EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Report.

During the past year two general meetings have been held under the direction of the Executive Committee. The Annual meeting took place on November 9th in the ever-hospitable Church of the Holy Trinity. The Bishop-Coadjutor of the diocese presided and made the opening address, which was followed by a convincing appeal for diocesan missions by Dean Groton. At the conference the United Offering and the value of Mission Study Classes were discussed. In the afternoon some of the needs of the work in China, of domestic missions, including Alaska and the work among the colored race, were presented by the Rev. S. H. Littell, Bishop Griswold, the Rev. J. L. Prevost and the Rev. W. A. R. Goodwin. The Epiphany meeting was held on January 24th in behalf of foreign missions.

While the interest and gifts of the Woman's Auxiliary in this diocese are constantly increasing, the fact that this branch has not met its apportionment for general missions comes with a shock of surprise. The Board of Missions has asked the whole Auxiliary to contribute \$100,000 yearly for the general work of the the Church, and the proportion assigned to this branch is about one-eighth of that amount. As the present report shows, much larger sums than this have been given, but they belong to "Specials," which though absolutely essential for the growth of the work, do not aid the Board to meet its pledges. Those who find it more inspiring to give to a particular object may also help the appropriation by choosing "Designated Contributions" which include stipends for missionary bishops, clergymen, catechists, lay workers and scholarships. Would it not be possible by earnest prayer and thought to raise the two thousand dollars necessary to complete the apportionment?

Owing to the patient endeavor and consecration of work accomplished in the past three centuries, the present years of privilege bring greater obligations and world-wide opportunities to prove the serviceable love of those who pray in the spirit and power of the Master.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE
Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the
Board of Missions

ARTICLE I.

Name.

The name of this Association shall be the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Object.

The object of the Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of Pennsylvania the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.

Organization.

To accomplish these various objects this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is organized into five standing Committees—Indians' Hope, Domestic, Foreign, Work among the Colored People, and the Diocesan. The Chairman of each Committee is to be appointed by the Bishop, with the exception of the Indians' Hope, which must follow its own constitution, as it antedates the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV.

Membership.

The Church itself is the Missionary Society. Every baptized person is a member of the Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese should be an active member of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.

Officers.

The officers of this Association shall be nominated by the Executive Committee, and in case of a vacancy, shall be appointed by the Bishop, and shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, and a Treasurer for the United Offering.

ARTICLE VI.

Executive Committee.

The general management of the affairs of this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is entrusted to an Executive Board, composed of the eight Diocesan Officers, the Officers of the Standing Committees, the Chairman of the Mexican Work and the Chairman of the Cuban Work, and two Officers of the Junior Department.

ARTICLE VII.

Duties of the President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all committees necessary for transacting the work of the Executive Committee. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees. She shall countersign all bills payable by the Treasurer from the Current Expense Fund, and fill all other duties pertaining to her office.

ARTICLE VIII.

Duties of the Vice-President.

In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and countersign bills.

ARTICLE IX.

Secretary.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall keep a record of such meetings, and prepare and present Minutes at each meeting. She shall prepare an abstract of the Minutes of the year for the Annual Report. She shall send a copy of the Annual Report to every officer of the Executive Committee, to every Rector, Minister in Charge, and Missionary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the President of every Branch throughout the Church. She shall compile in one book the Constitution and other rulings of the Executive Committee, leaving every alternate page blank. When an amendment is made she shall enter the amendment on the page opposite to the Article amended. She shall also enter in this book all new rulings made by the Executive Committee after the manner above specified. The Secretary shall advertise public meetings in such ways as seem best.

ARTICLE X.

Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of all funds belonging to the Executive Committee, and to deposit them in such banking institution as has been selected by the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, to be drawn thence upon the cheque of the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer for the purposes of the Executive Committee as ordered by that Committee. All bills sent to the Treasurer must be

countersigned before payment by the President, or in her absence, the officer taking her place. The Treasurer shall present an itemized report in writing at each stated meeting of the Executive Committee. She shall prepare a report of all funds in her charge for the Annual meeting, at which time her books shall be audited by a Committee appointed by the President. The Treasurer, after receiving the estimate of the amount due on the Annual Report Fund from the Publication Committee, shall send said notification to the Treasurer of each of the five Standing Committees, with total amount due from each. It is recommended that the payments of each Standing Committee to the Annual Report Fund be made, and the books closed, by June first of each year. If any of the Standing Committees has paid for more than its proportion for the current year (her estimate based on preceding year's report), the Treasurer shall credit to said Committee's account on her books, the balance on hand towards liquidating its proportion for the succeeding year.

