# Indians' Hope Association.

TWENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL

## REPORT.

---

The Report of the Indians' Hope Association for the year 1891-92 is not marked by any special feature worthy of note, but the work has nevertheless been steadily carried on in its usual field of sending boxes, collecting funds and supplying any immediate demands upon it.

It is not the less important, however, that we should know what has been accomplished in the field at large, and our report is based upon facts published in the recent Report of the Indian Commissioners, which takes a most comprehensive view of the question.

In no year have we had occasion to record so important an advance in the administration of Indian affairs as in the year 1891-92. The President of the United States has extended the laws of civil service reform to over 600 employes of the Indian service whose appointment and permanency will no longer be affected by political influences. Congress has also increased the appropriations for the education of Indians. It is now an accepted fact that education and Christian training make the Indian peaceable and loyal. The appropriations for school purposes for the year ending June 30, 1891, were \$1,842,770, and for the current year the amount appropriated is \$2,291,650. If Congress will increase the appropriation at this ratio for the next three years, we may hope to see every Indian child of school age in a Government school.

Missionary effort has no doubt done a noble and beautiful work among the Indians, but we cannot but realize that law and equity should be the basis of all our dealings with them, and that the time has come for every individual to make his



influence felt in that direction. Unless we as a nation give them equal laws, rights and education we cannot expect the proper results.

It is surprising and encouraging that in spite of the Sioux outbreak, which was so demoralizing to the heathen Indians, the attendance at the boarding schools has been larger than ever before, and we must feel that we cannot do too much in furthering this great work of education.

During the year from May, 1891, to May, 1892, \$5678.21 have been given in money and boxes to the Indian work through our Association.

We regret to report again the enforced absence of Bishop Hare, but we have endeavored to work according to his wishes and instructions. We trust that he will avail himself of the three months' holiday which has been urged upon him by the Board of Missions.

It is with deep regret that we report the deaths of the Rev. Charles S. Cook and the Rev. George Pay Pay, at Pine Ridge, S. Dak.

Mr. Cook was a shining example among the native ministry. A leader of men, his words and his life were an influence for righteousness. Although his labors were ended so soon, the influence of his life and character will live on and will encourage us in our efforts to help his people.

We owe our thanks to Mr. Frank McDowell for the paper for the report, and to the Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity for the use of the rooms for meeting, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad for transportation of boxes so far as Chicago.

Looking over the advance made within the past year, we may confidently look forward to increased activity in the future, knowing that in this transition period when the Indians are beset with new duties and difficulties they sorely need all the moral and Christian instruction we can give them.

"No part of our people or of any people represent a more hopeful field for earnest Missionary work."

We find that 18 packages and 142 boxes, valued at \$16,466.33, have been sent. The Treasurer's report shows receipts of \$1940.52, and \$1325.95 has been sent direct by parish Treasurers, and in money and boxes the Junior Auxiliary has contributed \$236, making a grand total of \$19,967.80, and this being an advance over last year's report of nearly \$2000, is very encouraging to note, and should quicken our zeal that we may keep pace with such improvements for our next report.

It, however, pleases me much more to tell, that in addition to our fine boxes, we have, in a great many instances, contributed money when it was much needed. It must always be the privilege of this favored branch of the Auxiliary, to receive many appeals, that are sent to headquarters for aid of



this kind, and it is truly delightful to find how gladly the needs are supplied, and what a variety of cases are aided.

Our annual meeting in November at the Church of the Epiphany was larger than any one we have ever had, and was of unusual interest. Our own Committee was favored by having Dr. Langford and the Bishop of Utah and Nevada, who forcibly portrayed some of the grand opportunities given to us in our own dear land. The special meeting held in April, under the auspices of the Woman's Auxiliary at the Church of the Holy Trinity, was even larger than the annual one, and was a unique occasion in every respect, and a season of deep interest and refreshment, to all who love the cause of missions. It was a source of deep gratification to me to find, on both occasions, my own dear Committee so largely represented, and I hope that no member of it will ever absent herself from a missionary meeting except for grave and serious hindrances. "The King's business requires haste." Let us never forget it. We have been favored during the year, with two visits from Bishop Talbot. His hearty zeal and unwavering cheerfulness always seem to us a rebuke to indifference or despondency. One of our delegates remarked, after one of his stirring hopeful addresses, that "it was like a tonic." We all need to cultivate a spirit like his.

