Report.

The Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary point with pride and thanksgiving to the Reports of the five Committees for the details of the year's work.

\$21,349.03 in money and \$22,120.21 in value of boxes is a good showing for "hard times." God be praised that the hearts of His children have been faithful and generous in days of loss, which yet have been days of greatly increased giving in special lines of charity.

The Executive Committee arranged for the usual missionary meetings during the past year:

On November 16, 1893, when the speakers were Rev. Mr. Chapman, on the Alaska Missions; Bishop Penick, for Freedmen; Bishop Ferguson, for Foreign Missions; Bishop Wells, of Spokane, for Domestic Missions; Rev. Mr. Armstrong, for Indian Missions, and Mr. Herbert Welsh, who "stirred up the willing minds" of all present by an address on the "Missionary Council in Chicago."

The usual afternoon meeting in Epiphany-tide, on behalf of Foreign Missions, was somewhat delayed, owing to illness. At this meeting, held January 31, in the absence of the Bishop of the Diocese, Bishop Hare presided. Addresses were made by Rev. Mr. Sowerby, Rev. Mr. and Miss Carter.

The Lenten Meeting was held on March 8, when the speakers were Rev. Mr. Cole, for Foreign Missions; Bishop Barker,

for Domestic Missions; Bishop Talbot, for Indian Missions; Rev. Mr. Wilmer, for Missions to the Freedmen.

The Committee are very happy in feeling that these meetings have shown an increase in sympathy and interest in the missionary cause, in the number of Parishes represented and persons present.

The Committee are glad of this opportunity to express their gratitude to the Rector and Vestry of Holy Trinity Church, for their unfailing hospitality, and to the choirs who have so kindly provided the music.

The Committee feel that, with God's blessing, their work has contributed and will continue to contribute to the glorious work of speeding the knowledge of "the one true God, and Jesus Christ, whom He hath sent."

Twenty-eighth Annual Report.

In reviewing the work of 1893-94 there is every reason for encouragement and hopefulness. We have had an interesting speaker at almost every meeting, which has been most helpful and instructive. There may have been a slight falling off in the number of boxes sent, but the response to special appeals has been most generous.

In consideration of the universal demand for assistance, we may well be gratified with the amount accomplished.

There was a most generous and spontaneous response to the appeal to raise \$1000 for Bishop Hare for his work. The actual sum raised amounted to \$1700, and was presented to him at Easter, in commemoration of the twenty-first anniversary of his consecration. The Bishop has appropriated \$1000 of this amount to the building of a chapel.

From a recent Report of Bishop Hare's we can get a definite idea of the work accomplished in his field. He has 70 congregations of Indian people, 40 Church buildings, 30 chapels, 5 boarding schools and 2000 communicants, of whom the Bishop confirmed 1000. Thirty years ago, there were about two or three churches, no boarding schools, and not 1000 communicants. This is very positive evidence of the work accomplished. It is also interesting to mention the Dakota Tune Book to which the Association contributed, and which is so great a help and delight to the Dakotas.

Great interest was manifested in the account Archdeacon

Crook gave of several Indian tribes in Bishop Leonard's jurisdiction.

Bishop Leonard has 5000 Indians who have had no Christian training whatever. The Pyntes, a tribe of 2600, have never seen a white clergyman, excepting the Bishop and Arch-deacon. There is a foundation for work among them, as there is an excellent missionary at Wadsworth, only fifteen miles from them, and the new Indian agent and his family are very eager to assist any missionary effort as much as possible. What is needed is money from the East to build churches for these poor people. The Association contributed \$200 for this work.

Politically there has been a great tendency to cut off appropriations for Indian Work.

