REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

This year, which began with the inspiration of the Triennial, has seemed unusually short for the accomplishment of the large plans made at the General Convention, and there is still much to do for St. Luke's International Hospital at Tokyo, and the completion of the New China Fund and the many needs of the domestic field.

In accordance with the resolution passed in Cincinnati in 1910, each diocese could have only five delegates, including one Junior officer, and five alternates, with one vote at the business meetings of the Triennial. Perhaps the most radical change then made which affected the whole Auxiliary, was a rearrangement of the Junior Department, and those who read this report carefully will miss the familiar "Babies' Branch." In order to unify the work, this branch has been made Section I of the Junior Department, and includes children from one to eight years old, and, as these could not be called babies, the suggestive title of "Little Helpers" was adopted.

In our own diocese we have to record the resignation of the Treasurer of the United Offering, who for eight Triennials has worked so untiringly and successfully in making our Thank-Offering worthy of its name and aim. The following resolution was passed with a rising vote:

"Resolved, That the Executive Committee deplores the resignation of Mrs. George C. Thomas, who has been the first and only Treasurer of the United Offering that our diocese has ever had, and we tender our grateful thanks to her for her devoted and generous service."

It is impossible to express in words our appreciation and gratitude, and we can best thank her by interesting other women in the United Offering and by our loyal support of her successor, Mrs. Ralph H. North, who has taken up this arduous work with whole-hearted enthusiasm. As our First Vice-President, Mrs. Thomas will still be a very active force among us.

The resignation of the Chairman of the Work in Cuba was accepted with deep regret, but the name of Mrs. Daniel S. Merritt will always be associated with Cuba, and her knowledge of the work there ever since its beginning will be a great help to her successor, Mrs. W. Horner Smith, in understanding past and present conditions.

Our annual meeting was held on Friday, November 14th, in the Church of St. Luke and the Epiphany, when the Bishop of the diocese made the introductory address, and the missionary work in domestic, colored, foreign and Indian fields was presented by the Bishops of San Joaquin, North Carolina, Anking and Alaska. The business meeting at noon in the Parish House was especially interesting, because in addition to the reports from the various committees, Mrs. Markoe and Mrs. Biddle spoke of the Triennial and the General Convention.

At the Epiphany meeting in St. Mark's Church on January 12th, the rector presided and the Rev. Dr. Cabell Brown spoke eloquently of the work in Brazil and the Rev. Mr. Matthews made a plea for Africa.

The Lenten meeting found us again in the ever hospitable Church of the Holy Trinity, with the Guild choir in full force to lead the singing. Bishop Rhinelander presided, and the work among colored people in this diocese was ably presented by the Rev. H. S. McDuffey, while the Rev. E. L. Sanford made work in the country districts seem the most desirable of all fields. The Bishop of Wyoming told about his Indian missions, and the Bishop of Kentucky dwelt upon domestic missions in general.

The advance step this year has been the holding of devotional days with conferences. The first was held in St. Luke's Church, Germantown, on November 6, 1913. There was a celebration of the Holy Communion, followed by a devotional hour conducted by Bishop Rhinelander, and mid-day intercessions. In the afternoon, papers were read on the Triennial and Apportionment, and Dr. William Jefferys spoke most earnestly upon the spiritual aspect of missions. It was a

memorable day and brought the women of the parishes in Germantown and Chestnut Hill closer together in fellowship and service.

On March 14th, a somewhat similar meeting took place in All Saints' Church, Torresdale, where the Bishop again presided, and over two hundred women from fifteen neighboring parishes were drawn onward and upward by his spiritual appeal. At the conference the Apportionment was again brought forward, and the new Treasurer of the United Offering set before her hearers ideals that must have inspired them with the desire of adventure for God.

A most interesting Diocesan Educational Day was held in the Church House on January 21st and about three hundred women were present. Addresses were made by the Bishop, the Bishop Suffragan, the Rev. George L. Richardson, Dr. Jefferys and Dr. Glenton, while study classes and conferences were held throughout the day. The purpose was twofold: to illustrate how educational work can find a place in every department of parish life, and to express the fellowship of diocesan work.

