EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Report.

A meeting of this Committee was held in the Church House, on September 28, 1898, just before the Triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in Washington, to express the desire of the Pennsylvania Branch as to the object of the United Offering in 1901, with this result, that "the first offering of the Woman's Auxiliary in the new century shall be an undesignated gift to the Board of Missions. We do this in recognition of our confidence in them." This was presented by the Secretary, at the officers' meeting in Washington, with many other resolutions from the various Dioceses, and was defeated, and in its stead the following was adopted:

"Resolved, That the United Offering of the Woman's Auxiliary in 1901 be given to the Board of Missions, with the request that it be divided in equal parts; one part to be given to each of the Missionary Bishops who shall be in charge of domestic or foreign jurisdictions at the time, and one equal part be given to the Commission for Work Among Colored People, to be used at their discretion; the offering in each case to be reckoned as a Special, and in addition to the appropriations made by the Board of Missions."

The annual meeting of the Pennsylvania Branch was held on November 10, 1898, at the Church of the Holy Trinity, beginning with the celebration of the Holy Communion, after a most earnest address from Bishop Whitaker. An adjournment was then made to the Parish House for a conference with the Clergy, and addresses from Rev. Dr. Blanchard, Rev. Mr. Hills, Mrs. Neilson and Mrs. George C. Thomas. After luncheon there was a very full meeting in the church, with inspiring addresses from Bishop Gray, of Florida; Rev. Mr. Kimber, Rev. Mr. Fuller and Bishop Talbot, of Central Pennsylvania. The offertory amounted to \$130.34, which was devoted to the missionary work of the five committees.

The Epiphany meeting for Foreign Missions was held in

the Parish House of the Church of the Holy Trinity in the afternoon of January 26, 1899, and whether considered from the standpoint of large attendance, interesting addresses or hearty singing, it was a great success. An electric thrill of subdued enthusiasm ran throughout the audience, which more than once almost burst into applause. It was presided over by the Rev. J. Dows Hills, who made the first address, and was followed by Rev. J. Lindsay Patton, of Japan. Miss M. C. Huntington, of Hartford, was then introduced, and read a deeply interesting paper on China and Chinese missions, showing most intimate knowledge of her subject, both from a missionary and political point of view. She pleaded for women workers to go out, and her address was not only most instructive, but at times both pathetic and humorous. The meeting was closed by Bishop Kinsolving with a few earnest and stimulative words on Brazil. The offering amounted to \$1,829.55; this included a check for \$200, which was given as a Special for China, Japan and Brazil, and the pledge of \$1,500, the sum for which Miss Huntington asked to build a church in China.

Instead of the usual Lenten meeting, a Conference of the Woman's Auxiliary with the Clergy was held at the Church House on April 14. The subjects were the duties of a delegate, the object in having a Diocesan Committee, and the relation of the Auxiliary to the Board of Missions. All these subjects were quite fully discussed, and Mrs. Neilson's paper on the duties of a delegate was most able and interesting.

Thus has closed another year, and when we remember that November will be our twenty-fifth anniversary of the Woman's Auxiliary in this Diocese, we may well "thank God and take courage." "Not unto us, oh Lord, not unto us but unto Thy Name give the praise."

INDIANS' HOPE ASSOCIATION.

Thirty-third Annual Report.

In reviewing the work of the Indians' Hope Association for the year 1898-99, we can feel that it has again been a season of good work accomplished and increased knowledge and interest in the work at large among the Indians. Although it is sometimes a struggle to accomplish all that we set ourselves to do, we may on the whole feel grateful for this year's results.

As usual, we have enjoyed two visits from Bishop Hare, whose cheering accounts of the increased independence and self-sacrifice of the Indians is most encouraging. The Bishop gave the following detailed statement of the most urgent needs in his jurisdiction:

1. Salaries of workers in the field. The maximum salary of a Catechist amounts to \$800 a year, while native deacons and helpers receive only \$5 a month and one box. Their houses are usually very small, and afford but little protection against the intense cold of the winter season.

2. Boxes for boarding schools and Catechists, extraordinary repairs on the buildings, and lastly new Chapels, for which the Bishop has constant appeals from the Indians, who themselves contribute what they can for this purpose. The Bishop has now sixty-five native helpers and eighty-five congregations.

