EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Report.

In presenting its report, the Executive Committee draws attention to a new method of calling the roll. At the annual meeting, a card was given to each person in the vestibule of the church, to write her name and the parish to which she belonged, and to return the card to the usher. The same plan will be carried out this year on November 9th, and it is hoped that every one will register. The meeting was held, as usual, in the Church of the Holy Trinity, and after the helpful address of the Bishop-Coadjutor, and the celebration of the Holy Communion, the Rev. Carl E. Grammer spoke of the work among the colored people, especially of St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville. After noon-day prayers, a conference was held in the Parish House with Mr. George C. Thomas and also with the Rev. Everett P. Smith, who made a strong plea for Missions Study Classes, and called attention especially to four results which were sure to follow such study, viz., the intellectual joy of knowing, the deepening of the spiritual life, the growth of missionary interest, and the power to convince others. After luncheon the Rev. E. Ruffin Jones and the Rev. H. St. George Tucker presented some of the needs in the domestic and foreign fields.

The Epiphany meeting, on behalf of foreign missions, was held in Witherspoon Hall, and it was gratifying to find that this hall, which holds a thousand persons, was filled on the evening of January 24th. The Rev. Arthur M. Sherman, of Hankow, made a special appeal for a chapel in Chiao-Keo, and as a result, \$2400.00 was raised, in addition to the collection for general missions, which amounted to about \$400.00. His address was followed by an exhibition of lantern slides by the Rev. J. Thompson Cole, illustrating mission work in Japan and China, and in conclusion, Dr. Talcott Williams spoke most earnestly on the proved value of missionary work to the world.

The Lenten meeting was held in the Church of the Advocate on the most stormy night of the season. Those who were privileged to be present will long remember the soul-stirring words of the Rev. S. Harrington Littell, Mr. George Wharton Pepper and the Rev. Charles S. Hutchinson.

Three changes have taken place in the Junior Branch of the Auxiliary. Miss Margaret E. Morris asked to resign for a year as Secretary and Miss Mary Allen Evans was ap-

pointed to fill her place. The resignation of Miss Mackay-Smith as Treasurer was accepted with great regret, and the Bishop-Coadjutor has appointed Miss Sarah Coleman Brock as her successor, and Miss Anne M. Hubbard was made Educational Secretary.

The year has been marked, as seems to have been the case throughout the Church, by increased missionary enthusiasm and earnestness, and the future is faced in His strength, Who has promised to those who give only a tithe, that He will "open the windows of heaven, and pour out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE I.

Name.

The name of this Association shall be the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Object.

The object of this Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of Pennsylvania the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.

Organization.

To accomplish these various objects this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is organized into five standing Committees—Indians' Hope, Domestic, Foreign, Work among the Colored People, and the Diocesan. The Chairman of each Committee is to be appointed by the Bishop, with the exception of the Indians' Hope, which must follow its own constitution, as it antedates the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV.

Membership.

The Church itself is the Missionary Society. Every baptized person is a member of the Society; therefore, every baptized woman in this Diocese should be an active member of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.

Officers.

The officers of this Association shall be nominated by the Executive Committee, and in case of a vacancy, shall be appointed by the Bishop, and shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, and a Treasurer for the United Offering.

ARTICLE VI.

Executive Committee.

The general management of the affairs of this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is entrusted to an Executive Board, composed of the eight Diocesan Officers, the Officers of the Standing Committees, the Chairman of the Mexican Work and the Chairman of the Cuban Work, and two Officers of the Junior Department.

ARTICLE VII.

Duties of the President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all committees necessary for transacting the work of the Executive Committee. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees. She shall countersign all bills payable by the Treasurer from the Current Expense Fund, and fill all other duties pertaining to her office.

ARTICLE VIII.

Duties of the Vice-President.

In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and countersign bills.

ARTICLE IX.

Secretary.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall keep a record of such meetings, and prepare and present Minutes at each meeting. She shall prepare an abstract of the Minutes of the year for the Annual Report. She shall send a copy of the Annual Report to every officer of the Executive Committee, to every Rector, Minister in Charge, and Missionary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the President of every Branch throughout the Church. She shall compile in one book the Constitution and other rulings of the Executive Committee, leaving every alternate page blank. When an amendment is made she shall enter the amendment on the page opposite to the Article amended. She shall also enter in this book all new rulings made by the Executive Committee after the manner above specified. The Secretary shall advertise public meetings in such ways as seem best.

ARTICLE X.

Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of all funds belonging to the Executive Committee, and to deposit them in such banking institution as has been selected by the Executive Committee, of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, to be drawn thence upon the cheque of the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer for the purposes of the Executive Committee as ordered by that Committee. All bills sent to the Treasurer must be

countersigned before payment by the President, or in her absence, the officer taking her place. The Treasurer shall present an itemized report in writing at each stated meeting of the Executive Committee. She shall prepare a report of all funds in her charge for the Annual meeting, at which time her books shall be audited by a Committee appointed by the President. The Treasurer, after receiving the estimate of the amount due on the Annual Report Fund from the Publication Committee, shall send said notification to the Treasurer of each of the five Standing Committees, with total amount due from each. It is recommended that the payments of each Standing Committee to the Annual Report Fund, be made, and the books closed, by June first of each year. If any of the Standing Committees has paid for more than its proportion for the current year (her estimate based on preceding year's report), the Treasurer shall credit to said Committee's account on her books, the balance on hand towards liquidating its proportion for the succeeding year.

ARTICLE XI.

Publication Committee.

The President shall appoint annually a Committee on the publication of the Annual Report, said Committee to consist of the Treasurer and Secretary from each of the five Standing Committees, with a Chairman. This Committee shall receive all copy, typewritten, for the Annual Report and take entire charge of its publication. It shall be the duty of this Committee to estimate amount per page due the Annual Report Fund from each of the five Standing Committees, and the United Offering, after receiving bill from the printer.

The Current Expense Fund of the Executive Committee shall pay for the remaining pages of the Annual Report not belonging to any of the Standing Committees.

ARTICLE XII.

Amendment.

This Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Committee by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

UNITED OFFERING

OF THE

Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

OBJECT OF THE OFFERING OF 1907.

Resolved, That the United Offering of 1907 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Domestic and Foreign Fields; including the training, sending and support of women workers, also the care of such workers when sick and disabled; this to be interpreted to include Brazil, Haiti, Cuba and Mexico; but that a sum not exceeding \$10,000 be devoted to some building or extension of the same, preferably connected with woman's work, to mark the United Offering of 1907 and to be begun in that fiscal year, such building to be approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Fortieth Annual Report.

The year just closing has been marked by several noteworthy events. Chief among these, perhaps, was the appointment of Bishop Johnson to assist Bishop Hare in the over-large field of his labors in Dakota, an appointment most satisfactory to Bishop Hare himself as well as a cause of thankfulness to his friends in the Indians' Hope, who know of his failing strength and his great need of help.

The Church's work in California, for Indians as well as our own people, has sustained a severe blow through the earthquake in San Francisco. Fearing that Alaska would also suffer through the failure of banks and the loss of boxes containing the year's supplies for the missionaries there, a special collection was taken for them. This collection, starting at one of the meetings with the sum of twenty-eight dollars, finally reached a total of \$548. We have sent to the Board of Missions for the regular Indian work during the year the sum of \$1643.11, about four dollars less than the amount forwarded last year; \$3246.10 has been given for special objects, an increase over last year of \$1384.17. Fully one thousand dollars of this increase were special or individual gifts; \$548 to Alaska, \$500 to Florida. The value of the boxes sent shows an increase of nearly three hundred dollars, being \$2656.64 for the year just closed, against \$2362.94 last year. Clothing and furniture for the girls of St. Mary's School have also been provided through the Box Committee.

The attendance at our meetings has ranged from thirty in December, when the low-water mark was reached, to ninety-eight in January, when the highest number of persons present during the year was recorded. At least three new parishes have been represented in the Indians' Hope, an evidence that interest in work for Indians is increasing.

Bishop Hare, Bishop Spalding, Archdeacon Appleby and the Reverend Mr. Clark, of Rosebud, have brought the needs and the news of their various missionary fields before the Indians' Hope. Bishop Hare's special need this year has been for money to build homes for his catechist, a desire which has not been as fully realized as he had hoped.

Bishop Spalding's work has been hampered for lack of men and money, as well as by the evil influence of white settlers upon the Indians, and their encroachments upon the lands dedicated to the Church.

Archdeacon Appleby reported to the Indians' Hope that some of the hitherto hostile Indian tribes of Minnesota had opened their hearts to the missionaries and were now eager to hear the teachings of the Gospel. His plea was for an increased number of churches and schools in that region.

May the Indians' Hope resolve each year, by a larger sympathy and a wiser, more generous giving, more and more diligently to uphold the hands of the devoted workers in the missionary field, that so in their difficult and oftentimes lonely tasks, they may be cheered by the knowledge of the devoted interest and support of those at home.

Thirty-first Annual Report.