What is our aim for the future? We want to reach every woman in the diocese and enlist her prayers and interest. To do this we earnestly beg the delegates to come to the monthly meetings of their Committees at the Church House and take back to their parish branches the knowledge they gain there. We also need the active interest of the clergy and those rectors who wish to start parish branches, or branches already formed that want fuller information about the aims and work of the Woman's Auxiliary, the Junior Department and the United Offering can get speakers for meetings by applying to the Presidents of the Committees.

When we realize the distressing fact that only a pitifully small number of our missionaries have been led to their choice of mission work by the active influence of the Woman's Auxiliary, we wonder why. May not this be one of the reasons: that we are apt to lay such stress on the gift of money, we lose sight of the greater power of prayer and the gift of life

which shows itself in sympathy, self-surrender and service? In the light of Christ's supreme love, shall we not try to follow His steps and give *ourselves*, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy and living sacrifice?

CONSTITUTION
OF THE
Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the
Board of Missions.

ARTICLE I.

Name.

The name of this Association shall be the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Object.

The object of the Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of Pennsylvania the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.

Organization.

To accomplish these various objects this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is organized into five standing Committees—Indians' Hope, Domestic, Foreign, Work Among the Colored People, and the Diocesan. The Chairman of each Committee is to be appointed by the Bishop, with the exception of the Indians' Hope, which must follow its own constitution, as it antedates the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV.

Membership.

The Church itself is the Missionary Society. Every baptized person is a member of the Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese should be an active member of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.

Officers.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, a Treasurer for the United Offering, five officers of the Junior Department. These shall serve for one year and shall be eligible for renomination. The Board shall have power to fill all vacancies which may occur during the year for the unexpired term.

An Annual Meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the last Wednesday in April, when appointments by the Bishops shall be announced, nominations having been made by written ballot at the previous meeting.

ARTICLE VI.

Executive Committee.

The general management is entrusted to an Executive Board,

composed of the Diocesan officers, the officers of the Standing Committees, the Chairman of the work in Mexico and Brazil, the Chairman of the work in Cuba, the Assistant Treasurer of the United Offering, and the Librarian.

ARTICLE VII.

Duties of the President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all members of committees necessary for the transacting of the work of the Executive Committee. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees. She shall visit Parish Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary when invited, and seek opportunity to establish branches in parishes where there are none and fill all other duties pertaining to her office.

ARTICLE VIII.

Duties of the Vice-Presidents.

In the absence of the President, a Vice-President shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and fill all duties belonging to the office.

ARTICLE IX.

Secretary.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall keep a record of such meetings, and prepare and present Minutes at each meeting. She shall prepare an abstract of the Minutes of the year for the Annual Report. She shall send a copy of the Annual Report to every officer of the Executive Committee, to every Rector, Minister in Charge, and Missionary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the President of every Branch throughout the Church.

The Secretary shall advertise public meetings in such ways as seem best.

ARTICLE X.

Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of the funds belonging to the Executive Committee, and to deposit them in such banking institution as has been selected by the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, to be drawn thence upon the cheque of the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer, for the purpose of the Executive Committee, as ordered by that Committee. All bills sent to the Treasurer must be countersigned by the purchaser before payment. The Treasurer shall present an itemized report in writing at each stated meeting of the Executive Committee. She shall prepare a report of all funds in her charge for the Annual Meeting. Her books shall be audited by a Committee appointed by the President. It is recommended that the payments of each standing committee to the Annual Report Fund be made and the books closed by June first of each year.

ARTICLE XI.

Publication Committee.

The President shall appoint annually a Committee on the Publi-

cation of the Annual Report, said Committee to consist of the Treasurer and Secretary from each of the five Standing Committees, with a Chairman. This Committee shall receive all copy, typewritten, for the Annual Report, and take entire charge of its publication. It shall be the duty of this Committee to estimate amount per page due the Annual Report Fund from each of the five Standing Committees, and the United Offering, after receiving bill from the printer.

The Current Expense Fund of the Executive Committee shall pay for the remaining pages of the Annual Report not belonging to any of the Standing Committees.

ARTICLE XII.

Amendment.

The Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Committee by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

ARTICLE XIV.

Missionary Services.

