REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The past year has been full of lights and shadows, first the consecration of the Bishop Coadjutor and the Bishop Suffragan on St. Simon and St. Jude's Day, then in less than three short weeks the sudden death of the Rt. Rev. Alexander Mackay-Smith, D.D., the Bishop of Pennsylvania. He had presided at our annual meeting held in the Church of the Holy Trinity on November 10th, although suffering physically, and we shall always remember gratefully his unfailing interest in our work. On that day we had the added privilege of having with us the Bishop Coadjutor and the Bishop Suffragan. Addresses were made by the Bishops of Salina and of South Dakota, the Bishop-elect of Kyoto and the Rev. W. A. R. Goodwin. At the conference the new bishops were presented to us and Miss Sibley spoke of the work in the Philippines, where she had spent a year as a substitute for a missionary home on furlough.

On December 11th, a conference of the Bishops of the Diocese, the Rectors, the Executive Committee and the Parish officers was held to consider how the Woman's Auxiliary may best help in raising the sum apportioned to the diocese by the Board of Missions. Bishop Garland presided and opened the conference by outlining a very definite plan, and it was decided that each Parish president shall consult her rector to find out the amount to be raised by the parish and then ask her branch to help as far as possible, without neglecting "Specials," and that a statement of the money sent through the Committees of the Auxiliary at the Church House shall be reported monthly to the rector or the accounting warden of each parish by the parish treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary. Blanks have been printed for this purpose and can be had at the Church House.

The Epiphany meeting was held at Christ Church on January 22d. The Rev. Dr. Perry presided, and the Rev. Hugh Burleson and the Rev. J. A. Welbourn spoke in behalf of missions in the foreign field. Bishop Garland presided at the Lenten meeting in the Church of Holy Trinity on March 21st, when the Bishops of Spokane and Eastern Oklahoma, the Rev. E. M. Frank and the Rev. Dr. McGuire spoke of their work.

Compared with the corresponding period of the United Offering of 1910, the amount is not so large, but we still have another year before the Triennial in 1913 in which to express more adequately what "a joyful and pleasant thing it is to be thankful."

Four new parish branches have been added to our number this season, and to them we extend a cordial welcome.

We have to record the resignation of our First Vice-President, on account of her change of residence. This was accepted with the deepest regret, for Mrs. Mackay-Smith has been a most valuable officer, and we shall miss her wise judgment and ever-ready help.

From all the many changes of the past, we turn for guidance in the future to our new leader, Bishop Rhinelander, with loyalty and appreciation of the interest he has already shown in our work, and to Bishop Garland, our friend of long standing, and in the years to come may we all be "of one heart and of one soul, united in one holy bond of truth and peace, of faith and charity," in our blessed service for the Master.

Rt. Rev. Alexander Mackay-Smith, D.D.

The Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, for the second time within the current year, has been called to take action on the loss of another diocesan head of the episcopate of Pennsylvania, the Rt. Rev. Alexander Mackay-Smith, D.D.

Among the many testimonies to the memory of Bishop Mackay-Smith which mark his career as bishop, parish priest, philanthropist, benefactor, citizen and friend, none inspires a deeper sense of gratitude than his untiring and self-sacrificing efforts in presiding at the missionary services and conferences of the Woman's Auxiliary in this diocese. Very soon after his consecration as Bishop-Coadjutor this organization became his especial care, because of the sudden prostration of the late Bishop Whitaker, and in the years which followed he never failed to be ready with his counsel and advice. At the last annual service and conference, on November 10, 1911, he presided as bishop of the diocese, and those who were privileged to be present will never forget his wonderful spiritual courage under physical disabilities.

This faithful soldier and saint obeyed literally the divine command, "Occupy till I come," until at last on the threshold of the Advent season, on November 16, 1911, "in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye," the call of the Master came, and Bishop Mackay-Smith was at rest.

On behalf of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, the Executive Committee, with a realizing sense of its great loss, tenders its earnest and affectionate sympathy to Mrs. Mackay-Smith, its beloved Vice-President, and her family.

CONSTITUTION
OF THE
Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the
Board of Missions.

