## REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

---

Reports mean little, unless they can show life and growth, but as we read the account of the work done by the Committees during the past year, we are encouraged to go forward with renewed hopefulness and consecration. This must deal with the diocesan branch as a whole, and as expressed in our three public meetings where the Auxiliary comes together in one united body.

At the annual meeting, held in the Church of the Holy Trinity on November 15th, Bishop Rhinelander gave the foreword for the year—power through Christ. Addresses were made by Mr. Matthew K. Sniffen, Secretary of the Indian Rights' Association; the Rev. B. L. Ancell, of Yang-chow, China; Bishop Talbot and Archdeacon Phillips. The Epiphany meeting was held in St. Peter's Church in the interest of Foreign Missions, and the speakers were the Rev. John Meem, of Brazil, and Mr. Charles Beury. For our Lenten missionary service, we met again in the ever hospitable Church of the Holy Trinity, to listen to a galaxy of Bishops: Bishop Funsten on Domestic Missions, Bishop Thurston in behalf of his Indian work; Bishop Garland outlined a plan for developing Church work in the country districts of this diocese, and the Rev. W. T. Capers spoke of work among the colored race. The only disappointment is that the attendance at all these meetings is not so large as it might be, and we should like to emphasize the fact that all delegates (and there are over one thousand) are expected to be present, when possible, and to bring members of their parish branches.

We have taken three important steps towards greater efficiency and increased knowledge this year. The first was in the autumn, when a devotional meeting was held in Grace Church, Mt. Airy, primarily for the parishes of Germantown and Chestnut Hill. The Bishop made an inspiring address, and in the afternoon, at a conference, Mrs. Knorr spoke on missions in parishes; Mrs. J. M. Cheston, Jr., on Missions in the Convocation of Germantown, Miss Ashhurst on Mission Study Classes, and Mrs. Charles Pancoast on prayer and missions. There were over two hundred present, and deep interest was shown throughout the day.

The next step was planned by Mrs. J. Nicholas Mitchell,

the Educational Secretary of the Diocese, and a most instructive course of two lessons on the strength and weakness of the Woman's Auxiliary and the vital necessity of enthusiasm for the United Offering was given at the Church House, with a supplementary lesson for the officers of those parishes not represented during the first course. How to bring all women of a parish into the Auxiliary was one of the questions discussed, and there was a strong plea for friendliness. As an illustration of this spirit, the Indian women of South Dakota always bring gifts of money or work to offer at their annual convocation, presenting them with these words, "This is from the Woman's Auxiliary; we shake hands with you." Would it not be possible for each Parish President to make an every member canvass and ask the women to attend the meetings of the Auxiliary and thus secure their interest?

The third step in growth was a meeting in the interest of the United Offering in St. Peter's Church, Germantown, when Bishop Lloyd spoke most earnestly of the common aim of this Thank-Offering and the power of prayer which prompts the gift. At the luncheon Dr. Teusler, of Japan, spoke informally, and aroused much interest in his plans for an International Hospital in Tokyo.

A special meeting of the Executive Committee was held to consider the resolution for the United Offering of 1916 to be offered by this diocesan branch of the Triennial in October next, and it was unanimously decided to present substantially the same resolution as in 1913, omitting the appropriation for buildings, and try to increase the offering to a sum adequate to support all our women workers in the field. Copies of this resolution were sent to the Diocesan Presidents.

A new avenue of communication has been opened to us in the columns of the "Diocesan Church News," and the Editor-in-Chief has kindly offered to print notices of the monthly meetings and other important items. We are most grateful for this opportunity, and we hope to use our privilege more systematically next winter.

It is with very deep regret and profound appreciation of her long and devoted service that we record the resignation of Miss Coles, who has been Secretary of the Executive Committee ever since its beginning. As our Honorary Secretary, we still have the inspiration of her presence among us and the benefit of her wise counsel and advice.

As Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, our common aim and purpose must be to help the apportionment that the routine work of the Church may run smoothly, and having done this, we can give gladly to the many specials which rightly claim our interest and support; but our highest privilege is devotion to our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and "As He moves among the golden candlesticks, He comes to us asking for entrance that He through us may be present in His world."

CONSTITUTION  
OF THE  
Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the  
Board of Missions.

ARTICLE I.  
*Name.*

The name of this Association shall be the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.  
*Object.*

The object of the Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of Pennsylvania the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.  
*Organization.*

To accomplish these various objects this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is organized into five standing Committees—Indians' Hope, Domestic, Foreign, Work Among the Colored People, and the Diocesan. The Chairman of each Committee is to be appointed by the Bishop, with the exception of the Indians' Hope, which must follow its own constitution, as it antedates the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV.  
*Membership.*

The Church itself is the Missionary Society. Every baptized person is a member of the Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese should be an active member of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.  
*Officers.*

The officers of this Association shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, a Treasurer for the United Offering, three officers of the Junior Department and two officers of the Babies' Branch. These shall serve for one year and shall be eligible for renomination. The Board shall have power to fill all vacancies which may occur during the year for the unexpired term.

An Annual Meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the last Wednesday in April, when appointments by the Bishop shall be announced, nominations having been made by written ballot at the previous meeting.

ARTICLE VI.  
*Executive Committee.*

The general management is entrusted to an Executive Board, composed of the Diocesan officers, the officers of the Standing Com-

mittees, the Chairman of the work in Mexico and Brazil, the Chairman of the work in Cuba, the Assistant Treasurer of the United Offering, and the Librarian.

## ARTICLE VII.

### *Duties of the President.*

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all members of committees necessary for the transacting of the work of the Executive Committee. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees. She shall visit Parish Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary when invited, and seek opportunity to establish branches in parishes where there are none and fill all other duties pertaining to her office.

## ARTICLE VIII.

### *Duties of the Vice-Presidents.*

In the absence of the President, a Vice-President shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and fill all duties belonging to the office.

## ARTICLE IX.

### *Secretary.*

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall keep a record of such meetings, and prepare and present Minutes at each meeting. She shall prepare an abstract of the Minutes of the year for the Annual Report. She shall send a copy of the Annual Report to every officer of the Executive Committee, to every Rector, Minister in Charge, and Missionary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the President of every Branch throughout the Church.

The Secretary shall advertise public meetings in such ways as seem best.

## ARTICLE X.

### *Treasurer.*

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of the funds belonging to the Executive Committee, and to deposit them in such banking institution as has been selected by the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, to be drawn thence upon the cheque of the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer, for the purpose of the Executive Committee, as ordered by that Committee. All bills sent to the Treasurer must be countersigned by the purchaser before payment. The Treasurer shall present an itemized report in writing at each stated meeting of the Executive Committee. She shall prepare a report of all funds in her charge for the Annual Meeting. Her books shall be audited by a Committee appointed by the President. It is recommended that the payments of each standing committee to the Annual Report Fund be made and the books closed by June first of each year.

## ARTICLE XI.

### *Publication Committee.*

The President shall appoint annually a Committee on the Publication of the Annual Report, said Committee to consist of the Treas-

urer and Secretary from each of the five Standing Committees, with a Chairman. This Committee shall receive all copy, typewritten, for the Annual Report, and take entire charge of its publication. It shall be the duty of this Committee to estimate amount per page due the Annual Report Fund from each of the five Standing Committees, and the United Offering, after receiving bill from the printer.

The Current Expense Fund of the Executive Committee shall pay for the remaining pages of the Annual Report not belonging to any of the Standing Committees.

#### ARTICLE XII.

##### *Amendment.*

The Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Committee by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

#### ARTICLE XIV.

##### *Missionary Services.*

There shall be three missionary services during the year—

1. The all-day service on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.
2. The Epiphany service in behalf of Missions in the foreign field.
3. The Lenten service.

