TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL

REPORT.

Although there is nothing very remarkable in our Report for the year 1892-93, still it is gratifying to know, that the monthly meetings have increased in interest and usefulness. The contributions for this year exceed last year's by \$600, and there are five new parishes represented.

The work of collecting funds and sending boxes has been carried on most faithfully, and we have tried as much as possible to take a wider interest in the field at large and to increase our knowledge concerning it. Especial interest was aroused in the Oneida Indians and there was a most generous response to the appeal in their behalf. There have also been five new scholarships established during the winter.

Politically there has been a great improvement in the last few years. Bringing all the school employés under Civil Service rules is a great step in advance; but a thoroughly efficient service cannot be attained until the appointment of agents is entirely taken out of politics, and fitness made the sole test of appointment. Still there is some hope of improvement even in that department, as the President proposes to appoint Army officers as agents wherever he can do so, which will remove them from the sphere of political appointment.

A problem of growing interest and perplexity presents itself in the condition and needs of educated Indians returned

to the reservations. They find no field for their labors, and their surroundings are most discouraging. Is it surprising that under such adverse pressure many return to their old ways? The educated Indian woman especially has a keen capacity for suffering, when, after futile efforts to keep up, she is finally compelled to adopt the old degraded ways of life. There are of course many who do very well. Two girls who have just returned from the Lincoln Institute are now teaching amongst their people and are very happy and prosperous.

It has been proposed to colonize these educated Indians on a reservation of their own, where they may have a chance of retaining what they have gained.

This is a question of great importance, and unless something be done to assist them, the civilizing of the mass will be most tedious.

The work in the Government schools is better than it has ever been; there has been an increase of 2000 pupils in enrollment and attendance.

The Report of the mission schools has also been excellent.

It was resolved at the last General Convention to decline all Government aid for our mission schools. There falls therefore a double responsibility upon us to aid them as much as possible. The Government schools are doing a noble work, but the practical Christian training which our mission schools impart cannot be overestimated.

We have reached a very serious problem in the Indian question, when we consider the evil effects which the present system of issuing rations has upon them. The extent to which they receive everything they want without any effort on their part, and the pauperizing effect it has upon them, is truly appalling. Let us hope that the allotment of lands in severalty will tend to make them self-supporting.

It may perhaps be interesting to know that since the Allotment bill became a law in 1887, allotments in severalty have been made to 15,482 Indians, and of these 9600 have been completed during the last year. Altogether about 30,000 have become citizens and 50,000 more are now receiving, or will

soon receive, allotments. This gives them at least an opportunity to make for themselves comfortable homes.

It is with deep regret that we report the death of Mrs. C. C. Parker, who was a most faithful and interested worker.

During the year from May, 1892, to May, 1893, \$6176.47 have been given in money and boxes to the Indian work through our Association.

Bishop Hare's presence has been a source of great pleasure and help to us in our work.

We owe our thanks to Mr. Frank McDowell for the paper for the Report, and to the Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity for the use of the rooms for meeting, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad for transportation of boxes so far as Chicago.

Although it is pleasant to look back upon years of labor and their good results, still if our work be truly earnest, "The little done, the undone vast," must inspire us to still greater efforts.

NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Domestic Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch
OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY
TO THE
BOARD OF MISSIONS.

When we parted with words of cheer and gratulation from our last Annual Meeting, and with kindly wishes for the months of summer, not one of us could have dreamed that the fair young Secretary had recorded the minutes of the last meeting she was ever to attend, and that in six brief weeks after, her useful life was to be ended here, and she was to enter into that rest that remaineth to the people of God. I cannot but speak of the solemn warning it is to us all, that like her we may "work while it is yet day, for the night cometh in which no man can work." In this connection let me beg you all to receive my heartfelt thanks for your loving action, both in regard to the Resolutions passed at the first meeting held after her departure, and the more substantial tokens of your appreciation in the scholarship in St. Mary's Institute at Dallas, Texas, bearing her dear name, and the costly memorial altar, to be placed in St. Matthew's Cathedral at Laramie, Wyoming, in memory of her.

