REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

This year of the Woman's Auxiliary in the diocese of Pennsylvania has been made memorable by the death of its late Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Ozi W. Whitaker, D. D., LL. D., who was always the just and conscientious friend to all woman's work. The resolution passed by the Executive Committee in regard to him appears on another page.

A scholarship in memory of Mrs. Julia C. Whitaker was established in the Church Training and Deaconess House two years ago, and its managers report the training of a student who has done excellent work and is to become a missionary in the Indian field. It has, in addition, helped another student who expects to go to Mexico.

During the year three meetings have been held, all of them in the parish of the Holy Trinity. The first was the annual meeting, which began as usual with a celebration of the Holy Communion, and was followed by addresses from the Bishops of Western Colorado, South Carolina, Tokyo and Alaska. At the conference in the parish house Mrs. Pancoast gave an account of the triennial meetings in Cincinnati, Miss Brock spoke of the work of the Juniors at the General Convention, Mrs. Markoe made an appeal for the United Offering, and Mrs. Mitchell spoke of the Prayer League.

The second meeting was the Epiphany Conference of the Foreign Committee, an account of which appears in its report. At the Lenten meeting the Rev. H. C. McHenry spoke of the activities of the City Mission; the Rev. A. G. Mortimer, D. D., on behalf of work among the colored people and their receptiveness to Church teaching; Bishop Thomas, of Wyoming, on the needs of the domestic field, and the Rev. Hugh Burleson, on work among the Indians.

In addition to these, and in connection with the Women's Jubilee, an enthusiastic rally of those connected with the Episcopal Church was held in the parish house of the Holy Trinity, over which Mrs. J. Nicholas Mitchell most ably presided. Interesting addresses were made by Miss Neely, of Japan, and Mrs. Staunton, of the Philippines, and by two volunteers for the foreign mission field.

The Auxiliary in this diocese is very grateful to the Board of Missions for their recent action in substituting for the old method "the plan for making apportionment to be dis-

tributed by the diocesan authorities to the parishes as units, including the Sunday School Auxiliary and the Woman's Auxiliary."

During the year five new parish branches have been added to the Woman's Auxiliary, and eleven to the Juniors, to whom a cordial welcome is extended, but it is very sad that, as year after year passes, there are so few missionary volunteers from this great diocese, and the women of the Church are urged to pray constantly that "God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission Field."

NECROLOGY.

Rt. Rev. Ozi W. Whitaker, D. D.

We, the members of the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, desire to give expression to our sense of the loss which, in common with the Diocese of Pennsylvania and the whole Church, we have sustained in the death of our beloved Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Ozi W. Whitaker, D. D., on February 9, 1911.

Bishop Whitaker's service in the episcopate was unremitting for forty-two years, seventeen of which were spent in the missionary district of Nevada, facing with undaunted courage the strenuous demands of that pioneer jurisdiction, and laying foundations deep and abiding for an educational influence on the womanhood of Nevada, which rejoices today "in calling him blessed."

For nearly twenty-five years the Diocese of Pennsylvania has been privileged to be under the ecclesiastical leadership of Bishop Whitaker, and he has given himself freely and generously for its growth and advancement. Under all circumstances he has stood so fast in the freedom of Christian liberty that his entire career has been an embodiment of "love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance."

To the interests of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary our dear Bishop always gave a sympathiz-

ing ear. His large missionary experience, acquired on the western frontier, gave him a consecrated knowledge and purpose, the outcome of his vicissitudes. The missionary spirit was always predominant whenever the call of the Master came.

His whole life was given to the good of humanity, and when approached on public movements, involving social, economic, or moral conditions of the community at large, he gave a ready response of practical sympathy and counsel.

Be it resolved, That a copy of this memorial be sent to the family of the late Bishop, be published in the Church papers, and placed on our own records.

Miss Mary W. Paul.

On January 5, 1911, Miss Mary W. Paul, beloved and mourned by all who knew her. She was a delegate to the Colored Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, and will long be missed by her associates. In her last will, she bequeathed one thousand dollars to the Domestic Committee, which, by a unanimous vote, will be held as the Mary W. Paul Memorial Fund—thus gratefully perpetuating her name among us.