#### ARTICLE XV.

##### *Annual Meeting.*

The annual Business Meeting shall be held at noon on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.

## UNITED OFFERING OF THE PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

### Object of the Offering of 1913.

*Resolved*, That the United Thank-Offering of 1913 be given to the Board of Missions for Woman's Work in the Mission Field, including the training, testing, sending and support of women workers; also the care of such workers when sick or disabled; but that a sum not exceeding \$20,000 be devoted to buildings for the use of woman workers, approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the General Secretary and the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

Also, that to our united gifts there shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission Field; or, if they cannot go themselves, to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY OF DIOCESE OF  
PENNSYLVANIA.

Report of the Educational Secretary from May, 1912, to  
May, 1913.

After the strictly Church work was over I consented to lead a class, during May and June, on the text-book published by the Woman's Committee, on "China's New Day," by Dr. Headly. It seemed a little foretaste of Church Unity when delegates from 13 Christian Communions gathered around my table for a normal class, each pledged to pass the study on to a normal class in their various Communions.

During these months I visited several Convocation meetings, and in July taught a class at Silver Bay consisting of delegates from many states.

Our Corporate Communion and Conference of leaders was held in October, and our Model Study Class met with a warm welcome at the Sunday School Institute, on October 21st.

Our first class on the text-book, "Japan Advancing," was a strictly normal one (the members, in groups, making the assignments and teaching, by turns, at the sessions) numbering 19 from 18 parishes. It began October 25th, and very hard and earnest study was put into its seven sessions.

At the urgent request of the Educational Secretary of Maryland, I spent a week in Baltimore, in November, conducting an Institute, teaching two sessions a day, with normal leaders of 17 parishes and visitors. I also addressed the Woman's Auxiliary, and was present at the Episcopalian Day in "The World in Baltimore."

One of my best leaders, Miss Lydie West, lead two classes at a week's Institute in Delaware, with great success this same month.

In December I was asked to lead a class on China, at the New Century Club, with a large enrollment of club women, few of them having ever before heard of Mission Study Class Work.

A reception given at my house to Rev. and Mrs. Ancell, of Hangchow, and Miss Richmond, of Shanghai, made it quite evident that the enrollment for the Epiphany classes would be large.

These classes were started on January 21st and 24th. In both the limit of 17 was admitted; each had seven sessions. They represented over 30 Churches and each was pledged to give a parish class on the subject, "Japan Advancing." The

enclosed list will show how nearly they kept their pledge. Several leaders who had not taught last year's course on the "Conquest of the Continent" were not admitted to the normal classes this year, but taught the "Conquest" in their respective parishes.

During Lent, at the request of Miss Emery, I invited each and every President of the Woman's Auxiliary to come and bring with her, to a series of Conferences at the Church House, all her officers to discuss various phases of Auxiliary Work, the United Offering, and the Educational Method. These three Conferences were conducted by Mrs. Adam Ross, Mrs. H. A. Pilsbury, Mrs. Charles Pancoast and your Educational Secretary. About 77 of the branches out of some 100 parishes, where there is a distinctive woman's missionary work done, responded, and I was asked to have another Conference of a like kind next year.

One of our members has conducted a number of normal classes and an Institute in New Jersey, so that in other dioceses this work has spread.

At Christmas almost all the members wrote and sent remembrances to various missionaries working in Japan, and interest has shown itself in money sent for Miss Bacon's kindergarten equipment in Kyota, in enabling Miss Peck to start a new kindergarten in S. Japan, and in sending to Rev. Mr. Chapman over \$150 for his work there.

My Alumnae have again published an edition of 10,000 of the "Church Missionary Calendar," and towards the Apportionment of the diocese, through an "especial" support a Catechist in China, besides giving the profits of the "Calendar" to meet the Board's obligations.