We also had addresses from Bishop Leonard, who gave a cheering account of his work among the Piutes in Nevada, and Bishop Rowe, of Alaska. Miss Jennie Dickson's letters from Greenwood, S. D., are always a source of pleasure and information to us. She speaks with enthusiasm of the

good work of the field matrons and of the necessity of keeping up this branch of the work. A "rest cottage" is badly needed, where tired workers may find a comfortable shelter for rest before their health fails them altogether.

A Chapel has been built at Rosebud with Mrs. Graff's legacy of \$5,000, and the interest on Mrs. Graff's legacy to the Indians' Hope Association, \$50.58, has been appropriated towards a scholarship at St. Elizabeth's School. We may be justly proud of the Report of our Box Committee. Fifteen Catechists' boxes were asked for, as compared to eight last year; all of which have been supplied. This increase shows the growth of the work.

All who had the pleasure of meeting the Rev. A. B. Clark and his wife from Rosebud last year will be glad to hear that, through Mrs. Graff's legacy, they now enjoy the comforts of a suitable house. Mr. Clark applied to the Indians' Hope for a furnace and bath room fittings, which were instantly supplied, amounting to \$250.

We have sent the sum of \$100 each to Bishop Gilbert, Bishop Rowe, and to the Catechist, Birch Coulie, at Flandreau; to Bishops Leonard, Gray and Brooke we have sent over \$80 each, and \$100 to the Oneida Hospital, Wisconsin. Our total of Specials amounted to \$1,273. There will appear a discrepancy between this statement of our Specials and the printed Report of our Treasurer, which is due to the fact that our Treasurer's Report had to be handed to the Bishop of the Diocese by May 1, while our annual meeting does not take place until nearly a month later, during which interval many of our deficiencies were supplied.

The total amount of money sent to the Board of Missions for the support of the work at Rosebud is \$881.86. In addition, \$560 was sent for scholarships.

DOMESTIC COMMITTEE.

Twenty-fifth Annual Report.

The Report that I give you to-day closes the record of twenty-five years' work. It is a blessed privilege to have been so long engaged in the Master's service.

Our annual pledges have all been met, but our interest in the one towards the salary of a Missionary Bishop, seems to be waning, much to my regret, for there is no other way in which we so surely aid the Board of Missions, whose Auxiliary we claim to be, as in the payment of salaries. During the past season 144 boxes, valued at \$13,599.61, have been sent away, and contributions in money are \$8,145.16, making a total of \$21,744.77. Five thousand dollars came to us in a single gift, from an anonymous donor, to buy a home for the good Bishop of Spokane and his successors in office, in the See City of that name, in the Missionary district of Spokane. Never, in my long service as your President, has anything touched me more than this splendid gift. It came, as a rebuke to my want of faith, in the possibility to secure so large a sum, and it has opened my eyes to yet larger ventures for the future, so that if I seem more extravagant in my proposals, and devise greater enterprises, you must not wonder. I am sure that the faithful delegate who procured this liberality must rejoice as I heartily do at her success. The gift fitly crowns our silver anniversary.

There has been a change made this year in the time of gathering the Reports, and some of the Parishes have not yet realized it, so that there are a few still to hear from, which reduces our figures. We regret more than they can, not to have been able to send to the Bishop a complete summary before the Convention. We believe that it will not happen again. Why cannot the Reports be sent by the Parish Secretary as soon as the season's work is ended? Some are so prompt that I give them my grateful thanks. Let all remember that for the future, the end of April is the time to

close them; unfinished work at that time can be reported in the following year.

Many inclement Tuesdays have reduced the size of our meetings during the winter, and there has been a great deal of illness among us; but we believe that the interest in the good cause has not flagged.

Our annual meeting at Holy Trinity on the tenth of last November was a delightful one, and was an earnest of the good year's work that always follows the meetings of the General Convention. Our women were especially "enthused" by the success of the United Offering, towards which the Diocese of Pennsylvania gave \$14,027.23 of the \$82,589.44, its total sum.

The full account of the annual meeting, as well as the one in April in Conference with the Clergy, is so well given by the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Branch that we refer you to it.

