## REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

---

Three unusually interesting meetings have been held under the direction of the Executive Committee during the past year. At the annual meeting in the Church of the Holy Trinity, the Bishop-coadjutor presided and the Bishops of Hankow, Mississippi, South Dakota and Idaho presented the needs of their work, and, in conclusion, the General Secretary told of the missionary centres he had visited in his trip around the world.

The Epiphany meeting was held in St. James' Church, when the Rev. George Wallace, of Tokyo, spoke to a large congregation. At the Lenten service Bishop Talbot, Rev. E. M. Jefferys, Rev. S. H. Bishop and Mr. John W. Wood made appeals for domestic, diocesan, colored and Indian missions.

In October the President of the Executive Committee, on account of failing health, tendered her resignation to the Bishop, which was accepted. Mrs. Whitaker was the first President of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, and for seventeen years gave it her unfailing service and loving attention. The Executive Committee, valuing keenly her devotion, have made her Honorary President, in order that she may still be connected with the work to which she has given her best endeavor. The vacancy was filled by Mrs. Neilson, whose long service in the work of the Auxiliary, knowledge and enthusiasm fitted her pre-eminently for the position.

In March another loss was sustained in the death of Mrs. Silvester, Chairman of the Diocesan Committee. Called in the midst of her faithful work here to join the Church Expectant, the foundations she has laid will uphold the work as it grows in the future.

The Woman's Auxiliary desires the aid of every Parish and Mission in the Diocese, and hopes that the Clergy will appoint delegates to attend the monthly meetings of the various Committees held at the Church House on the Mondays of each month. These meetings are absorbingly interesting and quicken the zeal of those who come. There have been added to the list twelve parishes this season.

In all parts of the world new opportunities and privileges arise and the United Offering resolution gives the keynote for meeting these responsibilities, "that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers, that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission field."

CONSTITUTION  
OF THE  
Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the  
Board of Missions

---

ARTICLE I.

*Name.*

The name of this Association shall be the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

*Object.*

The object of the Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of Pennsylvania the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.

*Organization.*

To accomplish these various objects this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is organized into five standing Committees—Indians' Hope, Domestic, Foreign, Work among the Colored People, and the Diocesan. The Chairman of each Committee is to be appointed by the Bishop, with the exception of the Indians' Hope, which must follow its own constitution, as it antedates the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV.

*Membership.*

The Church itself is the Missionary Society. Every baptized person is a member of the Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese should be an active member of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.

*Officers.*

The officers of this Association shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, a Treasurer for the United Offering and two officers of the Junior Department. These shall serve for one year and shall be eligible for renomination.

An Annual Meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Wednesday in May, when appointments by the Bishop shall be announced, nominations having been made by written ballot at the previous meeting.

## ARTICLE VI.

### *Executive Committee.*

The general management is entrusted to an Executive Board, composed of the Diocesan officers, the officers of the Standing Committees, the Chairman of the Mexican Work, the Chairman of the Cuban Work, the Assistant Treasurer of the United Offering, and the Librarian.

## ARTICLE VII.

### *Duties of the President.*

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all members of committees necessary for the transacting of the work of the Executive Committee. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees. She shall visit Parish Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary when invited, and seek opportunity to establish branches in parishes where there are none, and fill all other duties pertaining to her office.

## ARTICLE VIII.

### *Duties of the Vice Presidents.*

In the absence of the President a Vice-President shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and fill all duties belonging to the office.

## ARTICLE IX.

### *Secretary.*

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall keep a record of such meetings, and prepare and present Minutes at each meeting. She shall prepare an abstract of the Minutes of the year for the Annual Report. She shall send a copy of the Annual Report to every officer of the Executive Committee to every Rector, Minister in Charge, and Missionary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the President of every Branch throughout the Church.

The Secretary shall advertise public meetings in such ways as seem best.

## ARTICLE X.

### *Treasurer.*

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of the funds belonging to the Executive Committee, and to deposit them in such banking institution as has been selected by the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, to be drawn thence upon the cheque of the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer, for the purpose of the Executive Committee, as ordered by that Committee. All bills sent to the Treasurer must be countersigned by the purchaser before payment. The treasurer shall present an itemized report in writing at each stated meeting of the Executive Committee. She shall prepare a report of all funds in her charge for the Annual Meeting. Her books shall be audited by a Committee appointed by the President. It is recommended that the payments of each standing committee to the Annual Report Fund be made and the books closed by June first of each year.