In order that the educational work may be firmly established, my principal work this season has been to find in each parish a woman fitted to be Parish Educational Secretary, to help the rector in carrying into each organization in the Parish Auxiliaries, G. F. S. Guilds, and Sunday School such direct educational missionary work as is recommended by our Board's Educational Secretary, Rev. A. R. Gray.

In most cases the rectors have been most helpful, and in 57 churches such women have been appointed and in most cases they are members of my normal classes. They met with Rev. A. R. Gray and Dr. Brathenahl at my house on April 21st, for a Conference and reception, 59 being present, all secretaries or leaders.

May I again ask for your prayers and help in trying to make our foundations firm and sure in this most interesting work.

The closing year has seen no diminution in the work of the Indians' Hope. While we have not had many speakers this winter the attendance at our meetings has ranged from fifty-five to one hundred and eighteen, one hundred and over being maintained for several months.

The total amount received by the Treasurer this year is one thousand seven hundred thirty-seven dollars and forty-nine cents (\$1,737.49).

The Treasurer of Specials has received three thousand nine hundred and twenty-four dollars (\$3,924).

The scholarships were all completed, and all the boxes were taken. The total valuation of the missionary boxes is two thousand eight hundred forty dollars and twenty-seven cents (\$2,840.27).

Mrs. Cooper spoke at the September meeting of her work under Bishop Thomas among the Arapahoes. These Indians are very religiously inclined and Mrs. Cooper, who has given up active work among them on account of ill health, is endeavoring to raise the money for a chapel, club house and industrial buildings to further the work in this district.

Miss Hart spoke in October of her work at Carlisle. Of the one hundred and sixty girls there, fifty are members of the Church, and it would seem that their spiritual welfare should not be neglected.

In January Bishop Biller, of South Dakota, told us of the encouraging strength of the Church among the Indians of his diocese, a monument to the labors of Bishop Hare. Bishop Biller hopes the generous aid given heretofore to the work in South Dakota will continue, as the present is a critical period among the Indians there, owing to the settling of the whites, not always of the best class, on parts of the Indian reservations.

Two great dangers threaten the Indians at present; divorce, which is aided by shyster lawyers and unscrupulous judges; and the revival of their dance, a relic of the heathendom they had left behind when they became Christians, and which owing to its having been commercialized by the whites is also being used by the Indians for their own amusement. Their dance houses are now all over the reservations. With the dance the whites have taken the opportunity to introduce liquor and drugs. St. Mary's and St. Elizabeth's Schools are doing ther splendid work, but need assistance in many directions. Bishop Thurston, of Eastern Oklahoma, told us in February of his plans for extending the work among the Indians of that district. A curious condition in this Indian field is that the danger to many of the Indians is from prosperity. Oil and gas have been discovered on the property of many of them, some families receiving anywhere from four hundred to three thousand dollars per month. Honest and dishonest whites are pouring into the country and it is through the latter that the moral and financial ruin of the Indians may be wrought. The Government tries to protect them, but it cannot control the money after it is paid to the Indians.

The support of the work among the Karoks of the diocese of Sacramento, California, which was started last year

under the Rev. Mr. Shea, was assumed again for this year by the Indians' Hope. This work is very important, but the Indians' Hope does not feel able to undertake the whole support of it another year.

Assistance was given Bishop Gray towards the purchase of a farm in Florida, to be used in connection with the Mission work among the Seminoles of that diocese.

Letters from Bishop Rowe, Rev. Mr. Betticher and Deaconess Sabine tell us of the increasing needs of the work in Alaska, and although there is much to encourage us in their reports, one can read between the lines of the heavy burdens and discouragements borne so cheerfully by these brave workers in carrying the light and warmth of the Gospel to the people of this faraway frozen northland.

Bishop Rhinelander addressed the March meeting, and his words were very helpful and encouraging. He said that there should be no question of race feeling in the work of Christianity; that race distinction was necessary to unity, not compromising to it, as the diversity of the members of the body do not interfere with bodily unity. Racial contributions are needed from all the peoples of the earth "that they without us should not be made perfect." Missionary work has to make up for the tragic impact of Christianity and the old heathen religions and civilizations.

