REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

1916-1917.

This report begins with the melancholy fact of the resignations of Mrs. George C. Thomas and Miss Carryl, but we are happy in retaining their services on the Executive Board.

This has been a year of activity and the Auxiliary has grown both in Parish Branches and individual members. A new Committee—How to Reach Isolated Churchwomen—has been added, and our connection with the Church Periodical Club has been made closer, as its correspondent is now a member of the Executive Board.

On All Saints' Day Bishop Brent conducted a devotional meeting in the Church of the Holy Trinity, to which all the women's organizations in the Diocese were invited, and a deep impression was made. The next meeting was on St. Paul's Day, at Christ Church, whose hospitality was worthy of its traditions. Bishop Garland presided, and the speakers were the Bishop of Western Nebraska, the Rev. Dr. Braxton Bryan, of the Bishop Payne Divinity School; the Rev. Mr. McClement, of New Mexico; the Rev. Mr. Ludlow, of Wuchang, and Dr. William Hamilton Jeffreys gave us his ideals for the City Mission. It was a great opportunity for the Auxiliary to realize the remarkable work of the Neighborhood House, where we had a bountiful lunch served by the ladies of the Parish. The last session of the Auxiliary for the year was a conference, on April 18, when ways of reaching isolated churchwomen in the diocese were suggested, the Junior plan was outlined and other subjects were discussed. It was decided to print only the officers of the Parish Branches in this annual report and a card catalogue of all officers and delegates will be kept for reference at the Church House.

An important part of the work of the year has been the revision of the Constitution, which will come up for adoption in the autumn. We do beg every member of the Auxiliary to study the accompanying reports of the various committees, including for the first time that of the Church Periodical Club.

The great event of the year has been the Week of Prayer in the Diocese, which has led to the formation of classes on prayer and the consequent appreciation of our greatest duty and highest help.

At the meetings of the General Convention in St. Louis the President, in accordance with the usual custom, pledged the Pennsylvania Branch for St. Agnes' School, Kyoto, the sum of \$2,500, and the same amount for the Mission in Sagada, Philippine Islands. It is with thankful hearts that we record that both the pledges are more than paid.

As our nation is now at war, we urge our members to work harder than ever for the spread of the kingdom. Let us follow the noble example of England, who, in the first year of her war *increased* her contributions by the sum of \$1,750,000. Let us pray God that the daughter Church prove worthy of such a mother!

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE INDIANS' HOPE ASSOCIATION

The work of the Indians' Hope Association in its general characteristics varies but little from season to season. The following is a condensed report for the year:

The Treasurer has received, during the year, a total of one thousand five hundred and sixty-five dollars and ninety-one cents (\$1,565.91). This includes a balance of forty-one dollars and fifty-nine cents (\$41.59).

The Treasurer of Specials has received four thousand thirty-one dollars and ninety cents (\$4031.90).

The scholarships were all completed and all the boxes were taken. The total valuation of boxes sent to mission schools and stations, hospitals, missionaries and their families is two thousand five hundred seventy-four dollars and eighty-seven cents (\$2,574.87).

Our first meeting was preceded by a Corporate Communion in the Chapel of the Church House. The Rev. Henry Martyn Medary, of the Memorial Church of the Advocate,

was the celebrant. Bishop Rhinelander addressed the business meeting, which followed.

During the year we have listened to the personal appeals of several missionary Bishops and Missionaries. Rev. Aaron Clark, of South Dakota, and Miss Thackara, from the Navajo Mission Hospital, Fort Defiance, Arizona, in September; Bishop Morrison, of Duluth, and Bishop-elect Burleson, in November; Bishop Thomas, of Wyoming, in December, and Bishop Tyler, of North Dakota, in January.

Money was sent for special needs to the Bishops of Alaska, South Dakota, Duluth, Idaho, Oklahoma, Sacramento, Utah, and Wyoming and New Mexico.

The artesian well at St. Elizabeth's, Standing Rock Reservation, South Dakota, was completed by the addition of a watering trough with the inscription: "O ye wells bless ye the Lord," in memory of the late Bishop Biller, and is so inscribed. A little cottage of three rooms and a bath has also been built near the school and has been a great comfort and convenience for the teachers as a place of rest. St. Elizabeth's has prospered wonderfully under Deaconess Baker.

The work at Pyramid Lake, Nevada, is in a flourishing condition. The new Mission House, to the building of which last year the Indians' Hope contributed, is a splendid addition to the equipment of the Church on this reservation. This year, through the Indians' Hope, further gifts were sent to Pyramid Lake: a silver communion set, brass candlesticks, and a brass cross in memory of the late Bishop Robinson, of Nevada. A second brass cross was also sent to be placed at Bishop Hunting's discretion.

At our April meeting a resolution was read on the recent death of Mrs. John Ashbridge, who was Treasurer of the Indians' Hope for many years. Mrs. Ashbridge left a bequest of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to the Indians' Hope Association.