Our monthly meetings have not lacked visitors. In November, Bishop Abiel Leonard favored us, and was as ever, most welcome. A special meeting was held in December for Bishop Rowe; his enthusiasm and the unaffected simplicity with which he spoke of his work won all hearts. Bishop Morris addressed the December regular meeting; earnest and true he remains, and though his bodily weakness increases, his whole heart is in his work. In January Archdeacon Spurr, of West Virginia, won great interest for his field, and gathered a goodly sum of money. Mrs. Ware, whose husband is Missionary at Deadwood, South Dakota, followed him in an address, which rewarded her. In February the Rev. T. C. Wetmore, of Arden, N. C., gave a graphic picture of the needs of the new Missionary district of Asheville, which have since been generously remembered. The voice of those fresh from the field always creates an interest that nothing else can.

Thinking that it would be interesting to you all, I have, at some pains, searched our records to give you a summary of our twenty-five years' work. We have sent to Bishop Hare \$1,000 to build two Mission Chapels, to Bishop Garrett we gave the \$500 which he says "inspired him with the courage

to build the Church of the Good Shepherd at Wichita Falls, Texas," to which we also sent a stone font and neat Chalice and Paten. To Bishop Talbot we gave the money for Holy Trinity Church, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Eight hundred dollars from us helped to furnish the dormitories of St. Mary's College, Dallas, Texas. Substantial aid was given in the building of St. Luke's Hospital, Denver, Col. One hundred dollars was added to an endowed memorial scholarship to Bishop Elliott, contributed by the whole Auxiliary. A number of the dormitories of Kearney Hall, at Kearney, Nebraska, were furnished by some of our Parishes, and one of them remembers each year to replenish the wear and tear. Altars have been furnished to three Churches, and a Lectern to one. One hundred dollars was sent to Bishop Brooke, towards the purchase of Church lots in Oklahoma. A very handsome Altar of caen stone was placed in St. Matthew's Cathedral, Laramie, Wyoming, by the loving generosity of my dear committee in memory of my beloved daughter, its former Secretary. Grace Church, Dayton, Washington; St. Peter's, Spokane; St. Thomas', Ketchum, this last a memorial to the late Rev. Thomas K. Conrad, all stand witnesses to the zeal and liberality of my dear people. At one time \$1,375 was sent to Bishop Wells for St. Mary's School, Spokane. At another \$250 was sent to Bishop Gray after the disaster of the Florida freeze. We have also in several instances rescued from lapsing, life insurance policies of our poor Missionaries by paying the annual premium on them, which they were quite unable to do.

This is but a hasty and brief review, of what has been done by the Committee, in the quarter of a century just passed. We have kept a number of pledges, have paid for twenty years the salary of the Matron of the Good Samaritan Hospital, at Portland, Oregon; for eight years past a scholarship at St. Mary's College, Dallas, Texas, has been sustained, on which the daughter of a Missionary receives a superior education, and a number of minor pledges have given great encouragement to the workers in poor and needy places; 3,318 Missionary boxes have been sent away, valued at \$336,781.46, and \$69,738.41 in money has been given, making a total of

\$406,519.94. We may gratefully say, "What hath God wrought?"

We make this review in no spirit of boasting or of self-gratulation, but rather as a self-examination. Has each one of us done all that she could? That is the measure of perfect service.

We are entering to-day on another epoch. "Forgetting those things that are behind, let us press forward," to achieve yet greater results. If in our infancy and early years we have made such a record, what may we not do in the fullness of our maturity?

Our annual meeting will be held in Holy Trinity Church on Tuesday, November 7, and continue throughout the day. Will not each delegate consider herself especially appointed to give this notice in her Parish, and try to induce large numbers to attend? The twenty-fifth anniversary ought to gather a large and enthusiastic meeting. May we all receive from it fresh inspiration for future work.

FOREIGN COMMITTEE.

Report for the Year 1898=99.

It is a great pleasure to bring you the Report of the past year, for the record is one of earnest work and true progress. This is the more pleasant, too, because it must be so gratifying to her who was so long and so faithfully the Chairman of this Committee. In a measure she is seeing the fruit of her self-sacrificing labors. At the October meeting Mrs. T. S. Rumney announced her resignation as President, and the appointment by the Bishop of Mrs. George F. Knorr as her successor. At the November meeting the following minute was read and unanimously adopted:

"While warmly greeting our new President, we desire to offer to the retiring one the assurance of our high appreciation of her. For the long lapse of more than twenty years Mrs. Rumney was the head of this Committee. Her earnest zeal, her devoted love for the work, her unswerving fidelity,

her unfailing courtesy, can never be forgotten by those who have shared her labors. We beg to assure her of this, and that we shall ever cherish happy memories of her bright example and toil in the cause of Missions."