Strong in the hope of the fulfilment of the promise of the ingathering into the Church of all the nations of the earth, let us labor in this little corner of the Master's vineyard, and faint not nor fail in carrying His message to these Indian souls who in so many cases hold out to us eager, pleading hands; and like that from Macedonia their cry is, "Come over and help us." Can we withstand this appeal or neglect this duty?

With gratitude to our Heavenly Father, that He has spared us to complete another year of service in this department of Missionary work, I present the Annual Report of the Domestic Committee.

We have had large meetings throughout the season, and they have been made most interesting by the many speakers from widely scattered places. These meetings have become as a Mecca, to which the many poor souls forced to leave their work for a time, in search of funds to enable them to carry it on, eagerly turn. As "it is more blessed to give than to receive," I love to believe that we have been abundantly blessed.

We have heard from Georgia through Bishop Reese, from Spokane through Bishop Wells, and Eastern Oklahoma through Bishop Thurston; and the Reverends S. E. Prentiss, T. D. Windiate, F. M. Wetherill, Geo. P. Mayo, W. N. Wyckoff and I. A. Van Herrlich, who brought a message from the Bishop of Kansas, and Fr. Hughson, O. H. C. They have told us of what they are doing in North Carolina, Tennessee,

Kentucky, Kansas, Iowa and Virginia, and in our own Pennsylvania, in the Diocese of Bethlehem. Much is being done, they all await our help, that they may do more. From Mrs. Wetmore we have again heard of Christ School and its opportunities, from Mrs. Hughson of the merciful work of Grace Hospital, and Miss Hicks has carried us and our interest across the sea to St. Luke's Hospital, Manila. I must not omit from our list of speakers young Mr. Anthony, a graduate of Paterson School, N. C., who is about to begin his Theological studies, that the ministry may be his life work. As an object lesson of what such schools are doing for our young countrymen, nothing could have been more convincing of their great value.

Our boxes have been sent to twenty-seven States, and to all of our Island possessions. It is interesting, indeed, to note the list: Alaska, Arkansas, Alabama, California, Colorado, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Minnesota, Michigan, Missouri, Mississippi, North Carolina, Nebraska, New Mexico, New Hampshire, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Washington, West Virginia, Wyoming, Utah, Philippine Islands, Hawaii and Porto Rico.

Thus you see we have distributed widely and well, and have supplied many needs, and have lifted many burdens.

The salary of one Missionary Bishop has been paid. I wish that there was more enthusiasm about this, and that it could always be paid in Advent. For twenty-one years I have been hoping for this. Our record shows that 160 boxes have been sent, valued at \$11,563.11. \$1,096.35 has been sent direct by the parishes, and the Treasurer reports that \$9,670.34 has been sent through her, a total of \$22,329.80.

With thankfulness for all the helpfulness of my associates, and praying that we may still do more in the coming year, I submit this report.

Very certainly never before in her fourteen years of faithful guidance of this Committee has our wonderful Chairman, Mrs. Knorr, given us so great a variety of subjects and speakers, and it is fortunate for her and for us that our hour of assembly is now ten and not eleven o'clock. Another saving of time is the signing of cards instead of calling the roll. Another innovation is the individual intercession, besides the usual noonday service, by which the speaker of the day brings her or his individual need to the throne of God and enabling *us* together to plead to the Divine Leader of all to show us how to find means to grant the requests of the day.

In September Rev. Mr. Chapman came to us from that Sunrise Country of Japan to tell us of his poor little Mission at beautiful Nara and of the twelve stations under his charge, amid a population of 650,000 Japanese, eager for Church privileges and *each* group willing to contribute towards a churchly building; but a shabby room, such as most of them have now, does not appeal to this beauty-loving people. The Mission Study Classes have been much touched by his appeal for a motor cycle to save time and strength in visiting these twelve stations, and we have already over \$200 to send him.