It was a very promising act when the Secretary of the Interior selected as Superintendent of Indian schools, Dr. Hailman, who stands very high in his profession. The Committee on Indian Appropriations threatened to abolish the office of Superintendent of Schools, and although that plan was frustrated, they diminished his salary so much, that it is almost impossible for any man to accept it on such conditions.* The school appropriations are also much cut down. The statistics show plainly that there is yearly a considerable increase, both in enrollment and attendance at the Government schools, and how is the work to continue and thrive with diminished appropriations? There is even now a threatened decrease of over \$300,000 in the educational department, which will greatly cripple the work.

A great advance has been made in the methods of civilizing the Indians. Nothing can be more valuable than the work done by the field matrons; teaching the women and girls to cook and instructing them in general domestic economy is invaluable. They learn to conduct a neat and comfortable household, which is the basis of true home life. Domestic economy for girls and industrial schools for boys will be the greatest aids to missionary effort.

* The Senate increased this salary, but the fate of the bill is not yet determined.

It must be a fact of particular interest to us, that there are 48 societies of Indian women, branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, and they reported contributions last year to the amount of \$2210. The knowledge that these poor women are actually denying themselves and saving for the general welfare of the Church ought to stimulate us to give of our abundance to the full extent of our ability.

During the year from May, 1893, to May, 1894, \$6617.48 have been given in money and boxes to the Indian work through our Association.

We owe our thanks to Mr. Frank McDowell for the paper for the Reports, and to the Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity for the use of the rooms for meeting, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad for transportation of boxes so far as Chicago.

DOMESTIC COMMITTEE.

Twentieth Annual Report.

We must to-day review a year that has been one of more disaster and financial distress than has perhaps ever been known in our country, and yet it is our happy privilege to say, that the gifts and the work of this Committee have never been surpassed save in last year, when it really surpassed itself. It is with deepest gratitude that I tell you this, for while I suppose, that in none of our cities, has hunger and need been more lavishly relieved than in our own, the instances are rare where the Parish Branches have not worked for missions with so hearty an endeavor as to show that they realized that at whatever self-denial, they must not neglect the far-away missionaries, where closed mines and idle factories and shops made times harder to them and to those in their care than ever before. No grateful acknowledgment of mine is desired by the givers, yet I must make it, for the sake of the cause in which we are all engaged.

We have sent away 217 boxes and packages, valued at \$16,335.79. The branch societies have sent direct to the missionaries and their work \$1528.26, and our Treasurer accounts for \$6647.64, making a total of \$24,511.69.

The Annual Meeting of the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was well attended, and very interesting, but we shall have to look to it that the Annual Meetings of the Junior Auxiliary do not exceed ours in numbers. I wish that every delegate would make it a matter of personal interest and duty not only to come to these meetings herself, but to

try to bring, or induce to come to them, as many members of our Parish as possible.

The Pennsylvania Branch ought to fill to overflowing, at its Annual Meeting, the largest of our churches. I am always thankful to see such a large proportion of the members of my dear Committee, but I want to see them all. Bishop Wells, from the missionary jurisdiction of Spokane, was the speaker for our work, and how well he secured the interest of all who heard him, our Treasurer's Report will tell, as it shows that he has received more than \$2700. One good woman sent the checque that bought a \$1500 Congregational place of worship at Dayton, Washington, that was offered to the Bishop, and thus it became Grace Church. One of our own delegates sent another checque, that enabled a needy mission in East Spokane to have its own church; it is called St. Peter's. By far the most gratifying event of the year, is the large gift of \$1375 solicited and sent to St. Mary's, Spokane, the Bishop's School for girls, that was in urgent need of funds for enlargement. I am most grateful to the good delegate, that undertook this self-imposed duty, at a time when otherwise it must have been left undone, and I pray God that her reward may come in the rich harvest of earnest Christian women that such a school is certain to train.

Our Mid-lent Meeting was a fine one, and many of us saw for the first time Bishop Barker of Western Colorado. His graphic sketch of the needs of Domestic Missions must have deeply impressed all who heard him. It was our regret that he made no special appeal to which we could urge a response.

