EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Report.

The meetings of the General Convention always seem to give a special impetus to missionary work, and this last one was no exception. The women of the Auxiliary must have returned to their various dioceses with their faith strengthened and with renewed consecration to Him who calls each one to service in the Church. Many meetings, both general and special, were held in Philadelphia and earnest addresses were listened to from Bishops and Missionaries literally from every part of the world.

The Executive Committee has held its usual meetings and formally adopted a Constitution. At a business meeting on November 4th reports were read and the roll was called, and on November 11th the annual all-day meeting took place in the Church of the Holy Trinity, when addresses were made by Bishop Mackay-Smith, who presided, and by the Bishops of Georgia, Alaska, Montana, Duluth and Shanghai, and also by Miss Stuart, of Virginia.

The Epiphany meeting was held on the evening of January 11th in the Church of the Holy Trinity, when the speakers were the Rev. Mr. Hulse, on the work in Cuba, and Dr. Woodward, on medical missions in China.

Another event of interest was a conference with the Rev. Mr. Smith, the newly-appointed Educational Secretary, not only to welcome him to this old Diocese, but to discuss with him as to plans for the future. Mr. Smith described his work as a bureau of information and also of exchange, and asked those interested

in Study Classes or in any Church work, to keep him in touch with the best things along each line.

The outlook for the future seems encouraging in many ways in spite of the present deficit in the general treasury, but with more faith, more prayer and more consecration, the promise must soon be fulfilled that "the earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea."

OBJECT OF THE UNITED OFFERING OF 1907.

Resolved, That the United Offering of 1907 be given to the Board of Missions, for woman's work in the Domestic and Foreign fields; including the training, sending and support of women workers, also the care of such workers when sick and disabled; this to be interpreted to include Brazil, Haiti, Cuba and Mexico; but that a sum not exceeding \$10,000 be devoted to some building, or extension of the same, preferably connected with woman's work, to mark the United Offering of 1907 and to be begun in that fiscal year, such building to be approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

INDIANS' HOPE ASSOCIATION.

Thirty-ninth Annual Report.

We are glad to record that the work of the Indian Hope for the winter of 1904 and 1905 is fully up to the standard.

The nine meetings show an increased attendance, and the fulfilment of all the "Specials" is particularly gratifying, as the interest shown and money given come from a wider circle, and represent more parishes than ever before.

We have sent to the regular Indian work through the Board of Missions \$1,647.23, and for special objects \$1,861.93, also boxes valued at \$2,362.93.

We have had only one visit from Bishop Hare, who came to the January meeting, at which Mr. Merrill also spoke.

Bishop Rowe came in February and gave a most interesting account of his work, and the announcement that Mr. and Mrs. Clark would be present at the March meeting called out the largest attendance recorded. A special meeting was called in December to hear Bishop Moreland. We learned from Mr. Clark of the employment of Indians by the Government, within two years, and to those familiar with their former habits, it marks an epoch in their life and development. Eight hundred men went to work the first week.

Miss Dickson's letter describing the decoration of their graves at Easter, as contrasted with their gloomy attitude towards death of twenty-five years ago, also marks their mental and spiritual growth.

Bishop Rowe's greatest need is workers, men and women, and his account of the noble work done by Mr. Hoare, and Miss Wood's heroic life, must needs inspire others. Let it inspire us, who live at ease at home, to new efforts in aid of our Bishops amongst this interesting race.

Thirtieth Annual Report.

I am happy and thankful to bring to you the Report of the year's work. It is a great improvement over last year's.

One hundred and twenty-three boxes have been sent, valued at \$12,105.56; money sent direct by Parishes, \$1,610.75; money sent through Treasurer, \$7,294.52; making a total of \$21,010.83 (\$5,110.80 more than in 1904), without the hundreds of dollars sent to Miss Emery by our Pennsylvania women, who thus contrive to give her a far better showing than we can make. This is of little consequence, were it not that it is unbusinesslike, and it is a little discouraging to the officers of our own Diocese.