Twice we have heard from Cuba, which is about the size of Pennsylvania, where, when Bishop Knight took up the work eight years ago, there were but 141 communicants; there are now 1,440 communicants and 16 church schools. Rev. Mr. Steel and Rev. C. E. Snavely made clear to us how our Church fulfills in Cuba, in its 35 missions, the traditions of its natives, in its priesthood form of service, etc.

From Mexico came Bishop Aves and Mrs. Weber, bespeaking our increased interest for those 7,000,000 of peons, a people who have no ambition, for they have no hope. The average wage for a family is 12½ cents a day. These missionaries brought us good news of Mrs. Hooker's School, under Miss McKnight, and plead for a chapel to complete the group at Tacuba. Also of St. Andrew's Industrial School, at Guadalajara, with its 10 acres of well-planted fields, making it self-supporting, and of the fact that there were among its students, past and present, several who are studying for the ministry. The Bishop's account of the House of Hope, at Nopala, was also of stirring interest.

China's cry for a present crusade there, where there are still 1,000 counties in that great empire without one single Mission Station, could not have been stronger, coming as it did just as that great republic had asked for a Day of Prayer, April 27th, for its guidance and future. Miss Wong, a Chinese woman going out to visit her country folk after years of residence here, brought the personal touch as she asked for our prayers. Then, in December, our old friend, Miss Richmond, plead for a home and furnishings for her workers in China, and Rev. Mr. Wood for a chain of community houses in Hankow District, whence its inmates might go, especially to Shenan, our new western province, and preach the Gospel to 2,000,000 of Chinese. Fortunately, Mrs. Pancoast has been able to raise and give, on Christmas, to Rev. and Mrs. Ancell for their girls' school, at Yangchow, \$3,000, which was kindly credited to our Branch of the

Auxiliary. Mr. Ancell was our foreign speaker at our Annual Meeting, and Rev. Mr. Meen, from Brazil, thrilled us at the Epiphany Meeting held at old St. Peter's.

Our Board Secretaries came to us twice. Dean Burleson made us realize our blessed privilege in being daily contributers to the United Offering, and that it had a sacramental significance that should make us realize that it was a *direct* purchase of a substitute and making us thus sharers of our united Mission work.

Mr. John Wood told us of the condition of our African Missions, dwelling on the noble and self-sacrificing Bishop Ferguson and his native helpers in Liberia, which state is about the size of Pennsylvania, and our great hope "in the native" if we will keep up the training schools, etc.

Bishop Rhinelander spoke in Lent, directing our thoughts to spiritual lines, which address is to be printed in this report.

In April, Dr. Teussler plead for the great International Hospital at Tokyo, and we promised to furnish the children's ward for \$600, and our Secretary of the Third Missionary District, Dr. Bratenahl, showed how ripe the harvest was and that this *our* missionary district comprised 158,000 communicants, more than one-half women, and that it should be our aim to enlist every woman to work and to give for the spread of Christ's Kingdom so that we may reap this rich harvest.

Numberless letters have been read and requests for organs, sewing machines, etc., granted.

Especially rich have been our gifts for Kindergartens in Japan, one Mission Study Class supplying one for Miss Peck and another largely for Miss Bacon, besides the splendid offering for Mr. and Mrs. Walke, for which this branch of the Auxiliary contributed largely.

Again we have to thank the members of the Auxiliary for trying to sell our Church Missionary Calendar and to say that all our profits go, through the Woman's Auxiliary, to General Missions.

Very acceptable to us all was a vote of thanks given and indorsed to our Treasurer for the wonderful way in which she keeps our books and accounts.

We have tried this winter, by a series of Conferences, to increase interest and knowledge and form new branches of the Auxiliary in over one hundred parishes in our diocese, where there are some few women doing independent work, by treasurers of the United Offering, by Guilds, etc. We have felt that the genuine and lasting support of the missionary enterprise must come through a deep rooted general

knowledge of its needs, of its purposes and of the results that it actually accomplishes.