## ARTICLE XI.

### *Publication Committee.*

The President shall appoint annually a Committee on the publication of the Annual Report, said Committee to consist of the Treasurer and Secretary from each of the five Standing Committees, with a Chairman. This Committee shall receive all copy, typewritten, for the Annual Report and take entire charge of its publication. It shall be the duty of this Committee to estimate amount per page due the Annual Report Fund from each of the five Standing Committees, and the United Offering, after receiving bill from the printer.

The Current Expense Fund of the Executive Committee shall pay for the remaining pages of the Annual Report not belonging to any of the Standing Committees.

## ARTICLE XII.

### *Amendment.*

The Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Committee by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

## ARTICLE XIV.

### *Missionary Services.*

There shall be three missionary services during the year—

1. The all-day service on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.
2. The Epiphany service in behalf of Missions in the foreign field.
3. The Lenten service.

### *Annual Meeting.*

The annual Business Meeting shall be held at noon on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.

**OBJECT OF THE UNITED OFFERING OF 1910.**

*Resolved*, That the United Offering of 1910 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Mission Field; including the training, sending and support of women workers; also the care of such workers when sick and disabled; but that a sum not exceeding \$15,000 be devoted to a building, or buildings, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers, that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission Field.

Forty-second Annual Report

As we once more review the activities of the Indians' Hope during the year just closed, it is encouraging to note the added interest shown in our meeting, as evidenced by the increased attendance as well as by the generous sums of money given towards the work in various parts of the Indian field. Up to the date of the annual meeting in May \$1460 had been sent to the Board of Missions during the year for general work and scholarships, while the treasurer of specials had received \$2254. While this sum is about \$130 less than the total amount collected last year, certain generous gifts were to be counted upon before the books were closed which would make the

total for specials considerably more than the sum received during 1906 and 1907.

Thirty-two boxes were sent to various catechists and others through the Indians' Hope box committee; their total value was \$2403.70, about \$700 less than those sent last year. An Indian scholarship fund of sixty dollars was also completed. This is a new obligation on the part of the Indians' Hope, and it is intended to raise this amount regularly each year as an encouragement to some Indian students studying for the ministry.

New specials were also undertaken in connection with our regular pledges, aggregating about \$650 of the total sum given; of this, \$400 went to Bishop Gray for the hospital in the Everglades of Florida, \$180 was sent to Miss Dickson for a stable for her four-footed missionaries, the faithful little Indian ponies, without which her work would not be possible, and nearly \$70 was sent as a special relief fund to Indians at Rosebud, S. D., who were suffering from lack of food. Later a small balance of this sum was spent for seeds to be used by the Indians in the planting season, a great help to those engaged in farming, to which this people are turning more and more as a means of livelihood.

Work has been done in getting parishes hitherto without representation to send delegates to our meetings; as a result five new parishes have been added. The attendance ranged from thirty in September to one hundred and fifty in January.

Reports have come to us directly from the field through the speakers who have met with us. Archdeacon Stuck, of Alaska, reported that \$5000 had been appropriated from the men's thank offering for a new building at Fort Yukon, where the moral conditions are so bad that Miss Woods is quite unable to cope with them, and where, for lack of a school, she has taken orphan children into her own cramped quarters. Bishop Hare and Mr. Clark reported on the favorable conditions of our church schools in South Dakota and the good influence those who go out from them exert upon their Indian neighbors. Interesting letters came from Bishop Gray describing the splendid work done by the hospital under Dr. Gladden among the natives in the Everglades of Florida, and from Miss Dickson telling of a missionary's experiences in the Indian country and of the discouragements to which they are liable from the present unsettled conditions which surround the lives of the Indians.

Our president left us early in the year for an absence of some months and in parting left these words with us:

"We should look at our giving as an opportunity for service. As members of the Woman's Auxiliary we stand for the spreading of the gospel of Christ, and should think no

gift too large and no sacrifice too great if we can bring the kingdom of God nearer men."

Is it not fitting in closing to adopt these words as a motto for our encouragement in the work of the year to come.