ARTICLE XI.

Publication Committee.

The President shall appoint annually a Committee on the publication of the Annual Report, said Committee to consist of the Treasurer and Secretary from each of the five Standing Committees, with a Chairman. This Committee shall receive all copy, typewritten, for the Annual Report and take entire charge of its publication. It shall be the duty of this Committee to estimate amount per page due the Annual Report Fund from each of the five Standing Committees, and the United Offering, after receiving bill from the printer.

The Current Expense Fund of the Executive Committee shall pay for the remaining pages of the Annual Report not belonging to any of the Standing Committees.

ARTICLE XII.

Amendment.

The Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Committee by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

Annual Meeting.

UNITED OFFERING
OF THE
Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

OBJECT OF THE OFFERING OF 1907.

Resolved, That the United Offering of 1907 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Domestic and Foreign Fields; including the training, sending and support of women workers, also the care of such workers when sick and disabled; this to be interpreted to include Brazil, Haiti, Cuba and Mexico; but that a sum not exceeding \$10,000 be devoted to some building or extension of the same, preferably connected with woman's work, to mark the United Offering of 1907 and to be begun in that fiscal year, such building to be approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Forty-first Annual Report.

In reviewing the financial work accomplished by the Indians' Hope during the past year, it is gratifying to know that a much larger sum of money has passed through the hands of the Treasurer of the General Fund than was the case last year. The total sum given for work covering the entire Indian field, which sum includes the interest on deposits, was \$3,935.62, as against \$1,643.11 received last year. The value of boxes sent to the catechists and to the girls' school at Rosebud was \$3,101, an increase over 1906 of about \$450. While the amount given for specials is considerably less, being \$2,384.74 where last year it was \$3,246.10, this difference is accounted for by the large personal gifts made last year to Alaska and Florida, and special collections taken after the earthquake in California, fully \$1,000 of the larger sum having been given to meet these special needs. We are glad to know that we have met all our pledges, which is always our chief aim, believing, as we do, that it is our first duty to support those objects which we have promised year by year to assist. We have also given money for a new hospital recently opened among the Seminoles, and for the relief of the destitute Mission Indians of Southern California. Bishop Hare's desire to see his Indian catechists well housed and an example of decent, cleanly living to their people, has also been furthered financially during

the year just closing; and a considerable sum of money has been raised to help better the conditions of living among the wives of the missionaries in the Indian field.

The number of delegates to the Indians' Hope has not increased during the year, and two of our oldest members have been removed by death; but our meetings have been unusually well attended, the number present only once falling below fifty and generally averaging about seventy, while in January one hundred and seven were counted, which was a larger attendance than at any meeting last year. Items of general interest concerning the work among the Indians have been sent to the *Churchman* each month from November to April, inclusive.

We have had with us speakers direct from the field; among others, Bishop Hare and Bishop Johnson, to tell us of their work in South Dakota; Miss Thackara, who spoke of her hospital among the Navajos and their need of a little church near by; and Mr. Stahlé, who told us the story of Dr. Godden's new hospital in the Everglades of Florida.

The outlook over the Indian field shows the work to be broadening in all directions and full of encouragement everywhere. This is true even among the Oneidas in Wisconsin, where, owing to Mr. Merrill's ill-health, it has been necessary to transfer his charge to Mr. Curtis, a man most acceptable to the people and well fitted for his duties. New work has been undertaken in Alaska, where at Wrangell the entire congregation of Presbyterians has come over to our branch of the Christian Church, and at St. John's-in-the-Wilderness a little mission is about to be started among a tribe of Indians hitherto without any religious teaching.