During our winter's work we have sometimes felt discouraged in realizing how far short we fall in measuring up to the opportunities which come to us. Let us take heart and ever keep before us our goal, which is "the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ."

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DOMESTIC COMMITTEE

The first meeting of the Domestic Committee for the year 1916-1917 was held on October 9th, and was preceded by a Corporate Communion in the Chapel of the Church House, with the Rev. J. H. Chapman, of St. Paul's Church, Chestnut Hill, as celebrant.

The largest pledge of our committee to the Board of Missions has for many years been one of \$3,000 for a Missionary Bishop's salary, which we were especially urged to consider well before renewing for another year, but it was enthusiastically voted to continue it.

A new responsibility and opportunity was given us in a pledge of \$2,500 for our mission at Sagada, in the Philippines, which, with three smaller pledges, made our total \$5,740.

We have sent away 94 boxes, valued at \$7,627.89.

The Treasurer reports that \$11,066.25 have passed through her hands up to date, making a total in money and value of boxes of \$18,694.14.

The sum of \$650.89 was reported to our Treasurer as having been sent direct, from parishes and individuals, without passing through her hands. We understand that a good deal of money has been sent in this manner.

Four of our Missionary Bishops addressed us during the winter; Bishop Page, of Spokane, in behalf of the every-day constructive work in his diocese; Bishop Thomas, of Wyoming; Bishop Beecher, of Western Nebraska, and Bishop Rowe, of Alaska.

Bishop Rhinelander opened our December meeting and spoke to us about our responsibility of propaganda; he suggested that we might consider our spreading of the gospel as we would consider a commercial enterprise, making sure of three things: First, the real need of it; second, an honest confidence in it, and third, zeal in supplying it, always persuasive and persevering.

The Rev. John H. Staunton, of the Philippines, brought us his appeal for the Igorots, of the Sagada Mission. Miss Elizabeth Robinson, a United Offering Worker from the Satterlee Settlement House, Columbia, S. C., told us the story of life in the large cotton mills there. Father Harrison, O. H. C., of St. Andrew's School, Sewanee, Tenn., and Mrs. Wetmore, of Christ Church, Arden, N. C., both made appeals for the boys and girls of the Southern Mountains, that they might be given a chance to learn. Deaconess Carter, of the Church Training and Deaconess House, and Mr. John W. Wood, Secretary to the Board of Missions, conclude our list of speakers for the year.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1916-1917

In opening our report for this year, as a committee we wish to speak of our great regret that Mrs. J. Nicholas Mitchell had to resign because of ill health. For years as our Secretary she inspired and helped us, not only to gain a larger vision of what our part in extending God's kingdom could be, but in definitely accepting and doing more work for Him.

Her spirit will live with us, guiding and inspiring us, and we shall always be grateful for her leadership.

We are glad to welcome Mrs. Charles Carver, Jr., as our new Chairman of Work in Cuba.

Under the rare guidance of our President, our Committee has had another record year. In the autumn we decided to renew all our pledges, *which have been met*, with one exception, and in specials we have given more than last year. How could we have done otherwise in response to the earnest appeals for those absolutely essential needs for the progress of our church work, which have been presented to us by our representatives from all parts of the world. From Japan and Latin America we heard repeatedly of the imperative need for properly built and equipped educational institutions, where native leaders can be trained. Mr. John Wood showed us the plans for St. Paul's, Tokyo, and told us there are 750 Japanese students eagerly waiting the completion of the new, larger buildings, so that they can be admitted. Dr. Reifsnider said, there are now 1,152 Christian graduates, and that they are such a fine type of young men that business firms and corporations are anxious to employ them and will wait two or three years for them. In Dr. Motada (who, in all probability will be our first native bishop) we have just one example of the splendid Christian clergy St. Paul's has trained for the Church. Bishop Tucker and Miss Myers told us of the greatly needed buildings for St. Agnes. The only church school for girls in the diocese of Kyoto, where there is a population of eight millions, St. Agnes' has been for years a disgrace to our Church, consisting of dilapidated, unsanitary buildings in a city of great culture and beauty. The best men of Japan want to send their girls to a Christian school, for they recognize the advantage of having Christian mothers and homes for the future generations. We are glad to say that our committee has given \$3,783.00 for St. Agnes'.

Bishop Hulse told us that the repetition of such revolutions in Cuba as that just over can only be prevented by educating her men and teaching them self-control. He asked us to pray that God will give our churchmen such a vision of the need for trained Cuban leaders that they will give him the large, well-equipped school he means to appeal for at our next general convention

Larger, properly equipped hospitals are greatly needed in

China. Dr. Morris told us the Chinese have advanced in modern social ideas, and because of this they can now combine St. Elizabeth's and St. Luke's, and must put up one large hospital in a less crowded part of Shanghai.