There shall be three missionary services during the year—

1. The all-day service on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.
2. The Epiphany service in behalf of Missions in the foreign field.
3. The Lenten service.

ARTICLE XV.

Annual Meeting.

The annual Business Meeting shall be held at noon on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.

THE UNITED OFFERING OF THE PENNSYLVANIA BRANCH OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

Object of the Offering of 1916.

Resolved, That the United Offering of 1916 be given to the Board of Missions to be devoted entirely to the training, testing, sending and support of women for Mission Work at home and abroad, and to the care of such as are sick or disabled. Also, that to our united gifts shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves to the work of the Master in the Mission Field; or, if they cannot go themselves, to give of their substance gladly, as the Lord hath prospered them.

Another year has passed, and once more we are called upon to review the work that has been done during the past twelve months in the Indian field.

The Treasurer has received for work among the Indians this year a total of one thousand six hundred fifty-eight dollars and thirty-nine cents (\$1,658.39).

The receipts of the Treasurer of Specials has been five thousand two hundred seventy-three dollars and fifty-nine cents (\$5,273.59).

The scholarships were all completed and the boxes were all taken, although some not until very late in the season.

The total valuation of the missionary boxes sent this year is two thousand five hundred sixty-nine dollars and forty-two cents (\$2,569.42).

The September meeting of the Indians' Hope was preceded by a Corporate Communion in the Chapel of the Church House. The Rev. Mr. Capers, Rector of the Church of the Holy Apostles, and now Bishop-Coadjutor of West Texas, was the Celebrant.

It was announced at this meeting that the work among the Karok Indians of Bishop Moreland's Diocese of Sacramento had been taken over by the Board of Missions.

In October we were fortunate in having with us Bishop Biller, of South Dakota, and some of his missionaries, the Rev. Philip Deloria, one of our most loyal and faithful Indian priests; his lovely daughter, Miss Ella Deloria; Rev. Aaron B. Clark and Mrs. Lambert, who all spoke of the splendid work done in the past among the Dakota Indians and begged us to continue to encourage, support and extend the Church in this most fertile field. We also had at this meeting the Rev. Mr. Thorn, who told us of the work among the Oneidas of Wisconsin.

In January, Archdeacon Stuck spoke on the work in Alaska. He told us that one thousand miles along the banks of the Yukon River belong to our Church, in a spiritual sense. No other mission overlaps or conflicts.

There are many discouragements to worry and hamper the work of our brave Bishop Rowe and his missionary co-workers in Alaska. Whites, low in body and foul in speech, cause great trouble in the Indian villages. White men commit grave offences against the Indians and are acquitted by juries of white men. Our work is to stand behind the native council, who object to the white men planting their cabins right in the midst of the Indian villages. The white Indian trader's store is generally a barroom, gambling hell, and worse. Bishop Rowe has in a few cases succeeded in ousting the whites, and both Bishop Rowe and Archdeacon Stuck have interviewed officials of the land office in Washington. The result of many conferences is that the conclusion has been reached that the only way to solve this difficulty is to prevent the entry of the white man as a settler in any of the Indian villages, but as yet no action has been taken.

Archdeacon Stuck wants to establish hospitals and fight tuberculosis and infant mortality. Also to establish industrial training schools or shops, so that boys being educated in

various trades in the East can, on their return to Alaska, train other boys.

The changing of the habits of a nation is slow work, and a beginning is only made in teaching the children and training the youth. We have twenty mission stations in Alaska and only ten clergy. It has been said that our missions there are "*manned*" by women.

We were fortunate in having at our February meeting one of these brave women, Miss Langdon, who told us of how the splendid hospital work now going on in the Tanana district was begun, when she alone in a one-roomed cabin, which served as her home and also as a hospital, ministered to the sick, handing out medicines from a box given to her by Miss Cady when she started for her post. This box was filled with envelopes; on each was written symptoms of the disease for which medicine was enclosed. Miss Langdon has had to do police duty at times, and she related an interesting incident in which she was called upon to jail and lock up Yaska, a drunken Indian, and three of his companions.

Mrs. Bullitt spoke in January, and Mrs. Biddle in February and April, on the Indian work at Carlisle. There is urgent need of Christian oversight of the young men and women coming to Carlisle from our various mission schools. A constant menace of evil influences is at the very doors of Carlisle.