CONSTITUTION.

OF THE

Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE I.

Name.

The name of this Association shall be the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Object.

The object of the Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of Pennsylvania the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.

Organization.

To accomplish these various objects this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is organized into five standing Committees—Indians' Hope, Domestic, Foreign, Work among the Colored People, and the Diocesan. The Chairman of each Committee is to be appointed by the Bishop, with the exception of the Indians' Hope, which must follow its own constitution, as it antedates the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV.

Membership.

The Church itself is the Missionary Society. Every baptized person is a member of the Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese should be an active member of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.

Officers.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, a Treasurer for the United Offering and two officers of the Junior Department. These shall serve for one year and shall be eligible for renomination.

An Annual Meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Wednesday in May, when appointments by the Bishop shall be announced, nominations having been made by written ballot at the previous meeting.

ARTICLE VI.

Executive Committee.

The general management is entrusted to an Executive Board, composed of the Diocesan officers, the officers of the Standing Committees, the Chairman of the Mexican Work, the Chairman of the Cuban Work, the Assistant Treasurer of the United Offering, and the Librarian.

ARTICLE VII.

Duties of the President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all members of committees necessary for the transacting of the work of the Executive Committee. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees. She shall visit Parish Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary when invited, and seek opportunity to establish branches in parishes where there are none and fill all other duties pertaining to her office.

ARTICLE VIII.

Duties of the Vice-Presidents.

In the absence of the President, a Vice-President shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and fill all duties belonging to the office.

ARTICLE IX.

Secretary.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall keep a record of such meetings, and prepare and present Minutes at each meeting. She shall prepare an abstract of the Minutes of the year for the Annual Report. She shall send a copy of the Annual Report to every officer of the Executive Committee, to every Rector, Minister in Charge, and Missionary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the President of every Branch throughout the Church.

The Secretary shall advertise public meetings in such ways as seem best.

ARTICLE X.

Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of the funds belonging to the Executive Committee, and to deposit them in such banking institution as has been selected by the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, to be drawn thence upon the cheque of the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer, for the purpose of the Executive Committee, as ordered by that Committee. All bills sent to the Treasurer must be countersigned by the purchaser before payment. The Treasurer shall present an itemized report in writing at each stated meeting of the Executive Committee. She shall prepare a report of all funds in her charge for the Annual Meeting. Her books shall be audited by a Committee appointed by the President. It is recommended that the payments of each standing committee to the Annual Report Fund be made and the books closed by June first of each year.

ARTICLE XI.

Publication Committee.

The President shall appoint annually a Committee on the Publication of the Annual Report, said Committee to consist of the Treasurer and Secretary from each of the five Standing Committees, with a Chairman. This Committee shall receive all copy, typewritten, for the Annual Report, and take entire charge of its publication. It shall be the duty of this Committee to estimate amount per page due the Annual Report Fund from each of the five Standing Committees, and the United Offering, after receiving bill from the printer.

The Current Expense Fund of the Executive Committee shall pay for the remaining pages of the Annual Report not belonging to any of the Standing Committees.

ARTICLE XII.

Amendment.

The Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Committee by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

ARTICLE XIV.

Missionary Services.

There shall be three missionary services during the year—
1. The all-day service on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.
2. The Epiphany service in behalf of Missions in the foreign field.
3. The Lenten service.

ARTICLE XV.

Annual Meeting.

The annual Business Meeting shall be held at noon on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.

United Offering of the Pennsylvania Branch of the
Woman's Auxiliary.

OBJECT OF THE OFFERING OF 1913.

RESOLVED:—That the United Thank-Offering of 1913 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Mission Field, including the training, testing, sending and support of woman workers; also the care of such workers when sick or disabled; but that a sum not exceeding \$20,000 be devoted to buildings for the use of woman workers, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission Field, or, if they cannot go themselves, to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

Another year of effort, the forty-ninth in the history of the Indians' Hope, has drawn to its close. The interest in the work carried on by this committee has been well maintained, both in regard to giving to the various causes for which appeal is made, and in attendance at our meetings. The Treasurer's receipts for the present year were \$1,725.97, as compared with last year, this sum shows a loss of \$764.36, but last

year's balance included a legacy of \$1,000, which, if deducted from the total amount, would leave a gain of over \$200 in actual gifts for the present year.