The new President assumed her duties in November. With her tactful, cheerful and loving spirit she very efficiently carries on the work so well begun.

In December letters were sent to all the Parishes whose delegates had not been present for a number of meetings. Kind responses to the reminders were received from many of the Parishes, and at the following meeting we were glad to welcome back ten of these Parish Branches, and at subsequent meetings others have returned.

During the year the meetings have largely increased in interest and in attendance.

In February we were obliged to accept with regret the resignation of another faithful officer, Miss Elizabeth H. Watson. Continued ill health forced her to give up the work she had so conscientiously and faithfully performed. Mrs. Thomas Neilson was asked to write her an expression of our appreciation of her services.

Mrs. Joseph N. Blanchard was nominated and elected Secretary.

During the year very many interesting letters have been read—among them those from Miss Higgins, of Cape Mount, Africa; Mrs. Ridgeley and Miss Smalley, of China. We have followed with much pleasure Rev. Harrington Littell's account of his journey to and arrival at Wuchang, and also his encouraging reports of his first impressions of the Missionary work in China.

We have been much stirred by the appeals for Cuba from Mrs. Daniel Merritt, of the Cuban League, and Rev. Mr. Powers, Secretary of the American Missionary Society.

At our monthly meetings we have frequently been stimulated by speakers from our foreign fields, among them Rev. Mr. Forester, of Mexico. Miss Schott also told us most fully and with intense interest of the Church's work in Mexico. Mr. Osuga touchingly told us of his special orphanage in Japan. Bishop Kinsolving roused our interest in Brazil.

We have pledged a new scholarship, named for Mrs. Kinsolving, for this branch of the work. China has been represented by Rev. Mr. Ridgely.

Rev. Joshua Kimber, Associate Secretary of the Board of Missions, has talked to us of Japan and other of the far away outposts of our Church.

The General Epiphany meeting, held in Holy Trinity Church, was crowded with interest.

Judging as we are taught by the fruits, the year has been a good one. The annual Reports are pauses in our work when we look back; "thank God and take courage." At this twenty-fifth milestone we may well thank God, for the past year is our best. The large numbers attending each meeting and steadily increasing until the two last were the largest of the year is a most hopeful sign; another—the gladness to take up new work. The suggestion for the Brazilian scholarship was so quickly responded to that one felt the Committee were eager to do it. Constantly has there been evidence of the spirit that God loves—"the cheerful giver." Two most generous and beautiful gifts of money have been received—anonymous to us but known to Him. One was given at the Epiphany meeting in the offering of \$1,829.55 after hearing Miss Huntington's stirring address. The other after reading an appeal in the "Spirit of Missions."

The fruits of the work are seen again this year, when Rev. Mr. Forester tells us that next year he expects to send two Mexican girls from Mrs. Hooker's school to study in our own Deaconess and Training School in this city, to be fitted to do Christian work in their own land or in Cuba or Porto Rico, wherever they are most needed.

Again we have been blessed in our giving. Last year we gave \$4,593.69, this year \$7,476.33. Of this latter sum we have given this year in money \$7,239.52, in five boxes \$236.81, total \$7,476.33.

While we review the past with thankfulness, let us not forget to follow the instruction of St. Paul, the great foreign Missionary, to "take courage." God has told us, "the field is the world." It is His world, and He can convert the heathen if He chooses without us, but no woman for her own sake can

afford to lose her privilege to help. As Christ and His Church are precious to us, we shall work and give and pray for Foreign Missions.

FREEDMEN'S COMMITTEE.

Report for the Year 1898-99.

The work of the Freedmen's Committee is always growing, and with the growth come increasing demands upon our liberality.

A very generous anonymous gift of \$2,500 has enabled us to give material help to the excellent work being done by the Rev. Mr. Hunter at St. Augustin's, Raleigh, N. C.; by the Rev. Mr. Joyner, at Columbia, S. C.; by the Rev. Mr. Russell, at Lawrenceville, Va., and by Bishop Gray in Florida.

The field being so large, and the work in every direction so worthy of our support, it is often difficult to know where best to bestow our gifts, which seem so pitifully out of proportion to the many and varied needs.