Among the objects to which we have sent our gifts in money may be named: First, the matron's salary in the Good Samaritan Hospital, at Portland, Oreg. This sum of \$250 seems to yield great help and comfort to good Bishop Morris, who, being now a Diocesan, fails to receive much sympathy and aid that is given to Missionary Bishops in name. It has also been our great privilege to help several of them. To Bishop Talbot have been given various sums of money besides what our Treasurer's report will show. Some of it has been specified as to its use, and some to be used at his discretion.

In response to Bishop Graves' appeal for aid in furnishing his school at Kearney, Neb., a good deal of money has been sent, besides the boxes of household articles. We have also been so fortunate as to secure at least part of a scholarship in St. Mary's School at Dallas, Tex. This will carry



cheer to Bishop Garrett, and help him to take into the school the daughter of a missionary, who would otherwise be doomed to the poor opportunities Northern Texas affords for education, and training in a pure Christian faith. We have obtained several scholarships in a day school at Vancouver, Wash., in charge of one of our missionaries, where for so small a sum annually as \$30, so vast a good as education under Christian influences for a girl can be obtained. We have not forgotten our small pledge of \$25 annually to the Valley Mission, near Columbia, S. C., where a good work is being carried on. Contributions have also been sent towards building a rectory at Rockport, Tex.; towards an altar and reading desk for the chapel of Wilder Farm School, Minn.; towards an altar for the church at Edwardsville, Ill.; for the same in St. Thomas's Church, Rawlins, Wyo.; for covering Trinity Church doors at Pierre, S. D.; contributions towards the purchase of a box of books were received, and sent to a poor rector who had lost all of his by fire. By the generosity of one member of this Committee a gift of \$100 was sent to the missionary at Guthrie, Oklahoma, for the purchase of building sites for churches and church institutions, and a cheque of \$100 for the Enrolment Fund as an inspiration from our great afternoon missionary meeting, came to me, as one of the glad surprises, that come only too-seldom. I have only reviewed our list and given you a record of the chief objects of your benefactions, and I have done so, that it may be a stimulus for greater work in this direction.

The box work, pure and simple, goes bravely on, and there *are* no better boxes than those sent from Pennsylvania. It needs no words of mine to encourage the workers to continue in this labor of love, but to give the money, without first having the satisfaction to spend it, is something that needs all the inspiration we can get.

I hope that I shall have a large increase to report when the contents of the Enrolment Fund Mite Chests are given to us, and I trust as long as this fund remains an object for contributions that we shall never forget it. A proposition will be submitted to the Board of Missions in October, to use the in-



terest of the fund in hand, for the salaries of new Missionary Bishops, and if this be agreed upon, no one can refuse to go on with the work, until we have collected the million dollars

I have only to add my own grateful acknowledgment to every member of the Committee, for helpfulness and cheer, and to pray the Great Head of the Church that we all may abound more and more in every good work.

Report of Foreign Committee  
OF THE  
PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

1891-92

---

In making a formal statement each year of the work of this Committee, there must of necessity be a considerable sameness in the record.

Each year we collect as much money as possible, and for the same objects, namely : the support of missionaries and the insurances on their lives, the building of churches and hospitals, the general support of schools and orphanages, the stipends of Bible women, and the payment of the scholarships to which we are pledged.

Each year we obtain as much knowledge as possible respecting the objects for which we are working, by having present at our monthly meeting such missionaries from the foreign field as may be temporarily near us, and by having letters read at the meetings which have been written by missionaries abroad.

Each year the missionaries and their work are brought before the Church at a combined annual meeting. We, with



the three other committees, undertake this, that we may afford an opportunity, of which there are none too many, of extending information in regard to this great work of the Church.

Each year we make an effort to increase the number of our delegates, and to secure their attendance at the monthly meetings as frequently as possible.

This year money has been sent to Africa, China, Japan, Mexico, Brazil and Syria. The sum contributed falls short of that contributed last year, being \$2445.66, but the deficiency is more than accounted for by the fact that last year a gift of \$428 from another source was passed over to us.

The departures this year from our usual contributions are, a donation of \$100 (given by one person) towards the theological library in Tokyo; and the support for five months in this country of a missionary's wife who was studying the kindergarten system in order to be able to teach on her return to Africa; whose return passage we also paid in great part.

Three "foreign boxes" have been packed and forwarded. These do not include such as have been sent singly from parishes. The value of the three boxes was \$81.

The Junior Auxiliary of the Church of the Redeemer, Bryn Mawr, has contributed both in money and clothing, and seldom fails to have a delegate present at the meetings.

