EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Report.

The Executive Committee has held three meetings since the last Report. The first was the Annual meeting, which lasted all day, beginning with the Holy Communion service at the Church of the Holy Trinity, and then, on adjournment to the Parish House, interesting discussions on questions connected with missionary work followed until lunch time, and afterwards addresses, which were listened to with deep earnestness, by Bishop Graves of Shanghai, Bishop Brooke of Oklahoma, Bishop Nelson of Georgia and Bishop Brewer of Montana.

The usual Foreign Committee meeting was held during the Epiphany season at the Church House, which was well filled during the entire morning, and most interesting addresses were made by Rev. Mr. Massie for China, Mrs. Pierson for Japan, and Rev. Mr. Malson and Mrs. Green for Missions among the Jews. Afterwards Miss Emery made an address on the general subject of missions, and Miss Krikorian thrilled the audience with an appeal for Armenia.

The clergy of the city were invited to meet the Auxiliary at the Lenten meeting, so that instead of addresses there should be a discussion among those who were really in earnest on the subject, in order to do better work in the future. The day proved so stormy that the meeting was very small, and as a *conference* it was a failure, but the address of Rev. Mr. Hills on the work done by the Parish Branch at St. Mary's was admirable and full of practicable suggestions.

The amount contributed through the Pennsylvania Branch for the united offering made in Minneapolis in October was \$6,560.56, and the Committee earnestly hopes for enlarged gifts, and still more zeal in interesting in the future those who do not now contribute to Missions, nor feel their responsibility in helping to carry out the Master's command to "go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

Thirtieth Annual Report.

In reviewing our meetings since last May, there seems to have been a slight falling off in attendance and the minutes record so many appeals to members for increased exertions that we must realize the fact that there may have been also a slight falling off in interest.

We have had only two Bishops present during the year, Bishop Hare and Bishop Leonard of Nebraska, Utah and West Colorado. Bishop Hare gave a short review of his own work, and said that the work of the Indian Hope in the future lay chiefly in teaching and maintaining those already brought into the fold. He had now seventy parishes, fifty churches and had himself confirmed 4000 souls. The burden of scholarships weighed heavily on his mind. He dwelt on the importance of maintaining *The Ampa-o*, a Dakota monthly newspaper, which is the only brightness or outside life that goes into many Indian homes; and said that for the future "Tornadoes" must be included in all insurance policies, he having lost more churches through wind than through fire.

Bishop Leonard gave only a short address and said that his wants were much the same as those which he had mentioned last year, which is the more to be regretted as his opportunities for work among the Indians seem peculiarly urgent. He read a letter from a U. S. army officer, himself an Indian agent, stating their great need of religious instruction, and gave an interesting and amusing description of work among the Piute Indians at Wadsworth, Neb.

There have been minute and detailed accounts of many branches of work in the Indian field. We feel that we have never before known so much about the Seminoles under Bishop Gray's jurisdiction, in Florida, their lonely, desolate life among the swamps, their proud reserved natures, their Christmas tree celebration, held on the 4th of July, and their

oppression by the whites, their lands having been taken from them, and they, in many instances, ignorant of their right to remove even their crops. Bishop Gray writes that their suspicion and distrust is being at last overcome, and that his work is most promising, funds are all that is needed; a most faithful and efficient worker, Mrs. Brecht, has her salary for last year still in arrears.

We have also had detailed accounts of the Convention held in Bishop Hare's diocese, with services in English and Dakotan. We have had a letter from the Oneidas showing that the hospital work begun amongst them a year ago was getting well established. This is the first tribe about whom we record so advanced a stage of civilization, though the work is at present done by the white sisters. We have had full and satisfactory accounts of St. Paul's School, of "St. John's William Welsh Memorial School," of Mr. Clark's work at Rosebud when he had Christmas trees at twenty-three out of twenty-five stations, and an interesting letter from Mrs. Clark, describing her supervision of all Christmas boxes. This has not heretofore been done, and she clearly shows the wisdom and necessity of such supervision, as even the most civilized Indians are still in that primal state in which they will give away to any one, anything for which they have not immediate use.

