REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

In November the Synod of the Province of Washington met in Richmond, and the first report of the Woman's Auxiliary showed that in the eleven Dioceses there are 633 Branches, 20 Branches of Section B, 346 Junior Branches, 194 Bands of Little Helpers and 401 Mission Study Classes. In comparing the work done in the Diocesan Branches the development of the Educational Department has come first in the majority of them. The conferences and classes during the Synod helped us to compare methods of work, problems and difficulties, and to give and receive the advice and sympathy of friends bound together by one great purpose. The next Provincial Synod will meet in Philadelphia in 1917, when we shall have an opportunity to test more fully the value of these conventions in miniature.

In our own Diocese, in November, we had a devotional service in St. Mark's Church, conducted by the Rev. Hughell Fosbroke, D. D., and in the afternoon, at the conference at the Church House, our President made an inspiring address and the chairmen of the committees outlined their work for the winter.

On January 27th we met in St. Stephen's Church for our mid-winter missionary day. At the morning session, after the celebration of the Holy Communion, Bishop Jones, of Utah, and Dr. Teusler, of St. Luke's International Hospital, Tokyo, spoke enthusiastically of their work, and in the afternoon the Rev. R. W. Patton, Bishop Thomas and the Rev. John Chattin made stirring appeals.

In Easter week another conference was held in the Church House, when Presidents of sixty-six Branches gave very condensed reports, showing in many cases an increase both in members, gifts and study classes. It was suggested that Pennsylvania should try to send \$50,000 to the United Thank Offering in October, and this can be done if we will.

After many years of faithful and devoted leadership, Mrs. Neilson has resigned as President of the Domestic Committee, but we still have our Honorary President to help us with her keen interest and judgment, ripened through long experience.

The record of work done by the committees, the Mission Study Classes and the United Offering shows the three-fold aim of the Woman's Auxiliary—work, study, prayer—but the greatest of these is prayer.

"Teach us, good Lord, to serve Thee as Thou deservest;
to give and not to count the cost; to labor and not to ask for
any reward save that of knowing that we do Thy will."

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE INDIANS' HOPE
ASSOCIATION

Before the regular meetings of the Indians' Hope began for the winter the Association met with a great loss in the death, on August 16, 1915, of Mrs. C. Stuart Patterson, who had resigned her office of First Vice-President of the Indians' Hope Association in May, 1915, on account of ill health. Mrs.

Patterson was a devoted officer of the Association, and in her willingness to serve was ever ready to undertake even more than her share of work.

A resolution of sympathy was drawn up and approved by the Indians' Hope and sent to Mr. Patterson.

While we might say that our year's work is, on the whole, encouraging, it probably is part of the very fibre of Christian service to feel a sort of divine dissatisfaction with the labor done, as measured by the opportunities.

The Treasurer has received this year a total of one thousand five hundred thirty-seven dollars and sixty cents (\$1,537.60). This includes a balance of nineteen dollars and eighty cents (\$19.80) from last year.

The Treasurer of Specials has received five thousand three hundred fifty-one dollars and sixty-two cents (\$5,351.62). Of this sum one thousand and eighty-four dollars (\$1,084.00) was an extra special pledge towards the three thousand dollars (\$3,000) needed to build the Missionary's House at Pyramid Lake, Nevada, and one thousand eight hundred thirty-four dollars and seventy-five cents (\$1,834.75) an extra special towards the maintenance of All-Saints' School, Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

The scholarships were all completed and all of the boxes taken. The total valuation of the missionary boxes sent this year is two thousand four hundred forty-three dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$2,443.69).

Mrs. Charles M. Bayard was elected Second Vice-President at the May, 1915, meeting. Mrs. Charles Biddle became First Vice-President when Mrs. Patterson resigned that office.

Mrs. Ashbridge resigned her office of Treasurer in September, and at the October meeting Miss Watts resigned as Committee on Boxes and was elected to take Mrs. Ashbridge's place. Miss Katherine Hare was nominated and elected to take the office of Box Committee, resigned by Miss Watts.

