Minutes of Annual Meeting

On November 19th, 1901, the Annual Meeting was held in St. Andrew's Church, Pittsburgh, beginning with the celebration of the Holy Communion, and at this service Bishop Kinsolving of Southern Brazil emphasized the importance of Worship as the beginning and end of all missionary endeavor.

Bishop Whitehead introduced the speakers of the day who came from widely separated missionary fields.

Bishop Kinsolving told of the conditions existing in Southern Brazil; Bishop Rowe spoke of his work in Alaska; Rev. Henry Forrester was an able advocate of the Church in Mexico; Rev. Andreas Bard from the Girls' School at Walla Walla explained the need for Christian education in the far Northwest; and Miss Carter pleaded the cause of the Indians.

Luncheon was served at one o'clock, and the hospitality of the entertaining parish provided refreshment for 140 persons. All were warmly welcomed and a pleasant hour of social intercourse was spent.

The business meeting was held promptly at two o'clock. The President after commenting on Bishop Kinsolving's remarks on worship, opened the meeting with prayer. This was followed by the roll call when nearly 100 delegates from 26 parishes responded.

The Treasurer then read her annual report, all other reports being omitted.

The Committee in charge of the revision of the Constitution made a statement of their completed work and asked to be discharged from further duty.

It was regularly moved and seconded that the Committee on the revision of the Constitution be discharged with the thanks of the Auxiliary. Carried.

The annual election of officers was next in order, and Mrs. Geo. Gormley was appointed to take the chair.

Mrs. Gormley called for nominations from the floor, but none were made. The Nominating Committee then read their list of nominations for the various offices. Mrs. Ormsby Phillips was re-elected President by a unanimous vote which was afterward made a rising vote as a tribute of respect to her many years of faithful service.

Other officers elected were:—

The elections concluded, the President resumed the chair and made the two following appointments:

Treasurer of United Offering—Miss J. Cuddy.

Treasurer of Miss Carter's Salary—Miss Margaret Phillips.

The annual appropriations for Joint Work were next in order and awakened much enthusiasm and some diversity of opinion.

The President asked if the appropriation of \$700.00 should stand for the coming year, and the majority thought the appropriation should be increased to \$1,000.00. After some discussion, during which a few parishes increased their pledges, it was regularly moved and seconded that \$1,000.00 be given for Joint Work this coming year. Carried.

Appropriations amounting to \$950.00 were then made, and it was decided to leave the appropriation of the remaining \$50.00 to be made at the December meeting.

The President reminded the Auxiliary of the collection that would be taken at the December meeting for a memorial to Mrs. Twing, and a letter from Miss Emery was read, acknowledging the letter of sympathy from the Pittsburgh branch.

Mrs. Whitehead proposed a vote of thanks to the ladies of St. Andrew's parish for their hospitality and this was made a rising vote.

Notice was given that an adjourned meeting would be held in Trinity Parish House the following morning at eleven o'clock.

After the annual collection of dues the business meeting closed.

The members returned to the church where addresses were again made by most of the speakers until five o'clock.

An evening missionary meeting was held at Trinity Church, when those who could not attend during the day had the privilege of listening to the news of the work.

On Wednesday morning at eleven o'clock, about 40 women gathered in Trinity Parish House where Mrs. Brooks of Oil City read a most interesting paper on her personal experiences at the General Convention and the work accomplished at the Auxiliary meetings.

This was followed by a short conference when plans were discussed for the further increase of the United Offering.

Mrs. Brooks described the plan of house to house visitation which had proved so successful in the Northern Convocation and after further addresses the meeting adjourned.

Recording Secretary's Report

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Pittsburgh has greatly profited by the enthusiasm awakened at the General Convention held in San Francisco.

The fortunate few who could attend were wise stewards of the gifts committed to them, and their quickened zeal and increased knowledge have added much interest to the conferences held during the year.

Nine (9) regular meetings have been held and one special meeting, and although the attendance has not been greater than in former years, the increased representation from the neighboring parishes has been an encouraging feature.