The Report that I bring you to-day, fills me with pride and gratitude. The Committee has excelled itself. Two hundred and nine boxes and packages have been sent away—the value of two hundred and three of which only has been reported to

me, and is \$16,464.06 ; the parishes have also sent direct to their beneficiaries the sum of \$1652.16, while our own Treasurer's Report shows that \$6924.44 has passed through her hands, making a total of \$25,040.66. Truly it is encouraging to make in one year an advance of more than \$5000, chiefly in money. If the same spirit had animated the whole Church, we would not have the pain of hearing of the anxieties of the Board of Missions, lest they be not sustained in what they have termed their "audacity of faith" in assuming new responsibilities, and sending into the Domestic Field four new Missionary Bishops, for the support of one of these we are begging to claim the privilege.

Let none of us say that we are overpowered by the demands that aggressive missionary work makes upon us. Think what a blessing and a delight it is that they are so great! It might be that the people would turn a deaf ear, that they would bid the missionaries "to depart out of their coasts." Not so, everywhere God's blessing descends upon the work, the people are liberal to the full measure of their ability. The Church is gladly welcomed, her Bishops are held in the greatest reverence, and all of her clergy are honored. And as to Church unity, it is simply a question, How much *do* we long for it? Every Missionary Bishop tells the same tale, that it is in large measure a question only of which Christian body is the pioneer in a new settlement, to decide what will be its faith. Our Missionary Bishops must be sustained in their work, and it is a delight to find in our Treasurer's Report the names of eight of them who have received aid from this Committee. What Bishop Hare says of the white population in South Dakota is equally true in all the jurisdictions: "They are people who have sought this new land either early in life, before money had been made, or later in life under stress of necessity. Their pecuniary ability is on the whole small, therefore. They are engaged moreover in a desperate effort to subdue wild nature and plant the institutions and business enterprises essential to civilized man. When they have added to their other expenses a levy in behalf of a church, and a subscription towards a clergyman's salary, their generosity has been considerably taxed."

In the same strain writes Bishop Wingfield: "Many of our people arrive poor and have everything to make. . . . We insist upon their helping themselves to the extent of their ability, and we discourage their dependence upon the charity of their brethren, but at the same time, when we do feel the necessity of crying, 'Come over and help us,' we look to the brethren to send us relief, and give us the means wherewith to accomplish our work." Bishop Walker says, "Our wants are the old, old wants—more men, more money, money to build houses for our clergy, money to rear churches, money to help towards the support of my missionaries."

From poor Bishop Brooke, so lately gone to his vast field, where he finds one church edifice, and now, but one priest for a population of 325,000, we hear of his great needs, to supply which he says: "I must ask this money as I can, here and there dollar by dollar. This does not seem to me the best way, but under the circumstances it is the only way. It is the way the Church seems to expect her Missionary Bishops to raise the money they need for such work, and so it is the way I take." Was there ever anything more pathetic?

Dear friends, I give you these little extracts because I think they open a vista that we seldom pause to see, and because they show just how blessed and helpful your gifts and your work are to these poor men.

I must not omit to tell you of the wonderful triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in Baltimore, when the united offering reached so grand a sum that, after the delayed gifts had been received and added to it, its total of \$21,000 had been gathered to add to the Enrolment Fund, besides some gifts for other objects. Pray do not forget this fund; it gives me joy to see contributions to it coming in. Our women never intend to stop until a million dollars is secured.