The September meeting was preceded by a Corporate Communion in the Chapel of the Church House. The Rev. J. H. Chapman, of St. Paul's Church, Chestnut Hill, was the celebrant, and spoke of remembering, especially at this Eucharist, Mrs. Patterson, who had so long labored with us and inspired us.

Bishop Brooke, of Oklahoma, addressed the September meeting and told us of the work among the one hundred and twenty thousand Indians in his district.

At the October meeting we received the sad news of the sudden death, on October 22d, of Bishop Biller, of South Dakota, a martyr to overwork in the Master's cause.

In October Bishop Thurston, of eastern Oklahoma, made a plea in behalf of the Choctaw Indians of his district, and made the statement that it is an acknowledged fact that the difficulties of the government in dealing with the Indians increase in direct proportion to the decrease in mission work.

In November Bishop Morrison, of Duluth, told us of his Indian missions, the second largest in the United States, those among whom the great "Apostle to the Indians," Bishop Whipple, labored so long. They are the last of the Forest Indians, the Ojibways and Chippewas, as distinguished from the Indians of the Plains, the Sioux, their ancient enemies, between whom a lasting peace has been made by the Gospel of the Prince of Peace. These Indians have been in sore straits this winter, owing to the failure of their crops.

We had no speaker for the December meeting.

In January Mrs. Biller addressed us and gave an outline of the plans that Bishop Biller had made for the year's work in South Dakota. Mrs. Biller hopes to raise the money needed to carry on this work, about twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), and for this purpose made her journey to the east. Her courage in undertaking such a task under the burden of her great sorrow is truly wonderful. In writing of her purpose a South Dakota priest says: "Her desire for the future to do all in her power to carry on the work that he laid down calls forth such unselfish thought for others as I do not think I have ever seen."

Mrs. Biller spoke particularly of All-Saints' School, Sioux Falls, South Dakota, founded by Bishop Hare for the education of the daughters of the clergy, which she considers the greatest missionary influence in the state. The school at present is badly in need of repairs and refurnishings. The income from the school is not sufficient to meet its expenses, and the Bishop of South Dakota is always obliged to raise a certain amount each year to help carry on the work.

In February we had two speakers, the Rev. Mr. Barlow, who addressed us with regard to the work at Carlisle, and Mr. Henry Roe Cloud, a Christian Indian, who also spoke on Carlisle. The question of regular religious instruction at Carlisle has been discussed for several years, and no satisfactory plan has yet been put in action. There is great need of ministering regularly to the young people from our mission schools and others not Roman Catholic. A clergyman or mission worker of our Church and a Y. M. C. A. worker are greatly needed. Several attempts have been made to carry on this sort of work there, but for various reasons none of these has been successful.

We had no speaker in March. At this meeting our President asked every delegate to write to her Senators and Representatives, urging them to prevent the enactment of the Hastings, Fall, Johnson, Lane and Myers bills, which are framed to work great harm to the Indians and undo any good that has been accomplished. The Lane bill, which proposes to do away with the Indian Bureau, would remove from the Indians what little protection the government now gives them and leave them at the mercy of unscrupulous whites. The Secretary was asked to write, and did so, in behalf of the Indians' Hope Association.

In April Bishop Howden, of New Mexico, spoke to us of the opportunities in his field. During the last two years the Bishop has been making what he calls his evangelistic campaign, studying over the needs and opportunities of his district, as our Church has no missions among the Indians of New Mexico. The three tribes in the state are the Navajos, almost entirely pagan, though one of the finest of the Indian tribes; the Apaches, who are pagan, and the Pueblos, who are nominal adherents of the Roman Catholic Church, but who cling tenaciously to their pagan rites, particularly expressed in their dances, on the feast days of the Church. There is an appalling death rate among the babies of these tribes, and they should be taught sanitary living.