ARTICLE I.

Name.

The name of this Association shall be the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Object.

The object of the Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of Pennsylvania the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.

Organization.

To accomplish these various objects this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is organized into five standing Committees—Indians' Hope, Domestic, Foreign, Work Among the Colored People, and the Diocesan. The Chairman of each Committee is to be appointed by the Bishop, with the exception of the Indians' Hope, which must follow its own constitution, as it antedates the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV.

Membership.

The Church itself is the Missionary Society. Every baptized person is a member of the Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese should be an active member of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.

Officers.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, a Treasurer for the United Offering, three officers of the Junior Department and two officers of the Babies' Branch. These shall serve for one year and shall be eligible for renomination. The Board shall have power to fill all vacancies which may occur during the year for the unexpired term.

An Annual Meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the first Wednesday in May, when appointments by the Bishop shall be announced, nominations having been made by written ballot at the previous meeting.

ARTICLE VI.

Executive Committee in Mexico and Brazil

The general management is entrusted to an Executive Board, composed of the Diocesan officers, the officers of the Standing Committees, the Chairman of the work in Mexico and Brazil, the Chairman of the work in Cuba, the Assistant Treasurer of the United Offering, and the Librarian.

ARTICLE VII.

Duties of the President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all members of committees necessary for the transacting of the work of the Executive Committee. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees. She shall visit Parish Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary when invited, and seek opportunity to establish branches in parishes where there are none and fill all other duties pertaining to her office.

ARTICLE VIII.

Duties of the Vice-Presidents.

In the absence of the President, a Vice-President shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and fill all duties belonging to the office.

ARTICLE IX.

Secretary.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall keep a record of such meetings, and prepare and present Minutes at each meeting. She shall prepare an abstract of the Minutes of the year for the Annual Report. She shall send a copy of the Annual Report to every officer of the Executive Committee, to every Rector, Minister in Charge, and Missionary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the President of every Branch throughout the Church.

The Secretary shall advertise public meetings in such ways as seem best.

ARTICLE X.

Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of the funds belonging to the Executive Committee, and to deposit them in such banking institution as has been selected by the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, to be drawn thence upon the cheque of the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer, for the purpose of the Executive Committee, as ordered by that Committee. All bills sent to the Treasurer must be countersigned by the purchaser before payment. The Treasurer shall present an itemized report in writing at each stated meeting of the Executive Committee. She shall prepare a report of all funds in her charge for the Annual Meeting. Her books shall be audited by a Committee appointed by the President. It is recommended that the payments of each standing committee to the Annual Report Fund be made and the books closed by June first of each year.

ARTICLE XI.

Publication Committee.

The President shall appoint annually a Committee on the Publication of the Annual Report, said Committee to consist of the Treasurer and Secretary from each of the five Standing Committees, with a Chairman. This Committee shall receive all copy, typewritten, for the Annual Report, and take entire charge of its publication. It shall

be the duty of this Committee to estimate amount per page due the Annual Report Fund from each of the five Standing Committees, and the United Offering, after receiving bill from the printer.

The Current Expense Fund of the Executive Committee shall pay for the remaining pages of the Annual Report not belonging to any of the Standing Committees.

ARTICLE XII.

Amendment.

The Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Committee by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

ARTICLE XIV.

Missionary Services.

There shall be three missionary services during the year—

1. The all-day service on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.
2. The Epiphany service in behalf of Missions in the foreign field.
3. The Lenten service.

ARTICLE XV.

Annual Meeting.

The annual Business Meeting shall be held at noon on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.

United Offering of the Pennsylvania Branch of the
Woman's Auxiliary.

OBJECT OF THE OFFERING OF 1913.

RESOLVED:—That the United Thank-Offering of 1913 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Mission Field, including the training, testing, sending and support of woman workers; also the care of such workers when sick or disabled; but that a sum not exceeding \$20,000 be devoted to buildings for the use of woman workers, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission Field, or, if they cannot go themselves to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

INDIANS' HOPE REPORT.