A special meeting was held in September for the final ingathering of the United Offering. Many were still out of town, but twenty-five members gathered, and great was their satisfaction to learn that the diocesan share in the United Offering would exceed the two thousand dollars so earnestly desired.

At the October meeting the various parishes consulted in regard to the winter's work. A letter from Miss Emery expressed the desire that we supply the needs of our own diocesan missionaries and this work was undertaken by several parishes.

On this day the Triennial Offering was presented at a great missionary service held in San Francisco, and to mark the event Dr. Arundel conducted a short missionary service highly appreciated by all present.

In November the arrangements for the Annual Meeting were perfected, and committees on arrangements were named.

In December the collection for a Memorial to the late Mrs. Twing was taken, forty members being present. The collection amounted to \$48.25, augmented later by additional sums, and in the final report of Mrs. Thomas, the diocesan contribution reached the sum of \$147.75.

Twenty-three delegates from eleven parishes were present at the January meeting when it was decided to undertake a joint box of clothing for the Indians under the Rev. Mr. Cleveland.

In March another Vice President was appointed in the Northern Convocation, her duties to include the parishes in and about Erie.

In May much routine work was accomplished and the first collection of the United Offering for 1904 was made.

At the June meeting it was decided that the remaining \$50.00 of the \$1,000.00 pledge for Joint Work be forwarded to Miss Emery to apply to some work especially needing funds, expressing a preference for Miss Sabine's work in Alaska.

All the pledges had been paid and great satisfaction was expressed over the excellent showing for the year. Faithfulness in great as well as in small matters has been the pervading spirit of the year's work.

The officers of the diocesan branch have fulfilled their duties with precision, and every officer of every parish branch seems to have been imbued with the spirit of faithfully doing her part.

The pledge for Joint Work was increased from \$700.00 to \$1,000.00 in the belief that the increase could be met, and this venture of faith has been amply justified.

Our part in the United Offering of 1888 was \$1,414.28, while in 1901 we gave \$2,132.51, an increase of \$700.00, and there is an earnest wish in many a heart that the amount gathered in the next three years may be even greater.

More and more is the work of the Church Periodical Club becoming recognized and appreciated in every diocese. Its good works have been unobtrusively accomplished, but many an isolated worker has been cheered by this gracious ministry of books.

Some have felt a certain discouragement over the work of the Junior Auxiliary, but if we reason together we shall find that our meagre report speaks not so much of decay as of growth in another direction.

We cannot always judge of success by columns of figures, and we must remember that a veritable Children's Crusade goes forth during every Lenten season, and their fight against selfishness and greed would shame many a Christian soldier of mature years.

If the Sunday School Lenten Offerings were included in the Junior reports, we should have a grand showing, and we feel deep gratitude that the influence and teaching of the Junior Auxiliary, together with other agencies, have brought about these wonderful results.

The Treasurer of Miss Carter's Salary has gathered from many sources the yearly pledge, and we must not fail to appreciate her faithful stewardship.

The work built up by Miss Carter among the Indians should be dear to every worker in the Auxiliary. It is the work of a woman among women, and now that the Indians have lost two such powerful friends as Bishop Whipple and Bishop Gilbert, we should strive the more earnestly to hold up the hands of one who for many years has labored among the Indians and for the Indians, understanding their conditions and needs as only a few can.

It is not for us to quench the spirit that is stirred by tales from new missionary fields and longs to give substantial aid, but in our eagerness for abounding harvests, we should not neglect the old work for the new.

The daily watering of the Lord's Vineyard and the daily watching for the increase He has promised in His own good time, call forth more Christian principle and more Christian patience than the first enthusiasm of planting.

May not the workers in the Woman's Auxiliary draw a homely lesson from the parable of their own lives?

As women, we must learn to administer the affairs already committed to our charge before we concern ourselves with matters beyond.

We must see that our own children are provided for and made self-supporting before we adopt other children and, as the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, our first duty is to foster the work already begun, to care for the little ones already sheltered in our orphanages and schools, to keep open the doors of hospitals towards which the sick and impotent folk have already learned to turn.

Let us make it our constant care that no department of missionary work already established shall suffer and through this daily discipline of faithfulness over a few things will come the strength to rule many things.
