EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Report.

The Executive Committee has to report three Missionary Meetings held during the year. The first was the annual Meeting, on the morning of November 15, at the Church of the Holy Trinity, when the speakers were Bishop Atwill, Bishop Wells and Bishop Garrett, for the Domestic Committee; the Rev. Mr. Yen, a Chinese Presbyter, Mr. Forrester from Mexico, and Mr. Mellen from Cuba, for the Foreign Committee; Bishop Coleman and Rev. Mr. Duty for the Freedmen's Committee, and Bishop Leonard and Rev. Mr. Prevost from Alaska, for the Indian Committee. The meeting was a large one, and the addresses were listened to with sympathy and attention. The collection amounted to \$340, and later the Rev. Dr. McVickar received \$500 for Alaska and \$200 for Bishop Atwill, from members of Holy Trinity who had been present.

The second was the Epiphany meeting, held as an experiment, in the evening, at St. Luke's Church, Germantown. The addresses from Bishop Hare, Rev. Dr. Kimber and Rev. Dr. McVickar were rather appeals to the consciences of all church people to do their duty to Missions in general, than the usual statement of facts in the Mission fields.

The Lent meeting was held at St. James' Church, in the afternoon, and the addresses were made by Bishop Brewer; for Domestic Missions; Rev. Mr. Hunter from St. Augustine's, School, Raleigh, North Carolina, on behalf of his work there;

the Rev. Sherman Coolidge, a Shoshone clergyman, on his work among the Indians, and Mr. Sugira, a Japanese student.

The Committee has decided to set fixed days for these Missionary meetings hereafter, as printed below,* only to be changed to suit the convenience of important speakers.

The Committee begs to draw attention to the following Reports of the different Branches, and to urge earnest coöperation, by work, gifts, and, most important of all, by prayer, for the spread of our Master's Kingdom.

Twenty-ninth Annual Report.

It is with a feeling of great satisfaction that we can look upon the work of the past year. The meetings have been well attended and full of interest. The letters from the Rev. A. B. Clark and his wife, in acknowledgment of the boxes sent to Rosebud, show that the articles received, whether clothing or toys, were most suitable and abundant. In addition to our usual contributions to the Board of Missions, the response to the numerous special appeals has been most generous. The total sum given for specials amounts to almost \$1000. The most important of these are \$197.18 for Mr. Roberts' school in Bishop Talbot's jurisdiction; \$120 towards the gift to the Rev. Mr. Cook, to be given to him on the 9th of May, when he completed the twenty-fifth year of his missionary work among the Yanktons; \$77 for the windmill at St. Elizabeth School; \$100 for the Seminoles in Florida; and \$100 toward fire escapes and water works at St. Mary's School. The number and value of boxes sent this year far exceeds those of any previous year. Whereas, last year we sent 28 boxes valued at \$1715.05, we have sent this year 33 boxes valued at \$2212.38.

Most interesting was the account Miss Ives gave while on her visit here of her life at St. Mary's School, Rosebud, which presented a most comprehensive idea of the work and its results. According to Miss Ives' statement, it is far easier to manage forty Indian children than an equal number of our own. She reports that the average result in the cases of girls

who have returned to their homes or are married is most satisfactory.

Bishop Hare says that the general progress in his field is very encouraging; the schools are better attended than ever before. St. John's School is doing particularly well. The Bishop speaks of St. Elizabeth's School and the entire Station at Pine Ridge as a great success. It was pleasant to hear his account of the church at the lower Brules, built with the money given to the Bishop by the Association a year ago; it is beautiful and commodious, and in constant use.

It is with equal interest that we turn from the work of the Association to the work in the field at large. Although the appropriation for the Government schools has been diminished, the attendance and enrollment has increased. A strong disposition has been manifested to withdraw all Government aid from contract or mission schools; our Church mission schools refuse all Government aid, and are entirely dependent for support upon the Church. If the Government, by larger appropriations, will provide facilities for the secular education of all Indian children, the religious bodies can devote all their resources to direct missionary work. It is most important that the work of the mission schools shall be continued, though Government aid be withheld, as the most pressing need of the Indian at present is instruction in Christian truth and morals.