We are glad to note that Miss Sibyl Carter's house at Islip has been furnished for her by her many friends, the Indian Hope having contributed \$33.

The value of Miss Carter's work in teaching lace making to the Indian women cannot be estimated. She held a lace sale this winter in Philadelphia which realized \$300.

At the December meeting it was decided to move from the pleasant room we had so long occupied in Holy Trinity Parish House to the one provided for the work of the Women's Auxiliary in the new Parish House, corner Twelfth and Walnut streets, and all meetings in 1896 have been held there.

Besides the sums contributed through the Indian Hope to the Board of Missions in New York, we have in special departments contributed towards the work of Bishop Hare, Bishop Rowe, Bishop Leonard, Bishop Brooke and Bishop

Gray. As may be seen in the detailed list of the Treasurer for Specials, we have never in any one year worked for so many interests, and it is encouraging to feel that our special offerings as a whole are larger than those of last year.

We feel renewed hope in our increased information on Indian subjects and earnestly commend to our members the importance of such knowledge. The Treasurer for Specials reports that in all cases the gifts of money are in absolute proportion to the information possessed by the parish of the object worked for.

We are sure that our members will care to know the names of some papers published by or among Indians.

The Ampa-o, meaning "The Daybreak," from Rev. W. J. Cleveland, Madison, S. Dak.

The Indians' Friend, from Miss Toot, 2105 Spruce street, Philadelphia.

The Indian Guide, published monthly at twenty cents a year, and printed by the Indian pupils of the Wind River Boarding School, Shoshone Agency. Address *The Indian Guide*, Fort Washakie, Wyo.

The Palm Branch, a paper about the Seminoles, from Mrs. Gray, and the many valuable publications of the Indian Rights Association and the Report of the Indian Commissioner at Washington, which he will send free of charge to any one.

We again owe our thanks to Mr. Frank McDowell, for the paper for the Reports, and to the Pennsylvania Railroad for transportation of boxes so far as Chicago.

DOMESTIC COMMITTEE.

Twenty-second Annual Report.

This day closes our first season of work in our new quarters, so generously allotted to us, by the custodians of the Church House, and furnished, ready for occupancy, by some of the good churchwomen of the Diocese. While never forgetting our debt of gratitude to the noble Parish that kindly sheltered us so long, we confess to a sense of great satisfac-

tion at having a home of our own, and we hope that we may show our appreciation of it by an ever-growing interest in the blessed work that it is our privilege to do here, and by a steady increase in our work, and our money gifts for the cause of missions.

The event, to the Woman's Auxiliary, of the year, indeed I may say of the triennium just passed, was the great meeting in Minneapolis, when its united offering of over \$56,000 was made. Pennsylvania gave of this large sum \$5560.56. Some of you may remember that you counted me over-sanguine to expect \$5000, and I was not at all surprised that it was a much larger sum, for Pennsylvania is a noble Diocese, and its good women will not be outdone in their works and labors of love. Those of us who had the privilege to be present when the great offering was made, can never forget the occasion, and we thought that every woman who had contributed nothing must feel a pang of regret. We have now well begun to gather our gifts for the united offering of 1898, its object must be dear to all of us, the training and support of women workers in the missionary fields. Let there be no occasion for regrets when that gift is made—let every woman join the great company of givers, and let each one do what she can. To those who find the mite chests great helps, let me say, that during the summer, the holiday from monthly meetings and innumerable appeals, they will be found invaluable, pray do not leave them in deserted homes; let them have an outing too, and perhaps we may meet friends who will appreciate them. And to those who do not need to use them, and whose generous help comes in large gifts, I will remind that May and September are the months that the Treasurer asks for remittances.

