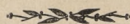

Minutes of Annual Meeting

On Tuesday, November 4th, 1902, the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was held at Christ Church, Allegheny, the exercises of the day beginning with a Celebration of the Holy Communion at ten o'clock.

The first address of the morning was made by Bishop Brooke of Oklahoma, who told of the wonderful increase in population in his Diocese, and the crying need of men to minister to the spiritual needs of the people flocking into the Diocese.

Rev. Mr. Mann then told of the work in Brazil and how their experience had been that the Clergy should preach the Word and leave School teaching to the laity.

The Annual Report of the Recording Secretary was read, after which Miss Higgins told of her work in South Africa and her desire, while in this country, to raise ten thousand dollars for an Industrial School at Cape Mount.

The addresses were interspersed with missionary hymns, sung with great spirit, a choir of colored children leading the singing most effectively.

At one o'clock, the ladies of the parish served a bountiful luncheon to 120 guests in the Sunday School room.

The business meeting convened at two o'clock in the nave of the church, the President opening the meeting with a reading of the Scripture and with prayer.

The minutes of the previous annual meeting were read, all yearly reports being omitted.

In the absence of the Treasurer, Mrs. Marcellin Adams was appointed to receive the annual dues. The roll call was read and 90 delegates from twenty parishes responded. There being no unfinished business, the Auxiliary proceeded to the election of officers for the ensuing year.

Mrs. Phillips called upon Miss Byram to take the chair and she presided during the election.

Nominations were called for from the floor, and none being made Miss Byram read the list of officers prepared by the Nominating Committee.

No objections or amendments were made, and it was regularly moved and seconded that the Recording Secretary cast the ballot for the Auxiliary. Carried.

The Recording Secretary then cast the ballot and the following officers were declared duly elected:—

Mrs. Phillips resumed the chair and appointed Miss J. Cuddy as Treasurer of the Triennial Fund and Miss Margaret Phillips as Treasurer of the fund devoted to Miss Carter's Salary.

In the discussion on Joint Work a general impression seemed to prevail that the yearly pledge should not be further increased, and a motion to again pledge \$1,000.00 for Joint Work was carried.

An appeal from the Girls' School at Walla Walla was here read, asking the renewal of the one hundred dollar pledge for the coming year, and an appeal from Brazil was also read, for increased offerings.

The appropriations for the past year, amounting to \$950.00 were here read, and it was regularly moved and seconded that they remain the same during the coming year. Carried.

It was regularly moved and seconded that \$25.00 be appropriated for Miss Higgins' Industrial School at Cape Mount, Africa, and \$25.00 to Bishop Brooke of Oklahoma. Carried.

A motion thanking the ladies of Christ Church for their hospitality and earnest efforts to make the day a successful one was made, seconded and unanimously carried.

Miss Carter then made an address to the workers in the Junior Auxiliary and the meeting adjourned.

In the evening a missionary service, held at St. Peter's was largely attended, addresses being made by Bishop Brooke, Rev. Mr. Mann and Miss Higgins.

Recording Secretary's Report

Another year of Auxiliary work has passed into history and in looking back, one is deeply impressed by the fact that varying conditions surround each year's work, making it differ from the years that precede or follow.

A member of the Auxiliary remarked that she did not think we had accomplished very much this past year. Without doubt that remark is made every year by some but not always by the same persons.

This goes to show that human judgment is an uncertain quantity, largely biased by our emotions which are equally uncertain.

Where then shall we look for a correct proof of our year's work? Not to any individual opinion, but to the work itself by all means.

What matters it if some have lacked the enthusiasm of last year? What matters it if some have felt a discontent almost amounting to despair that, no matter how much is accomplished more and more is expected of us?

What matters it if, in the equation of missionary work, great willingness of heart seems often to be coupled with a lack of means, while an over abundance of wealth is frequently coupled with great poverty of spirit?

All these great problems will be solved by our Heavenly Father in His own good time, and our chief concern must be to work out our own problem to a successful finish.

Here let us briefly review the work of the past year.

Nine meetings have been held during the year with an average attendance of 28.

The Annual Meeting held in Christ Church, Allegheny, was very interesting and all arrangements for the services were well carried out.

The singing by the choir of colored children was inspiring, and the ladies of the parish spared no trouble to give a hearty welcome to the Auxiliary. A bountiful lunch was served to 120 guests, and at the business meeting, 90 delegates from 20 parishes answered the roll call.

All our pledges for Joint Work made at the Annual Meeting and amounting to \$1,000.00 have been paid.

The Junior Auxiliary has been placed in competent hands, and sooner or later results will be forthcoming.

The United Offering has nearly reached the sum of \$900.00. Through the earnest efforts of the Treasurer of Miss Carter's salary we all share the satisfaction of knowing that our diocesan branch has paid her modest stipend, and that the lace sale held this past winter was the most successful, save one, ever held by Miss Carter in any diocese.

The noble work of the Church Periodical Club goes on quietly and efficiently.

The Correspondent reports that during the past year 16 librarians have regularly sent 334 periodicals, while more than 500 books, and more than 5,000 magazines, papers, cards, and calendars have been sent to places where they will be a blessing indeed.

The Corresponding Secretary's report shows an unusual amount of correspondence, and many perplexing and delicate problems have been happily solved through her tactful zeal and utter disregard of work when results could be obtained.

All this and much more has been accomplished in the face of many untoward circumstances.

In missionary affairs we have been passing through a reconstructive period that has stirred and perplexed many a heart, and many a liberal giver has felt it her duty to put in the parish apportionment and decrease her contributions to the Auxiliary. Then too, many women in the Auxiliary have felt the great disproportion between the incomes which have not increased, and the cost of living which has so materially increased.

The Secretary of the General Clergy Relief, in a printed appeal, states that it takes \$1,100 to do the work that \$700 could do five years ago. Therefore we have done well to even maintain our position and not be driven back before the strong current of increased demands and expenditures. But all this is history now, and we must concern ourselves with the future. Some there are who are able and willing at all times to give abundantly, and to these we look with renewed courage and hope when the battle is too strong for us.

There are some betterments we can make in our methods, and let us come to our Annual Meeting in the fall, prepared to take these steps onward. Let us bend our efforts to increasing our United Offering in the one year left before the General Convention. Let us have a class for missionary study.

Let us devise some method of coming in closer touch with our fellow workers in the Northern Convocation.

If the next General Convention is to hold a missionary exhibit

let us begin at once to do our share in upholding the reputation of our own diocese.

In conclusion let us all ponder over this paraphrase of a couplet sent by an Eastern clergyman to every member of his parish.

What would our Auxiliary be
If every member was just like me?

Report of Correspondent of Church Periodical Club

The Club has 20 Librarians, representing 21 Parishes. St. Stephen's, Wilkinsburg, without a Librarian. Four parishes failed to send their reports. 354 periodicals have been sent regularly, 509 books, 1 Bible, 4964 numbers of odd magazines, 250 Christmas cards, 243 Easter cards, 7 calendars, 171 pictures and 8 boxes of books and magazines.

The Correspondent has written 113 letters and 88 postals. Total expenses have been \$5.75.

Nineteen parishes have contributed \$21.50 toward the expenses of the New York office.