Bishop Darlington has written to say that if a deaconess could be found to live at Carlisle it would be of inestimable value. At the April meeting the Indians' Hope pledged itself to contribute three hundred dollars a year towards the support of a deaconess at Carlisle.

In March, Bishop Thomas, of Wyoming, told us of the work in his diocese. He said that the Indian situation is acute at this time. First, because the Indian is an old story, he is no longer warlike and unsubdued and interest in him has waned; second, because the whites with whom they come in contact are constantly dragging them down. There seems to be something in the constitution of the white man which enables him to live and withstand the ravage of vice; not so the Indian. The question with us is whether we care enough for the Master's work to help save the Indian, especially when we consider that it is through unworthy members of our race that terrible diseases and moral degradation have been carried to these children of the plains and forest.

Bishop Thomas said that the whites in large numbers are settling in Wyoming as farmers, and if the Indians in many places could be trained to be respectable farming communities, they can live peaceably with their white neighbors, possibly intermarry. Money given to the Indian cause today will be for the white man tomorrow. Bishop Thomas wishes to build for the Arapahoes a series of unit buildings, a glebe or rector's house, a school, a stable, a council house, a church. A good beginning has been made. The money for the glebe house has been raised and the money for the school recently given. It is sincerely hoped that this unique plan can be carried through in its entirety; if not, one more opportunity will be lost to the Church. The Bishop of Wyoming is confronted with the same problem that faces other of our missionary Bishops, and that is, what to do with the Indian boys and girls after they have finished their education in the Indian schools. If they have been taught trades, and no opportunity of employment is offered, it is but natural for them to go back to their blankets. This is not a "retroversion to type," in spite of our saying that it is such.

Many letters have been received from our missionary Bishops and other faithful workers in the field telling of much discouragement, much loneliness, but also of work well done, and encouraging results, and thanking us for the aid sent out to help them in their Christian warfare.

In one of these letters from the Rev. Neville Joyner, of Pine Ridge Reservation, after giving us a detailed account of his field of work, this splendid priest says:

"Yes, the work is a success, and there is much to stimulate one to greater effort. There are hardships, to be sure. It takes a great deal of patience and a great deal of physical endurance to do the work and stand the life on a large Indian Reservation in South Dakota. This is a hostile climate. Here the winds are fiercest. The four winds of the earth meet and strive here together. . . . Tonight the wind is fierce, and it is 36 degrees below zero."

When we read such lines do we not feel an answering thrill of sympathy for those unselfish, heroic souls who are in the thick of battle, winning souls to Christ and doing the Master's work so bravely and uncomplainingly amid discouragement and deprivation, fired with the spirit of that inspired first missionary to the Gentiles, St. Paul, who said, "I can do all things through Christ who strengtheneth me?" Cannot we who work to help these our co-laborers in Christ endeavor

another year to more effectively support our missionaries, and give more liberally than ever to spread the Light and Life of the Living Christ among the North American Indians, many of whom as yet "sit in darkness and in the shadow of death?"

It has been said that "the missionaries have gone into the field as our representatives; we are their partners in the enterprise, and we back them with our prayers and our gifts." Let us see what we have done for those in the Domestic field during the working time of the year just passed.

We have never had so many and such distinguished speakers, five Bishops among them, and they have generally been well rewarded for coming to us. Sometimes I wonder whether it is well to have such a succession of speakers, who give us such inspiring addresses. They do create enthusiasm for their own work, but where there is none to make a plea for it other work suffers. For instance, many boxes and gifts in money will be given in response to the appeals of the speakers, while other missions are quite neglected, perhaps forgotten, by us. No response at all was made to more than a dozen letters sent to me by Miss Emery, and more than twenty