By the action of the General Convention we have several more missionary Bishops added to our list, and though Bishop Garrett has become a Diocesan, it does not enrich him, nor may we forget him.

The total number of Missionary boxes sent by us this year is 192, valued at \$16,718.10; of these 53 have been sent within the Diocese, valued at \$2118.28. This year the list is to be made separately, at Miss Emery's request. Her own

Report has become so voluminous that there will be changes in it too. The Treasurer reports \$3810.33 as having passed through her hands, the Parishes have sent direct \$649, making a total of 21,177.53. It is a noble sum, but we have done better than this. In one number of *The Spirit of Missions* I was sorry to note that \$510 had been sent direct from our Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, that I would have liked to have had sent through us. This may perhaps be vainglorious in me, but it seems so much more business-like and appropriate for Miss Emery's accounts and mine to agree that I must be pardoned, and express once more my gratitude to all those who make us the medium of their gifts.

The Annual Meeting of our Branch held at Holy Trinity Church was a notable one, both as regards speakers and attendance. There was a new feature in the plan of it. Following the Holy Communion office, and our own good Bishop's address, and after adjourning to the Parish House, the heads of the various committees made brief addresses, stating their needs, and plan of work. Then a suitable luncheon was served, and in the afternoon we heard from several of our Bishops. Bishop Brewer was the chosen one for Domestic Missions. Our monthly meetings grow in interest, as the work expands, and we have had with us to enhance it Bishops Talbot, Leonard and Wells, and at a special meeting given to welcome Bishop Rowe, we had full witness of the wisdom in the choice of the first Bishop of Alaska. He seems to have made friends everywhere, and I hope that they will not forget him while he is so far away, that not till October can he hear from those he has left behind him.

We have filled all our pledges for the year and sent two new ones besides, one to Bishop Gray of \$250, the other to Valle Crucis Mission of \$25. At the officers' meeting in Minneapolis the needs of South Florida were so pathetically set forth, that among many others I was moved to promise this help. Before I came to the October meeting, generous friends had given me a large part of it, and the Committee, as it always does, promptly sustained me, and made up the sum, which was almost the first to reach the Bishop. The \$25 to Valle Crucis is the annual pledge towards paying a

small stipend to a visiting missionary. Of the old pledges, the salary of the matron of the Good Samaritan Hospital, helps and cheers Bishop Morris. The "In Memoriam Scholarship," in St. Mary's Institute, Dallas, Texas, enables Bishop Garrett to have the daughter of one of his missionaries educated there. The gift to Valley Mission, N. C., helps to pay for the services of the missionary there. The money towards the salary of the only woman missionary now in Alaska, is a direct help to the Board of Missions, as is also whatever we send towards Bishop Wells' salary. Shall we ever send it all? Yes, I think we shall. This is an opportune moment for all who love their Lord to stretch forth their helpfulness to the Board, which we learn with pain and horror, is once more confronted with the prospect of a large debt. It is passing strange that with such a membership as the Church has there could ever be an anxiety with those who are charged with the care of her finances. There is an appalling lack of duty somewhere, I know that not one of this company fails in her gifts, but perhaps we all fail in the paramount duty to pray for missions, and I fear that we all shirk the obligation to endeavor to interest all those whom we reach in them. If a general effort were to be made now, the whole sum needed of \$86,000 would melt away among 650,000 communicants.

The review of a year's work is a solemn thing. We all wish that we had done more. I hope that we shall all strive to do more in the years to come. We have been blessed with new Branches, and much loving generous service has been given. FOREIGN COMMITTEE.

Twenty-second Annual Report.

The opening meeting in September was marked by the presence of the Bishop of Tokyo, and on that account was unusually large. It is so rarely we can have a Bishop from

the foreign field that we may call it an event in the year's calendar.

