REPORT.

Since the last Annual Report of the Pittsburgh Branch of the Women's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, the work has been steadily carried on, with, we trust, beneficial results to all concerned. The semi-annual meeting in June was held in Trinity Church, Pittsburgh. Addresses were made by the Rev. W. Thompson, of St. James' Church, on the Auxiliary Society as an aid to Missionary work; by the Rev. W. R. Mackay, of St. Peter's, on the Indians, and by the Rev. Boyd Vincent, of Calvary, Pittsburgh, on the Freedmen. The second semi-annual meeting was held on the sixteenth of November, in St. Peter's Church, Pittsburgh, and was largely attended. The Rev. Mr. McConnell, of St. Stephen's, Philadelphia, preached an eloquent sermon on the Freedmen. On the following day, there was a meeting in Trinity Chapel, opened by the Bishop of the Diocese, and attended by a number of the clergy. Miss Carter made a most soul-stirring and touching address. The absence of the Secretary during the time of both these meetings must account for so meagre a mention of these interesting subjects. The regular monthly meetings have met with more than usual encouragement. The increased number of delegates from the city parishes ensures a larger at-

tendance, and those who come, show a warm interest in all subjects under consideration. Reports of the work going on in the different Parochial Societies are furnished, and often all join in some common labor of Christian love. Last year, a box to Mrs. Brierly, at Cape Mount, Africa, was fitted out by the loving hearts and willing hands of women from St. Andrew's, St. Peter's, St. Paul's, Calvary and Trinity, Pittsburgh; Christ Church, Allegheny, and Christ Church, Meadville. The acknowledgment of its arrival was read at a recent meeting, and was a touching tribute of gratitude. The box arrived in time for the celebration of the Christmas festival, and the little tin toys, games, books, etc., which had been selected here in May, gladdened the hearts of those distant little ones after so long an interval. The personal gifts to Mrs. Brierly were also lovingly mentioned. A box to the Divinity School, at Petersburgh, Va., was sent during the winter by the Parochial Societies of Trinity, St. Andrew's, Calvary, St. Peter's, Pittsburgh, and Christ Church, Allegheny. These things are mentioned to show some of the channels of joint usefulness opened by membership with the society. Once having united in any such labor of love, excites and maintains a warm personal interest in the objects of it.

It is often asked, "What is the use of the Auxiliary? What does it do?" This is surely no unimportant part of its work: to unite distant loving hearts in one common bond of giving and receiving, to the glory of God.

In a letter received from a hard-working clergyman in Idaho, acknowledging the receipt of a box, he remarks, "our Bishop says, 'he cannot express what a help the Women's Auxiliary is to him.'" His wife adds, "I have been ill all winter. My parents' home is too far distant for me to visit; it is out of the question, consequently, I have been homesick; but the box cheered me so, for I felt that only loving hearts could have fitted and made everything so beautifully." What a pleasure for so small an outlay of means and efforts. Shall we not feel encouraged to go on, praying God to bless our labors more abundantly? Time fails to mention all the interesting letters read at the meetings from Rev. Sherman Coolidge, of the Indian Missions, from Miss Wong, of China, from Africa, and other places.

The sum asked by Miss Emery in furtherance of the joint work, viz.: "The Education and Insurance Funds, for Foreign Missionaries, a teacher to the Freedmen, and Miss Wong's salary," is this year, seven hundred dollars, more than double the amount given by this branch last year. A large part of it has been pledged. Let us trust that if any be still failing, that it will be made up. In regard to the work in China, Miss Wong, the native teacher, is most urgent to establish an orphanage for infants who are deserted, or who can be rescued from destruction. She has five such in charge, in addition to her labors of teaching. Mrs. Boone writes of her that "however difficult, nothing daunts her, if it be for her Saviour."

In conclusion, it is our earnest wish, that the other parishes of the Diocese, those which have not as yet responded to our invitation to "come over and help us," and others, which at first showed an interest, not since sustained, would all give us some report of their work. If unable at present to give much of their means they need bind themselves to nothing; or the very smallest gifts would be a welcome token of their sympathy, given according to their ability. At least we would have a mutual knowledge of each other's work, and from such communion, an interest would arise, beneficial to all. Of course, much is given directly to Miss Emery of which the Branch Society is not informed. If such sums were known to us, it would be embodied in this summary of Diocesan work, making it more complete and satisfactory. Once again all are invited to unite in this pleasant labor of Christian charity, in the spirit of our Divine Master.