We have had this season, as the Treasurer's Report will show, two splendid gifts of \$1,000 each, designated, too, the more to delight my heart, "towards the salary of a Missionary Bishop,"

and I can scarcely realize it, but it is true, that the whole \$3,000 has been sent to the Treasury of the Board, so that this year, at least, we have our own Missionary Bishop. For thirteen years I have been longing and striving for this great result. It is the only direct aid that we give to the Board in paying the Missionary Stipends. It is quite true that they are so small, that the boxes are indispensable to the poor men, but I beg you to remember that they and their families must be fed as well as clothed, and that is what the Board has to do, and it is something like making "bricks without straw" when the people fail to supply the Church's Treasury. Many Parishes have their own Missionary, and surely it is not too much to propose that this great Diocese will be proud to have in the field a Bishop of its own. We can never fall back now. Our great trouble is that while we have some munificent givers among us, the masses are permitting the blessing promised, to fall upon the few, and those few are sometimes overwhelmed with appeals, while hundreds and thousands are giving nothing.

We have, during our working season, heard from many parts of the wide field, and our gifts are carrying cheer and comfort to many homes and missions. We welcome the Missionaries who come to tell us of their needs, but I beg you not to forget those who, "in patient continuance," are "out of sight." Let us see that they are not "out of mind" while they are at their posts.

I may not omit to tell of our losses by death. Three of our dear delegates have entered into that better country, since our last Annual Meeting: Mrs. Allen, of St. Mary's, Ardmore, one of our newer members, very earnest and interested; Mrs. Andrew Wheeler, lately representing St. James' Parish, but for many years a devoted member of the Woman's Auxiliary; and Mrs. Edward Shippen, of St. Peter's, Philadelphia, for several years our Vice-President, and who was never absent from our meetings until her failing health detained her. We bless God for their good examples and pray for them eternal rest, and for us, that we may be like them in faithfulness.

I thank you all for your valuable help and never-failing interest in our great and blessed work and for the kind and generous response you give to all that I bring to you. Invoking for you all a large measure of the Divine blessing, I submit the Report. Respectfully,

FOREIGN COMMITTEE.

Report for the Year.

Another year has slipped away, and each of us must realize how unusual have been our opportunities to do the work for which we are here,—to learn, to give and to pray for those who are doing our work in the foreign field.

Four voices have come to us from those who are eagerly watching "the Dawn on the Hills of Tang":—Dr. Mosher, plead-

ing for the work in Wuish, and with the encouraging news of the twenty-five per cent. increase in the number of Chinese catechists; Dr. Woodward, telling of his work at Gankin and of the one hospital within a radius of one hundred miles amid a population of five million Chinese and of the eleven thousand surgical cases dressed last year; Dr. Glenton, who has worked single-handed for years in Wuchang in her little hospital, the Elizabeth Bunn Memorial, and of the gratitude shown by the one hundred and twenty patients treated last year in the wards.

All these dwelt largely upon the need of the medical side of the work, but Dr. Jeffreys brought us face to face with the spiritual side of all hospital service by showing how at St. Luke's, Shanghai, the ministry of healing wins the heart and thus gives acceptance and added meaning of power to the message of salvation, and the works of kindness talk out loud and thus make the love of Jesus ever manifest.

From "the Island Empire," with its enlarged responsibilities as a world power, Dr. Teussler pleaded for the hospital at Tokio, Japan, and its great needs, and showed how the Christian influence was felt by all its inmates, especially by the daily prayers held each morning and by the constant work of the catechist, who not only talks to and catechises the convalescents but follows up the cases after they leave, and how by this means thousands are brought to a realization of what is "the fulfilment of the law of Christ" "in bearing one another's burdens."

Rev. Ambrose Gring brought his message of work done in Western Japan amid what he calls his "Not-Christian brethren." He is the only white man in a big area of country. He goes from place to place, and for many months is separated from his wife and children, doing evangelistic work.

Besides our nine regular meetings, we have had the privilege of hearing from Bishop Knight, with encouraging news of the eagerness of the Cubans to have the church planted in a dozen or more places and of the enthusiastic co-operation of the laymen to lay foundations for self-supporting work in the future.

Then, again, Mr. Backus told of the progress of work in Mexico and the impetus given to it by the Church's wise choice of the new Bishop.