boxes were stricken from my report by her because they had been sent either to private or Diocesan Missions, over which the Board of Missions had no supervision. Of course, they were needy, but not more so than the regular ones under the Board, and, while we call ourselves its Auxiliary, I think we are in duty bound to remember its dependencies. Our records show that 123 boxes have been sent, valued at \$10,817.35, and \$2,009.50 has been given direct by parishes, and the Treasurer reports \$10,067.56 as having passed through her hands. Total, \$22,894.41. By the faithfulness of many Parishes and the great liberality of a very few of our good women, we have once more paid the salary of a Missionary Bishop, and, though we have done this for twenty-two years, this is the first one that we made it a solemn pledge. Heretofore we only said we would try. As this money counts on the Parish Apportionment, it looks to me as if the Rectors will heartily approve it. To me it seems such a beautiful thing to have one Missionary Chief Pastor to shepherd the wandering flock, and in our own dear land, too, that I wonder that we do not count it a great privilege and blessing to do it. Let this be our first duty next season. I thank you all, for the very large attendance at the meetings, and I am grateful that they have been so interesting, and that God graciously permits us to be fellow-laborers with Him.

As we look back over our winter's work and pick up the threads trying to weave them into a whole, we find many golden strands woven in by faithful workers of our Committee and faithful workers who came from the field to tell us of their great encouragements and further needs. Over and again was reiterated the fact that "God's purpose for us in this twentieth century is the realization that the world is a brotherhood, that Christ's love is universal, and that to win the world for Him we must be Christlike in our love for all men." We record with gratitude the wise and loving guidance of our chairman, Mrs. Knorr, at each meeting, and thank her and

Mrs. Biddle for the privilege of hearing each month an account of the forward work of the Church, as presented by some worker or visitor from the foreign field, and of our opportunities as co-partners with them.

We greatly missed our Secretary, Mrs. J. Nicholas Mitchell, who was obliged by ill health to remain in Europe for the winter. Letters expressing the Committee's sympathy were sent to her, and letters received from her told of her loving and continued interest and prayers for the work. We are glad to hear that she is recovering her health and expects to resume her work and be with us again next autumn.

It was moved and seconded, and unanimously passed, at our September meeting that our annual pledges, amounting to \$1,840, should be renewed. Miss Blakiston reminded us in November that the total we had promised to give in pledges and specials was \$2,575. We are happy to state that letters of thanks were received from a number of gifts and boxes sent by our Committee, amongst which was a most grateful acknowledgment from Miss Ogden for the boxes sent St. James' Hospital, Anking; a communion service sent Mr. Diaz for his use in visiting small churches in Cuba; Christmas gifts sent Rev. Pierre Jones, of Haiti, and \$50 sent Mr. Matthews, Cape Mount, Africa. We received a letter from Miss Emery, questioning our continued gift of \$50 interest on a life insurance to Mr. Goddard, and at the request of the Committee a letter was written Mr. Goddard asking if he wished it continued, and a most grateful letter accepting it and telling of his work in Nanchang was received in reply. Two of our most faithful delegates were called to render a further service in His presence during the year, Miss Gorgas, of Holy Trinity, West Chester, and Miss Mary F. Smith, of Christ Church Chapel, Philadelphia.

With great regret we heard of Mrs. Daniel Merritt's resignation as chairman of the Cuban Guild, because of ill health, and we had the pleasure of welcoming Mrs. W. Horner Smith, the new chairman. In a brief review of the splendid work done by the Guild under Mrs. Merritt's leadership since it started in 1885, Mrs. Horner Smith told us the gifts in money had amounted to \$18,687.72. The following resolution from the Cuban Guild was sent to the Committee and accepted, viz.: At a meeting of the Cuban Guild, held at 1917 Spruce Street, February 12, 1914, it was resolved that the chairman of Cuban Work in the Foreign Committee of

the Woman's Auxiliary in Pennsylvania shall in the future be ex-officio Treasurer of the Cuban Guild, with power to receive money, indorse cheques and disburse all Cuban Guild money through the said Foreign Committee; also, to call meetings of the Guild when she deems it necessary. This resolution being carried, Henrietta C. Smith (Mrs. W. Horner Smith, of St. David's, Pa.), chairman of the Cuban Work, was declared to be Treasurer of the Cuban Guild, to succeed Mary F. Smith, deceased. Signed: Mary G. Abbott, Secretary.