This being the year of the General Convention, and, coincident with it, of the Triennial Meeting of the whole Auxiliary, great interest centred in the bringing together on that occasion, of the entire united offering gathered during the past three years, which, according to the decision of the previous Triennial Meeting, was to be used for the endowment of the Episcopate in a missionary jurisdiction. Fifty-six thousand dollars were received—a phenomenal advance upon the offering of three years before. Of this the Diocese of Pennsylvania gave \$6500. It was then determined that the next united offering should be “devoted to the training, sending out and support of women workers in the mission field.”

A proposition was made at the same Triennial Meeting, in response to some words of Bishop Ferguson, not only wise in its purpose, but in its character as a memorial, appealing to the hearts of all.

For years past the name of Mrs. Brierley has been spoken with respect and affection, but her modesty kept her very quiet about herself, and not until three years ago, when she made a visit to America, and was present at one of our meetings, did we realize with what a high aim she lived. July last at Cape Mount, Mrs. Brierley entered into life eternal. The proposal to erect to her memory a girls' school at Cape Palmas found a ready response. Four of the five thousand dollars required for this object was then and there pledged; and the Pennsylvania Committee not only redeemed its portion of the pledge, but added to it at its October and November meetings. The interest in this memorial extended far and wide, and offerings large and small came from many sources.

Let no one forget that Mrs. Brierley's own work at Cape Mount still lives. Everything given to it is really a memorial, though a silent one, to her. It would be a joy to her could she know that those who have taken her place are not forgotten at home.

Since December the Woman's room in the Church House

has been in use for our meetings. It was furnished by the four Branches of the Auxiliary and the Managers of the House of Rest. The central position of the Church House enables the members from suburban parishes, and who are as faithful in their attendance as those living in the city, to come with much greater ease than formerly.

We pass over the Annual Meeting, knowing that it will be fully noticed in the other Reports. The second of the three general meetings was held, as always, in January and for foreign missions only. The speakers were the Rev. Robert Massie of China, Mrs. Pierson (Miss Goepp) of Japan, Miss Emery, Miss Krikorian of Armenia and the Rev. Dr. Matson and Mr. Green who spoke in behalf of the Jews in this country. This meeting was considered one of our most successful.

A variation was made in the usual "Lent" meeting, the third and last of the general meetings. It was occupied wholly in explaining and developing the aim and work of the Auxiliary. Clergymen were especially invited to be present. The busy rector, when asked to do so, sends representatives from his parish to the Auxiliary, but he himself does not know much about it, and therefore cannot judge of its worth. As to his congregation, though they may frequently have heard it mentioned, but few know anything of it beyond the fact that it is one of our missionary organizations. If such a meeting as this one should be repeated we ask all who can to be present and acquaint themselves with this branch of work in the Church.

Some much-needed articles for Dr. Walrath at Cape Mount were supplied by some of the delegates and added to by one parish, the entire box being valued at \$67. Several other parishes have taken an unusual interest in sending boxes to her and to Miss Woodruff. Other boxes have been sent elsewhere, a record of which may be found in the Report of the Box Committee.

Fifty-six dolls were brought to the September meeting—an unusually large number. They were sent to Africa and Japan.

Some of the delegates have expressed an unwillingness to

attend the meetings unless they can do their share in contributing. However painful it may be to come empty-handed, yet we say come. The parish to which they belong may at some future time be able to contribute more than it can at present, and in any case familiarity with the names of our stations, their situation, and the names of our missionaries is not without its advantages.

We recommend to every one the interesting leaflets and booklets published by the Junior Auxiliary.

Referring to the new members, there are twenty-one, some of whom are already actively interested. It may be added that both at Holy Trinity Parish House and in our present quarters there has been at every meeting, with one exception, an increase in attendance compared with the corresponding meeting of last year.

The pledges for scholarships, salary, and the missionary insurance fund (two dollars annually from each member) have been met by contributions from month to month, and besides these a number of special requests have met a ready response.

The sum total for the year is \$3221.34, about four hundred more than that reported a year ago.