As a material token of our appreciation of these earnest workers, we have been able to give to each financial help and, through Parish Branches, one room at the Gankin Hospital and two at that in Tokio have been built and equipped at a cost of over \$800.00. A surgical bed promised to Dr. Glenton and several

pews for the new church at Wuish, besides a God's Acre purchased for Mr. Reifsneider's work in Japan. Also the salaries promised for two evangelists to work under Dr. Jeffreys, and the support of a scholarship at Boone School.

Most of the parishes have been well represented at the meetings, and some twenty-five have taken a special foreign worker to pray for and to write to.

A series of gatherings for intercessory prayer for missions and for conference were held at the home of the Secretary during Lent, and we all believe that the oneness in spirit evinced has brought us closer to each other as well as deepened our feeling in the truth of the promise, "Call unto Me and I will answer thee and will show thee great things."

We have lost several of our most valued members, among them Mrs. Conover, Mrs. Downs, Mrs. Andrees, and as this report is being written comes the news that Mrs. Walton, one of our newer, most enthusiastic members, has been called "to higher service." May others be spurred by their good example to help our efficient Chairman and Treasurer, to whose ever faithful ministrations and exactness in *every* detail we owe our helpful and delightful meetings.

Our pledges have been increased by promising the salary of a trained nurse for five years to Dr. Jeffreys and the change made from scholarship at girls' school in Brazil to one in Theological Seminary, costing some \$200.00 more. We are glad to report that these have been all met.

Thus the work has grown; but let us remember that with the opportunities we assume new responsibilities, and it is only according to the fidelity and thoroughness of our individual and united effort and prayer that we can hope to obey Christ's command "to bear His Word to the uttermost parts of the world." To what extent have we borne it?

Four hundred millions in China alone are ignorant of the fact that the mission has come—the mission of the Father's revelation in the Son to all. They and others wait for it.

"The restless millions wait,
The light whose dawning
Maketh all things new.
Christ also waits,
But men are slow and late.
Have we done what we could,—
Have I? Have you?"

COMMITTEE ON COLORED MISSIONS.

The Committee on Colored Missions has steadily pursued its way throughout the past year. The work, while of the first importance in the estimation of all thoughtful people, is not one which commends itself to the general public, making it most difficult to arouse interest and secure funds for carrying on the many branches of mission work among the colored people. It is earnestly hoped that as the negro problem forces itself more insistently upon the notice of legislators in church and state, the time may not be far distant when a realization not only of the perils to ourselves, which a neglect of this question must entail upon us, but an appreciation of the vast amount of good to be done to all these millions of our brethren may stimulate church people to recognize their duty and to give at least a fair proportion of their interest, and their means to this pressing need in the Mission field.

As the different Parishes have learned to appreciate the value

of that great organization, the Woman's Auxiliary, and to fall in with its methods, the attendance at the monthly meetings of the Committee has largely increased, but not so, in proportion, the contributions. Without growth there cannot be life in missionary work, and it should be the aim of all those connected with this Committee so to arouse the interest of their contributors, that each year will see a marked increase in the funds at our command, and in consequence a much larger amount of work accomplished.

The Diocesan Committee has held its stated meetings as usual with about the same average attendance.

We notice with regret the resignation of Miss Bodine as Treasurer, but are glad to welcome in her place Miss Helen Landell.

Also the severe illness of our Secretary, Mrs. N. S. Thomas,

which has necessitated her absence from her post for three months. We hope to have her with us again in the autumn. The work has been very much the same as heretofore, the most notable new interest being the Galilee Mission, to which has been given \$390 for the new building and its equipment.

We have listened to many interesting speakers. Among them the Rev. Messrs. Taitt, Phillips, Caley, Thomas, Hodge, Gassner and Zara, and to Deaconess Pew.

We have representatives from fifty-six Parishes, a gain of three over last year, but only Juniors from nine. We should have more. Besides these from Parishes, we have delegates from the Church Training and Deaconess House and the Tuesday Missionary Bible Class.

The Treasurer reports: For Diocesan Missions, \$1,297.67; specials, \$149; total, \$1,446.67; boxes valued at \$1,836.16. This is a good showing, but by no means all we can and ought to do.