### Thirty-third Annual Report

The close of another of our working years brings to me the duty to tell you what has been done by this Committee for Domestic Missions. I grieve that we have not done more, for truly the needs are great. Everywhere may be seen laborers in the field, worn and weary, trying "to make bricks without straw." I can never forget Bishop Elliott, of Western Texas, as he said to me not long before he died, "It is not the work we do that wears us out—it is what we dare not touch for lack of funds that kills us. Golden opportunities are lost on every side—it breaks our hearts." But why say this to my faithful band, who are doing to their utmost, and by their efforts, comfort and cheer enter many homes. Year by year I have pleaded for more branches, and in the past season I rejoice to tell that twelve more parishes have joined our ranks. Some of them in their earliest infancy, to whom we shall be very tender to all, we extend a hearty welcome. Our record for the year is 130 boxes, valued at \$11,340.70 and \$1409 has been sent direct to the field. Our Treasurer has

received \$7627.35, making in all \$20,377.05—a goodly sum, indeed. We know that much has been sent to New York by many of our good women, who forget how glad we would be to forward it and how well the Pennsylvania Branch deserves their regard, but we thank them heartily for remembering the cause so dear to our hearts.

During the season Bishop Restarick, Bishop Horner, Archdeacon Stuck, the Rev. Mr. Mayo, of Virginia; Rev. Gottfried Hammarskold, and Deaconess Drant have addressed us and kindled our zeal in behalf of their varied work, to which we have given substantial aid.

The completion of the sum of \$3000 for the salary of one missionary bishop fills me with pleasure and gratitude to all who have contributed. I trust that the time is at hand when every branch will desire to have a hand in this. Many parishes support a catechist or one of the clergy—how lovely for us to pay the salary of a bishop! There are a number of parishes who have never failed since 1892—when we assumed this privilege, to contribute. All honor to them. This is direct aid to the Board whose auxiliary we are.

Death has taken from us during the year a most faithful, gracious and devoted delegate, Mrs. Stanley G. Flagg. We miss her presence and generous aid. May light perpetual shine upon her. A new delegate, Mrs. Emily Bowditch, has also been called from earth. Thanking you all very heartily for all your help and cheer, and praying God's blessing on all our work begun, continued and ended in Him.

### Report for the Year

Another milestone in the history of our Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has been past, and we are brought to the close of our thirty-fourth year. The only change in our Board was the election of Mrs. Charles Biddle to fill the place of our faithful vice-president, now President of the Executive Board of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.

At the September meeting we had a corporate communion service, and we wished that more of our members might have been present to hear Rev. Mr. Stanger's earnest words concerning the spiritual side of our work and the challenge to more prayer and earnestness.

To your officers I think the greatest source of satisfaction has been that so nobly have the delegates realized their obligation that there has been no need for the constant reminders of the necessity of meeting the regular pledges.

We have taken upon us three new scholarships in Japan, two in China, and one in a divinity school in Cuba, this last to be called after that devoted churchman, Mr. W. Beaumont Whitney.

We have sent eight dozen beds to the Rev. Mr. Ancell in Soochow, China, for his school, and large quantities of bedding, etc., to St. Luke's Hospital in Shanghai, an organ for a mission in Japan, and several Christmas boxes to Africa and many smaller gifts.

From the Hankow district we have had visits from Miss Clark and Mrs. Roots, telling us of the immediate need of more women to carry on the great work of training Chinese women for Bible readers and nurses in our hospital. They want fourteen such women, and the duty of all Christians was summed up by Mrs. Roots in these words: "Go, let go, or help go." Shall we each ask ourselves which it shall be with us?

From Shanghai Miss Mitchell told us of St. Mary's school for girls and of the great need there is for a library there. From Dr. Jeffreys we heard news of his hospital, which last year ministered to 43,000 patients, and Dr. Lloyd called our attention to the fact that Dr. Jeffreys largely supported his work by fees paid to him by outside patients. From Mexico City Rev. Mr. Haughwout, the dean of the Theological Seminary, brought a pathetic story of the small dark edifice where he is training fifteen students. If more money were forthcoming a wonderful work might be done among the fourteen millions in Mexico, the majority of whom have no religion except a terrible conception of a dead Christ and the owing of all things to the Virgin.

Our Epiphany meeting this year was held at St. James Church on January 19th, when the Rev. Mr. George Wallace told us of some of the radical changes in education, in politics, and in religion that are taking place in Japan. It is of first importance that Christianity assume and continue the leadership of educational work such as Dr. Tucker's at St. Paul's University and St. Margaret's for girl's at Tokio.

Mrs. Merritt brought us cheering news of the stations formerly supported by the Cuban Guild, but now, except for the payment of salaries, are self-supporting, and of the new openings all over the island.

From Africa our only direct news was from a letter written by Miss Woodruff, telling of her long term of service in the girls' school in Liberia. A Mission Study class of St.