The year just closing marks another mile-stone in the long episcopate of Bishop Hare. Thirty-four years ago the Bishop found four or five log-cabin churches and perhaps as many helpers in all Dakota; now there are ninety congregations, the prayer-book and hymnal in the Dakota tongue, and a body of Christian Indians ten thousand strong, out of a nation of twenty-five thousand. With these results are not wanting many evidences of fine Christian character among the Indians themselves. The annual gift to the Woman's Auxiliary of more than \$3,600 this past year is a sum which stands for much patient endeavor and self-sacrifice on the part of Indian women; the example of the Rev. Percy Phillips, who gave up a good government position to resume his work as a catechist at a much smaller salary; the generosity of those Indians who, in time of need, came forward with their small gifts of money to aid the destitute Californians, and their appreciation of the blessings which St. Elizabeth's school has brought to their children, recently expressed by a thank-offering on the part of several leading Indians at Rosebud; all these are evidences of the way the Church's teachings have reached the hearts of these people.

With these results to stimulate us, shall we not realize that it is a blessed opportunity given us who are members of the Indians' Hope to help all those who are striving to build up Christian character among the Indians? And shall we not press on with renewed zeal and interest for the coming year, believing that we who are hindered by distance from doing great things in person among them, may yet, by our gifts and prayers, bear our part in helping forward the work of God's kingdom and of Christian service among our Indian brothers?

Thirty-second Annual Report.

I greet you all with pleasure, this bright May day, our annual meeting, grateful to the great and good God, who has permitted to us another year of service in His blessed work.

It is not pleasant for me to tell you that we have fallen short of last year's report, but the figures will betray me if I do not say so. One hundred and forty-seven boxes have been reported to me, valued at \$13,356.02, the parishes have sent direct \$1,098.91, and the Treasurer has received \$8,340.88, making a total of \$22,795.81, as against \$23,569.30 of last year. The chief deficit is in the boxes, and we may partly account for that by the outpouring of supplies to San Francisco after the fearful calamity, 18 boxes having been sent there at once, valued at \$1,685.83.

There are still many good women among us who pass over the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary and

send their gifts direct to New York, so that Miss Emery in her turn presents a much better account of Pennsylvania than is given in our own report, which, to say the least of it, is unbusiness-like, and it is discouraging, too, to the officers here.

Then, too, some of our good helpers have this year been giving through the other committees, so we hope that the cause of Missions has not suffered. Whether we have given more or less is not the question—have we done what we could? is what deeply concerns us.

Our gifts in money have been widely scattered and have carried help and cheer to seventeen of our Bishops in their work, as well as to many needy missionaries, and to their work, and what of our boxes; \$13,356.02 worth of supplies must make a grand transformation in those bare homes.

Have you ever paused to consider it? What comfort and delight must a well-filled box bring to many a one far away, on mountain side or ranche—to be sure they are only making good what is promised to them, when they go forth on their blessed work.

Our meetings throughout the season, notwithstanding many inclement Mondays, have been well attended, and their interest has been enhanced by the voices of the missionaries. Nothing helps the cause more than this, and not to disparage any who have visited us, I believe that poor Mrs. Wetmore, who in her great sorrow is trying to carry on, almost alone, the work of her good husband, called to higher service, and Deaconess Carter, from Alaska, high in the ranks of heroines, gave more pleasure to the members of the committee than many of the sterner sex.

At our last meeting the Bishop of Harrisburg was our speaker; he showed us his diocese so well that he made us see that there is foreign missionary work to be done almost at our doors in our own Pennsylvania. It is joyful to tell that his visit to us procured a gift from one good woman that enables him to build a church at once, and other gifts for his work have also been made.

During the last year we have lost by death two dear delegates, Miss Elizabeth Miller, from Grace Church, Mt. Airy, always faithful and devoted, and Mrs. Alice E. Browne, who for thirty-four years was our constant and true fellow laborer. She was the first Secretary of the Committee, and in its early days she gave of her time to its interests without stint. She was the daughter of one of our most distinguished and beloved Rectors, and she is so highly esteemed among us that it is deemed meet that a memorial of her shall be given, in the form of a silver communion service, to a little church in which

she was always deeply interested; S. Mary's, Beaver Creek, N. C. I need not add how warmly I approve the action of the Committee.

We have entered upon the last four months that remain before the United Offering is to be made. I am confident that you have this in mind, and that the Domestic Committee will not fail in their duty to the cause.

Thanking you all for your unfailing help and cheer, I submit my report.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR.

To the members of this branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has surely come the vision which met St. Paul at Troas, "Come over and help us," for never before, we think, have opportunity and responsibility been so forcefully, so hopefully, so powerfully brought before us as during our nine sessions this season.