The speakers at our first three meetings were from Japan. Bishop Tucker, in September, gave a most encouraging account of the work and stated that the past antagonism to Christianity was now giving place to interest, and that this was especially true amongst the officials and higher class. He emphasized the great need for more trained native leaders and the necessity of the home Church supplying further equipment and more missionaries to train these leaders, as the Japanese Church is as yet too poor and weak to do so. Miss Bull, following in October, told us that only 20 per cent. of the Japanese as yet are in contact with Christianity. Both Bishop Tucker and Miss Bull spoke of the splendid and progressive work now being done by our three churches in Osaka, a city of two million inhabitants, and of their need from us for further equipment. In November, Rev. Mr. Daito gave an address on the evils of Buddhism, and illustrated his talk with most convincing stories of the moral uplift and joy that had come to the converts to Christianity amongst his parishioners in Tokyo. He asked us to help him put up a proper church building in this stronghold of Buddhism. Bishop McKim, following, emphasized all Mr. Daito said, and also spoke of Dr. Teusler's work and of its being our duty to sustain him by giving the necessary funds for the new International Hospital. The \$600 promised by our Committee for the Children's Ward at St. Luke's (to which \$50 was added) was sent, the money being contributed from forty-nine parishes. Miss Mann, in May, closed our year's meeting with a most interesting account of her work, and asked for funds for a church at Nikko, that center of Japanese religious life, where "the only blot on the landscape is our small, old church building."

In December, Bishop Kinsolving made an especial plea for workers, telling us that so far the Church has only given four men to the work in Brazil and has given no great support or gifts. The call from China, that great country where God is giving us such marvellous opportunities to help forward

His Kingdom today, was forcibly given several times. Dr. Glenton gave an account of the honorable and useful places taken by the native nurses whom she had trained, and of the wonderful work done by our doctors during the revolution, and the appreciation expressed by the Chinese officials, not only in words but by gifts. Rev. Arthur Sherman said that "in the next ten years we can do more towards the establishment of Christianity in China than we can do probably after that in one hundred years. What new China is to be is for the Church's Christians to decide, and decide quickly, for China is now holding out her hands to us, and the opportunities are endless." Mrs. Ely, of New York, told of her trip with her husband to the East, and how they went with the conviction that the eastern philosophers and religions were all sufficient for the Oriental, to find that the things done in the name of religion were too dreadful to repeat. So convinced were they of the needs and good of mission work in the East that they have decided to give their lives to work in St. Mary's School and St. John's College, Shanghai. She emphasized the education of girls and women as the greatest need in China today, and gave St. Mary's School as an example of what Christian schools have accomplished in the development of Chinese womanhood. She repeated the same story which Miss Ellen Morris had given us of the unsanitary conditions of St. Mary's building, and asked us to acknowledge our gratitude to Miss Dodson for her faithful and devoted service of twenty-five years by gifts towards the much-needed new building.

Mrs. Pancoast was requested to take a resolution of goodwill from the Committee to all our mission stations which she visits during her six months' trip in the East.

The Committee heard with pleasure Mrs. Pilsbry's report, and wish to thank her for the splendid work done by the Mission Study classes under her leadership this year, and to acknowledge their very generous gifts sent through this Committee to our missions in China. Six normal diocesan classes were held, resulting in seventy-seven parish classes, with a membership of 700. On the Diocesan Educational day the classes and instruction were attended by 300 women, and April 23d a most successful meeting was held for both senior and junior leaders and their class members, when reports were read of the winter's work and addresses made by Dr. W. H. Jefferys, Rev. P. M. Tsu and Mr. Tsing Lee. Appreciation and gratitude were expressed to Dr. Jefferys for his diocesan class for men, among the results of which are a

Men's Committee for Educational Work and the establishment of mission study classes for men in this diocese. Nine thousand copies of the Church Missionary Calendar were sold. The spirit of the mission study classes is shown by the one supreme aim taken by the members "to know Christ and to make Him known."

We have repeatedly heard this winter our missionaries' requests for more workers, for greatly needed equipment, for our sympathy, our prayers; and, knowing their needs, the responsibility and obligation to meet them is now ours. From all parts of the world our brothers are stretching out their hands to us asking our help. How are we, each one, going to answer? The conception of the task laid before us is the establishing of the Church throughout the world, a glorious vision, "empire building for Christ." This can only be done by the giving of our life—i. e., ourselves. Christ gave all for us. What are we willing to give Him? As Rev. Arthur Glasier, who spoke to us in Lent, expressed it: "The quality of love we must carry in our hearts is the cross of sacrifice, for the purchase price to win men is to give all. It isn't interest we need, but passion, for the cause of missions is the cause of Christ."