Our monthly meetings have been well attended and their value enhanced by visits from Bishops Talbot, Leonard, Wells and Gray, so that our interest in various parts of the field has been freshly stirred. Bishop Talbot read to us a letter from a Congregationalist body at Ketchum, Idaho, proposing the purchase of their pretty place of worship on very advantageous terms, and in a few days after I had the pleasure to send him the money from a member of the Woman's Auxiliary. It is now St. Thomas' Church and will be a memorial to Rev. Thomas K. Conrad, D.D. A sum of money towards furnishing it has also been contributed by this Committee. Thus you

see that we have bought three churches during the year and now we have five.

We have once more paid the salary of the Matron of the Good Samaritan Hospital, at Portland, Oregon, which is a help to Bishop Morris that he acknowledges warmly. Some substantial gifts have also been made to St. Luke's Hospital, Denver, in response to an earnest appeal setting forth the severe pressure the times had made on them.

The Church Charities in Olympia have not been forgotten either. This merciful work of the Church to the bodies of men ought to commend itself to us. Bishop Morris has told us that when he was seeking to establish the Hospital at Portland, Oregon, the first on the Pacific coast not Roman Catholic, one of the citizens to whom he applied for aid said, "I did not know that your Church cared for Hospitals at all, I thought that was the business of 'Catholics'" (meaning of Rome). "If that is your idea," said the Bishop, "we will have a Hospital at once," and so he has one, that is a joy and pride to us all, who help him to keep it open.

There is another department of Church work that Rome does not forget, nor should we, and that is the educational. The splendid gifts to St. Mary's, Spokane, and the Memorial scholarship in St. Mary's, Dallas, and some minor sums in scholarships in the jurisdictions of Nevada, Wyoming, and Spokane, are tokens of duty fulfilled in this direction.

Bishop Talbot says, "There is no wiser agency for the extension of the kingdom of God than a Christian school for young women."

Bishop Johnston says, "There is no better way of doing missionary work than by giving these scholarships."

Bishop Graves says, "Some small sums sent me for the purpose have been used as scholarships to the great blessing of a number of pupils."

Bishop Leonard says, "I am more and more impressed with the fact that a good Church school is the best missionary we can put in the field."

Bishop Garrett says, "Whatever opinion may prevail on this subject in the larger cities of the East, there can be no question as to the duty of the Church in the Missionary juris-

dictions. *Here the hope of the Church is in the young.*" If she neglect these her work will bear little fruit, if it do not die out altogether."

I am glad to enforce my views by such testimony from the last Annual Reports of these Bishops. And henceforth I am going to try to secure a Scholarship Fund that shall overflow our pledge for the Memorial one, so that we may help in other places as well, and thus share the blessing of these good men, who are struggling to keep the schools equipped and open. Above all that we may help to supply the means to educate the daughters of our missionaries.

I laid before you last year my plan to pay the salary of one of the four new Missionary Bishops. We chose Bishop Wells. We have since then seen and heard him, and know that "he is the right man in the right place." But alas! we only secured \$1000 instead of \$3000 last year, and it looks as if we shall do no better now. Still I do not give up the hope of obtaining the full sum aimed at, and after all \$1000 is a large sum of money, and it is far better to send it than not to have made the attempt. I most cordially thank my helpers, especially those, whether Parishes or individuals, who have contributed both last season and this. It is a disappointment when we hear that those whom we hoped were to be annual subscribers are not so.

I think the introduction of the little envelopes marked "Woman's Auxiliary" into our Parish societies, and gathering in them small sums from the many, would secure an amount of money that would supply many a need—and I most heartily commend them to your adoption.

Time hastens on, so that when we meet again in October, the triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary will be only one year distant. We must not forget the United Offering to be made then. Mite chests are ready for those who will use them, and to them we look to yield a sum of which Pennsylvania will be proud. We aim to secure \$50,000, and I have no doubt that we shall obtain it.