Stephen's Church has sent a Christmas box valued at \$125 or more for Mrs. Mooit.

We have sent to Rev. Mr. Muhlenburg a typewriter to assist him in his work of translating the Bible into the Vey language. Several parishes filled a request from Miss Ridgely for washing machines.

A message came from Brazil on the broadening of the work there. At our Lenten meeting Rev. A. G. Mortimer, D. D., made an address on the purpose of the foreign missionary work of the church, calling attention in closing to three things **we** each of us could and should do.

1. Pray for missionaries in the fields that more may go.
2. Get definite knowledge by study that prayer may be explicit.
3. Not only to give ourselves, but make others realize their privilege to help on the work. Thns will colonization and Christianity go hand in hand, and the Kingdom of Christ shall be established in all the world.

So we see fields in Japan, China, Africa, Mexico, Brazil, Cuba—white unto harvest.

"The possibilities of going forward," writes one missionary, "are limited only by the means of going forward. We are not limited in our opportunities, nor in the spirit of God, but in the spirit of the churches towards us."

Bishop Brooks' words should be our challenge: "It is the sincere and deep conviction of my soul when I declare that if the Christian faith does not culminate and complete itself in the effort to make Christ known to all the world that faith appears to me a thoroughly unreal and insignificant thing, destitute of power for the single life and incapable of being convincingly proved to be here."

Is this your conviction and mine?

If so, should we not move forward now?

"Behold now is the accepted time: behold now is the day of salvation."

### Report for the Year

In reviewing the work of our committee during the past year, salaries of teachers paid and augmented, scholarships maintained and boxes sent to the families of missionaries, it is nevertheless, at first sight discouraging, to compare the money receipts with those of last year. We have fallen short by about \$600; but when we reflect that this is due to the fact that large special offerings from individuals have been lacking, and in view of the general financial depression, we have not done ill, in that the parishes have kept up to their mark, and in some cases have gone beyond it.

The year has given us special advantages, too, which it is earnestly hoped will bear fruit in the near future. We had an admirable address from the Bishop of Mississippi at the annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in November. Then in Lent, came the never before enjoyed opportunity of a *Colored Mission Study Class*, led most ably by Mrs. Thomas Roberts, whose laborious research was only equalled by her self-sacrificing devotion and enthusiasm. Last of all, an address at the Lenten missionary meeting by the Rev. Samuel H. Bishop, Field Secretary of the "American Church Institute for

Negroes," upon quite new lines, the speaker dwelling more upon the ethical side of the question; tracing the origin of the negro, demonstrating his actual blood relationship to ourselves of the white race, and pleading most eloquently that he be given the opportunity to make the best of himself, mentally, morally and spiritually.

And indeed in regard to this insistent question, which however we may disallow it, will still confront us at every turn—*What do we mean to do about it?* It is easy to understand that those who go through life idly gazing upon the surface of things only, should turn with ill concealed indifference if not disgust, from the spectacle of the northern or imported negro—insolent, self-assertive and insufferable. This phase is however but a fraction of the whole great question, with which not only we, but our children must reckon, a question insistent, threatening and overwhelming.

The negro is here—he has come to stay—and while one shrinks from appealing to sordid motives only, of those not interested in the spiritual side, it must still be asked—if you do not regard the negro as a man and a brother—are you content that the great black hurricane cloud rolling slowly, but most surely toward you, should engulf you—obliterate you? Do you mean to go under without a struggle? Truly the part of wisdom—philanthropy—Christianity—is to bend every effort toward humanizing and Christianizing the great mass of humanity, which wisely and rightly dealt with, might strengthen and uphold the arms of this great country of their adoption, and which if left to itself must, and will involve it in misery and ruin.

It will also remain a problem to thoughtful persons why those good people who are sufficiently interested in other missionary work, who delight in the picturesque features of the Foreign and Indian fields, and who toil bravely and well to relieve the poor and needy at home, should appear so utterly and avowedly indifferent to this other great claim so loudly knocking at the door of their philanthropy and patriotism.

Let us hope that the lessons of this year may be taken to heart, and bring forth the fruit of well doing in the future.

Before closing this report I would earnestly beg the rectors of the parishes represented upon our committee, to impress upon their delegates when appointing them, the necessity for punctual and regular attendance at the monthly meetings of the committee held upon the first Monday in every month, at the Church House at 11 A. M.