At all our meetings interesting letters from missionaries have been read from all parts of the Indian field, letters that are an inspiration not only because they tell of splendid work done so quietly and unostentatiously, but because we know that those who thus labor so willingly, often without seeing the results of their work, have caught the vision of the Kingdom and labor as seeing Him who is invisible.

May we not also keep the vision before our eyes and rouse ourselves to greater effort to make known the Gospel of Life to those who sit in "the shadow of death"?

This is the day when I must give you a review of what has been done, and given, during the season of our work. I hope that we may never lose the deepest interest in Domestic Missions, for they deeply concern our patriotism, so that while Foreign Missions may be said to be our opportunity, Domestic Missions are surely our responsibility.

We have sent away 112 boxes, valued at \$9,578.59. The parishes have sent, in money direct, \$1,598, and the Treasurer reports that \$9,025.65 has passed through her hands, a total in value of boxes and money of \$21,202.24. We have had with us several of our Missionary Bishops—Bishop Brooke, Bishop Beecher, Bishop Jones—and of our missionary clergy the Rev. W. B. Allen, of North Carolina; Rev. A. Rufus Morgan, of Penland; Father McVeigh Harrison, O. H. C.; Archdeacon Mayo, of Virginia. So that the interest created has indeed been widespread. Nothing stirs us as the voice from the front does.

And now, dear people, it is my sad duty to say to you all, good-bye. And after forty-three happy years I shall no longer be your President. I have no words to tell you how I appreciated your good help and loving interest and loyalty. God bless you all. Adieu.

As members of this, the Foreign Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, we must remember that we have to help the Board of Missions in supporting the work under nine Bishops in ten missionary districts, whose forces include three hundred and five clergy and upwards of one thousand lay workers, men and women, Americans and foreigners. We are most thankful to our President and Vice-President for having given us the privilege of coming into touch with every part of this vast work. The accounts which we have heard were thrilling, and

your Secretary regrets that she can give only a sketch of that which to all of you must have seemed a most helpful and successful season, with its nine meetings, each full of enthusiasm.

The September meeting found us in our new quarters, which have proved very satisfactory. Our Treasurer reported the good news that the Bishop Stevens Scholarship Fund was completed. Rev. Mr. McNulty, of Soochow, told us about the beautiful life of the late Rev. Mr. Woo and about his two schools for boys and girls and of their great need for scholarships. We promised to give one for each school.

In October Deaconess Whitaker told us about the sad conditions in Mexico and described most vividly the pitious condition of the people; how they are suffering from famine and what an opportunity was offered to gain a permanent hold on the people through the relief work which was done each day. Later Miss McKnight wrote about the opening of the Hooker Memorial School, with twenty-four girls in attendance.

Rev. Roger Walke, of Kyoto, pleaded with us to live up to our opportunity in Japan. He told us that Mr. Chapman has charge of nineteen mission stations and of the urgent appeal of Bishop Tucker for nine more workers to relieve such situations. Also he spoke of the absolute necessity of rebuilding St. Hilda's School, under the care of Miss Myers, and, last of all, of his own need of a students' hospital.

Bishop Colmore told us about our work in Haiti, of the devastating tornados there and of the dire need for true religious and educational work. He hopes to establish a Cathedral School at Port au Prince. The funds for two chapels were pledged by the committee, besides \$30 sent in September.

During the year we heard twice from Cuba, Archdeacon Steel reporting that there are five or six American congregations, besides the splendid Cathedral services in both Spanish and English at Havana. He told us of the degradation of the women and their urgent need for help.

In January Miss Hopwood made a most earnest appeal for St. Agnes' School, Anking, picturing the contrast between the education Chinese girls receive at St. Agnes and in the government schools, and said "that Christianity alone can help the awful situation of girls in China, who for the first time learn in such a school as St. Agnes' what love is." There are twenty-two daughters of high officials in the school, and from lack of room they have had to refuse to take many others.