The opening of the Church Missions House in New York on the first day of the year, the Feast of the Circumcision, I think marks an era in missionary work in our dear Church.

The liberality of New York Churchmen and women mainly secured to us this great gift. It was my privilege to attend the first meeting of Diocesan officers of the Woman's Auxiliary, held within its walls, and the dedication services. It has been the privilege of the Committee to help in the Thank-offering made that day, and so to aid in sending out both of the new missionaries to Alaska, and I feel sure that it will be their pleasure to help annually to send their stipends. The Missions House is a most worthy one for its grand object. I know that it will not fail to impress upon all who see it the majesty of its purpose, and I am sure that we rejoice and give thanks for the happy consummation of the plan.

We too have in prospect the Diocesan House, where rooms will be appropriated to the use of the Woman's Auxiliary. Funds are still needed for it, and I hope that if any of our good women are to be among the contributors, they will make their gifts through the Auxiliary. One Parish reports a donation of \$50.

My report is already too long, but I will not close it without expressing my thanks to the delegates who have so graciously responded to the proposition to extend the time of our meetings so that they cover two hours: the plan has worked like a charm. None of us would be willing to curtail them again. And so with gratitude to our helpers, and to Him who maketh us both to will and to do His work, I close my Report.

FOREIGN COMMITTEE.

Annual Report.

More life and interest than heretofore seems, this year, to pervade our branch of the Foreign Committee. At nearly every meeting, a new delegate, sometimes more than one, voluntarily brought by a member, has been added to our already enlarged membership. Our average attendance has greatly increased, and the seats, full or almost so, are occupied by those who seem to be giving thought and attention to the business of the day. Further information is often sought in regard to statements made from the desk, letters are taken away to be read at Parish meetings, and one member kindly wrote a report of the October meeting for one of the Church papers. Efforts have also been made by delegates from small and feeble parishes to induce them to send a contribution for some particular object. May not all this be the harbinger of something better next year?

As an additional means to the same end, would it not be possible to bring into existence more parish branches of the Auxiliary? There are many parishes here represented in which there exists no missionary society of any kind. The smallest and simplest would be better than none. Letters can always be obtained, and the *Spirit of Missions* and other publications can be relied upon to tell something, at least, about every mission station. The dues paid by the members would be an immediate source of income, while in time, others would open up. Such societies would not only help the Auxiliary, but would be centres of missionary intelligence.

When we have been privileged to hear at our own monthly meetings such missionaries as the Rev. Henry Forrester, Mrs. Brierley, and the Rev. Mr. Tyng, we ought to plan and to work with redoubled activity.

At the October meeting, Mr. Forrester, in a long but highly appreciated address, set forth the exact state of things in Mexico. (The reforming of the Church in that country is the end in view, not the bringing into it of a foreign Church.) His most earnest appeals were for the support of the Orphanage, for the establishment of a much needed boys' school, and a seminary for the education of young men for the ministry.

At the November meeting, Mrs. Brierley spoke at some length of her work in Africa. At the close she asked for means to build an additional room in connection with the school, such a room being greatly needed for the sick. The Committee pledged itself to provide the one hundred and fifty dollars required, which was almost immediately subscribed. At her suggestion the room is to be called "The Philadelphia Room."

In April, the Rev. T. S. Tyng, President of St. Paul's College, Tokyo, Japan, spoke before what was probably the largest number that has ever attended any one of the monthly meetings. His purpose in coming to this country was to obtain funds to rebuild the College. It has been pronounced unsafe, and in its present condition endangers the lives of the inmates. The entire building will cost \$42,500, \$9500 being required to put up one wing. It was well that so many were present to hear his first sentence—"The work of Foreign Missions in Japan will soon be at an end"—with the explanation that the Church in Japan would, probably within ten years, be able to carry on its own missions by its own native clergy, independent of foreigners. These were remarkable and most encouraging words, but that end can only be reached by the thorough education of a native clergy. Mr. Tyng's whole address was full of interest and was most convincing as to the necessity of the work which he has in hand.