To carry out the well-known words, "Know and you will feel, know and you will pray, know and you will help," we feel that it is necessary to have as a foundation at least three departments in each missionary society. The Extension Department, seeking to draw all the women within the influence of the Woman's Auxiliary, never mind how weak her parish, she can carry back her message. Then the Educational Department, where their attendance at our monthly meetings should teach them all by coming into direct contact with those working on the Foreign Field, and the Devotional Department, with its marvellous power of intercessory prayer, the soul of the Department, as the Extension should be, the hand and the educational, the brains.

Can we not in this coming year strive to increase our branches? The mission of the Church will never be accomplished until its separate members get this individualized conception of obligation. The whole Church is to give the whole Gospel to the whole world.

Let me close with the words of our new poet, Alfred Noyes:

"Trumpeter, sound for the great crusade,  
Sound for the power of the Red Cross Kings,  
Sound for the passion, the splendor, the pity  
That swept the world for our Master's sake.  
Sound till the answering trumpet rings  
Clear from the heights of the heavenly city;  
Sound for the tomb our lives have betrayed,  
Over ruined shrine and abandoned wall.  
Trumpeter, sound us the great recall,  
Trumpeter, rally us, rally us, rally us,  
Sound for the last crusade."

Are we reaching for this great crusade of this missionary enterprise, and thus our object be not to rescue the grave of a dead Christ, but with the power of God's Holy Spirit promised to us at this time to make Christ King over all.

It is with pleasure and a sense of encouragement that we present our report of work done by the Committee on Colored Missions throughout the year.

It is true that we cannot claim as a permanent advancement the great increase in our total of money received, which doubles that of last year, as this is owing to the generosity of one of our most interested and devoted contributors; but it has enabled us to make possible the final payment of the debt which has so long oppressed that most admirable and invaluable institution, St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, Va.

Mr. John W. Wood, Secretary of the Board of Missions, says: "St. Paul's stands for two facts. It supplies the need of the colored people for bread and for God. For bread because it has made the men and women industrially efficient. . . . St. Paul's is giving God because it has helped them to make homes for themselves. Where on earth can we be more sure to have God reign in our hearts than in a decent, Christian home?"

The Hon. E. P. Buford, Commonwealth's Attorney for the county, testifies that during his twenty-two years at the bar: "There has never been a student of St. Paul's brought here before the Courts to answer for any violation of the

law." What a splendid record. Surely it remains for those who are interested in the uplifting of the colored race, to provide the means for the furtherance of the splendid work done by its devoted and self-sacrificing Principal.

We feel that our work in supplementing the meagre salaries of our missionaries in the field, by means of boxes of clothing, etc., is of the greatest value to them, as testified by their letters of grateful acknowledgment. The total value of these boxes for the last year is \$3,203.81, considerably more than last year. Not for a moment could we consider the suggestion which has been made that the money hitherto subscribed for boxes should be sent directly to the missionaries, for not only could it not be expended to equal advantage at the distant Mission posts, but we should lose the pleasure and profit of coming into more personal touch with our missionaries.

Our address at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was most acceptably made by Archdeacon Phillips; and that at the Lenten Meeting by the Rector of the Church of the Holy Apostles, whose Southern birth, environment and personal interest in, and knowledge of the colored people, enabled him to present their cause with the utmost sympathy and understanding.

We earnestly trust that all this good seed may fall upon fallow ground and bring forth an abundant harvest of interest and good works.

The hearty co-operation of our Bishop, and his deep interest in the colored people, cannot fail to encourage those who are sometimes "weary in well doing," and to inspire them to renewed zeal and effort. And let us not be overwhelmed by the problem which confronts us, but let us bear in mind that to us have been given the opportunity of serving our country as well as of obeying the mandate of our holy religion, in succoring God's little ones who are placed in our midst.