The year just closing has been a very active one in the Indians' Hope. We have had more than the usual number of speakers at our meetings, a good attendance, ranging from seventy to one hundred and more, has been maintained except in the months of September, December and May; and our gifts through the treasurer and to specials compare very favorably with those of last year.

The total amount which has passed through the hands of the treasurer this year is \$1,553.73; the amount received for specials is \$4,021.30. While this sum is \$2,831.77 less this year than last, this is explained by the fact that last year there was a very large special collected for rebuilding St. Mary's at Rosebud. The amount given for that purpose amounted to almost the sum total for the current year. Making allowance for this we have done even a little better with our collection for 1911-1912.

All boxes were taken; their total valuation is \$2,628.57, and all scholarships were completed.

Six missionary bishops have brought us news from their several districts, in some cases news of encouragement and progress, in others of difficulty in maintaining work already begun, as in Utah and Florida, because of lack of funds. Bishop Thomas told us of the difficulty of reaching the Shoshones by Christian teaching; and of the larger problem which work among the Indians presents because of the lack of a substitute and incentive for the old life of war and the chase. Through the generosity of a few of our members he is enabled to start new and much-needed work among the Arapahoes.

The year has been marked by the resignation of Bishop Johnson from the charge of South Dakota; but a new bishop has been appointed who seems by his long experience of Indian character and Indian problems eminently fitted for the task and prepared to carry it forward in a spirit of consecration and devotion to the highest ideals. Miss Dickson, after years of faithful service at Chamberlain, S. D., is to be retired in a house of her own, which is later to revert to the diocese.

Bishop Robinson told us of the encouraging outlook for the future of the Piute Indians in Nevada. They are becoming quite successful farmers and cattle-raisers, are interested in the church and send their children to Sunday-school. He would like to raise money to rebuild one of their churches, recently burned, to their great distress.

Very little has been heard from Alaska, but a letter from Miss Sabine gives a cheerful picture of her life of helpfulness to the natives at Anvik.

Dean Burleson addressed the March meeting, emphasizing the adjustment the Indian must undergo before he becomes a part of our national life, and of the difficulties ahead of him as a competitor with the white man. He spoke of the 50,000 unevangelized Indians, the greater part of them being in California.

Bishop Darlington and Mr. Hall, of the Y. M. C. A., have told us of the dangers from which the Indian children at Carlisle suffer for lack of spiritual oversight and training. No religion being taught in the government schools, the children receive no spiritual care unless from some Christian who may be placed there among them. The Y. M. C. A. proposes to have at Carlisle a secretary who shall be a churchman and shall interest himself in the religious care of the boys; while Bishop Darlington plans to send a deaconess there one day in the week from Mr. Bullitt's church in Harrisburg to have the oversight of the girls. The money needed for her support has been subscribed by individual parishes, the auxiliary at Harrisburg helping; and something else has also been given for the Y. M. C. A. secretary, who will be only partially supported by the Indians' Hope. This represents a new line of work for the coming year. New work has also been undertaken among the Karoks in California who have until now been without religious training. A special gift of \$1,200 has been sent to Bishop Moreland for this purpose.

St. Mary's school has been re-opened in a fine new building, and this was made possible largely through the gifts of our branch.

With so much that is encouraging in the outlook for the future, may we not go forward trusting in larger results in the year to come, carrying help and uplift in the name of the Master to those who still "sit in darkness" in Indian lands, believing more and more that it is His work and will receive His reward.

The year just passed has indeed been a memorable one to us all. Within a week after the Annual Meeting in November, our most kind and faithful friend, our Beloved Bishop, passed from the sufferings and cares of this mortal life to "the rest that remaineth to the people of God." We shall not soon forget him. Among his latest acts is the letter he wrote to our Secretary in response to the thanks we had sent him, by her hand, which will be found in the pages of this Report. Most happily we are not left comfortless, but are in the care and keeping of our two good Bishops, who have already shown us many kindnesses.

The Season's Meetings of this Committee have been largely attended and have been enriched by the presence of many speakers. Bishop Brooke, Bishop Spaulding, Bishop Rowe, Canon Bratenhal, the Rev. Messrs. H. C. Parke, F. D. Barnett, E. P. Newton, G. F. Neve, H. D. Phillips, have all told their tales of work and need and success and we have travelled with them far and near and helped them all as best we could, for which I am most grateful to my dear Committee.