At the Annual, the Epiphany and the Lent meetings, the foreign work was represented by Bishop Ferguson, Bishop Hare, Rev. J. Thompson Cole, Rev. Herbert Sowerby, Miss

Carter and the Rev. D. M. Bates. Thus we cannot plead ignorance of any part of the field.

Twenty-two letters have been read during the year, and in response to them, besides money contributed, we have been able to send some of the articles asked for, one being a typewriter, given by one member.

The sum total of the contributions was \$2343.34.

Three boxes have been packed and sent. Their united value was \$170.50. One was from the Auxiliary as a whole, and the others were from individual parishes.

We congratulate the little babies of the Church that by their offering in the mite-boxes, they, the sub-juniors, presented at the Annual Meeting of the Junior Auxiliary, \$18.

FREEDMEN'S COMMITTEE.

Report, 1893-4.

The Committee on Work for Freedmen report that during the past year they have quietly pursued their efforts of trying to gather up the crumbs left over from larger contributions for this work, and making up boxes for the schools, and teachers and missionaries engaged in it.

They have held their regular monthly meetings with a general attendance of between thirty and forty; have listened to letters and appeals received through the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and been addressed from time to time by those who are working in various parts of the field. This has the advantage of exciting personal interest and sympathy, and we wish very much that our meetings could be more largely attended that there might be more familiarity with the actual condition and wants of the colored people. What is out of sight is out of mind. If our Church women could only hear and have brought before them the pitiful and pathetic accounts of the moral and physical destitution of these people, we are sure their hearts would be touched and they would be moved both to give and to work for them in larger measure than they do.

We are glad to report a slight increase in the amount of our money receipts this year over the previous year, but have to note a falling off in the number and value of the boxes contributed. This surprises us, because this is really the primary purpose of the Woman's Auxiliary and there is absolutely no limit to the number of clothes that could be distributed in

this way, and they are the easiest and least expensive boxes to make up, as clothing of the simplest character and of any description can be made use of in the various Freedmen's schools. We should think our delegates might enlist the interest of sewing-schools and guilds in this work as well as the regular ladies' societies. It is a branch which affords a field for the members of the Junior Auxiliary, whose representatives we have been glad to welcome at our meetings.

The needs of the work increase as time goes on, and the fearful increase of crime reported in the Southern States, the natural and inevitable result of the neglect of the religious education and training of the colored people, should stir us all up to renewed efforts to atone for past remissness and do something to stem this tide of wickedness which threatens to assume such terrible proportions. Nothing but the Church of God, with its accompanying agencies of schools, hospitals, asylums and other benevolent institutions, can avail to bring to any people the blessings of peace and righteousness of life. Let us see that we do all we can towards extending that Church among these people who need its instrumentalities so much.

It is hoped that before another year has gone all the Parishes of the Diocese will have a Branch of the Junior Auxiliary connected with them. Believing that we have indeed had God's blessing in the past, we hopefully look to the future.

Amen.

O LORD, who didst come to seek and to save the lost, and to whom all power is given in heaven and earth, hear, we beseech Thee, the prayers of Thy Church for those who, at Thy command, go forth to preach the Gospel to every creature. Amen.

Send to them the light and comfort of Thy Holy Gospel. Bless all the means used to bring them to the knowledge of Thy dear Son, who died for the salvation of all men. Guide with Thy Spirit, guard with Thy power, sustain with Thy love, all those who minister to them in spiritual things, and bear to them the tidings of redemption. Stir up the hearts of all who profess and call themselves Christians to prayer and deeds of mercy for this perishing race. Give to our rulers a sense of honor, truth and justice in all their dealings with them, and fill this whole nation with compassion for this poor and scattered people ; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd. All of which we ask through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