Rev. Dr. Pott, making his one hundred and sixteenth address on his holiday, made an eloquent appeal for St. John's University, claiming it as the centre of all educational work in China. The committee pledged itself to raise \$5,000 to

build a wing of the much-needed new preparatory school building, this wing to be called after Bishop Rhinelander. Miss Ogden wrote, thanking us for five boxes sent her for the hospital at Anking, Miss Wood asked for more books and Miss Richmond wrote of the joyous Christmas festivities at Soochow.

In April Rev. S. Harrington Littell gave a thrilling talk on the progress of China, its present crisis and the marvelous development of the native Church. At the Synod held in 1915 entire approval was expressed for the native Church to open up missionary work in the Shensi Province, with its nine millions of untouched natives, and also expressed the hope of electing a native Bishop in the near future. Mr. Littell told us about the wonderful growth of his Catechetical School, which in four years has sent out eighty-eight trained workers. Now, after eight years, seven are returning to be further trained at All-Saints' Divinity School, which is soon to be made the central theological seminary for all China. Best of all, and showing his wonderful humility, was the spirit in which he told us that his former Chinese assistant was so thoroughly fitted to take charge of the Catechetical School that now he has the full responsibility of the work, while Mr. Littell acts as his assistant. This should be the goal of all foreign missionaries, not blocking the way, but aiding and watching "to see the natives increase while we decrease." It was imperative that the Divinity School should have more ground, and therefore Mr. Littell said he had procured a corner lot for a modest sum and that he wanted Philadelphia to have the privilege of giving it to China. Most earnestly do we hope that we may raise the \$7,000 needed.

At the Epiphany meeting Dr. Teusler told us about the funds for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo, and we are glad to know that we have raised nearly the entire amount promised by the Diocese of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Reifsnider made a strong appeal for the greatly needed new buildings for St. Paul's University, Tokyo, and expressed the hope that Philadelphia would give \$7,000.

At our Lenten meeting Bishop Rhinelander spoke to us on the duty and the unimagined possibilities of prayer and the special promise as to united prayer. Rev. Mr. Richardson also spoke on the spiritual side of missions. Both of these addresses helped to bring before us the work planned by our faithful United Offering Chairman, Mrs. North, and we are glad to report many gatherings for united prayers all over the Diocese.

To far-away Africa have been sent Christmas boxes for Cape Mount School, and several contributions were sent to the work in Edena, Liberia, in answer to an appeal from a dying African chief "that the God-man would take the message of God to his people."

Mrs. Pilsbry told us \$540 had been received from the sale of the S. M. calendars, and she also told us about the splendid progress of the educational work.

We have welcomed several new Branches and rejoice in the new and energetic work being done by them. We hope in the near future we may have delegates from every parish in this Diocese, for we need a fourfold increase to fulfill the calls.

"Wider and wider yet
The gates of the nations swing;
Clearer and clearer still
The wonderful prophecies ring.
Go forth ye hosts of the living God,
And conquer the earth for your King!"

Will we who have such endless opportunities answer this call?

We began the work of the Committee on Colored Missions for the past year with the determination to better our record by every measure in our power. To this end we asked the Bishop to attend and address our first meeting with a view to arouse interest, and, if possible, enthusiasm for the work, such as had not hitherto distinguished those engaged in it.

We conferred with the Colored Archdeacon of the Diocese as to his methods of work, and as the Bishop had assumed that lack of interest in the subject was due to lack of knowledge, we recommended to the committee a diligent study of literature upon the negro question.

We had also the good fortune to secure as a speaker for our Epiphany meeting the Rev. Robert Patton, at present connected with the American Church Institute for Negroes. Those who had the privilege of hearing Mr. Patton could not have failed to be fired by the burning enthusiasm with which he treated his subject, his birth, training and deep personal and sympathetic interest having made him thoroughly conversant with its every phase. As we all know, however, fires will eventually die out if not kept supplied with fuel, and it

behooves us to keep alive the flame thus kindled, lest our zeal languish and the result be no fruit but ashes.