The object for the next united offering was decided to be the endowment of a missionary jurisdiction. This offering will be made in 1895, and I am quite sure that Pennsylvania will do her duty in helping to raise this \$50,000. At our own Annual Meeting, held last November in the ever-hospitable Parish of Holy Trinity, this Committee was so fortunate as to

have Bishops Garrett and Talbot to present the cause of Domestic Missions. It was at that meeting, and while Dr. Langford was speaking, that the inspiration came to me, to claim for my dear Committee the honor of sending to the Board of Missions, the sum of three thousand dollars, for the salary of one of the new Missionary Bishops. I believe that I have not overrated the ability or the generosity of the Committee. Words fail me to tell of the gratification I have felt at the manner in which this proposition has been received by them; and I thank most warmly all my helpers.

In mid-Lent the Pennsylvania Branch of the Auxiliary held an afternoon meeting, and Bishop Brooke spoke for our cause. Those who braved the severe rain storm were well repaid by the interesting addresses of all the speakers.

Our monthly meetings have been made very delightful by visits from Bishop Morris, Bishop Talbot, Bishop Leonard and the Rev. L. W. Applegate. The news brought fresh from the front always secures an attentive hearing, and many noble gifts have been borne away by the speakers.

The field has become so vast, and the appeals so numerous, and the interest and the enterprises so varied, that we have entirely outgrown the one-hour meetings of former times. We use the utmost dispatch in the transaction of our business, but with the best appliances for rapid transit, we beg that our delegates will give us two hours for each meeting, and if we accomplish our work sooner we will let them depart. We have reached a high mark this year, dear friends; let us see to it that we maintain the standard. I want to thank you all for your unvarying kindness, and also once more for the tender sympathy that I have received so abundantly, and which has made it possible for me to go on with the work so dear to us all. And praying God's abundant blessing on the work and on all the workers, I submit my Annual Report.

Annual Report of the Foreign Committee
OF THE
PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.
1892-93.

In presenting a sketch of the work of the Foreign Committee for the past year, a few encouraging facts may well stand first.

We have between forty and fifty new members, owing to the kind readiness of many of the Rectors to appoint suitable delegates from their parishes. In consequence, the average attendance has been much larger than that of last year; and as one of the results the contributions at the February meeting exceeded those ever before taken for general purposes at any one meeting.

The Executive Committee of the Auxiliary has been most successful in its efforts to have frequent meetings in behalf, not only of the Foreign needs, but also of those of the Indian, Domestic and Freedmen's Missions. Whether the day be one of sunshine or of rain, there need be no fear of an empty house.

The Annual Meeting, held in November, had its usual full attendance. The next meeting was held in January, and

another in March. Finally, in April a special meeting was called that every one might hear the native missionary from China, Mrs. Pott, the first native female missionary of the Church who has ever visited America. A scholarship has been given her for the Baby's Orphanage in Shanghai, by a young girl, who in giving it said only, "A thank-offering for having been born an *American* girl-baby."

Since the Bishop announced in the winter that the Sunday-schools of the Diocese would be considered as branches of the Junior Auxiliary, the effort and the interest in behalf of Foreign work have been wonderfully increased.

Another missionary is soon to come to this country for the first time, Mrs. Brierley, who has already given many years of her life to the missions of Cape Mount, Africa. She has been for the most part alone in her work, and has passed through many severe illnesses, yet has worked on bravely and cheerfully.

But as one comes near to us another goes far away, even to the other world. Mrs. Hooker, so long known as the faithful guardian and friend of orphan girls in the City of Mexico, died in January, after two years of suffering. She continued at her post and worked to the end. We did a little to remove the mortgage on her orphanage, but promises already made had to be preferred. One of these was the raising of a hundred dollars towards the outfit and traveling expenses of Miss McRae, a trained nurse appointed to the hospital at Wuchang, China. Another was to aid Miss Bull in paying the rent of her orphanage in Osaka, Japan. A scholarship has been also undertaken for this orphanage, making the whole number of our Auxiliary Scholarships eighteen.

At the monthly meetings held during the year about twenty letters have been read. Some of the calls for help seemed very urgent, but our means forbade.

