Minutes of Annual Meeting

November 4th, 1903

The Celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30 o'clock in the Parish House of Calvary Church was the opening service at the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Pittsburgh.

The dense fog prevented many from reaching the meeting in time to hear Bishop Whitehead's words of welcome to the women of his diocese, but a goodly number were finally gathered to hear the addresses.

Bishop Brewer of Montana spoke in favor of the Apportionment Plan and eloquently pleaded for a "Million for Missions."

The Rev. Mr. Claiborne told of the work the Church was doing among the Mountaineers of Tennessee, and Bishop Kendrick of Arizona further explained the practical working of the Apportionment Plan.

At one o'clock the women of Calvary parish served a luncheon, and although more guests were present than were expected, yet their abounding hospitality was equal to the emergency, and all rejoiced over the increase in the number attending the annual meeting.

At two o'clock the President opened the business meeting with a reading of the Scripture and prayer.

The reading of the minutes of the last annual meeting was omitted and the minutes of the October meeting were read that all present might pay their tribute of respect to the memory of the late Mrs. Childs.

The roll call of parishes was read, and 100 delegates from 24 parishes responded. This is a very conservative statement as many left before the business meeting.

The election of officers now took place, Miss Byram taking the chair during the nomination and election.

Nominations were called for, and none being made, the ballot prepared by the Nominating Committee was read.

On the resignation of Miss Bundle as Vice President, it was regularly moved and seconded that the name of Mrs. Eben Clarke be substituted on the ballot. Carried.

The revised ballot was here read and a motion was made, seconded and carried, that the Recording Secretary cast the ballot for the Auxiliary and the acting President declared the following officers elected :

The matter of the pledge for Joint Work was then taken up and after an enthusiastic discussion and a sufficient number of increased pledges to warrant the action, it was moved, seconded and carried that the pledge for Joint Work be increased by the sum of \$200, making the pledge \$1,200 for the coming year.

The report of the Acting Treasurer, Mrs. Clarke, was read, and the thanks of the Auxiliary were extended to her for the efficient discharge of the duties of Treasurer for the past year.

The annual dues were received by the newly elected Treasurer, and the Treasurer of the United Offering read the report of the past two years, showing that only a small number of parishes contribute to this fund.

In the absence of the Directors of the Junior Auxiliary pledges for 450 Christmas gifts were received.

A rising vote of thanks was given to the women of Calvary parish for their hospitality and successful efforts in making the day a memorable one in the history of the Auxiliary.

Mrs. Brooks brought a greeting from Miss Emery and spoke in behalf of increased offerings from individuals towards the missionary deficit.

Addresses were again made by Bishop Brewer and Rev. Mr. Claiborne of their personal work in their respective fields, and Bishop Brewer asked for hospital supplies.

A motion was then carried that \$50.00 be given to each of these two speakers from the collections of the day, and after a few remarks from Rev. Mr. Rambo the meeting adjourned.

The results of last year's work have been given first, as some may not care to read or listen to the other matters contained in this report. But to all who have worked and planned to attain these results the following resumé may prove of interest.

Eight business meetings have been held with an average attendance of 22, the Annual Meeting being held on November 4th in Calvary Parish House.

This meeting was interesting and instructive, and it is gratifying to note that an increased number of delegates represented an increased number of parishes.

The women of Calvary Parish dispensed a generous hospitality to all present, and the atmosphere of good cheer which pervaded the luncheon hour still lingered during the business session which followed, when our yearly pledges for Joint Work were increased from \$1,000 to \$1,200.

The close of last year's work was overshadowed by the illness of our beloved Treasurer who in July was called away from the labors of earth.

She was ever so faithful and helpful that we felt our loss very keenly and knew not which way to turn.

But a member of her immediate family has now assumed the duties of her office in such a satisfactory manner as to increase our faith in reminding us that

“God takes the Worker,
But carries on the work.”

This year we have been enabled to come in contact with some who have not been attracted by the regular business meetings.

A Missions Study Class was organized under a most efficient leadership and four meetings have been held on the second Thursday morning of every other month, two papers being read at each meeting followed by a general discussion.