The amount received for specials in 1910 was \$4,622.57. This year, the sum of \$6,853.07 has been received, a gain of \$2,230.50.

The number of delegates at our September and December meetings is always small, but a high average has been maintained, ranging from 70 to 110 at all other monthly meetings. It is a pity that some earnest effort cannot be made to have delegates sent from the large number of parishes not represented with us, that increased interest in Indian Missions and larger giving might naturally result from a more extended membership.

The chief work of the year has been the raising of funds to help rebuilt St. Mary's school, destroyed last fall by fire. The regular specials have been kept up, and, in addition to this, the sum of \$3,926 has been raised for this purpose. The school is being carried on at present under very inadequate conditions, and it is hoped that Bishop Johnson may have all the money in hand for rebuilding within the next few months.

Another very important special has been the Memorial Fund to Bishop Hare, to endow All Saints' School. It is a great gratification to the friends of the Indians that Bishop *Johnson was elected in the early part of the year to succeed the late Bishop Hare, as they feel sure that the work for the Indians will be carried on in the same unselfish spirit, and with the same consecration which he ever showed.

Bishop Thomas' work among the Arapahoes and Shoshones, in Wyoming, begun last year, is prospering in a very wonderful way. The two women sent out, partly through the Indians' Hope, are doing a splendid work in gaining the hearts of these alien peoples. At a recent meeting, the bishop told of the progress being made and of the unselfish labors of the Rev. John Roberts for more than twenty years.

Appeal has been made from Key West, where fire has destroyed St. Paul's, and from the missionary at Duluth, for help to increase and enlarge their work. Should we not feel, as the old work prospers, the call to interest ourselves in new fields of usefulness, that the bounds of Christ's kingdom may be enlarged?

One of our missionaries, addressing us recently, said: "Personal service is the greatest thing any of us can give.

Let it be our endeavor in the coming year to give ourselves more freely, and with greater zeal to the spread of the kingdom, and to the bringing of the blessings of the gospel to our Indian tribes.

In closing our thirty-seventh year of our work for Missions, we are happy to find no sign of loss of interest in the blessed cause. We have never, in one season, had such a succession of delightful addresses, and our meetings have never been more largely attended. Bishop Johnson, of South Dakota; Bishop Webb, of Milwaukee; Bishop Atwood, of Arizona; Bishop Guerry, of South Carolina; Bishop Thomas, of Wyoming; Fr. Hughson, of Sewanee; Dr. Thomson, of Kentucky; Rev. J. A. Staunton, from the Philippines, have all added to our knowledge of these varied fields, and stirred our zeal to make us more eager to help in this beautiful work. Mr. Hughson, too, has enlisted more helpers in the hospital, it being the only one for miles around it.

One hundred and twenty-two boxes have gone out on their errands of love to cheer and comfort those in the field; their value is \$10,715.43. Seven hundred and forty-six dollars has been sent direct by the parishes, and our Treasurer reports that \$10,815.50 has passed through her hands, making a total of \$22,326.93, \$1,000 of this sum is the legacy of the late Miss Mary W. Paul, to this committee, who has thus shown her

interest in our work, for which we are most grateful. It is only the second time in our history that we have thus been remembered.

We have once more given to the Board the real proof that we count ourselves its auxiliary by sending to it the salary of one Missionary Bishop. This is not the most popular fund we appeal for, but I count it, with pride, among our achievements. The need for help in the Domestic Field has never been so great as it is today. The last General Convention created five new Domestic Missionary Districts, and so added the new Bishops elected to take charge of them to the list of those whom it is our joy and privilege to help in this work. The census of 1910 showed that the vast increase in population in the last decade in our country has been chiefly in our Mountain States, and on the Pacific Slope. The great influx of immigration, too, should awaken the sense of the danger of neglect as they pour in upon us from every nation in the world until the million mark is passed in a single year. If we are to continue in the list of Christian people, we must bestir ourselves, ere it is too late, and learn that Domestic Missions are our heavy responsibility, while Foreign are our high privilege.