Through Miss Littell we heard of the really terrible conditions of our Woman's Hospital in Wuchang, and how difficult the work is made under such conditions for our heroic doctor and nurses there. One of our great missionaries in China, Archdeacon Thomson, died this spring. For fifty-eight years he represented us there, serving under five Bishops. A singularly Christlike character in all he did, he was actuated by the spirit of love. No wonder that he was greatly beloved by the Chinese, for whom he faithfully labored all those years. The Church in China and at home should thank God for his saintly life and the valuable work he accomplished.

Of the Church's great loss by the death of Bishop Ferguson, "That man of God," Miss Ridgely told us. For all Liberia we have only three white missionaries. Often they have to wait weeks for a celebration of the Holy Communion, and there is no one to confirm the converts. She told us of gifts needed, but especially pleaded for workers. The imperative call to service, which means sacrifice, is what we, as a nation, are now accepting to help end this horrible world war. We know it is only as His whole world family become united in Him through brotherly love, that the Prince of Peace can reign in the hearts of men. Knowing this, God grant that we will each one give even more largely of ourselves and of our substance towards establishing His gospel of love amongst all mankind.

We also heard of the new work being done at Eddystone by Rev. W. H. Anthony; also of the Church Mission of Help, by Miss Means; the Bishop's Brick Fund, by Mrs. John D. Thomas; the Church Periodical, by Mrs. A. F. Kempton; the Episcopal Hospital, by Mrs. Charles S. Harvey; the Church Home for Children, by Mrs. Effingham Perot; the French Mission, by Rev. Mr. Malan; of some of our Diocesan Missions needing help, by Rev. G. Wolsey Hodge.

At our Lenten meeting Mrs. Hornor-Smith spoke to us on the spiritual side of the Parish Auxiliary meetings, and at our last meeting we heard the reports of our two parish workers, Miss Bispham, of St. George's, and Deaconess Camp, of St. Ambrose.

May we keep the vision before our eyes and put forth every effort to make the work of the coming year better than ever before.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT. 1916-1917.

CLASSES.—On the subject for the year, the Church's Mission to Latin America, five Normal Classes have been led, with a membership of 75; 84 Parish Classes, with a membership of 874; 4 classes for men, with a membership of 51; making a total of 93 classes on the year's course, with a membership of 1000. It is with especial thankfulness that we report two classes in All Souls' parish for the deaf mutes. Two classes were led on Modern Discipleship, with a membership of 75.

PRAYER CLASSES.—Septuagesima Week being appointed for our Pilgrimage of Prayer, letters were sent to the 90 Parish Educational Secretaries asking their co-operation. Three Normal Classes were held to prepare leaders, with a membership of 100; two led by Dr. Jefferys, one by the Educational Secretary, resulting in 76 parish classes and 13 classes in private houses, with a membership of 1282.

Total, 201 Senior Classes, with membership, 2487.

EXTENSION WORK.—Seventeen leaders conducted classes outside their own parishes. Outside the Diocese, two classes were held in Massachusetts, two in Maryland, one in Washington, three in New Jersey, with a membership of 297. Our assignments have been sent, upon request, to Georgia, Virginia and Louisiana.

EDUCATIONAL DAY.—January 21st was observed as Educational Day. Classes and conferences were held throughout the day, with an attendance of over 300.

REPORTS.—In March report blanks were sent to 90 Educational Secretaries. The responses furnished material for

this report, and showed, as results of classes, the formation of Bible Classes and Church Periodical Clubs; addresses on our missions in Latin America made to Auxiliaries, Sunday Schools, Mothers' Meetings, Girls' Friendly Societies and the Episcopal Hospital. One parish where no class was held reports the text-book distributed during Lent and read by 60 persons. Especially has the study class been appreciated and entered into by the smaller parishes and missions and among hard-working people.

CLOSING SESSION.—April 16th brought together leaders and members of Normal and Parish Classes. Reports were heard from Juniors and Seniors, and gifts presented.

The R. L. M. Mission Study Class Alumnae held its two semi-annual meetings.

THE CHURCH MISSIONARY CALENDAR.—Eight thousand copies were published. Net proceeds, \$650.

MASS MEETING.—The members of the Mission Study Classes choose missionary companies for the course. The companionship consists in daily prayers and an exchange of letters. The letters received from the missionaries proved so interesting and illuminating that a meeting was the outcome of our desire to share these letters with the whole Diocese. The meeting was well attended. Special thanks are due to Miss Coles, the Rev. Edwin S. Lane, Rev. J. M. Gilbert, Rev. George J. Walenta and Rev. F. D. Ward. A telegram of congratulation from the Secretary of the Province was deeply appreciated.

Thousands of our current magazines, as well as books, both religious as well as secular, are now forwarded to all parts of the United States and elsewhere, to all missions of the American Church in foreign lands.

Books are provided for permanent and traveling libraries, games, music for clubs and choirs, are sent to individual clergymen, students, lay missionaries, as well as masses of Sunday School supplies, Testaments and Bibles. Reading matter is sent to all prisons, hospitals, institutions and to the chaplains of the army and navy. During 1915-16 it served 1397 Clergy, 2642 Laity and 443 Institutions. Such is the report for Pennsylvania, 1916-17.
