ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

The past year dawned brightly for the Pittsburgh Branch in that the Missionary Council held its meeting here in October. The enthusiasm and zeal then aroused have borne fruits throughout the year. The presence of the Missionary Bishops, of Miss Emery and Miss Carter, and of the earnest workers from all quarters who came together to give information and to incite each other to good works, gave a new impulse to the missionary labors of this diocese. A knowledge of the great needs and wide interests of the work which the auxiliary is pledged to assist, was extended in words of eloquence and earnestness, which moved all hearts. From China, Japan, the west and the south, were heard the urgent appeals for help to seize upon the golden opportunities now offered. At the Annual Diocesan meeting, held at this time, Miss Emery stated the objects for which our joint contributions for this year were desired.

Miss Spencer, who at this meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, during the Council, spoke on the subject of "Privileges as well as Privations," has recently been very suddenly removed from the labors, with her work uppermost in her thoughts, until the last.

At the officers' meeting, presided over by Miss Emery, it was decided to lay aside the project for a united offering of the society which had been proposed—the object suggested being the furnishing of rooms for its use in the New Church Missions Building—until the general convention of 1892, in order to combine every effort for the completion of the enrolment fund at that time. Miss Carter being present, and having conferred with the Bishops, then in session, who gave their endorsement to the proposal for renewed efforts in behalf of this great object. The Auxiliary, as a body, pledged itself to take up this work, hoping to be able to report the completion of the \$1,000,000 fund in October, 1892.

Acting upon this resolution, and in addition to the ordinary contributions of money and sending of boxes, the systematic collection of money for this purpose has been undertaken and carried on by a number of parishes. A separate secretary and treasurer appointed, and a large number of missionary or mite boxes procured and distributed. Miss Carter accepted an invitation to meet and speak informally to all interested in missionary work, in St. Andrew's Sunday School rooms, on the 23d of April, and she also made an address at Trinity Chapel on the evening of April 24th. Printed pamphlets with a history of the Enrolment Fund and its plans and purposes as to the use of the money, have also been widely circulated in this diocese, and every effort has been made that ignorance of its existence and designs may no longer exist. At least, one grand sermon has been preached on the subject, in Pittsburgh, which, if it could be widely circulated, would hardly fail to move every heart. For want of time and space this subject must be dropped at present, but let us all remember that it is a great work and the time is short. On February 5th there was a quiet day in Trinity Chapel. The exercises were conducted by the Rev. Mr. Bates of Cleveland. The deep thought and earnestness of his addresses were calculated to benefit all present.

In addition to the joint amount pledged to Mrs. Emery, and the work for the enrolment fund, several other joint contributions have been made to different objects by a number of parishes. A box to a missionary in the diocese, a box of bags to a sale in Kansas, and as lenten work, boxes to the Indian schools in South Dakota.

A new and promising addition to the parish branches—is that of the Church of the Epiphany, at Bellevue. The President, and some others, visited the parish, receiving a cordial welcome. The rector, holding a

service, with an inspiring missionary address. A helping hand from the clergy is highly appreciated by the women of the Auxiliary.

The Church Periodical Club has increased the number of its librarians and contributions, and is doing a good work in supplying reading matter to many who cannot afford to indulge in that luxury.

The constitution, requiring some change to make it accord with the altered time for the annual meetings, a committee was appointed to attend to it, with the following result. This article was added: "This constitution may be amended by a proposition made in writing at a regular meeting and passed upon finally at a subsequent regular meeting, or at a meeting called for that purpose—all parishes in connection with the branch having been notified. Such an amendment shall be adopted only by a majority vote of those present."

Articles 10 and 11 were revised, and a resolution taken to accept the changes, etc., chiefly regarding the times of meetings. With great regret we were obliged to accept the resignation of Mrs. Soule, president of the Junior Auxiliary, on account of her removal from the diocese. That she has conducted these first two years of the children's work with great ability and success, her report will show. She will be greatly missed in the Woman's Auxiliary on account of her missionary spirit and untiring energy in the fulfilment of her duties.

The average attendance at the monthly meetings has been very good, and a deep interest shown in all the works of the society. This has been more than usually noticeable in regard to some of the smaller parishes, and is especially gratifying as promising a larger field and steady growth for the future. Whether from individuals, societies, or guilds much or little, all is gladly received, and the earnest desire of those interested is, that every parish in the diocese may send contributions, and when possible, delegates, to share in the counsels and projects of the society.

Again, we may close this year's report with a thanksgiving for the past, and may these blessings incite to fresh interest and renewed efforts for the year to come. With its close—the time for the meeting of the General Convention will again be drawing near—when the work of the Enrolment Fund must be reported. Let us trust that it will be through no faint-heartedness or negligence on our part that the fulfilment of the great plan be frustrated. And let this, and all other good works be offered in a spirit of gratitude and humility to Him, through whom alone all offerings are acceptable, and who has led us so graciously through the years that are past.

However, after the second annual meeting, which we expect to hold in Meadville about October 1st, we will hope for added interest and greater results.

JUNIOR AUXILIARY.

SECOND ANNUAL REPORT.

The Junior Auxiliary ends its second working year with 25 branches, an increase of 8 over its first year, and with growing interest among the children—many parishes reporting larger numbers working in the branches than last year.

An enthusiastic missionary meeting was held in Carnegie hall, Allegheny, on Wednesday afternoon, October 22, 1890, during the session of the Missionary Council. Bishop Whitehead presided, Bishop Talbot of Wyoming and Idaho; the Rev. F. R. Graves of Wuchang, China, and Archdeacon Kirkby of Rye, N. Y., made interesting addresses.

The hall was filled—about half the audience being grown people—the offering was \$76.32.

The special work of the Diocesan branch for the year was the raising of \$100 for the support of St. Thomas' Day School, Wuchang, China, and this has been accomplished, together with much other good work, as will be seen by the following report of parish branches.

The fitting out of Christmas trees is one of the principal objects of all the Junior Auxiliaries, and our branch has not been behindhand in thus giving pleasure to the mission stations.

It is with the deepest regret that the President gives the work to another, as she is leaving the diocese, and she wishes to express her thanks to the Bishop, the clergy, the Woman's Auxiliary, the Parochial Secretaries, and the Church News, for the cordial interest they have taken in this work among the children.