From Japan Miss Wall brought us encouraging news of the good work our special missionary, Miss Babcock, is doing there, and Dr. Street showed how in Kiroto the medical work has been a strong factor in bringing Christianity to these clever people.

Miss Coles made the plea for larger and more suitable buildings for the Rev. Mr. Tucker's work at St. Paul's Col-

lege. Many of us believe that "the key of the future of Japan, China and Korea is just now in Tokyo where are gathered the choicest students of the East—100,000 of them—Japan leading the Orient—whither? Is it too daring to forecast a day when Japan with its heritage from chivalrous Samurai days, with its eyes turned westward towards enlightenment and eastward towards Nazareth will lead the Orient into the very presence of the living Christ?" Shall we help by sending of our best?

China's call for help was brought to us from Soochow by the Rev. Mr. Ancell and from Wuchang by Mr. Robert Wood. Both of these walled cities are centres from which *could* be sent answers to millions who in the near-by provinces are crying for some one to come over and teach them. Our Auxiliary, largely owing to the effective, earnest work of a sub-committee, has made it possible to establish a divinity school at Hankow.

From Africa we have a call and an answer. So impressed by the influence for good that Mr. Matthews' school has been at Cape Mount, Liberia, a Mahommedan chief has asked to have a Christian church established in his village of Bendu, and he and his followers are building it now. The money—\$750.00—has been sent through this our branch of the Auxiliary.

For our Lenten meeting the spiritual side of our work was emphasized by an earnest appeal for more prayer and intercession by the Rev. C. S. Hutchinson, followed by an address by Rev. Dr. Cabell Brown on his work in Brazil.

Nearer home the cry to come over and help sounded in our ears when Miss Schott told of the wonderful opportunities for progressive work in Mexico.

Archdeacon Steel came early in the season with his plea from Bishop Knight for Cuba, and later the Bishop writes: "The work is growing very rapidly, the confirmations this year are more than double those of last year, and everything is working systematically. We have now over thirty congregations in Cuba, and our communicant list is 750, compared with 225 two years ago." The Cuban Guild, a sub-committee of our committee, is working for the salary of a teacher at Jesus del Monte this year.

At our Epiphany meeting, held at the Church of the Holy Trinity, Bishop Darlington spoke of the spiritual side of our work, and the Rev. Mr. Chapman told of the needs of Japan and Rev. Mr. Ancell of the awakened China.

The most helpful individual work done for us was the preparation by Mrs. Grice of a clear statement just why we support each of our annual pledges and the bringing to our

notice that in two of our nine foreign missionary jurisdictions those of Kyoto and Haiti—we have no share. Cannot we do something for each of these another year to show our gratitude for our many privileges?

We miss from our midst several of our faithful delegates, especially our former President and dear friend, Mrs. Annie J. Rumney. To her has come the rest and peace of a long and useful life—not the least of her labors was the laying the foundations of this our branch of the Auxiliary.

Our hearts were made glad at our April meeting by knowing that all our pledges were filled and that our efficient treasurers could report three thousand dollars more than at this time last year, owing largely to the work of the sub-committees so wisely chosen by our ever-faithful President.

We note also with satisfaction that in many of the Parish Branches Intercessory Prayer services were held during the Lenten season, and we trust that all of you will endeavor to be present at a corporate Communion service your officers are planning to have just before our first meeting in September.

As a forward movement can we not each of us cultivate the habit of laying the interests of this Committee more constantly before our Heavenly Father until each of our hearts shall thrill to be a worker and a factor in the answering of these calls "to come over and help us" and as disciples of Jesus Christ, filled with the Holy Spirit as we should be at this holy Whitsuntide, we thus contribute to the fulfilling of the prophesy of Jeremiah, "For they shall know Me, from the least of them even unto the greatest of them."

REPORT FOR THE YEAR.

Once again we are called upon to report the progress of our Committee on Colored Missions for the past year. I wish that it were possible to tell of great achievements, but that this is not the case, must be a reproach upon the patriotism as well as the missionary zeal of the women of our church.

There are always those who do take an interest in the welfare of mankind, and some few who are especially interested in this particular race, but how few they are and how utterly inadequate are the efforts made to solve the great problem which confronts us, when we consider the future of this people set in our midst, our neighbors and our brethren, whether for better or for worse. If it be urged that women can do but little toward the solution of great problems, it remains for them at least, to feed the hungry, clothe the naked and to teach ceaselessly and untiringly the principles of righteousness and morality, without which no race can be other than degraded and outcast.