The close of another year's work brings to us the duty of telling you what has been done, by your ready and cheerful co-operation; 168 boxes have been sent, the value of four of them has not been given me, but 164 are valued at \$15,025.72. \$1508.51 has been sent direct by parishes, and the Treasurer shows receipts of \$7,035.18, making a total of \$23,569.30, which exceeds last year's by over \$2500.00. The catastrophe to beautiful San Francisco followed quickly upon our Easter rejoicing, but somewhat to console us; so far removed

from all suffering, has been the quick and liberal aid, that has so gladly been given in money and supplies to the unfortunate, who, in a brief moment were reduced from comfort, if not affluence, to pinching want and absolute poverty.

We have to report the sending of 22 boxes, valued at \$1679.05 to Bishop Nichols to distribute among our destitute Church people, in his diocese, and a goodly sum of money, too, as our Treasurer will tell. Miss Emery's request for aid to be sent to the Bishop did not come to us, until, I supposed, all resources had been exhausted, in the family, in the Church, and in the city; but with tender sympathy, the dear people went to work and three joint barrels were packed and sent from the Church House, with gifts from many parishes, in addition to those sent directly to the Bishop from other sources.

We have a number of parishes on our list for the first time, for which I am grateful. I again repeat we want every one in the diocese, and the Girls' Friendly Society of the diocese is proving a very valuable ally. Its report last year was too late for printing and, added to this year's, shows that 7 boxes, valued at \$523, have been sent to the Domestic Work, and the other Committees have not been forgotten either.

We have had Missionary Bishops, and other missionaries from many parts of the fields to visit us, and tell us of their work and their needs, and that they have interested the good women is plainly seen by the aid they have given to them. The Committee lost an old friend, and the Church a noble Bishop, when good Bishop Morris was called to the rest of Paradise. His abundant labors only ceased with his life. It is pleasant to know how often we helped him, his letters seemed a benediction to us. Thanking you all again,

REPORT FOR THE YEAR.

Very full of blessings has this last year been to our branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. At all our nine meetings, the faithful Chairman and the Treasurer have given us encouragement and clearly shown to us our obligations and privilege of supporting the ever-growing work, and our delegates are more and more realizing that by regular attendance they can best take back to their parishes the news. In time we hope that the prophecy of Psalm LXVIII, 11 (Revised Version) may be fulfilled, "The Lord gave the word, the women that publish the tidings are a great host."

Miss Mahony brought us hopeful news of the House of Bethany, which is bringing light into the lives of so many girls and children in the Dark Continent. Mr. Welbourn, full of enthusiasm for his pets, the Japanese students, made us realize that we must try to do more for Mr. Tucker's work at Tokio another year. Mr. John Wood, fresh from his trip to Cuba, told us of the wonderful strides in the work there, and as a result of his special appeal for the Church School for girls in Guantanamo, we pledged a scholarship there for three years. Miss Schott shamed us by showing how little the Church is doing for Mexico,—can we let well established schools close there, and enjoy our own richly endowed institutions in America?

Again the news from China thrilled us, as Mr. Sherman and Mr. Littell depicted the awakening of that country and asked the question, "Now that China is open to us, shall this opening be a blessing or a menace?" If we answer in the affirmative, we must provide men, means and chapels in every populous town. After the enthusiastic Epiphany meeting, held on January 24th at Witherspoon Hall, \$2400.00 was raised to build a chapel at Chiao-Keo, as a thank offering for our many blessings. As a preparation for Lent, Dr. Lloyd spoke of the spiritual side of Auxiliary work, pointing out that if we did but live close to Christ, His light would shine from our faces and no one could come near us without seeing that light. At another meeting, Mr. Meem, of Brazil, told of the faithful work done by the small corps of ten clergy who are working in that vast country.

The Cuban Guild is now a Sub-committee of the Foreign Committee and its special work is to raise the salary of the missionary at Jesus del Monte, Cuba.

The presidents of the parish branches met at the house of the Secretary to form plans for progressive work in Lent, with the result that the officers had the pleasure of visiting many parishes, and in about thirty of them, there was held an Intercessory Prayer service during Lent.

From a Normal Mission Study Class, whose aim was to show "the responsibility of this generation for the evangelization of the world," many leaders went forth, and some three hundred persons studied missionary needs with enthusiasm. With God's help, we hope to establish such Mission Study Classes in every parish. We welcome four newly-formed Parish Branches of the Auxiliary, two of which are the outcome of these classes.

A reception was given to Miss Neely on the Saturday before her interesting talk to us in January, and she made us

realize how great was the necessity of sending our best and cleverest trained men and women to satisfy those wonderful Japanese folk amongst whom she works.

We have missed from our midst several of our faithful delegates, amongst them Mrs. Phelps, Mrs. Garden, and Mrs. Lundy, who have been called to "Higher Service."