These Missionary Morning Talks, as they were called, have been well attended, and the outlook for another year's work seems very encouraging.

An illustrated missionary lecture was also given by Rev. Chas. Scadding in St. Peter's Parish House, which was well attended by young people and Sunday School workers. The success of this lecture was largely due to the efforts of our Corresponding Secretary who has had a laborious year.

She needs an assistant to take charge of the routine work of sending out the reports and monthly notices. This part of the work she has systematized so that it could be undertaken by some person willing to give a little time to Auxiliary work, leaving our Secretary free to carry on the increased correspondence.

“Missionary letters” were never meant to imitate the antics of an Australian boomerang, yet occasionally our Secretary has confidently sent forth a letter which after circling aimlessly around the various branches has to her astonishment and dismay fallen again into her own hands. Then the only recourse for the waiting missionary would be a Joint Box and such experiences always entail additional work.

In the matter of making up Joint Boxes it would be a great help to the Secretary and Packing Committee if they had a contingent fund upon which they could draw to supply the deficiencies which always exist even when liberal contributions come in.

Some Dioceses have a Comfort Club which is especially designed to gather in small contributions both in money and household necessities from individuals and the smaller parishes, and this store house can be drawn upon when the necessity for a hastily prepared Joint Box is urgent.

The Church Periodical Club has been doing its accustomed good work, and would that the number of those who send regularly of their abundance might increase !

There may be some thankless recipients, but the greater number highly appreciate the remembrance. It was the privilege of the Recording Secretary, in a last conversation with our late Treasurer, to hear her speak in terms of affection of a Southern lady to whom for years she had sent the New York Churchman. It is so much easier to gather up a barrel of magazines to send to an institution than to create a regular duty for ourselves which might only lead to more sins of omission. But the former way is only the exuberance of an house-cleaning spirit, while the latter is the discipline of the disciple.

The United Offering has reached the sum of \$1,614.38, and if some concerted effort is not made before October, the Pittsburgh share in the Triennial Offering will fall below that of the last General Convention when we gave \$2,132.51.

Comparatively few parishes contribute to this fund which could easily exceed that of three years ago if every parish would give a little.

The Treasurer of Miss Carter's Salary has again received the necessary amount in cash and pledges, and to assume the yearly responsibility of this fund requires much faith and patience.

The Directors of the Junior Auxiliary have been hampered in their work by their inability to obtain reports from the distant parishes.

Beyond a doubt every Rector is fully aware of the good deeds done in his parish, particularly among the children, and if he would suggest that a statement be sent to the Directors of the Junior Auxiliary it would cheer their hearts and strengthen their hands. We only ask you to tell us of these good deeds that they may be written in our Book of Remembrance that the information may stimulate others to do as well.

At the last meeting of the Auxiliary a faithful member who was belated, said to the Recording Secretary : "Now, are you sure you put my name down, for I have been to every meeting and I want my name put down." Now that is the animus of the Woman's Auxiliary, for names have been its inspiration and are its choicest heritage.

Sometimes when the burden and heat of the day seem too great and our hands become listless in the work of the Vineyard, the very mention of some name that stood for zeal and devotion will stimulate us to greater efforts. And so let us cultivate the possibilities of our names that they may be adorned with the choicest memories to the coming generation of Auxiliary workers.

Is the United Offering less? Put your name down to help in its increase.

Is there no one to interest the children of your parish in missionary endeavor? Put your name down for an hour's work every week.

Is our Secretary overburdened? Put your name down to help with her routine business that she may be more free to devise liberal things.

Climb we to the higher plane where work ends in worship. Let your name be remembered as one who prayed daily for Missions that we "may be one Fold under the one Shepherd," who " calleth us all by name."

It may be a great joy or a great sorrow, or the peace of a well ordered life that leads us to add our names to the ever increasing list of workers. But amid varying conditions the roll call grows longer, until in every land where the prayers of the Church ascend there will be some to join this organized society of women whose hearts respond to every appeal and who, while "sowing beside all waters" can still wait in patience for the increase that the Lord of the Harvest sends.
