THE past year has been marked by no great changes, and the work of the Society has progressed in a quiet and uneventful manner.

According to the changes in the Constitution, the Annual Meeting was held November 3d, and took place in Trinity Chapel. After a brief service and address by the Bishop of the Diocese, Bishop Brewer of Montana gave an interesting sketch of his jurisdiction, his needs and methods of work, gracefully adding that he saw the great necessities of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, as well.

At the business meeting the officers of last year were re-elected for the current year.

The enrolment fund was again discussed, and a plan proposed for taking mite boxes and contributions in them, at least five cents weekly, to be presented as part of the "United Offerings" of the Woman's Auxiliary, at the time of the General Convention in October. Had the enthusiasm of the preceding year, aroused at the time of the Missionary Council in Pittsburgh, been sustained, much better results might have been gained. But different

discouraging circumstances have combined to greatly dampen the interest felt at that time.

Miss Carter, being compelled by ill health to resign active work for the Board of Missions, and taking charge of an Indian Hospital at White Earth Reservation, Minnesota, her friends in Pittsburgh contributed, through the Woman's Auxiliary, the necessary salary. As many supplies were needed, several barrels of groceries, etc., were sent by different parishes.

January 25th being the tenth anniversary of Bishop Whitehead's consecration, some members of the Woman's Auxiliary thought it would be suitable and acceptable to present him with an offering for his diocesan work. Accordingly, the sum of three hundred and thirty three dollars was contributed, which he was much pleased to receive. There is a growing appreciation of the needs of our diocese, which may bear good results, in the future.

The sum pledged to Miss Emery, for the year, from this diocese, was six hundred dollars, as follows:

The large city parishes for the most part, fulfilled their pledges in good season. But the smaller sums from the more distant points have been slowly contributed. What we need very much, is the co-operation of the smaller parishes, especially those outside the city of Pittsburgh.

Those delegates living near Pittsburgh might occasionally attend the monthly meetings. Of course those more distant take some opportunities, of hearing all that is needed and spoken of, at such times, but full reports are furnished in the *Church News*, and any information will gladly be furnished by either of the Secretaries. Besides all else that comes up, a certain sum is pledged in the beginning of the year to Miss Emery, for specific objects named. Small amounts of even five dollars from parishes, unable to do more, would be of great assistance. Some send ten dollars, which are as gladly received as much greater sums from the larger parishes.

With much to be grateful for, the year has not been free from discouragements. Some parishes are burdened with debt, or engaged in Church building, or hampered in other ways. Whatever the causes, the Auxiliary Society is not the last to feel any diminution in its contributions. And yet, very much depends on its ability to meet its engagements. It is careful not to promise more than it can reasonably expect to fulfil. For several years, until the present, it has not increased the sum of five hundred dollars for Joint Work. This year six hundred dollars were pledged, instead of fifteen hundred asked for. We cannot enlarge our borders without steady, systematic effort. The amount that it can contribute should be considered by each parochial society at the beginning of a working season, be it great or small.

The work that offers is almost boundless. Appeals from all quarters are coming in, and there are generous hearts and willing hands, but still, the needs cannot be met. We should be thankful that among those, largely blessed with this world's goods, there are some ready to make up many deficiencies. Were it not so, our reports would fail to make so good a showing.

The Church Periodical Club continues its good work, and has increased the number of libraries. In response to a request for assistance to begin an Endowment Fund, as a memorial to Mrs. Fargo—who established the work, and had charge of it until her death—Bishop Whitehead sent a contribution, through the Woman's Auxiliary, and it is desirable that others be sent.

So far, reading matter has been sent by mail, at the cost of the donor, but as the work increases, funds are necessary for printing, postage, and other expenses. A large number might be interested in this labor of love at the cost of a little effort and expense to each individual. All information on the subject may be obtained from Mrs. H. Doubleday, No. 201 Collart Square, correspondent for this diocese. The total number of books, papers, etc., distributed during the past year is five thousand, four hundred and seventy-five.

A "Quiet Day" for women was held in Trinity Chapel February 20th. The services were conducted by Bishop Whitehead, Rev. Dr. Holland, of St. Louis, and the city clergy.

Our thanks are due the *Church News* for full reports of all the

monthly meetings. All parochial and hospital work is acknowledged there, while the Annual Report is confined to Missionary work.

In closing it must be stated, that the whole amount pledged by the Pittsburg Branch has been made up. The reports from some parishes of the Northern Convocation have been quite encouraging owing to the oversight of the Second Vice-President, Miss Davis, of Meadville. With a branch of the Auxiliary in every parish, under an earnest and diligent leader, the results attainable can hardly be estimated. That this may some day be the case is our earnest prayer, with devout thanksgiving to the great Head of the Church for that which He has so far permitted us to do in His name.

THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF
JUNIOR AUXILIARY

For Year Ending June, 1892.

The third year of the Junior Auxiliary of the Diocese of Pittsburgh closes with its usual report of work done, new branches formed and general interest maintained. Those of us who have had experience with the work of children—and grown people—know that the difficulty does not consist in starting a branch of some new organization but in sustaining the interest, energy and enthusiasm with which the work began. On the whole our Juniors have done well, some few have waxed weary, but the majority have persevered when such labor involved self denial, both of precious playtime and still more precious pennies. There are now twenty-nine working branches in this Diocese, representing city parishes and those in the country, where distance comes in as an additional hindrance to missionary zeal. Several branches have been formed in parishes where there is as yet no branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. Could we but realize that our work is fitting the boys and girls to take place as members of the Layman's League, St. Andrew's Brotherhood and the Woman's Auxiliary, making them better because more intelligent church men and women, I think we would strive to make our meetings more helpful and attractive in every way, and more productive of the best good.

Our joint contribution of one hundred and twenty-five dollars for a scholarship in Japan is larger than last year's, and we feel that we owe this to the earnest work of Mrs. Soule, who so well laid down the principle of larger giving each year.

Our Christmas work was also well planned, many branches began preparation during the spring and summer, and the thirteen well filled boxes sent to the Rev. Charles Cook, South Dakota,

showed that not only the children but also the parents had an interest in the Indians.

It is proposed to hold quarterly meetings of the Junior Auxiliary Branches next year, realizing how much is to be gained from organization and interchange of thought and experience.