We have also had interesting addresses from different clergymen and teachers from the South visiting this city with the sure faith that they could not fail to reap in this large and prosperous community a rich harvest of interest and money to help maintain their struggling schools and missions. It is pathetic to see the bravely disguised dejection and disappointment with which they turn their faces homeward, their hopes dashed, their plans frustrated, their faith in the sympathy and brotherly feeling of the North too often destroyed.

We have kept up our interest in St. Paul's School, Lawrenceville, and in St. Augustine's School and St. Agnes' Hospital, Raleigh, as well as other smaller schools and missions, and have paid some teachers' salaries and scholarships, besides meeting our annual undesignated contributions to the Board of Missions, and last, but by no means least, we have sent a number of boxes of varying value to our missionaries in the field, which have been acknowledged in letters expressing the utmost gratitude and appreciation of what has been sent them. But while this is gratifying in a way, it is humiliating to receive gratitude for what is, after all, the right of those who labor in our stead, the right to be maintained in comfort if not in luxury; the right to be adequately supported by the Church to which they have given their all, but which fails to fulfill their reasonable expectations. "My brethren, these things ought not so to be."

It is true that we have fallen upon evil times; the claims upon our sympathy and help both at home and abroad have been overwhelming, and we must be thankful that we have held our ground, having even made an advance upon last year's receipts, both in money and boxes, but it must be admitted that we are far from having made the record at which we aimed, when we consider the opportunities which cry aloud for recognition and review all that we might have done.

Surely we should not be content with not having retrograded; surely we should, if we undertake the work at all, strain every nerve to accomplish each year more and more, as becomes the followers of One who never rested from His beneficent labors for the welfare of His brethren.

It is with a sense of gratitude and encouragement that we present our report of work done by the Diocesan Committee throughout the year, for in going over the record we rejoice to find that we have made a step forward in more than one direction. More parishes have sent delegates to the committee than ever before and the interest has been deeper.

The year began with a motion to continue the payment of the salaries of our parish workers at St. George's and St. Ambrose's; also to pay in part the helper at St. Augustine's.

At our October meeting an appeal was made for three Christmas boxes to be sent to the wives of three of our diocesan clergy. This appeal was answered in a most generous way, and the letters of appreciation and gratitude that we received helped us all to feel the true Christmas spirit.

All those who had the pleasure of hearing the address made by the Bishop at our February meeting feel that they know our Diocese in a way they never did before, and realize more fully the wonderful work we are doing and hope to do, also the privilege it is to be delegates to a committee that has its part in this great work. After listening to the Bishop we could only feel that we each and all had our share to do and could by our personal effort help in the work of Christ in our own parish and Diocese.

Our Lenten meeting was a devotional one, Mrs. J. N. Mitchell speaking to us in such a sincere way on prayer that

we all felt more than ever before the great value of prayer to ourselves and others, especially those at the front in our mission fields.

Among those who have spoken to us during the year have been Mrs. J. D. Thomas, who gave us a most encouraging account of the growth of the Bishop's Bricks Fund, which is becoming of true importance in the Diocese, carrying out, as it does, the Bishop's desire for cooperation for unity in diocesan extension. This work has even penetrated the penitentiary, where the prisoners have built a beautiful church and presented it to the Bishop. Surely what can be done to help our Diocese in one of our prisons can be done in every parish.

Miss Smiley, the head social worker at the Episcopal Hospital, gave us a most interesting outline of the work being done there by the four social workers, which is divided into four classes, one taking charge of the kindergarten and work among crippled children, one work among babies under two, including classes for mothers; one the social service work of the wards, and the fourth all work not included under the three other classes.

Miss Rumney gave us an account of what is being done at St. Barnabas', Germantown, and made an appeal for assistance towards the salary of the helper there.