Once more we are called upon to present our account of work done during the past year. It certainly has been one of hope and encouragement. The attendance has been excellent and we have added eight new parishes to our list and new work has been started in fields which up to this time have had but little of our support and interest.

The work of the Committee grows more interesting each year as we become more familiar with our diocese as a whole, and with the mission work that the Church is doing in new fields; making centers of religious influence extending out into the neighborhoods in which they have been established.

Two of our faithful delegates have passed into life eternal during the past year, Miss Jeanie Sharples, from St. James', and Mrs. Thomas Lindsay, from the Advocate Memorial.

Among those who have spoken to us are Bishop Rhinelander, who told us the meaning of Diocesan Missions and of our relation to the diocese. In the five counties comprising our diocese there are about 2,000,000 people, 40 per cent. of whom are unchurched. If every Parish Auxiliary would seriously consider this they would fully realize the responsibility which rests upon the missionary work of the Church in the home field.

Bishop Garland was with us at our October meeting,

and spoke most forcibly of the great need of more interest in Diocesan Missions, saying that we often see things at a distance, overlooking those at our door; that China and Japan must not be neglected, but we must remember that the work there can never prosper if we do not begin in our home, our parish and our diocese; if there is to be any spread of Christ's Kingdom it must begin at home.

The Rev. George Copeland, of St. Ambrose, Rev. A. J. Arkin, of St. George's, and Rev. G. R. Miller, of St. Nathaniel's, all gave us most interesting accounts of the work being done in the districts of Kensington.

Rev. H. L. Phillips and Mrs. Johnson spoke to us of the colored work, while Rev. H. S. McDuffy told us of the purchase of the Church of the Beloved Disciple, Twentieth Street and Columbia Avenue, for St. Augustine's Mission, and of the encouragement and help it is to his parishioners to have a church building in which to worship.

Rev. James McHenry, of the Church of the Holy Comforter, Forty-eighth Street and Haverford Avenue, spoke to us of a section of our city, the northwestern part, that is almost destitute of Episcopal churches, those that are there presenting a pathetic appearance.

Rev. Herbert Burk was one of the speakers at the February meeting, and made a very urgent appeal for the completion of the Washington Memorial Chapel at Valley Forge. The second speaker at this meeting was Rev. A. W. Shick, of St. Martin's Home for Boys. This was the first time that this home had been brought before us, and we were deeply interested in the work being done here for homeless boys.

Rev. George Gassner spoke to us of the Seaman's Mission, telling us that the past year had been one of great growth and encouragement.

Mr. W. W. Montgomery gave an interesting account of the rural work, especially that of St. Mark's, Honeybrook, and St. Mary's, Warwick. We heard, too, of the work being done at Hulmeville under Rev. Mr. Chatten, and that of St. Paul's, West Whiteland, under Rev. Mr. Prevost. At our April meeting Mrs. Wm. C. Platt made a strong appeal for the Sheltering Arms, telling us of the good that is being done in this home for unfortunate girls, many going out cured and prepared to lead helpful and upright lives.

We also had the pleasure of having with us Mrs. Thomas Roberts, who spoke to us of the fund to be raised as a token of gratitude to Miss Julia Emery; Mrs. Effingham Perot,

who made an appeal for the Deaconess Retiring Fund, and Miss Fisher, who gave an account of the Church Periodical Club.

In ending, allow me to quote from Bishop Garland's address: "Never has the world been so ripe to receive the Gospel as today, and if we can only translate our belief into our prayers, our service and our gifts, then it will mean something in our homes, our parishes, our diocese and in the world; God will then prosper our labors and enable them to bear fruit."

The Junior Department has a varied career to report this year. Our Institute in November with good results, the loss of Miss Marjorie Townsend as Vice-Chairman, the gain of Miss Adele Bayard to fill the vacancy, and then the additional gain of Miss Nancy Reath for the unofficial, but very necessary position of Secretary.