First of all there are Missionaries to be supported, men who are giving their best years and energies to the cause of educating and Christianizing the colored race; there are churches to be built. The Archdeacon of North Carolina said last winter that he could use at once six thousand dollars in building two new and completing ten unfinished churches, and it is the same in every Diocese.

Hospitals need our assistance, and also the training schools for colored nurses, that are growing out of the hospital work.

Parochial and industrial schools are of the utmost importance.

The Bishop of Texas is quoted as saying that the colored work might as well be abandoned as have no Parochial schools, and we know quite well the value of industrial training. Many of the young girls, unless they have this training, do not know how to wash and iron, bake bread or make a dress; factories are shut against them. What can they do but drift into idleness and degradation?

With the young men it is the same. Many occupations are closed to them, and if they are not taught something by which they can earn an honest living, they become worthless and vicious.

But absolutely essential as the industrial school is, we must remember that there is also a place for the higher education of at least some of the negro race.

This was most eloquently impressed upon us by the Bishop of Tennessee in his address at the annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in Philadelphia.

He said, in substance, that in our efforts to push forward the industrial education of the mass of the race we were apt to forget that they are an emotional and mimetic people, not acting on principle, but ready to follow those who excite their affections and admiration; and, therefore, it is most necessary that the men who are to guide and instruct them should receive the highest possible education, and urged us to support the institutions that are giving this education and fitting these men to be the teachers of their people.

An encouraging feature of the condition of things in the South is the improved attitude of the white population, their feelings having changed from indifference and in some cases even opposition to interest in and sympathy with the work.

One of the most faithful and earnest of Missionaries in a Southern Diocese says that he trusts that "they of the South giving themselves and we of the North giving our money and our prayers may, in God's good time, bring these people into the fold of the Holy Catholic Church."

There is no lack of work to be done, and plenty of opportunity for self-sacrifice in the doing of it; and, therefore, the words of the Bishop of Washington, in his sermon at the triennial meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, may be to us an inspiration—"Usefulness is the test of Christian character; self-sacrifice is grace, self-sacrifice is power."

DIOCESAN COMMITTEE.

Report for the Year 1898--99.

The Diocesan Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary was organized, as stated in the last Annual Report, in April, 1898, but did not get into active operation until the following October.

At that time circulars were sent to one hundred and thirty-five of the Rectors of the Diocese, asking their interest and co-operation, and urging them to appoint delegates to this new committee.

This resulted in the representation of eleven Parishes at the first meeting, October 29, the number increasing month by month, until now delegates from twenty-six Parishes are on the roll.

Such work accomplished, as can be summed up in figures, amounts to: money received and expended \$1,110.74, and value of boxes sent to \$1,281.34; but beyond this and, as we feel, more important than financial results, is the awakening interest in the cause and the growing sense of responsibility among the women of the Diocese towards the work, both foreign and domestic, lying at our door.

For many years the Domestic Committee included Diocesan work in its ministrations, but the time has now come when increased opportunities and responsibilities call for a separate department for each field, hence the formation of the Diocesan Committee.

In adding this fifth committee, Pennsylvania completes the ideal organization of the Woman's Auxiliary. Encouraged by the beginning already made, we look forward with hope to a long and useful service in this part of the Master's vineyard.

Preserve them from all dangers to which they may be exposed; from perils by land and perils by water; from the deadly pestilence; from the violence of the persecutor; from doubt and impatience; from discouragement and discord; and from all the devices of the powers of darkness. And while they plant and water, send Thou, O Lord, the increase; gather in the multitude of the heathen; convert, in Christian lands, such as neglect so great salvation; so that Thy Name may be glorified, and Thy kingdom come, O gracious Saviour of the world, to whom, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, be honor and glory, world without end. Amen.

ALMIGHTY and most merciful God, the Father of the friendless and the helper of the helpless, have pity, we beseech Thee, upon the Indian tribes who dwell in this our land. Send to them the light and comfort of Thy Holy Gospel. Bless all the means used to bring them to the knowledge of Thy dear Son, who died for the salvation of all men. Guide with Thy Spirit, guard with Thy power, sustain with Thy love, all those who minister to them in spiritual things, and bear to them the tidings of redemption. Stir up the hearts of all who profess and call themselves Christians to prayer and deeds of mercy for this perishing race. Give to our rulers a sense of honor, truth and justice in all their dealings with them, and fill this whole nation with compassion for this poor and scattered people; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd. All of which we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