The death of two of the oldest members remains to be recorded, Mrs. J. Edward Carpenter and Mrs. Frederick Graff. The names of both are on the roll of 1878, and it is probable that they were members from the beginning.

Mrs. Graff was a regular attendant at the meetings, while in health, and a constant contributor. Moreover by her will she bequeathed a substantial sum to the general treasury of the Missionary Board.

FREEDMEN'S COMMITTEE.

Report, 1895-6.

In making a summary of the work accomplished by the Freedmen's Committee during the past year, we find encouragement in the fact that a larger number of parishes are represented in the work, and also that the aggregate amount of money disbursed, and value of boxes sent exceeds the record of last year by the amount of \$441.42. We have been able to fulfill and even increase, our pledges for scholarships, and teachers' salaries, and the boxes sent in response to the numerous appeals (though perhaps numerically less), have been of greater value, inasmuch as experience has enabled us to better understand the needs of the applicants. In the sending of these boxes we gratefully appreciate the assistance of the Junior Auxiliary, who, by their good work already accomplished, promise in the future to be an increasing power for good.

The completion of the Diocesan House enables us to share there, with the other Branches of the Women's Auxiliary, the comforts of a large assembly room, but we shall ever hold in grateful remembrance our "day of small things," when, through the courtesy and kindness of the Rev. G. Woolsey Hodge, Rector of the Church of the Ascension, it was our privilege for so many years to hold our meetings there.

We lament to record that since our last roll call, Mrs. Lanpher, wife of the Assistant Rector of the Church of the Ascension, and one of our most faithful members, has entered

into the rest of Paradise, " may light perpetual shine on her."

Those of us who were able to visit the exhibit of the Tuskegee and Hampton schools, held last winter in Philadelphia, were surely deeply impressed by the wonderful progress in mental and manual education attained by the students of those institutions; and therein lies a partial but weighty solution of the so-called "*problem*" of the work for the Freedmen. They are earnest and patient, and their teachers (largely of their own race) understand their needs and are striving by all the means in their power to teach them how best to help themselves.

Surely it is our solemn duty to give to these pleading people the advantages of religious, educational and industrial training; and remembering that the work must necessarily be a slow one, we must patiently labor on in the good cause, and " try His work to do."

On looking over the record of the year that has just passed there seems to be every reason for sincere thanksgiving to our Heavenly Father for all the blessings He has vouchsafed to us, and we pray Him to accept our work done in His name. During the year there were two meetings held, one

of the officers and delegates on Saturday afternoon, January 18, in the Assembly Room of the Church House, Bishop Whitaker presiding. The meeting opened with prayer, after which the Bishop made an address. Representatives from various churches were called upon to tell something of their work, and these reports were very interesting. Thirty-two Branches were represented. A letter was read from Miss Emery, and the meeting closed with prayer. The Annual Meeting was held on Saturday, April 18, in St. Luke's Church, at which time the money collected during Lent by the Branches was presented. It was a very hearty meeting, and splendidly attended in spite of the extreme heat of the day. Two new officers have been a great assistance. The former Assistant Treasurer, Mrs. Dixon, was forced to resign, and Miss Landell has taken her place. Mr. Bertram Frazier has been made Corresponding Secretary. The Babies' Branch is a most important feature of the work. It was begun in Pennsylvania only three years ago, and has now 700 babies enrolled. At the General Convention in Minneapolis last October, the babies' share in the "united offering" was \$29.10, the gifts from 582 babies. In the last two years the babies' offerings at the Annual Meetings have amounted to over six hundred (\$600) dollars. This is a very simple work, but farreaching in its influence for good. Every Branch in the Auxiliary has a noble record, and we thank them for their efforts in the past, but let us not be weary in well doing, for while we throw out our lives to help others, we are helping ourselves, as one of our poets says:

"The very flowers that bend and meet,
In sweetening others grow more sweet."

Let us then not rest satisfied, but work on, and try to interest those who are not working to join this band of helpers, and so will God bless our every effort.