A very great improvement has taken place in the entire Indian School System, through the earnest care exercised by Superintendent Hailman and the Civil Service Commission in the examination of applicants for positions in this service. It is a splendid thing that the Hon. Secretary of the Interior can say, "I believe it is possible to develop a competent, permanent and non-partisan Indian Service, and I hope before the end of another year that such progress will have been made in this direction that its realization will be assured."

The Secretary also recommended a larger appropriation for field matrons, which Congress did not heed. No branch of Indian education is more important than this house-to-house visitation and instruction of the Indian women in the arts of domestic economy. Miss Sibyl Carter, with her vast experi-

ence, says of the Indians, "Though they seem lazy, it is not laziness, but idleness that is the trouble, and there is a big difference between the two." It is well for them to take up land, but they cannot all be farmers, so she decided to teach them some handiwork and pay them wages. She began with the mothers, and now she has women over seventy who make beautiful lace. She says her special duty is to clean up the homes and form an industrial community, so that when the girls come back from the Eastern Schools they will have something to do and find pleasant homes. The small amount, \$20,000, asked for by the Department would support twenty such women in the field, and the results of their labors would be the backbone of all the missionary and educational work which is now being carried on.

During the year from May, 1894, to May, 1895, \$5161.75 have been given in money and boxes to the Indian work through our Association.

We owe our thanks to Mr. Frank McDowell for the paper for the Reports, and to the Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity for the use of the rooms for meeting, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad for transportation of boxes so far as Chicago.

DOMESTIC COMMITTEE.

Twenty-first Annual Report.

That "past labors are pleasant" never seems so true, as when I come to review the season's work of my dear Committee, that I may say it before its members. There is one side of it, however, that I can never tell, and that none of us can fully realize, and that is the amount of comfort, encouragement, and cheer that your benefactions have carried to scores of desolate hearts and homes, where but for it, sadness and need would still remain. I am sure that every detail of the fatigue and weariness of the labor, though it "proceedeth of love," is forgotten, as we think of its results; and that we heartily thank God, that He permits us to be fellow-laborers with Him, in thus helping on the coming of that kingdom for which we daily pray.

Our list of boxes numbers 206, valued at \$15,944.58; the branch societies have themselves dispensed \$1618.18, and the Treasurer has received \$4153.29, making a grand total of \$21,716.05.

We must not be disappointed that this sum falls short of last year's, when an urgent case inspired one of our good delegates to use special efforts to meet it, and \$1175 was thus handed to our Treasurer; while another of our liberal-hearted delegates gave \$1000 for the same object.

Besides the many well-filled boxes that have gone forth on their errands of mercy, our money pledges have all been met. The salary of the Matron in the Good Samaritan Hospital, at Portland, Oreg., has been sent, to the great comfort of good

Bishop Morris, in these stringent times. The Sarah Neilson In Memoriam Scholarship has been paid, and thus, while keeping before us a beloved name, we are conferring the priceless boon of a thoroughly good Christian education on the daughter of a faithful missionary, himself now stricken with serious illness. My hope of an overflow of the needful sum for this Scholarship has not, this year, been realized, but it will not forsake me, and perhaps at some future time we may be caring for more than one poor girl, who must otherwise be neglected, while her father serves the Church in some distant mission, where no educational advantages exist. We have again helped in the Mission for the poor whites, near Columbia, S. C. The sum sent is a very small one, but we receive most bountiful gratitude for it. Many gifts to the Missionary Bishops have been made. I always long to see in our Treasurer's list the name of each one of them, their needs are so pressing. I am grateful, too, to find the names of Diocesans among those we have helped. One of them, whom I met this last spring, seemed astonished that an officer of the Woman's Auxiliary had an ear for any but Missionary Bishops. Pray remember the poor Diocesans. To my mind the crowning glory of this Committee is the effort to pay the salary of Bishop Wells; this brings us at once in touch with the Board of Missions, and makes us truly an auxiliary to it. For two years we have sent one thousand dollars for it. We always wish that it were the whole three thousand, and now you will learn with pleasure, that we have well entered upon the second thousand, which in another year I hope will be complete. I thank you warmly for seconding this project. I am well convinced that there are few Parishes that could not join us in this effort, and send annually thirty dollars, if some plan of systematic offerings were adopted in them, and once more I beg for it. The great crisis of the Board at this moment warns us that, above all else, it must not lack money for salaries. Would that all, instead of only one-half of our Parishes, were its helpers! Perhaps the women may have the joy of bringing new contributing Parishes into line.