I do not appeal to the members of this committee to increase their interest and enlarge their gifts, but I do beg them to bring recruits to the service. I am happy to say that seven new Parish Branches have been added this year.

On the 9th of February, full of years and of honors, our beloved Diocesan, Bishop Ozi W. Whitaker, departed this life. He had been deprived of his dear wife, and had become nearly blind, as he lingered for months. A beautiful example of a perfect Christian. The whole diocese mourns his loss, for everybody loved him. His successor in office, thought highly to honor the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese by delegating to it the privilege of collecting the money for his memorial. I grieve to say that the returns so far have not been worthy of the object. Many of the parishes seem to have had the idea that members of the Woman's Auxiliary only were privileged to subscribe, though the Bishop's letter especially asks that every man, woman and child should help.

Another sorrow comes to us in the resignation of Bishop Mackay-Smith. He has been the champion of all missionary work; the true friend of the Auxiliary, and we shall never forget his kindness and his help. We hopefully anticipate his

return to health, when relieved from the care of everyone but himself.

Grateful for another year of added service.

This year will always stand prominent in the history of Missions, as having witnessed two of the largest and most far-reaching of movements to promote Unity and the Knowledge of Missions. The World Missionary Conference at Edinburgh, with delegates from all over the world, and the Woman's Foreign National Jubilee have swept from West to East in the United States. Both have been great influences, in making thousands realize their personal responsibility for the task which Christ left for us—the evangelization of the world. That the non-Christian world is known today as it never has been before, and that the minds of the people are open and favorable to the urgency of the present situation was brought to us in September, when Bishop Roots spoke of the rapid growth of the work in the Diocese of Hankow, especially amongst the girls, and urged the need of more helpers.

On October 1st we held our service of Yearly Intercession with a corporate Communion Service, and an earnest address from Rev. Robert Johnson.

Later, we heard from Dr. Jeffreys, who told us that since he had spoken to us before, seven years ago, St. Luke's Hospital, Shanghai, had ministered to half a million of suffering mortals.

Mr. Steel brought us encouraging news of Cuba, with its 17 churches, schools, and a native offering of \$9,000.

Rev. Mr. Watson urged us to remember the thousands of young American men who were settling in that great neighbor, of ours, Mexico, and the necessity that their spiritual needs be looked after, which, with the Church's present equipment, is impossible. Small church buildings are needed everywhere.

From far-away Brazil Bishop Kinsolving told of his wonderful corps of 21 native priests ministering to the poor, ignorant people in 39 places, with such a Christ-like spirit that even the Roman Catholic priests do not dare to live their sensual lives in places where the church is established.

On January 16th we had an interesting glimpse of our work in Haiti, near where Columbus landed, and were ashamed that the harvest there had so few to work it.

Dr. Glenton pictured to us her busy life in her hospital at Wuchang, and the Chinese girls who have made such splendid nurses.

Just when the Jubilee was visiting our city, and our big committee of church women, two from each parish, were talking and praying that our collection for St. Margaret's School, Tokyo, might be large, Rev. Robert Andrews came to tell us of the needs of Japan, especially for church schools, saying, that last year out of 18 children he sent to Tokyo to be educated, all who went to church schools became Christians, and none who entered Government schools.

In April Miss Neely gave us a vivid description of life in the interior, and of the help a Japanese Bible woman, such as are being trained in our school at Sendai, is in helping with language, and keeping in touch with all absent members, etc.

Our meeting during Lent was made memorable by a wonderful and spiritual address by Father Officer on the 32d chapter of Genesis. At our closing meeting we heard again from Deaconess Stewart, of the need of workers and money for Hankow Diocese. Very many letters of thanks and some appeals have come to us. We sent an organ to Mr. McGinnis

in Japan, a fine typewriter to Rev. R. L. Andrews, and books for the Boone University Library.

Our annual meeting was held at Holy Trinity Church, November 11th, with Bishop McKim as speaker, and at Epiphany we had a helpful service of intercession, and a conference on how to increase interest in Foreign Missions in our Diocesan Branches.