We also heard of what is being accomplished at St. Augustine's and the Church of the Crucifixion, three of our missions doing work among the colored people of our Church.

We were glad to hear again of our French Mission of St. Sauveur. Its present incumbent, M. Malan, told us that when he took this charge two years ago everything was in a most discouraging condition. But the congregation has become enthusiastic and is now working with courage and interest. The buildings have had the necessary repairs and both Sunday School and guilds have been started and are going on well. We also heard from Rev. Della Cioppa, of the Italian Mission of L'Emmanuello. This church is the centre of the Italian work being carried on in the Diocese, having now under it a number of missions and social centres not only in the city proper, but also in the rural districts. There are still many localities where there is great opportunity for work, and it is the hope of the committee under which it is now being carried on that they may be able to send workers to these localities in the near future.

Rev. J. J. Hall told of the wonderful growth of the Galilee Mission, a work always of deep interest to the committee.

We heard for the first time of what is being accomplished at Trinity Church, Buckingham, from its rector, Rev. George N. Holcomb.

Miss Blakiston told us of the Home for the Homeless and Mrs. Dallam of the House of Rest and Miss Butterfield of a new branch of work in our Diocese called the Church Mission of Helps, being a rescue work among delinquent women and girls of our Church.

We also heard from Mrs. Alexander Wetherill of what is being done at the House of the Holy Child for colored girls.

As usual at our last meeting, we had reports from Miss Bispham, of St. George's, and Deaconess Camp, of St. Ambrose, each giving us such a full account of the progress made at these missions that we felt our committee was blessed in being able to give to the Diocese the work of two such noble women.

There is a special call for sacrifice to every Christian today. Shall we not answer this call and feel it our greatest privilege to be able to help our Lord in His work in our home Diocese and abroad? Let us do our best and bring His blessing on our Diocesan Committee and on our homes.

Report of the Bishop's Brick Fund, 1916.

This committee reports progress and increased interest in the work. Begun in the first year of Bishop Rhinelander's Episcopate, it has become a channel through which small sums may be gathered annually to help in the work of Church Extension in the Diocese. The Bishop's Brick Fund has already amounted to \$1,778.56, derived chiefly from dimes, although there have been generous individual gifts. This year's offering was \$706.56. The work is established through the various organizations of the Church, and the Bishop's Brick Fund Committee wishes to thank the Diocesan Committee for kind interest and co-operation. The work is now established in many parish auxiliaries. The Bishop's Brick Fund Calendar, issued every year, pays for all expenses. Eight hundred copies were sold last year.

REPORT OF JUNIOR AUXILIARY, 1915-1916.

The Junior Department of the Woman's Auxiliary wishes to emphasize the plans for the future rather than the accomplishment of the past year, though in some respects it has been a good year.

Six conferences were held during the winter, three especially for the leaders and three for the leaders and junior members. At the last conference, when reports of Branches were read by the children, the Chapel in the Church House was crowded by boys and girls, and thirty-eight Branches were represented. The Bishop spoke at this meeting. One conference was for manual training, illustrated by Miss Prophet, and another was in the form of a quiet day for leaders, conducted by Father Hughson.

The Educational Secretary, Miss Anne Hubbard, has done splendid work and provided three normal classes in mission study, one led by Miss Margaret Evans. Thirty-four leaders were enrolled, representing thirty-six Branches and thirty-two parishes, and as a result of these classes five hundred and seventy-four juniors were taught the three Mission Study Courses recommended by the Board of Missions. The charts and illustrations and contributions to the Junior Magazine, which was published in May, are striking evidences of the interesting education the children received.

The juniors expect to raise their usual apportionment of \$2,000, and have sent off many boxes and specials. A number of young people, many of them members of the Junior Auxiliary, succeeded in raising \$10,000 for the Children's Ward in St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo.

We are glad to report that Miss Rose Dolan, of Rosemont, has been appointed Chairman of Boys' Branches, and we ask the Woman's Auxiliary to support Miss Dolan in her important department.