At our annual meeting, held in November, in Holy Trinity Church, the field of Domestic Missions was presented by

Bishop Wells, of Spokane, and Bishop Atwill, of the new Diocese of West Missouri, while Bishop Garrett, of Northern Texas, eloquently pleaded the cause of Christian education. Although Bishop Atwill is not a Missionary Bishop in name, his large and weak Diocese is filled with needy Missions, and it gives me pleasure to tell you that he created such an interest in his work as to carry home with him from Philadelphia \$958.30, of which sum, however, the merest fraction can find mention in our Report, as that only was given through us. The same may be said of large gifts from our good women, made to the various Missionary Bishops, as from time to time they come among us. I know how pleasant it must be for the donors to place their gifts in the hands of those they are helping, but indeed it is also very pleasant to us, to be able to add the sum to our Report as well.

The Mid-Lent meeting held in St. James' Church was a fine one. Bishop Brewer, of Montana, was our chosen speaker. He had been often invited before, but we had not been so fortunate as to secure him. His honest words delighted all who heard him.

Our monthly meetings have been favored by visits from Bishops Leonard, Talbot and Graves, and the Rev. L. B. Ridgely, of Salt Lake City. The voice of the Missionary fresh from the field creates an interest that nothing else can do. And many are the substantial tokens of this, that are carried away by our speakers, several of whom have told me that they would far rather come to our monthly meetings, than address our annual one. I would like to plead for those who have not been among us. "Out of sight" is too often "out of mind," and this is why so many of our Missionary Bishops are forced to pass so much of their time in what Bishop Garrett calls "mendicant peregrinations," their only other alternative being to have the wheels of all progress stop for lack of motive power, and in some cases the work would perish.

Dear friends, we ought to keep ourselves informed of the needs of all the jurisdictions, and if we know them, they will be far more likely to be supplied. Read the Annual Reports of the Missionary Bishops, read the *Spirit of Missions*, and your hearts will burn within you, as you read the pathetic

appeals and see the opportunities awaiting us on every side. During the past season we have been *afflicted* with four stormy Tuesdays. On two of them the snow was blinding, and many a car blockade was in the streets, and the rain was as determined on the other two days. Of course this affected the size of the meetings, but not their enthusiasm. On one of the most inclement days, I could scarcely believe my eyes, to see that thirty-eight good women, having braved the storm, were in their places. "The King's business requires haste," they thought, so they would not suffer themselves to be detained. It is most encouraging to see such zeal. And I know that it was not lacking in many who were not strong enough to venture from home, and so were unwillingly deprived of the pleasure of the meetings which I am sure we all enjoy.

The Church House of the Diocese of Pennsylvania will soon be finished. A considerable sum however is yet required for it. I have from time to time appealed to the Committee for help towards it, but without much success. I am proud to say that very large gifts have been made to it by some of our delegates, and I know too that individuals have been pretty generally sought and subscriptions obtained, so that I do not attribute my lack of success to apathy, or unwillingness to help. The ample provision that has been made in it for a home for this branch of the Woman's Auxiliary would seem to warrant the Building Committee to expect from us good proof of interest in the work which they fear must stop unless more money is forthcoming. When the time to furnish the rooms of the Woman's Auxiliary comes, I know that this Committee will be outdone by no other in its contributions.

It may be that the generous and hospitable provision that this noble Parish has made for us, is the cause of indifference to move to other quarters.