In reviewing our work, we discover but slight changes from year to year.

It is gratifying to note that the sense of responsibility for the Parish Apportionments to the Board of Missions is increasing; so that this year a larger sum than ever before has gone through our hands for that purpose. Of course, the ideal method would be for every parish to send its apportionment through the parish treasury, and leave the Woman's Auxiliary free for the "special" work for which it was organized. But unless our debts are paid, we cannot allow ourselves the luxury of giving.

The figures in the Report of the Box Committee, we feel sure, do not fully report the work that has been done. While figures are the least important part of the work, it is desirable that every box sent to Colored Missions should be promptly reported to the chairman, so that there can be no opportunity for a mistake.

As to our Specials, in some cases we have kept in touch with the graduates whom we provided with their first clerical suits, until now we subscribe for their children's education. And as we see the results of Church training for the Negroes we confidently present our plea to the Woman's Auxiliary for the colored children of the South.

Each year the fact is more strongly driven home to those watching their racial development, that our Branch of the Church, working through the primary, normal and collegiate schools, gives by far the most deep-reaching results. Take the young man and young woman, trained as our schools *do* train them, sober, cultured, refined and self-respecting, full of a keen religious enthusiasm and ready to do their duty in that state of life to which they have been called; contrast them with the Negroes who have had only the public school training, without the Church influence to show them that they have a "duty towards their neighbor." Could we open the eyes of every member of the Church to this condition, no further word would be needed to fill our treasury. The results are few because our means are so very limited.

As it is, we are individually looking forward with doubt as to our own financial condition for the coming year. Are we to begin by economizing in our contributions for Missions? Or shall we rise to the emergency, determined that those who depend on us to supply the means to carry on their work shall not be disappointed?

If we can recall the stress that our venerable Presiding Bishop lays on the word "Faith-full," let us make it our watchword, and "show our faith by our works."

Once more we are called upon to give an account of our year's work, which has been encouraging in spite of the many ways in which we feel we could improve. This in itself is perhaps a sign of growth. We have reached out in new directions, and these untouched fields have shown us the vast amount of work to be done here at home in our beloved diocese. At times this discourages us, at others gives us a new stimulus to push forward and make every effort to teach (for knowledge is what is needed) our parish auxiliaries what must be done if our diocese, one of the oldest in this country, is to be an example to the newer ones, and not a lesson of the results of a lack of home missionary spirit.

The congested parts of our city must be taken care of spiritually and socially, such as the mill districts of Kensington and Richmond, as well as the southeast portion. Into the lives of these people we must put something besides the drudgery of daily toil, giving them ideals to strive for that will bring Christ into their lives. The colored people, numbering many thousands, must have more than the few churches they now have if we hope to raise them and make good citizens of them. Do we realize how cut off these people are from the recreations allowed the whites? Few places of amusement are open to them, and these are of the lowest type. What can they do but stand on the corners, unless we give

them places where they can find occupation and pleasure in which to spend their free time together? Then think of our rural sections, miles and miles without a church, families that have not seen a clergyman for twenty-five years, hundreds of children that have never heard of Christ. These are a few of the problems that are facing us and making us feel that not a moment can be lost. We, as a Diocesan Committee, must put our armor on and work with all our might, praying that every member of this glorious Church of ours may be given the true spirit of God and help in making this diocese all it should be.

Five new parishes have been added to our list, and our attendance has been good.

A new fund has been added in response to the Bishop's appeal, made in his first convocational address in 1912. This is called "The Bishop's Brick Fund."

The appeal was for money with which to build one church each year for six years. Three of these have been built. The next one is to be St. George's, Richmond, and it is to aid the Bishop in this work that this fund exists. Strips of small red bricks are sent on request to any parish desiring them. These bricks are sold for ten cents each. The idea was suggested by a faithful churchwoman, who designed the little red bricks and gave the first issue of printed slips. It gives an opportunity to hundreds of willing helpers in the diocese who are not able to give large sums. Particularly do we suggest this work to the poorer parishes, missions, junior auxiliaries, mothers' meetings, etc.