We are happy to report five new branches on our list. We are still longing for every Parish and Mission in the Diocese.

The treasurer gives us the sum of her annual receipts as \$11,743.70. Cash sent, not passing through her hands, is \$3,504.00, and the value of the 136 boxes sent is \$11,824.65, making a total of \$27,072.35, a goodly sum, for which we are most grateful. Of this large amount \$2,194.00 was gathered by a special committee, named by me at the suggestion of Mrs. George Wharton Peppts, of which Mrs. Allen Evans consented to be chairman. The above is only what was contributed in our own Diocese, and was sent direct to the Rev. George C. Bartter, of Manila, who appealed for funds to build a Church for the natives in the poorer section of the city. Bishop Brent thinks that a concrete building can be erected for about \$5,000, so we hope that St. Luke's, Manila, will soon be built. The Church edifice in which they now worship is much devastated by ants—as all wooden buildings become—so that it is really unsafe.

An important change has been made by the almost unanimous vote of each committee in our hour of meeting, and hereafter it will be ten instead of eleven o'clock. Our hope is that after our business is ended and our speakers' addresses are over we shall be able to attend the noonday prayers in the Chapel. Although the prayers are always said at noon in the meetings, we shall surely appreciate the privilege of the service when our good bishop officiates, and I believe that we shall all be there.

What am I to say about our annual pledge of \$3,000 for the salary of a missionary Bishop? This is the twentieth year since we began to do this, and the truth must be told that if it were not for some large and most generous gifts, we could not make up the amount. This is such an excellent object for us in which to fill our apportionment, I must once more commend it to your attention. Many Parishes support a missionary; surely the Domestic Committee will proudly claim the joy of supplying the stipend of one missionary Bishop.

Thanking you all for your constant help, and praying God's blessing on the work in which He permits us to be fellow laborers, I submit this report.

History has been making itself fast and vigorously during the last year, and the story of the missionary achievement has been brought to us by many who are doing our work in China, in Japan, in Mexico, Cuba and by letter from Africa and Haiti, our other fields.

It was a rare pleasure to have Deaconess Hart with us in September, bringing such encouraging news of the Training School at Hankow and the fine work these Chinese Bible women are capable of doing. The only hindrances to the work she finds are the weather and the mother-in-law.

In October Mrs. Stockman brought examples of the lace which that wonderful band of Chinese women are doing, trained as they were by Miss Huntington at Ichang, but warned us that "What we have not done is so great in comparison with what we have done in that place of opportunities in mid-China."

One of our members had a prayer service in November to ask for Dr. Tucker's work in Tokio at St. Paul's College and to prepare us for the powerful appeal he made at our Annual Meeting, held at Holy Trinity on November 14th.

Japan seems to be so full of opportunities as we listened to Miss Elizabeth N. Newbold tell of her experiences and success with her Japanese Young Men's Bible Class at Akita and of the charming, affectionate girls who are overcrowding the training school at Sendai and of the joy it was to the teachers at the school to see the light of the soul which comes into the eyes of these girls as they, too, realize the Great Light and Love of Christ.

Possibly the appeal of Mr. Hayakawa, a Japanese priest, working for many years at Osaka in a small wooden shanty of a church, with eighty-seven seats for a congregation of over one hundred communicants, was most touching, especially as his congregation had given several Bible women, professors and priests to the Japan Church.

We are indebted to our Board of Missions for allowing their busy secretaries to come on to tell us of their recent visits to Cuba and Mexico, bringing most cheering accounts through Mr. John Wood, of Cuba, where the progress is splendid and Bishop Lloyd with his story of wonderful openings in Mexico.

Last but not least were the thrilling accounts brought us of the birth of a Republic in the oldest, most conservative country in the world. Both Rev. Harrington Littell and Miss Wood were in the midst of the Revolution, and told us of escapes from the horrors of war, but made our hearts glad by the cheering news of the new spirit of love, of tenderness, of mercy, shown by the Chinese even to the Manchus. The leaders of the new movement are largely Christians, and the 18th of April is to witness the birth of a Chinese Church.