Our President has always been at her post graciously guiding us. She has formed a new Committee on Literature, and increased the Committee on Cuban Missions.

Our most efficient Chairman on Mexico, Miss Schott, having had to resign, Mrs. Samuel Jones has taken her place, by appointment of the Bishop.

The Box Committee has done fine work, as will be shown by their separate report.

Our pledges have all been met, but no new work undertaken. The Jubilee Collection amounted to \$4,360.15 for St. Margaret's, Tokyo, and is to be used for a new assembly hall, to be called the Philadelphia Jubilee Hall.

We have welcomed three new branches of Auxiliaries, and wish every parish in the diocese could be numbered among us. We miss several who have been faithful to us here, especially would we mention Mrs. Jabez Gates, who died in the winter.

In closing a report which shows that we have had the opportunity to intelligently *see* our distinct Missionary responsibility. Shall we ask ourselves, Will the Church rise to take advantage of this Opportunity? The cause of Christ is straightened not by the Holy Spirit, not by the heathen, but only by ourselves. Surely, we believe, with Father Hecket, that "a body of free men, who love God with all their might, and yet know how to cling together, could conquer this modern world of ours." We can do it if we will.

The routine work of this committee consists of furnishing boxes for Missionaries on small stipends, scholarships for promising pupils at our larger schools, beside regular contributions towards the current expenses of three schools, and salaries of the teachers, when we can raise the money.

These fundamental needs are supplied by the faithful Parish Delegates, whose efforts cannot be overestimated. They have for many years supported a scholarship at the Bishop Payne Divinity School, Petersburg, Va., paid the salaries of two teachers in the Missionary District of Asheville; given a scholarship to Bishop Nelson, of Atlanta, and carried five or six scholarships at St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, and St. Pauls' School, Lawrenceville, Va.

When special appeals have aroused the sympathy of the committee the response has been very gratifying, as for instance when Bishop Guerry came to make the address at our annual Missionary meeting, hoping to raise nine hundred dollars for the colored work in his diocese, he was given twelve hundred dollars. He left us much encouraged by his report of the interest now felt by the white people of the South in the progress of the negroes.

Perhaps the most interesting work we undertook was the raising of \$250 for the endowment of one "day's" expenses

in perpetuity, at St. Agnes' Hospital, Raleigh. We began with a contribution of \$50 from one person, and thirty-one parishes gave from one dollar upwards. The response was quick and sympathetic, and the date chosen was the birthday of Bishop Whitaker, for our Memorial Day.

When it became known in November that \$5,000 of the United Offering was donated to building a Girls' Dormitory at St. Augustine's School, Raleigh, as a memorial to Mr. Geo. C. Thomas, other gifts came in for the same purpose, thus showing the force of good example.

In view of the fact that Mr. and Mrs. Hunter, and Arch-deacon Russell have devoted more than twenty-five years to strenuous and heroic labor among the colored people, with such admirable results, it would seem advisable that our chief efforts during the coming year should be directed toward increasing the endowment of St. Paul's and St. Augustine's Schools, and St. Agnes' Hospital.

Our greatest encouragement, however, comes from the field itself. The new South, we are told, now approves our Church Schools, and is beginning to contribute to them. In proof of this we hear of a Southern lady who sends the daughters of one of her former slaves to St. Augustine's School, and of young business men in Richmond and Norfolk, who contribute to St. Paul's School because of the good work done by its trades pupils, and of the President of the Board of Commerce in Brunswick, Ga., expressing regret at the departure of the colored clergyman from the town.

Let our appeals for aid be based upon a knowledge of what has already been achieved, and let us never forget that very much more remains to be done before we shall have accomplished a tithe of our duty as Christians towards the colored race, who have such just claims upon our brotherly kindness and ministrations.

During the past ten years our city has so changed with thousands of immigrants and colored people pouring into it that the problems of the Diocesan Committee are not the small ones they were in the beginning, thirteen years ago. They have become many and serious, so much so that the officers and delegates feel, at times, almost helpless and hopeless. Less money is given to this committee than to any other, and the number of parishes sending delegates is also smaller. Why is this? Surely, if we stop and think we must feel that "home" is our first care and responsibility.

