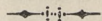

Minutes of Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held in St. Peter's Church and Parish House on November 2, 1904. The day began with the celebration of the Holy Communion at 10:30 o'clock, and at this service Bishop Funsten of Boise City, made an address on the spiritual aspect of the work of the Auxiliary.

The hour following this service was entirely devoted to the addresses of the three speakers who made direct appeals for help in their respective fields of labor.

Mrs. Hunter told of the great need of a Hospital in her work among the colored people at Raleigh, N. C.; Mr. Mosher's appeal was for \$200 to equip one room in a girl's school in China; and Bishop Funsten spoke of the great need of church teaching among the people of his diocese and desired funds for a scholarship in St. Margaret's School, Boise City, Idaho.

At one o'clock a luncheon was served in the Parish House, and the business meeting took place at two o'clock.

Mrs. Phillips, being detained in Philadelphia by illness, Mrs. Whitehead presided over the meeting. After the opening prayer, a letter of greeting from Mrs. Phillips was read and a motion carried that a telegram of greeting and sympathy be sent to her in return.

All reports were omitted and the roll call was read, to which 98 delegates from 19 parishes responded, 7 members of the Auxiliary being present from distant branches.

The election of officers being next in order, the Nominating Committee reported that, as no changes were made necessary in the present list of officers by removal or resignation, nominations could be made from the floor if any changes were desired. As no nominations were made, the present officers were elected by an unanimous vote, and Mrs. Whitehead reappointed Miss Cuddy as Treasurer of the United Offering, Miss Margaret Phillips as Treasurer of the fund for Miss Carter's salary, Mrs. Young as Director of the Babies' Branch, and Miss Louise Bostwick as Secretary of the Northern Convocation.

The matter of the pledge for Joint Work being taken up, it was regularly moved and seconded that \$1200 be pledged for Joint Work and for Specials for the current year. Carried.

Rev. Mr. Ferris then stated that a lady in Calvary Parish would give half the sum desired by Mr. Mosher if the Auxiliary would give the remaining half, whereupon members from Calvary Parish pledged \$25.00 and \$10.00 respectively; \$15.00 being pledged by other parishes. In order to secure the remaining \$50.00, it was regularly moved and seconded that the \$50.00 given for the past three years to the girls' school in Walla Walla be given this year to Mr. Mosher's work in China. Carried.

The Directors of the Junior Auxiliary then made an appeal for Christmas gifts to be sent to Key West, Florida, and to Porto Rico, boxes to be packed as soon after November 15th as possible.

Miss Wade made a short address on the purpose of the Missions Study Class, and Mrs. Hammond spoke in behalf of her work.

Mrs. Hunter then read a very interesting paper written by one of the United Offering workers in St. Augustine's School. A vote of thanks was then tendered to the women of St. Peter's Church for their bounteous hospitality, and the meeting was then adjourned.

A Missionary Meeting was held at Trinity Church in the evening when Bishop Funsten and Mr. Mosher again spoke concerning their work.

Recording Secretary's Report

Quite bare and uninteresting may be the statistics of the past year's work of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Diocese of Pittsburg, but to the members who have labored together to attain these results, many memories can be read between the lines.

Every box sent to an institution or to an individual means, first, the great need felt and then expressed by a letter of appeal, in response to which there must be sympathetic hearts and willing hands.

There must be many conferences, a judicious outlay of the means at hand, the oft-repeated question "Shall we buy or shall we make?" And so every woman, interested in the sending of a box, brings to this purpose all her training as a housekeeper and home-maker. Surely we can boast that our Auxiliary possesses of "Honorable women not a few."

The Woman's Auxiliary has expanded from its original chrysalis—the Missionary Box—until one is amazed in reading the reports from different dioceses to learn how many and diverse are the objects for which we are working.

Indeed, we might almost forget that, being many, we yet were one, if it were not for the fact that we have created a sort of "national debt," to bind us all together in a common sisterhood, and that "national debt" is our "United Offering," which every three years is gathered from every diocese in the American Church as a Thank Offering.

By this means we are constantly sending new workers into the mission fields, and our own diocesan Treasurer presented the sum of \$2,279.62 at the last General Convention as our share in an offering amounting to \$150,000.

Only a few parishes in the diocese contributed to this fund, the purpose of which ought to appeal to the heart of every Christian woman.

During the past year our work has been blessed in its results. We hope to report at the June meeting that all our pledges for Joint Work and Specials have been paid.

The sum for Miss Carter's salary has been raised by the usual process of faithfully gathering the many sums that make the whole.

The Junior Auxiliary has a good report in the face of many discouragements, as so little of the children's work in the diocese is reported to the Directors.

The Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club has distributed through the parish librarians a large amount of current literature. A few parishes are without librarians, and we trust that these vacancies may be filled, and other librarians added at the beginning of another year's work.

The Missions Study Class, though necessarily confined to Pittsburgh and its vicinity, has been the means of stimulating some to renewed interest in Missions. Four meetings have been held in four different churches instead of in one church as during the first year. The attendance and interest have so increased that the same plan will be pursued next year.

The program arranged for the third year includes all the departments of the Mission work of the church not yet discussed, thus giving a general idea of the work as it now stands. Any parish could have a Missions Study Class with no expense, save a few postage stamps to secure Missionary Leaflets to read at the weekly sewing society, or, by applying to the Chairman of the Pittsburgh class, the papers read at their meetings could be forwarded.

If the women of *every* parish became interested in some branch of the Auxiliary work, what noble results could be obtained. And who would dare to check the habit of giving!

If we give generously of our time and means to the work in our parishes, the desire to give will grow with our spiritual growth, until we reach out beyond the sheltered boundaries of our parish life, to touch hands with those who are fighting ignorance and superstition, striving to keep the pure light of a Christian home burning amid heathen darkness.

We feel triumphant when we induce some sister absorbed in home duties to become interested in the welfare of the parish or neighborhood, for we feel we have helped her to a higher plane, to a broader outlook. Can we not apply the same teaching to ourselves in a higher degree? Can we not climb a little higher and look a little beyond our present horizon? Then shall we see how the fields lie already white to harvest, and though it may not be our privilege to be among the laborers sent out for this express purpose, nevertheless

it is always permitted us to carry strength and refreshment to those who are bearing the burden and heat of the day; and, without question, this is the true province of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.