Our pledges are all paid and a new one of \$25.00 for the education of the daughter of one of our workers in Africa. Another pledge for \$100 towards scholarship in Mexico and \$50.00 towards Rev. Mr. Jones' salary in Haiti are substituted for scholarships assumed by various parishes. The Treasurer's report will show our large gifts to Miss Wood for her library fund, \$50.00 for Miss Mann for Lanborn at Nikto. For Cuba and Mexico we have had some literature translated into their native language.

The Box Committee reports Christmas remembrances sent to Liberia, and supplies to Anking, and books for Miss Wood.

Our meetings have been largely attended and our officers always in their places.

Again the Church Missionary Calendar was issued, and some \$240 sent through our committee towards salaries of native priests. The R. L. M. M. S. C. Alumni sends also support to two native workers in China.

As for the spiritual growth of our branch of this great Woman's Auxiliary we wish we could report a larger attendance at our Consecration Service on October 2d, a service which ought to bring us great help and inspiration.

At our Lenten Meeting Rev. Charles Hutchinson, D.D., told us that Missions mean the spreading of the Gospel, and spreading the Gospel is preaching the Cross; but it is easier to set up the Cross in a foreign land than to set up the Cross in one's own heart. Missions mean the Cross. The Cross means sacrifice, self-discipline, obedience to the will of God in our own hearts and lives.

Shall we remember this and press forward with renewed Faith and Power?

In going over the record of the work done by the Committee during the past year, we rejoice to find that we have made a step forward in more than one direction, and therefore can sound the note of encouragement.

More parishes have sent delegates to the Committee, and the attendance at the meetings has been better than usual, but best of all we have nearly doubled the sum sent last year undesignated to the Board of Missions, without detracting from our gifts to special objects. For this Miss Emery has sent her congratulations and we hope this increase will continue, so that we may give the Board all the aid in our power.

It is also very encouraging to hear that Mr. Buford has sent out a formal notice that owing to the prosperous conditions in Brunswick Co., Va., of which Lawrenceville is the county seat, the negroes in future will be able to provide for their own aged and infirm. Mrs. Buford's hospital has done its work and no longer needs aid. The endowment fund will be used up in the care of the present inmates, and its doors

closed. This surely speaks well for St. Paul's School and its influence on the neighborhood, and makes us more anxious than ever that St. Paul's, St. Augustine's and the other excellent schools established throughout the South should receive our thoughtful consideration and help.

They are wonderful centres of good wherever we find them, reaching out and bearing a beneficent touch to the people for many miles around. In spite of so much success Archdeacon Russell has just now reached a serious crisis in the affairs of the school. To quote from the *Spirit of Missions*: "To-day, as the result of nearly thirty years of undaunted and self-sacrificing service, this man of vision is at the head of the largest missionary and educational work under the auspices of the Church. During the past academic year it enrolled 529 students. It has fifty-five officers and teachers conducting twenty-three trade and literary departments.

"The school farm covers 1,400 acres, and the total plant and equipment is worth over \$200,000. Nor is this all. The presence of St. Paul's School has well-nigh reconstructed the agricultural, industrial, social, religious and moral condition of the negroes of Brunswick County. What does the Church owe to the man who has done this in her name? At least, surely, such support as will enable this needed work to be continued."

It is well known that the indebtedness has arisen because it is an industrial school, and as such must provide productive work for the students. This involves the carrying of a large stock in trade, and the erection of plants for various industries. They have never had the capital to meet these needs, and a recurring and increasing deficit has been the result. Now is the time to cancel all debt and put the school on a firm foundation.

Much good work has been done by the parishes sending out boxes of clothing, etc., for missionaries and their families; also joint-boxes have been sent, the contents most carefully purchased and packed by a very faithful Box Committee, for all of which appreciative letters of thanks have been received. Scholarships have been contributed, aid given to students and some help in the building of schools and churches. It all seems very little, considering the great need, but we should be very grateful for the privilege of doing our share of work in so great a cause.

