars, and I fear that much of the difficulty in the way of it lies in our disregard of trifles. We fail to remember their mighty import, and so we go on careless of small sums, and thus heedless of the mighty impulse that this goodly one would give in every part of the Missionary field.

It is, however, most encouraging to note how the work grows at every point, but let us not forget that this only increases the demands upon the Board of Missions, who must look to us all to help to supply them.

Once more, forgetting those things that are behind us, let us press forward in our blessed work, eager and earnest, as Patriots as well as Churchwomen.

Thanking most gratefully the noble band of helpers that has worked in this Committee, I respectfully submit the Seventeenth Annual Report.

Report of Foreign Committee

OF THE

PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

1890-91.

The Foreign Committee in presenting its Report for the past year has cause for thankfulness in the increased number of delegates, seven having become members from Parishes not before represented. If each Rector would take a deep interest in Missions, and appoint representatives to the different branches, how much work could be accomplished.

Regular monthly meetings have been held, and many interesting reports have been read. Miss Sybil Carter has been present twice, and spoken at the meetings; she always touches upon the subject of the Enrollment Fund, as the Board of Missions has entrusted it to her, and it certainly applies to all branches of the Auxiliary. This matter should be more seriously and heartily taken up, so that the sum of \$1,000,000 may be ready for presentation at the next meeting of the General Convention. Miss Carter spoke at length, and gave most interesting accounts of the work in China and Japan, and were the offerings from Parishes and individuals equal to the needs, what results under God's guidance would be shown! Letters from Mexico and Cuba have been read, also one from Mrs. Brierley, Cape Mount, Africa. Rev. Dr. Neilson was present at one meeting and gave a most interesting account of

the Church and condition of the people in Cuba, where he had been visiting for several months. The cry for help comes over the sea, men and women are ready to go to teach the heathen and ignorant ones, but the lack of funds in the treasury of the Board of Missions prevents.

All scholarships pledged by our branch of the Auxiliary have been renewed and paid, also Miss Mailes' salary. Additional sums have been sent to China, and two boxes of clothing and other things to Africa?

A very interesting letter was read, giving an account of the work in Samoa; truly our lines run out in many directions. Will not all the members of our Committee resolve to work more earnestly in the future by prayers, alms and increased interest, generally, in the Foreign work.

Missionary meetings have been held in country Parishes, several uniting together, when addresses were made and Mission work fully discussed.

We have to record the death of Miss Spencer, one of our most faithful teachers in China; she was soon to have returned to that country, but has been called to her rest in Paradise.

Five Junior branches of the Auxiliary have been formed in several Parishes, one meeting was held in Holy Trinity Church, Philadelphia, also one in the Church of Our Saviour, West Philadelphia, which was attended by 800 children, and was most enthusiastic; another was held at St. Philip's Church. A scholarship in Mrs. Brierley's school, Cape Mount, Africa, is supported by the Junior Auxiliary, All Saints' Church, Lower Dublin, Torresdale; this branch sends a delegate to our Foreign Committee.

Contributions in money for the past year have amounted to \$2757.08; \$428 of this came through Bishop Whitaker from a friend. Rev. Mr. Gringe addressed the meeting in May, giving a very graphic account of his work, and his impressions of the condition of the people and the Church in Japan. Mr. Gringe expects to return to Japan in October next.

The amount contributed by the Sunday School children through their Lenten offering is \$41,242.73, and not all Parishes heard from at the time of writing this Report. Our

own Diocese has done better than ever before, the whole amount being \$10,698. Many of the new Western Dioceses gave in a very large proportion.

The whole amount would have reached \$50,000 had all the Parishes given their entire Lenten collection as in former years, but certain sums have been sent in other directions, and therefore cannot be counted in the Lenten offering from Sunday Schools.

There is a story told of Hannibal, that once when he had led his men to a high ridge of the Alps and they began to murmur, and desired to be reconducted home, the brave general, standing on an eminence, waved his hand, and looking down on the plains of Piedmont below, said, "Behold these fruitful vineyards and luxurious fields, a few more struggles, and they are all yours." These inspiring words had the desired effect. Can we not apply them to ourselves? The fields at Christ's feet are luxuriant, a few more struggles on our part, even though we meet with discouragements, and they are won for Christ. Let each one resolve to work with renewed interest. At the last meeting of our Board for the season, a very small deficit towards paying all our pledges was found, but it will be made up before this Report goes into print. Our receipts are larger than last year, but nearly all our scholarships have been raised in value, some five dollars, some ten, one, the Annie J. Rumney Scholarship, is increased to \$100. So in the face of all this, we can thank God and take courage.

Report of the Freedmen's Committee

OF THE

PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH of the WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

JUNE 1, 1891.

The work of the Freedmen's Committee has gone quietly on, and we trust that it is increasing in usefulness as it is steadily increasing in numbers.

One is inclined always to wish that more might be done, and to feel that the results accomplished are not in proportion to the numbers represented on our Board.

We would therefore plead for a larger amount of personal interest on the part of the Committee.

We know from grateful letters received in response to boxes and money sent out in aid of schools, hospitals and hard-working missionaries all over the country, that much good is done. Our work, however, is limited by the benefactions of the people of our Parishes, and we therefore appeal to them for greater help.

The most interesting feature of the colored work just now is the continued growth of Church schools, and the increasing demand for industrial departments connected with them. Nearly every missionary writes of his anxious desire for funds to start such schools, or of the satisfactory results where already established.

These manual training schools are of the utmost importance, giving the boys a trade by which they can become honest, self-supporting citizens, and teaching the girls sewing, cooking and house work, of which things they are wholly ignorant. Let the few who are capable of it go forward to a higher education and become the teachers of their race; but for the many thousands who are mentally unfitted for anything beyond a primary education this training on mechanical and homely lines is a necessity; and for all is needed the teaching of the Church.

A faithful priest who has been devoting himself to educational work in Tennessee writes:

"We shall have to ask help from outside, but I have great faith that the Church will not let so necessary a work go down for lack of support.

"Now, at last, the Church seems alive to the responsibility (none greater upon any other religious body, I do firmly believe), and she begins, though not as we hope to see her doing, to realize her fitness for this great task of training and evangelizing the negroes of the South. In this work we must begin with the children. My older friends among the colored people say: 'We know the Church can take our children and do for them what nobody else can do, and we want Church schools.'

"We must not, if we are true to what God has manifestly set before us, leave these colored people to the vague and often unholy teachings of guides unfit to lead them.

"If the people in the North will only realize the necessity of the work we have to do in the South, that 8,000,000 souls are as yet largely left to imperfect or false systems of religion; and if they will be very generous with their gifts, we shall be enabled to go forward."

This very important branch of Missionary work is again earnestly commended to the thoughtful attention of Churchmen.