The time to present the triennial united offering of the Woman's Auxiliary will soon be here; before the next meeting of this Committee it will have been done. I do not know how heartily we are working for it. I am told that no large sum is in the hands of our Diocesan Treasurer, but I will not believe myself mistaken in the women of Pennsylvania. So far the mite chests seem to have been gathering all the gifts;

they are invaluable to those of us who can make no large offering at one time, but there are at most only a few hundred of them at work, and there are thousands of good women who do not want the care of them, but who, when the time comes to draw their cheques, will show us that they never forget the cause of Missions, and they will not be outdone by the liberality of their sisters in other Dioceses.

I want to thank very cordially the many Parishes who have acted upon the suggestion made several years ago, to send at once, in the autumn, to the Missionary whose letter they accept, the full supply asked for of winter underwear and other comforts for the cold weather. I know that this costs more than to wait until the box is ready to carry them, but when we think how much more merciful it is, the money sinks into insignificance. We must not forget, either, in making up our boxes that summer and winter succeed each other in the missionary homes as well as our own, and that there is but one chance each year to send a list from their homes, so that we must expect a long and a varied one. I know how faithfully it is filled in Pennsylvania.

This closes our Twenty-first Annual Report. We have attained our majority! The years past are full of happy memories of loving service. May we go forward in fuller strength, realizing that "we are soldiers in the great army of Christ, and that each one of us is, in a measure, responsible for the success or failure of the battle," and may it be said, at the last, of each one of us: "She hath done what she could."

FOREIGN COMMITTEE.

21st Annual Report.

There stands upon the report of the Treasurer \$2770.85 as having been sent this year to Foreign Missions by this Committee. It may not be without interest to know the destination of a few of the larger sums which go toward the making up of this amount, and to have the attention called to some parts of the work of Foreign Missions in which we have been able to assist.

One hundred and twenty-five dollars was sent from the Church of the Redeemer, Bryn Mawr, as a special gift to a missionary who, having worked for many years in Japan, has broken down under the severe strain of her labors.

One hundred dollars was given as a thank-offering by one member from the Church of the Holy Apostles, to be placed in the hands of Bishop Schereschewsky to assist him in the publication of his translation of the Bible into "Wen-li," the written language of Southern China, a translation which, when completed, can be read by two hundred and fifty millions of Chinese.

Fifty dollars sent as a thank-offering from a member of St. Mary's, West Philadelphia, was given to assist in opening a station in one of the ten walled cities of China. This sum formed a part of the offering received at the "Epiphany" meeting in January.

From St. Mark's Church, Philadelphia, has come fifty dollars for St. Paul's College, Tokyo, whose needs brought the Rev. Mr. Tyng to this country a year ago. His statements in

regard to its unsafe condition were verified when, a few weeks later a part of the building fell, killing one of the native teachers.

A few gifts not in money have also been sent in answer to personal requests from missionaries: A Communion service (as a memorial) presented by one member, from the Church of the Ascension, to the Chapel at Mount Vaughan, Africa; a font given by the Auxiliary to the same, and a cooking stove from a member of St. Peter's, Germantown, to Miss Woodruff at Cape Palmas.

Lastly it may be mentioned that, as always, we have secured the fulfillment of all pledges for scholarships which are under our care. The amount for these scholarships altogether was \$985. We included for this year a new scholarship in the Isabella Hooker Memorial School in Mexico, the first the Auxiliary has ever pledged for Mexico. A new scholarship in China has been promised by a member of St. Peter's, Germantown.

The foregoing facts relate of course to the Foreign Committee alone. There are two matters in which it acts more or less in connection with the Indians' Hope and the Domestic and the Freedmen's work: first, the three general missionary meetings alway snoted in this report, and second, the effort to enlarge the United Offering to be gathered in from the whole Auxiliary at the General Convention.

The first of these, the missionary meetings, have been for some years a series of successes, and the Annual and Mid-Lent meetings held this year, respectively at Holy Trinity and St. James' Churches, were what might have been expected from previous experience. The "Epiphany" meeting in behalf of the Foreign Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was this year an experiment, being held out of the city. The suburban parishes not having the same opportunity as the city congregations to take part in these gatherings, it was proposed to hold this meeting in St. Luke's Church, Germantown. It was a most happy thought. The excellent addresses were made to a congregation which filled the church, and the offerings were larger than those at the meeting of the previous year held in the city.