Report for the Year

During the past year, nine meetings of the Diocesan Committee have been held, with an average attendance of 49 delegates. Three new parishes have sent in delegates this year, making a total of 81 parishes in the Diocesan Committee.

In December, the Bishop appointed Mrs. W. W. Montgomery, of Radnor, Pa., as treasurer of our committee, Miss Landell being obliged to resign the office.

Addresses have been made by the Rev. Mr. Prevost, of St. Ambrose Mission, and by the Rev. Mr. McDuffy on his work at St. Augustine Mission, where the communicant roll has increased in two years from 16 to 54 persons.

Mrs. Nicholas Mitchell addressed us, giving us a resume of the meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary in Richmond, stating that of the 7818 parishes of the Protestant Episcopal Church at home and abroad only 3162 have branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, and in the last three years there has only been an increase of 119 branches all over the world.

Rev. Mr. Phillips gave a very interesting address on his work at the Church of the Crucifixion and their Summer Home. Miss Maud Adams also appealed for this work.

Deaconess Colesberry told of her work at St. Martha's House and Deaconess Albyn-Jones gave us a very clear insight into what she is trying to accomplish at St. Nathaniel's.

Miss Blakiston made an appeal for the Home of the Homeless, 1327 Fitzwater Street. Miss Whitehouse spoke at the December meeting of her work at St. Ambrose Mission.

Mrs. George C. Thomas reminded us from time to time of our duty toward the United Offering and asked each member of the committee to take a United Offering mite chest.

The Rev. Mr. Burke, to whom the success of the Valley Forge Memorial Chapel is due, made an appeal for that work.

The Rev. Mr. Jansen, of St. Bartholomew's, said that this mission is eight years old and had labored under the disadvantage of being in the neighborhood of the Municipal Hospital, the dog pound and the potter's field. Now contagious diseases have been removed from the Municipal Hospital, and dwelling houses are going up by the hundred. He emphasized the need of a parish house and said that the longer we put it off the more people we shall lose. A very generous member of the Diocesan Committee has given \$5000 to this object, and with the same amount from her husband will make \$10,000 immediately available. This same "Member of the Diocesan Committee" has paid her pledge of \$10,000 to St. Nathaniel's, which was promised, should \$15,000 more be raised for that work. I am sure that we are all grateful that we can number so invaluable a helper among the members of the Diocesan Committee.

In addition to our pledges the paying of the salary of a Deaconess at St. Ambrose and one at St. George's, which have been renewed, we have added another—that of the salary of a Deaconess at St. Ambrose.

Ninety-three boxes have been sent this year to worthy objects in the diocese, valued at \$2362.76.

The Treasurer's report shows: Receipts, \$8705.90; expenditures, \$8345.93, with a balance on hand of \$359.97.

We have lost by death this year two members of our committee—Mrs. Theodore Morris, who had for so many years represented Holy Trinity Parish, and our much beloved President, Mrs. W. W. Silvester. Mrs. Silvester was the first vice-president of the Diocesan Committee, which was organized in 1898, and in October, 1903, she was appointed president, which office she held until her death on March 14, 1908.

With a full knowledge of the work of the Diocesan Committee, faithful to her trust and with deep sympathy for those who needed help, her loss is keenly felt by every member of the Diocesan Committee, as well as by those who turn to that committee for help.

## JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

### Eighth Annual Report

The Junior Department has held its usual meetings in the spring and autumn, two for its Leaders and two for its Juniors. At the autumn meeting Dr. Lloyd and Bishop Roots addressed the Juniors, of whom there were more than six hundred present, and at the spring meeting Miss Emery spoke. The Central Committee has held its regular meetings, followed by a half hour of intercessions for missions on the second Thursday of each month, and on March 11th Dr. Lloyd conducted a quiet hour for Junior Leaders and older Juniors.

It will be seen in the Treasurer's report that the Pennsylvania Juniors have more than fulfilled their pledge of \$1000 made to the Board of Missions in the autumn. Our apportionment two years ago was \$450, and last year \$600 (a sum which was raised with great difficulty), so that in two years it has been more than doubled. Some new branches have joined our ranks, so that we now number sixty-seven in all, and we have been very glad to have the help of three Chapters of the Brotherhood of St. Paul. This added assistance, however, does not count for the fact that the \$1000 apportionment this year was made up with far less trouble than the \$600 last year. The only possible explanation of this is that the Juniors' interest and real concern for the spread of our Lord's Kingdom have been strengthened more than ever before.