We are not yet able to announce the name of the Chairman of Little Helpers' Branches.

Of the approximate one hundred and ninety-nine parishes in the Diocese, only sixty-four are represented in the Junior Auxiliary.

By the end of next year we hope to have a Branch in every parish, and have made other ambitious plans.

May we have the help of the men and women of the Diocese?

DIOCESE OF PENNSYLVANIA.

Report of the Educational Secretary for 1915-1916.

October 13th. The Educational Secretaries and Mission Study Class Leaders began the work of the year by making a Corporate Communion. The Bishop was celebrant and gave an instruction on the watchword for the year, Light. This service was followed immediately by a conference, when the work of the year was planned, classes announced and registrations made.

Subject for the year: The Church's Mission to the Nation.

Watchword: Light.

Aim: To bear witness of the Light, through the Church to the Nation.

Classes—The first class, led by the Educational Secretary, was the Faculty Class, consisting of four senior, four junior and four men leaders. Two Normal Classes were held in Advent, two in Epiphany and one Diocesan Class in Lent. These classes had a membership of 79, 59 of whom led classes. Ten led classes in outside parishes as well as in their own. Six of these classes were for men and women, one for young men—79 classes in all, with a total membership of 921, 327 of whom had never been in a Mission Study Class before. Several leaders trained in senior classes led juniors. These were reported to the Juniors.

Perhaps the most memorable class of the year was the Sunday morning class at St. Luke's, Kensington, from which a trained nurse volunteered for service and is now working under Rev. F. D. Lobdell in the North Carolina Mountains.

At the close of the Washington Class a woman wrote: "I have been baptized again with the light of enthusiasm, love and fellowship." This has been said in different words by dozens of women. The Study Class has formed and cemented friendships, called men and women into the Church, sent them on errands of love and mercy, for its sole purpose is to know Christ and to make Him known.

OPEN MEETINGS—Educational Day was observed in January, over 300 attending the conference and classes. A pageant, the "Mission of the Church to the Nations," was given for the first time that day, and afterwards in seven parishes. Two open sessions were held, one in March on the mission of the Church in Philadelphia to the Italians, another in April on her mission to the negroes. In both there was opportunity for

these people to speak for themselves, and those present were convinced that they not only needed us, but we needed them—the contribution of their lives to the Church.

ALUMNAE—New members of the Normal Classes have been received into the Mission Study Class Alumnae. The Alumnae has held its two regular meetings, continued to support a priest and a catechist in China, and has made various other gifts of money.

PUBLICATIONS—The Church Missionary Calendar for 1916 made \$600 over and above expenses, to be sent to the Board of Missions through the Pennsylvania Branch of the Women's Auxiliary, to apply on our apportionment. In addition, the Educational Department has published a pamphlet by the Bishop on "The Authority of Creeds," and a book on "The Mission Study Class, Its Message and Methods," by the Educational Secretary.

EXTENSION—The Pennsylvania course has been carried beyond the limits of the Diocese. To Canada by Mrs. R. L. Hayes; to Richmond, Va., where the Educational Secretary led a class at the Provincial Synod. Also in Washington, D. C., where five sessions of the course were given to a drawing room class of 43 and the pageant to a large audience. A New Jersey Normal leader took the course in one of our Normal Classes. In Louisiana the course was given by correspondence.

Twelve Parish Educational Secretaries were appointed this year, making the present enrollment 90.

Especially to Mrs. Ralph R. Hayes, through whose endeavor this has been accomplished. To the Bishop for his presence, his blessing, his simple, direct teaching, which has sent us on our way "rejoicing in the Light." To the fifty-nine leaders who have given themselves to bear witness of the Light.

Above all, to Christ, the Light, to whom we bring, in joyful thanksgiving, all that by His Grace and our endeavor has been accomplished.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE I.

Name.