In regard to the United Offering, it has been a point of interest throughout the year and many mite boxes have been distributed. The Chairman of the Executive Committee (Mrs. Whitaker) prepared a leaflet on the subject, we think the best of all we have read. It was addressed to the members of the Auxiliary, and many copies have been distributed in the parishes. If read by all to whom they were given we can hope for generous offerings.

Great activity has been shown in the careful distribution of the babies' mite boxes, that new enterprise even more valuable in its indirect results than in its ingathering of money, though this is not to be despised. The little child in whom a desire to give has been awakened and the habit of giving formed by this means, will not find it hard or unnatural to give when it reaches maturer years. Nine hundred of these little boxes have already been distributed, and we have reason to think that many of the children take a lively interest in the matter. Thus we can verify the words of Holy Scripture, "A little child shall lead them." Those who desire a fuller explanation of the working of this branch can find it in Mrs. Whitaker's leaflet, "The Babies' Branch of the Junior Auxiliary."

Our delegates number this year a hundred and twenty-four, and the general attendance has been very good. There are still several important parishes which do not send representatives, and we again earnestly entreat the rectors to appoint delegates from them.

Looking forward to changing the place of our meetings to the new Diocesan House, a resolution was passed at the last meeting that through this report the Rector and Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity should receive our thanks for their kindness in permitting us to hold the meetings in the Parish House these past years, and also that the cheerful readiness of the Sexton and his assistant to give their help upon all occasions when it was needed should be acknowledged by us as it has been appreciated.

Boxes of clothing and toys have been sent from St. Andrew's, West Philadelphia, St. Thomas', St. Stephen's, Wissahickon, St. Peter's, Germantown, Grace Church, Mount Airy,

and the Church of the Saviour, West Philadelphia. We hope that more parishes will undertake these next year. Especially we would be glad of material and clothing for Africa. We send them at little expense, as no duties are required.

The usual box of dressed dolls prepared by members of the Auxiliary was sent in the Fall. These dolls are most gladly received by the missionaries, who need them as Christmas gifts for the children under their care. A larger number would be acceptable to them, and we would be very glad if any one, whether connected with the Auxiliary or not, would help us every year by sending one or more dolls to the meeting in September.

FREEDMEN'S COMMITTEE.

Report, 1894-5.

The Freedmen's Committee report that they have been carrying on their usual work of sending money and boxes in response to appeals received from all parts of the South.

The work grows more interesting year by year, as we have the opportunity of seeing the results of our labors.

The needs are so great and the conversion of these people is apparently so slow, that in our impatience we sometimes cry out; but we should remember that God works slowly, and that the process of turning men from evil to good is necessarily a slow one; therefore we must not despair, but take courage from the much good already done.

We have in the past year expended \$1990, and sent out boxes to the value of \$3128. These figures, we regret to say, are not in proportion to the increased number of our members. Possibly one reason may be that there are so few Parish branches of the Auxiliary, consequently there is no one to whom the delegates can report what they have heard at the monthly meetings, and whom they can interest in the cause, and no one authorized to collect subscriptions in the Parish towards the work of the Auxiliary.

During the winter, besides letters giving details of what is being done in various quarters, we have listened to most interesting addresses; some from men engaged in the simple beginnings of missionary work, and also from those who have carried large enterprises to a great degree of success.

All agree that education, meaning Christian education, is the most important feature of their work. To gather the children into Sunday-schools, Parish and manual training schools is their steadfast aim.

One missionary of wide knowledge and experience says he likes to begin with children under five years of age, and that after ten they can do very little with them in the way of moral influence.

Both parents and children are willing, for the desire for education is strong in them—only money is lacking to build school-houses and provide well-trained teachers.

At the Missionary Council, last October, much interest was manifested in the work among the colored people—perhaps the Church is waking up to its importance. If so, let it give in abundance money to further the cause, and prayers to sustain the hearts of the missionaries.