The officers of the Diocesan Committee have held during the past year two meetings with the officers of the auxiliaries to the Convocations of Chester, Norristown and Germantown; hoping in this way to come into closer touch with the convocational work, and, by centralizing all diocesan work, to give it more strength and vigor. Reports from these auxiliaries will be added each year to the Annual Report of the Diocesan Committee.

During the year the Committee has given substantial aid in helping to renovate the rectories of two rural parishes. It is hoped that this may become an important part of our yearly work, as well as sending boxes to any of our diocesan clergymen who may be in need of them.

The salaries of the parish workers at St. George's, St. Ambrose's and St. Augustine's are still being paid by the Committee.

We have had most interesting addresses at all the meet-

ings, our only regret being that the allotted time does not permit us to have many more. Among those who have spoken to us are: For Missions, Rev. George Copeland and Deaconess Camp, for St. Ambrose; Miss Helen Corson, for St. George's; Rev. T. E. della Cioppa, for the Italian Mission; Rev. Henry C. McHenry, for the City Mission; Rev. Edward Bonsall, for the Atonement, Morton; Rev. J. M. Chattin, for Grace Church, Hulmeville; Mrs. Ilsley, for All Saints', Darby. For colored work we had Rev. H. L. McDuffey, for St. Augustine's; Rev. R. H. Tabb, for the Crucifixion and its Summer Home; Rev. E. S. Thomas, for St. Barnabas', Germantown; Miss Mary Blakiston, for The Home for the Homeless. On rural work, Rev. H. M. G. Huff and Rev. William C. Emhardt. On immigration, Mr. Frank W. Longshore; for Deaf Mutes, Rev. Dr. Louis C. Washburn and Rev. C. O. Dantzer; for the Jew, Rev. James B. Halsey; for the Lighthouse work, Mrs. Bradford; for the United Offering, Mrs. Ralph North; for St. Martha's House, Mrs. Cookman; for St. Michael and All Angels', Sister Katharine; for the convocational auxiliaries, Mrs. James Cheston, Jr., Mrs. G. G. Field and Miss Mary M. Hibbs.

What we have been able to do seems very little, considering the great need, but it has been a great privilege to have had our part in this little, and it is our earnest hope and prayer that each year may see an increase of Christ's missionary work in this diocese.

The past year has been one of many changes, beginning with the complete reorganization of the whole Junior Department, as decided at the Triennial Meetings last October. In the Junior Department there are now three sections—the Older Juniors, the Intermediate and the Little Helpers. We are indeed happy to welcome the Babies' Branch as our official members, and to include them in this report of all the Juniors of the diocese.

In December, Miss Almy resigned after three years of helpful and inspiring service as our chairman. All of us who worked with her and under her realize what such leadership meant to the Juniors, and how strong were the foundations she laid for work in the future.

The usual meetings were held during the winter, the most notable being an Older Junior Meeting, with Bishop Brent, in October, and a joint meeting of the Mission Study Class members and Older Juniors, with Bishop Rhinelander, in March. It was in March, too, that the first annual election of officers was held. A Nominating Committee was appointed to prepare a ticket which should include three names in nomination for the vacant office of chairman. One duly accredited representative from each parish branch was sent to this meeting to cast the vote for her branch. Miss Margaret Yorke Bannard was elected as chairman. The other officers were re-elected.

A very active Mission Study campaign was carried on

by Miss Hubbard and a number of leaders trained by her in the Advent Season to teach normal classes in the various sections of the diocese in Epiphany, the members of these sectional classes to repeat the course in their own parishes during Lent. Miss Hubbard also held three normal classes for leaders, and as usual held a normal class for the seniors at the Church Training and Deaconess House. The full report of the mission study enrollment is given below.

There is much to be thankful for in the past year, many things accomplished—box work, *The Junior Magazine* published once more, splendid charts and entertainments on truly missionary lines—but as we look forward we are yet more grateful for the opportunities that await us on every side.