Eleven new members have come into the committee; nine members have resigned; and one, who never failed in faithfulness to the work, has passed away—Miss Florence Landell—for a time the Secretary, and until her death an active member.

At our monthly meetings we have twice had an address: in October from the Rev. Pedro Duarte, of Cuba; and in March from the Rev. Sidney C. Partridge, whom we have to thank for a most interesting and comprehensive account of the work in China.

The annual meeting was held on the 12th of November, at the Church of the Epiphany. No pains were spared to make it successful. In March it was decided by the four Committees that a second general meeting should be held; and as



missionaries from the West and South, as well as from abroad, were within call, it was arranged to have it take place without loss of time, and at the Church of the Holy Trinity. The result was an equally large gathering with the first—proof that the earnest and powerful words spoken on these occasions are welcomed and appreciated.

And so we close the report of a work which may seem small. It is small, we are glad to say, compared with the whole that is being done; very small compared with what ought to be done, but large, if we are doing all that we can.

Report of the Freedmen's Committee

OF THE

PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH of the WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

JUNE 1, 1892.

---

The Freedmen's Committee is glad to be able to report an increasing number of Parishes represented and greater interest in the work as manifested by a larger attendance of delegates at the monthly meetings. As an offset to this we regret to say the Treasurer's Report shows that contributions, both in money and boxes, have fallen below the standard of previous years.

It is difficult to assign a cause for this; certainly it is not that appeals for help have grown fewer, on the contrary, they become more numerous and more importunate every day; possibly our delegates forget that it is part of their duty to awaken an interest in the work in the members of the congregations which they represent?

However this may be, we would beg all Churchmen to give more thought and attention to the cause of the Freedmen. There is nothing romantic about it; it seems in fact not only to fail to enlist the sympathies of many, but to be positively repellent to them. The more, however, the subject is looked into, the more absolute does our duty seem, to do all in our power for this race which is crying out to us for help, for



education—both of the head and the hands—for moral and religious training.

In the matter of industrial education we are happy to say there is a steady advance. Where there are schools of any sort, they are trying to add to them a workshop, a sewing or cooking school. This last department is especially desirable. The colored race has a peculiar aptitude for this art, the old experienced cooks are dying out and the present generation is utterly untrained.

The Rev. Mr. Hunter, of Raleigh, has been fortunate in securing the services of Miss Corson to establish a cooking department in connection with his school of 125 pupils. She has pledged herself to remain, without salary, until she has succeeded in training some thoroughly competent cooks, able to teach the others.

It seems scarcely possible that any would fail to feel an absorbing interest in these people if they could hear the addresses often made at the monthly meetings of the Committee by Missionaries, both white and colored. (These meetings are held in the Parish building of the Church of the Ascension on the last Friday of every month, and are open to all.) They tell us of ignorance, depravity and brutality equal to anything heard of in heathen lands.

The Rev. Mr. Wilmer, of Virginia, says their actual condition is sometimes almost beyond description—much worse than before the War, for then there was some discipline exercised and intercourse with the whites had an elevating effect. Now all restraint is gone, they have mistaken liberty for license, and are materially and morally in a worse condition. There seems to be no connection in their minds between religion and morals, and there is a growing antagonism between whites and blacks. Intellectual and higher education without that of the heart and soul only adds to the difficulties. It is the duty of our Church to give them a religion which shall teach them morality. We have lost a generation and our efforts must begin with the young. The penitentiaries are full of negroes who have been educated by the



public schools; they have to steal from hunger and nakedness, because they do not know how to work.

Archdeacon Joyner, of South Carolina, who is nobly devoting his life to the Christianizing of these people, and who, having been born and brought up among them, knows their peculiarities, while he speaks with encouragement of what has been done, and with hopefulness of the future, tells the same sad story of their wretched moral condition. He says the few intelligent ones who make their way North are very different from the vast numbers in the out-of-the way places, and gives instances of brutality and want of natural feeling to the point of the most hideous cannibalism and superstition that has caused some of them to follow after a false Christ, and has even led to actual human sacrifice.

And this in the heart of our so-called Christian land! Is it surprising that we feel that the Church must arise in her strength to help these people? There is no escape from the duty, for they are here in our midst, and they need our aid to minister to the sick and suffering, to care for the aged and the orphan, to give to these thousands of children growing up all over the land an education that will make them respectable, law-abiding citizens, able to help themselves—and, above all, the benefits of Christ's religion for this world and the next.