Please, readers, *do think* of your City of "Brotherly Love?" Do you realize that we have 105,000 colored persons to be looked after? Our committee is trying its best to care for as many of these as possible through the Church of the Crucifixion with its summer home, and giving all the aid it can to the hundreds suffering from tuberculosis; St. Augustine's Mission doing wonderful work in the northern part of the city, as well as St. Barnabas and St. Thomas', St. Michael and All Angels, The Home for the Homeless, House of the Holy Child, and many more.

Do you realize that in our own city we have Foreign Missions which involve greater problems than those of Africa and Asia? We have more than 100,000 Italians, only about 2,000 of which go to the Roman Church, the rest are for the Protestant churches to care for; we have in the northern part of the city thousands of Russians, Poles, Greeks, Syrians,

Armenians, Servians and Roumanians, all of these ministered to by one church, with so small an income that both the rector and his wife are breaking down. We send Missionaries abroad, but at home cannot give a helper to such a work as this.

We have Jews all about us as ignorant as the day they landed, some not speaking one word of English after being in the country 25 years. Then we have all our city mission work; to the seamen, helping them to be better men on land and water; the Galilee Mission, saving many men and women from the lowest forms of degradation; the numerous charities under the City Mission; the Lighthouse Work in Kensington, giving pure, social life to thousands of mill workers, who had only the streets, saloons or dance halls in which to spend their leisure hours until these clubs were started for them; St. Martha's House, with its dispensary, visiting nurse, library, classes of all kinds, doing good to so many in the southern part of the city. We also do what we can to help the blind through the Society for the Promotion of Church Work among the Blind. If my readers could only hear the pathetic stories of Mr. John Thomson, of the thousands shut up in a dark cell, waking and going to sleep just the same every day in the year, with almost nothing to do; think of the years of solitude. Besides all these, we have our many Church Missions, all needing help sorely, their rectors urging us to allow them to present their cause to the committee, which we do when we can, but for what? a few dollars at most, so little when they need so much. Is this right? Should we not be given more money, and have delegates from *every* parish in the diocese? Is it just that those at our door be overlooked for those at a distance?

We have, to our great sorrow, been obliged during the past year to give up paying the salary of our parish workers. Why? because the money did not come in, next year the question must be seriously considered whether we can continue to pay the salaries of the remaining two parish workers, whether to continue this or distribute our small income among more objects.

Please pray for the work at home. If you will do this faithfully it will prosper, and the Diocesan Committee will be filled with renewed courage and strength to go on, even in its small way to bring help and light to those who need them in our own diocese.

Report.

With a new officer to break in, the Junior Department began its winter in a rather chaotic condition, but things simmered down in time, and by May everything was running without a hitch.

The leaders again accepted the apportionment of \$1,500, and attended in moderate, but very enthusiastic numbers the conferences on the first Saturday in each month, which were on. The work of the coming year, Organization, Problems, the Qualifications and Preparation of a Leader, the Board of Missions, the Junior's Working: Why? Where? Accomplishments, and they had the real privilege of hearing the Right Rev. Joseph M. Francis, Bishop of Indianapolis, at the Annual Corporate Communion Service, and at the conferences later in the year Miss Alice Lindley, of New York, and Miss Katharine Scott, of Baltimore.

There were three general meetings: The "Rosebud Meeting," the Lenten Service, at which we had the most beautiful and inspiring addresses by the Rev. Hugh L. Burleson, and the annual meeting of the Junior officers, in the spring. Number of Branches represented, 26; attendance, 50.

One of the best features of the year's work was "Sectional Week," for which we were lent Miss Clara J. Neely, of Japan, who played her part of informer and enthuser so admirably. Statistics: 9 meetings; number of Branches represented, 29; attendance, 1,100.

There have been three normal study classes, in which were ninety members, twenty-four of whom were Junior Leaders.

There are 68 Branches in the diocese, with the immediate prospect of many more. We visited, or came in contact through our Sectional Meetings, 59. And of the 13 new Branches two of the best came through the Jubilee.

We feel that in every way our work has deepened and taken more of a hold, and we look forward in pleasure and hope to the next year.