Another milestone has been passed, the work of the Diocesan Committee is completed for the year.

We note with gratitude that our receipts have been larger and the number of boxes greater than ever before.

The attendance throughout the year has been good, but not what we should wish it to be. We are happy in having added eight new parishes to our list, yet we wish every parish in the Diocese might not only send a delegate to us, but take some active interest in the missionary work of their own home field.

While our activities have confined themselves largely to the same channels of usefulness, new work has been started in some fields which up to this time have received but little of our interest and support.

The year began with a motion in regard to continuing the payment of the salaries of our parish workers—whether it were better to do this or to distribute our income among a greater number of objects in the Diocese needing our help and support. Dean Le Roy made an address telling us of the great need of the helpers at both St. George's and St. Ambrose's, and urging us to make every effort to continue the salaries. A vote was taken, the result of which was in favor of continuing the salaries in full for another year.

A motion was also passed that the Committee pledge itself to pay \$300 a year toward a helper for St. Augustine's Mission, of which Rev. H. S. McDuffey is rector. Among

those who have spoken to us during the year have been Rev. F. M. Taitt, Dean of the Convocation of Chester, who told us of several missions within his jurisdiction needing help—those at Highland Park, Eddystone, Parkesburg, Collingdale and Darby. The latter has just been started. Until this time there has been no church work done here at all, our people being utterly neglected.

Rev. A. J. Arkin gave us an account of his work at St. George's, telling us of the growth of the parish from a congregation of eleven, held in a small wooden building lighted by a kerosene lamp, to the present large number, both of communicants and Sunday-school scholars.

We had the pleasure of having Bishop Rhinelander with us at our January meeting and of hearing him express his deep interest in Diocesan Missions, their importance to general missions and to the church at large.

Mr. J. M. Chattin gave us a most interesting account of the work he is doing at Hulmeville, near Bristol, a district quite new to us and a work that has remained uncared for for some time.

We also had the pleasure of welcoming Rev. J. L. Prevost, who spoke of his new field at West Whitelands, where, as always, Mr. Prevost is doing true missionary work, not being satisfied to confine himself to his own parish, but stretching out in all directions.

Deaconess Colesberry was the speaker at the February Meeting. The account of the work at St. Martha's House is always one that holds us spellbound. The pathetic stories of sympathy, love and gratitude given and received fill us with reverence and esteem for our workers there.

Our last address was by Rev. H. L. Phillips, who spoke of the Church of the Crucifixion and its many missions, laying special stress upon the Summer Home on the Chester Pike.

We also heard with pleasure of the work to be done during the summer in Bucks County, under Rev. Mr. Emhart, rural missionary of that district.

The missionary work in the Diocese is slow and at times almost discouraging; there is so much to do and so little to do it with, but we must press forward more and more, counting it a blessed privilege to aid in helping to bring to many the knowledge of Christ and of His love.

Report of the Chairman, 1911-1912.

The report from the Junior Auxiliary this year is of new undertakings and increased growth in some parts of the old work, though there still remain many things to improve and to carry out.

The Institute held for the Training of Leaders in Junior Work, January 31, February 1, 2, 3, at the Church House, was something which had never been undertaken before, and was the most important if not also the best part of our year's work. It was splendidly attended in all departments and the interest shown in each was most encouraging to us and to all those who came from other dioceses to teach and make the addresses. It was decided to hold another this fall the date of which is November 13-16. At this same time we published *The Junior Magazine*, which was contributed to and edited by the Juniors of the Diocese only, and we expect to continue it this year, publishing it at Christmas and Easter.

Besides the four Normal Mission Study Classes at the Institute Miss Hubbard had two other classes during the year. One on the Conquest of the Continent and the other on the Conquerors of the Continent. The combined membership was twenty-four.

The Boys' Branches, after consultation with Dr. Perry, are to be turned into the Boys' Department of the Men's Auxiliary under Mr. Arthur Newbold, Jr., who shares the Junior Office.

The number of Junior Branches is seventy-five. Our pledge towards the Apportionment more than paid, and we start on with every hopeful outlook for the new year.