The name of this Association shall be the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Object.

The object of the Association shall be to carry out within the Diocese of Pennsylvania the purposes and work of the Woman's Auxiliary as approved by the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE III.

Organization.

To accomplish these various objects this Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary is organized into five standing Committees—Indians' Hope, Domestic, Foreign, Work Among the Colored People, and the Diocesan. The Chairman of each Committee is to be appointed by the Bishop, with the exception of the Indians' Hope, which must follow its own constitution, as it antedates the formation of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV.

Membership.

The Church itself is the Missionary Society. Every baptized person is a member of the Society; therefore, every baptized woman in the Diocese should be an active member of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE V.

Officers.

The officers of this Association shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, a Treasurer for the United Offering, and five officers of the Junior Department. These shall serve for one year and shall be eligible for renomination. The Board shall have power to fill all vacancies which may occur during the year for the unexpired term.

An Annual Meeting of the Executive Committee shall be held on the last Wednesday in April, when appointments by the Bishops shall be announced, nominations having been made by written ballot at the previous meeting.

ARTICLE VI.

Executive Committee.

The general management is entrusted to an Executive Board, composed of the Diocesan officers, the officers of the Standing Com-

mittees, the Chairman of the work in Mexico and Brazil, the Chairman of the work in Cuba, the Assistant Treasurer of the United Offering, and the Librarian.

ARTICLE VII.

Duties of the President.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee. She shall appoint all members of committees necessary for the transacting of the work of the Executive Committee. She shall be ex-officio member of all committees. She shall visit Parish Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary when invited, and seek opportunity to establish branches in parishes where there are none and fill all other duties pertaining to her office.

ARTICLE VIII.

Duties of the Vice-Presidents.

In the absence of the President, a Vice-President shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and fill all duties belonging to the office.

ARTICLE IX.

Secretary.

The Secretary shall give notice of all meetings ordered by the Executive Committee. She shall keep a record of such meetings, and prepare and present Minutes at each meeting. She shall prepare an abstract of the Minutes of the year for the Annual Report. She shall send a copy of the Annual Report to every officer of the Executive Committee, to every Rector, Minister in Charge, and Missionary of the Diocese of Pennsylvania, to the General Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to the President of every Branch throughout the Church.

The Secretary shall advertise public meetings in such ways as seem best.

ARTICLE X.

Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to take charge of the funds belonging to the Executive Committee, and to deposit them in such banking institution as has been selected by the Executive Committee of the Pennsylvania Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, to be drawn thence upon the cheque of the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer, for the purpose of the Executive Committee, as ordered by that Committee. All bills sent to the Treasurer must be countersigned by the purchaser before payment. The Treasurer shall present an itemized report in writing at each stated meeting of the Executive Committee. She shall prepare a report of all funds in her charge for the Annual Meeting. Her books shall be audited by a Committee appointed by the President. It is recommended that the payments of each standing committee to the Annual Report Fund be made and the books closed by June first of each year.

ARTICLE XI.

Publication Committee.

The President shall appoint annually a Committee on the Publication of the Annual Report, said Committee to consist of the Treasurer and Secretary from each of the five Standing Committees, with

a Chairman. This Committee shall receive all copy, typewritten, for the Annual Report, and take entire charge of its publication. It shall be the duty of this Committee to estimate amount per page due the Annual Report Fund from each of the five Standing Committees, and the United Offering, after receiving bill from the printer.

The Current Expense Fund of the Executive Committee shall pay for the remaining pages of the Annual Report not belonging to any of the Standing Committees.

ARTICLE XII.

Amendment.

The Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Committee by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.

ARTICLE XIV.

Missionary Services.

There shall be three missionary services during the year—

1. The all-day service on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.
2. The Epiphany service in behalf of Missions in the foreign field.
3. The Lenten service.

ARTICLE XV.

Annual Meeting.

The annual Business Meeting shall be held at noon on the Friday following the second Thursday in November.