Just as the report is about to be closed, the sum for the year is increased by sixteen hundred dollars. It is a gift in accordance with the especially expressed desire of one now gone—Miss Florence Landell, who, as last year's Report mentioned, was at one time the Secretary of the Foreign Commit-

tee. Deeply interested in missions, she did not fail to speak of her wishes in regard to what she had to give, for, though young, she had reason to think that death might come to her suddenly. It did so come. Her family have faithfully carried out her wishes, and the gift is divided among several of our missions.

The addition of this large amount brings the sum total for the year to \$4509.06. The boxes are valued at \$198.05.

With our larger membership, may the interest become so strong that we shall in the future leave undone nothing within our power to push forward the missionary work in foreign lands.

Report of the Freedmen's Committee

OF THE

PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH of the WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

JUNE 1, 1893.

It is with much pleasure that the Freedmen's Committee calls attention to the fact that the Treasurer's Report shows a decided improvement in contributions, both of money and boxes, so that the falling off in this respect we were obliged to deplore last year has been much more than made up—in fact, more has been given than for several previous years. For this we are very thankful, as the needs are always increasing. The very sad report of the Advisory Committee of the Board of Managers, showing that there has been no increase in receipts for Missions to correspond with the additional appropriations of last year, and hence, that there is no margin to justify the increase of appropriations demanded by the growth of the work, makes us more anxious to do our small part.

With regard to contributions, there are one or two points to which we would like to call attention.

Our missionaries find it most difficult to meet their expenses during the first four months of the school year, beginning with September or October. The schools have to be started, teachers engaged, and the work organized without

much cash on hand, and, very frequently, without the slightest idea of what funds they can depend upon to carry them through the year. It would be well, therefore, to send in our contributions as early in the year as possible. Christmas boxes also should be started in good time, as it is a great disappointment if they reach their destination too late, and the articles have to be put away till another season. Also, in making up boxes, it is earnestly asked that equal attention should be given to boys as to girls. The boys, it is said, are often sadly neglected. The chief reason for this no doubt is that girls' clothing is more easily made, and provides work for the guilds and sewing societies of a parish. The missionaries are very grateful for what they do receive, but beg to put in a plea for the boys.

As regards the general work, there are many drawbacks and also many encouragements.

The results of the mission schools are marvelous and a great work can be done for the rising generation. The negroes are a hungry crowd, glad and proud to be taught, not asking, but pleading for more. The most ragged parents will make any sacrifice for the education of their children. One of our missionaries says the deeper he goes into the work the deeper the waters seem to become; the more he does, the more he is asked to do.

The only limit to the work is the lack of men and means. We trust, with God's blessing, these may both come in abundance, and we look with hopefulness to the future.

During the past three years there had been formed, in several parishes in Pennsylvania, small Branches of the Junior Auxiliary, but it was only during the present year that Sunday schools in the Diocese have been organized as Branches of the Junior Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

Early in December, the Bishop invited the Clergy of the Diocese to meet at his house, that he might lay the subject before them, and a goodly number responded to his call.

In January, at the Sunday-school Teachers' Institute, held at Holy Trinity Parish House, the subject of the Junior Auxiliary was ably presented by Miss Julia Emery in the morning session, and by Dr. Langford in the afternoon, and was thoroughly discussed by the Sunday-school teachers and superintendents then gathered together.

It was so favorably received that, before Easter, forty-seven Sunday-schools had organized as Branches of the Junior Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, and at the present time fifty-one Sunday-schools are enrolled.

On April 15, 1893, in the Church of the Holy Trinity, there was a gathering of all the Branches, forty-seven being represented. At this meeting addresses were made by Bishop Whitaker, Dr. McVickar and Dr. Langford, and each Branch presented its Lenten offering for the Board of Missions, which was received by Mr. Crease.

Mr. Orlando Crease, 1347 Spring Garden Street, is Treasurer of the Junior Auxiliary for the Advent and Lenten offerings; Mrs. A. J. D. Dixon, 412 South 22d Street, is Assistant Treasurer for all other moneys, and everything except the Advent and Lenten offerings.
