

## Recording Secretary's Report.

---

### *To the Board of Missions:*

During the past year the monthly meetings of the Woman's Auxiliary have been full of interest and progress.

In June, Bishop Whitehead told of the missionary meeting at the Convention in Erie, and the Auxiliary adjourned until October.

In October an address was made by Rev. H. L. Marvin in the interest of St. Augustine's School.

In November the time was taken up with arrangements for the Annual Meeting and it was decided to prepare a Joint Box for one of the workers in St. Augustine's School.

The Annual Meeting was held at Emmanuel Church, Allegheny, on November 10. The Celebration of the Holy Communion was followed by addresses from returned missionaries.

Rev. Mr. Partridge spoke of the work in Alaska, and his own particular work in Sitka. He was particularly desirous that a reading room should be well provided with books and papers, and be made an attractive resort for the transient population.

Rev. Mr. Gring gave most interesting impressions of his twenty years' residence among the people of Japan. He made no appeal for his own work, but urged the Auxiliary to remember the work at Sendai with their gifts and prayers.

A luncheon, most abundant in hospitality and good cheer, was served in the Parish House by the ladies of Emmanuel Church. After luncheon the business meeting took place.

Letters were read from Miss Woodruff and Miss Carter, regretting their inability to be present, and a letter of suggestion for the coming year's work was received from Miss Emery.

Mrs. Brooks spoke of her methods of inspiring interest in the United Offering, and Mrs. Mackey gave some suggestions in organ-

izing new branches of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The election of officers for the ensuing year then took place.

A vote of thanks was rendered to the ladies of Emmanuel Parish for their abounding hospitality.

The memorial minute to the late Mrs. Brunot was read, and ordered to be transcribed in the records of the Auxiliary.

The members then adjourned to the Sunday School room of St. Andrew's Church, and the day's experiences closed with an illustrated lecture on our Missions in China by Rev. A. P. Ingle.

The December meeting was held in Trinity Church and Bishop Gailer made an address on the Colored Work.

When it was shown that the Constitution did not limit the number of Vice Presidents, Mrs. Brooks of Oil City was elected a Vice President—a worthy tribute to her labors in the Northern Convocation.

Miss Margaret Phillips was elected Treasurer of Miss Carter's Fund in the place of the late Mrs. Daly.

In January, memorial minutes to Mrs. W. H. Daly, and Miss Sarah O. Phillips were read.

Miss Carter was present, and spoke words of cheer and encouragement sadly needed when we think of the faithful workers who have departed.

A paper prepared by Miss Woodruff on our Missions in China was read at the February meeting which gave valuable and encouraging information.

In March, the Bishop urged the expediency of holding neighborhood Conferences from time to time in different parts of the diocese, as he thought these would awaken interest in the work of the Auxiliary.

The need of an Organizing Secretary becoming apparent, Mrs. Geo. Gornley was appointed to that office.

In April arrangements were perfected for Miss Carter's Lace Sale which was held in Trinity Parish House, on April 19th.

The meeting in May was chiefly occupied with the yearly reports.

The Treasurer announced a deficiency of \$73.00, but this was conditionally promised that our obligations might be met before the semi-annual meeting at the time of the Diocesan Convention.

The past year has held much grief and discouragement for the members of the Auxiliary. Death has removed from our midst some who were examples to us of liberality and good works. But while we miss their valuable counsel and generous help, the memory of their good deeds can stimulate us to renewed activity, and we truly believe that through these chastening influences the life of our Auxiliary is renewed.

One of these dear departed fellow workers, the month before her death, gave to the Secretary a record of some recent large gifts to Missions with the remark: "I longed to withhold this, but I thought per-

haps my Heavenly Father meant it should provoke others to gifts according to their means."

True it is that only a few can give large gifts of wealth and service. But in every parish, no matter how feeble, there are some who can give a little of their time and money, and oh! so richly of their prayers for the spread of Christ's Kingdom.

The great discouragement that confronts the members of the Auxiliary is not so much a lack of funds as a lack of interest. The funds seem always to come, and we have always been able to attain the objects to which we have aspired. But we miss your presence and we miss your prayers.

So do not be fearful, dear sister workers of the weaker parishes, that our great Auxiliary wants to support its tottering form on your feeble shoulders. We know only too well how you work and strive and plan and pray to keep the Gospel in your midst. That is well, but if you come to our meetings you will see how surely God's work grows, and many of your doubts and discouragements will vanish — you will gain new ideas for the betterment of your own work, and, best of all, you will ally yourself with the spirit of progress which is in all missionary work, and which will carry you out of self into the boundless realm of Christ's Kingdom here and beyond.

In the face of many untoward circumstances, we find much to cheer and encourage us. In the northern convocation, the work has grown steadily under the leadership of Mrs. Mackey and Mrs. Brooks.

The reports from the various departments of our work show for themselves the progress that is being made. We ask you to read them carefully. At first they may seem dry and uninteresting, but let us remember that the fire of missionary enthusiasm is wanting when the tinder of dry facts is not converted into a burning flame.

Read between the lines of our Treasurer's Report: her constant anxiety lest our obligations should not be met, and her satisfaction that another year's work is complete.

Try to see, in the successful gathering of Miss Carter's Fund, how in every part of the Diocese, there is a confidence in the worker and an eagerness to share in her work.

Notice, too, how the work of the Church Periodical Club has grown. Two new librarians have rendered efficient service, and 348 magazines and papers, with 81 Sunday School papers, have been sent regularly, while from time to time, 12 Prayer Books, 14 Hymnals, pictures, cards, and 3227 odd numbers of magazines have been distributed.

The Junior Work, in spite of many discouragements has been kept up, by willing hands, and we feel very thankful that it has attained results nearly equal to those of last year.

The Corresponding Secretary has done her work faithfully, and her contact with the various parishes makes her realize the great

dearth of missionary information. We need a Lending Library to distribute throughout the Diocese.

If we cannot establish working branches in the smaller parishes, surely some devoted woman could read a rousing missionary book at the Parish Sewing Society.

The objection has been made: "If we had a Lending Library, no one would take out the books." The same objection was raised when the Carnegie Free Library was established. The Library has not altogether waited for the people to come to the books, but has scattered its books among the people. In the most neglected parts of our great city, through the distributing agency of civic, industrial and religious societies, the Carnegie Library is reaching the people. Could not we make a start in this direction by sending out attractive biographies of our departed missionary heroes, and glowing words from the workers now in the field? Then if "faith comes by hearing" the knowledge thus gained will create greater confidence in the success of missionary work, and a growing desire to participate in that success.

Fifty missionary boxes have been sent during the past year, including a joint box valued at \$123.68.

The total value of the boxes amounted to \$2,628.96 and the sums disbursed by the Treasurer amounted to \$1,501.12 making a total of \$4,130.08.