Two interesting papers were read by our delegates, one on Africa and one on China; also many letters have come to us of thanks and of requests for the prayers and help which our Auxiliary is always ready to give. How much more *might* we do if our hearts were only burning with zeal, like those disciples who, on Easter evening, returned to Jerusalem after talking with

In closing, let us take for our watchword, this thought of Henry Martyn—"Live more with Christ, catch more of His Spirit, for the Spirit of Christ is the Spirit of Missions, and the nearer we get to Him, the more intensely missionary we shall become."

COMMITTEE ON COLORED MISSIONS.

The Committee reports this year a good attendance at its meetings, and a number of most interesting addresses from missionaries in different parts of the South. While it has given substantial help in many directions, it has been unable, through lack of funds, to respond to some most pathetic appeals for aid in paying the salaries of teachers, building churches and keeping up schools and hospitals, and it would earnestly ask for larger contributions from all the parishes, that this most important line of missionary work may be carried on more effectively.

Our large industrial schools at Raleigh and Lawrenceville are a source of much encouragement.

Through the generosity of several women of the Auxiliary, one thousand dollars was given to Archdeacon Russell for an artesian well on the school grounds at Lawrenceville. For this he was most grateful, as it was not only a benefit to the school, but has enabled him to take a four thousand dollar contract for supplying water to the town.

Many faithful teachers throughout the South are doing untold good in the parochial schools. One of our Bishops has lately said that the education of the Negro is the best way to evangelize him. To ground his character upon the principles of the Creed, the Lord's Prayer and the Ten Commandments are essential to his true upbuilding, and he cannot be thus educated outside of the parochial school.

Archdeacon Hughson, of North Carolina, says that the work among the colored people of the South is the most intelligent work being done anywhere; that the Negro adapts himself to the Church, and there is always a change for the better in neighborhoods where Church work is being done.

Surely such testimony as this should give us confidence in the result and spur us on to renewed efforts for the evangelization of these people.

DIOCESAN COMMITTEE.

Report for the Year.

The Diocesan Committee has reason to feel much encouraged with its work during the past winter. Sixteen new parishes have been added to the roll this past year, but there are many more to be gathered in and interested in the work of the diocese. One hundred and fifteen boxes have been reported as sent to worthy objects in the diocese, valued at \$4,089.28, more than double what it was last year, when sixty-five boxes were reported.

The Treasurer's report shows:

\$3686.64 Diocesan Missions.

\$188.50 Specials.

\$284.00 Sent direct from parishes.

As will be seen from the Treasurer's report, we have received from a "member of the Diocesan Committee" a most generous gift of \$2,000, designated for certain missionary work in the diocese.

Our pledge for the woman helper's salary at St. George's Chapel has been paid.

Great assistance has been afforded us in the stimulation of interest in the missionary work of the diocese by different clergymen, who have so kindly addressed us. Rev. Mr. Arkin spoke of the need of St. George's Chapel, Venango; Rev. Mr. Bell, of St. Stephen's, Clifton Heights; Rev. Mr. McIlhenny, of St. Brtholemew's; Rev. Mr. Phillips, of the Summer Home, Church of the Crucifixion; Rev. Mr. Carson, of St. Paul's Mission; Rev. Mr. McDuffy, of St. Augustine's Mission; Rev. Mr. Matchett, of St. Ambrose Mission, and Dr. Upjohn spoke of the work done in Germantown for the colored people.

We feel that our work this year has been most satisfactory, but we must look forward to next winter as an opportunity of greater usefulness to those in need of help and encouragement.

Sixth Annual Report.

Room 10, Church House.

Thirteen new Branches have been organized during the past year, making a total number of sixty Branches in the diocese. We are glad to report, also, a marked increase in the contributions.

Several changes have been made in the working order of the Junior Department. The diocese has been divided into eight districts, and a chairman appointed over each district who holds monthly meetings of the officers of all the Branches in her division. These eight chairmen, with the diocesan officers, form a Central Committee, which also holds regular monthly meetings. This plan has proved most successful in awaking intelligent interest in many Branches.

The Bishop has appointed Miss Anne M. Hubbard Educational Secretary for the Juniors. Miss Hubbard holds regular Mission Study Classes at the Church House during the winter for Junior workers who are preparing to teach in their new parochial classes.

We have rented an office for the Junior Department, in the Church House, which will be open every morning, after September, from nine to twelve o'clock. "All business communications for any of the Junior Diocesan officers are to be sent there." There will be a full supply of missionary leaflets and literature on hand, which will be at the disposal of all Junior workers.

We note with regret the resignation of our Treasurer, Miss Mackey-Smith, whose work has been so efficient in the past, and whose substantial aid is still generously continued. We regret also the temporary absence of our Secretary, Miss Morris, who is taking a well-earned year's rest; and we hope that she will come back to us next year with renewed strength.