This is the matter with which we have to do. It is not for us to decide whether the negro is capable of the higher education. This may be safely left to the care and acumen

of the wise and good men who have devoted their lives to the uplifting of this race; but it is surely for us to hold up their hands, to give them of our sympathy and substance, and to minister to the corporal needs of themselves, their families and those under their charge.

To this end let us all resolve to enter upon a new season full of enthusiasm and determination to abound in good works; willing to forego some of our life and comfort, and despise failures and discouragements; to labor faithfully towards an end which is for the interest of our country, ourselves and our children, and which is moreover our imperative duty, if we aim to be true followers of Him whose arms are thrown wide in welcome to all men of whatever race or color.

Let me remind you once again of the growing needs of those noble institutions, St. Paul's, Lawrenceville, Va., and St. Augustine's, Raleigh, N. C., which only need the same support given to Tuskegee and Hampton, to rival those fine institutions; remembering that "he that soweth little shall reap little, and he that soweth plenteously shall reap plenteously," and that "God is not unrighteous that he will forget your work and labour that proceedeth of love, which love ye have showed for his name's sake."

DIOCESAN COMMITTEE.

Report for the Year.

It is with much pleasure I make you my report of the year 1906-07. The Diocesan Committee has added six or more new parishes to its roll, and the average attendance has greatly increased.

Eighty-three boxes have been sent to worthy objects in the diocese, valued at \$3,129.72, and boxes valued at \$1,342.17 have been sent direct by parishes. Money sent through our Treasurer amounted to \$2,320.36, making a total of \$3,662.53. A most generous gift of \$10,000 was pledged by a member of the Diocesan Committee toward the erection of a church at St. Nathaniel's Mission, should \$15,000 first be raised for that object.

Our pledge for the support of a woman helper at St. George's was renewed for another year. A deaconess being much needed at St. Nathaniel's Mission, the Diocesan Committee has pledged itself to pay the salary for one year, and a deaconess is now at work in that field.

Appeals have been made to the Diocesan Committee for the Galilee Mission, the Seamen's Mission, Italian Mission and City Mission, and for the work at St. George's, St. Nathaniel's, St. Augustine's, St. Ambrose, St. Barnabas and Epiphany Chapel, formerly called Sherwood Mission, and the Colored League. The Rev. Mr. Phillips also appealed for the Summer Home of the Church of the Crucifixion, which is doing so much for the poor colored people that throng our city.

We also had the pleasure of hearing from our beloved Bishop Whitaker, who told of the great need of our committee, which, by aiding the missions and missionaries of our own diocese, was thereby aiding the Board of Missions. The Bishop's words were a great encouragement to us all, and will no doubt make us more zealous in our work for the coming year.

The Junior Department can report this year a great increase in the interest and faithfulness of its members, and also the addition of thirteen new branches to its roll. We have been delighted to welcome among us also the Girls' Friendly Candidates of the Diocese, who have sent a fine box to Liberia and have reported it through the Junior Auxiliary. Over 1000 Juniors are regularly attending their parish auxiliary meetings, and at the Diocesan Junior meeting on April 6th there was an attendance of nearly 600—the largest number that has ever come to a Junior meeting.

Since December, on every second Thursday of the month, one-half hour of intercession for Junior work and for missions has been held. This gives us the great opportunity of praying together during this one-half hour and also during the month, for it is hoped that every branch will send at least one representative to take back a list of the special intercessions to her own parish. The intercessions are led each time by a different member of the Auxiliary.

It has been agreed by all that our Normal Mission Study Classes led by Miss Hubbard have been the greatest factor in the increased success and interest of the Auxiliary this year. All those who have not attended this normal course should certainly try it next year, to find the help and inspiration it has given to other leaders. Those who attended this year will need no urging to come again.

The leaders of the Auxiliary have met twice during the year—on November 2d and March 14th. On November 2d

Miss Evans presided. Several interesting questions were discussed and the leaders received with great regret the announcement of Miss Evans' and Miss Morris' resignations from the secretaryship of the Auxiliary. Miss Morris was asked to become our honorary secretary and has kindly accepted, so that we still have her valuable help in our work.

We are thankful for the progress of our Junior work and have every reason to look forward to another year of prayer and study and work as full of blessing and of growth as the one God has just given us.
