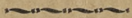

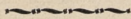

Minutes of Annual Meeting

The Twenty-sixth Annual meeting was held at the St. Mary Memorial Church, on Thursday, November 15, 1906.

Both weather and walking were alike disagreeable, yet the goodly attendance surprised even the most sanguine, and the exercises of the entire day were marked by a spirit of devotion to the common cause.

The services began with the Celebration of the Holy Communion at ten o'clock, at which time Bishop Whitehead made a devotional address.

Rev. Mr. Steele, of Cuba, was the first speaker of the day, and gave a very clear history of the Church in Cuba, its present condition and most pressing needs. After the hearty singing of a missionary hymn, the Rev. Robt. Meech, of Christ Church, Allegheny, read the 26th annual report, and this was followed by an address by the Rev. Mr. Claiborne, of Sewanee, Tennessee, well known among us as the earnest advocate of the poor white people in the Southern mountains.

Luncheon was served at one o'clock and this was characterized by an abounding hospitality which created a spirit of cordiality among the one hundred and twenty-five guests of the entertaining parish.

All assembled in the church at two o'clock for the business meeting, and a missionary hymn sung by all present was a fitting prelude to the Scripture reading and prayer of our President. The roll call was next in order with twenty-four parishes sending one hundred and five delegates; three new branches being represented, visitors also being present from other dioceses.

The roll call was followed by the usual resignation of the board of officers, pending the report of the Nominating Committee.

Mrs. Geo. Gormley took the chair, and Miss Wade, for the Nominating Committee stated that as no nominations had been received, nominations from the members present were in order.

No nominations being made, a motion was made and seconded that the old board of officers be re-elected, and that the Secretary be instructed to prepare and cast the ballot. This motion was carried, and, as a fitting expression of respect to our President, all the members present honored the motion by a rising vote.

The President resumed the chair and made the following appointments: Treasurer of United Offering, Miss J. Cuddy; Treasurer of Miss Carter's Salary, Miss Margaret Phillips; Treasurer of Babies' Branch, Mrs. E. H. Young; Secretary of Northern Convocation, Miss Louise Bostwick. The President also appointed the officers of the Missions Study Class as follows: Chairman, Miss Wade; Vice-Chairman, Mrs. Jos. Speer; Secretary, Mrs. Bragdon.

It was regularly moved, seconded and carried that the President appoint a Traveling Secretary, and Mrs. Geo. Gormley was unanimously chosen for this office.

The matter of the pledge for Joint Work was then taken up, pledges having been already received from the various branches, to the amount of \$1080.00. After some discussion and a general disposition to pledge the usual \$1200.00 for Joint Work and Specials, the following motion was made and seconded:

We pledge \$1200.00 for Joint Work and Specials, provided we receive before Easter, a sufficient sum to supply the present deficit of \$120.00 in the said pledge. Carried.

A rising vote of thanks was tendered to the St. Mary Memorial parish for their hospitable entertainment, and the meeting was adjourned.

Addresses were then made by Rev. Mr. Claiborne and Rev. Mr. Steele, and the members dispersed carrying away with them many pleasant memories of the day.

Recording Secretary's Report

(Read at the semi-annual meeting in St. Paul's Church, Erie, Pa., May 15th, 1907.)

The Woman's Auxiliary in its routine work from year to year presents much the same appearance. The Annual Meeting with its renewal of Missionary zeal, the regular monthly meetings with reports from the different parishes, the semi-annual meetings with the gathering into a compact total of the statistics of the year—in all this routine there is a sameness that fails to appeal to the casual observer.

But to those who are intimately associated with the work, all these meetings and reports are only the frame work of the building; and looking onward and outward into other lands and countries where Christian knowledge is furthered and favored, we see a stately temple of good deeds being reared to the greater glory of God.

During the past year the Auxiliary has held nine meetings on the first Thursday of each month in Trinity Parish House, Pittsburgh. At one meeting we had the pleasure of listening to Mrs. Jenkins, a Missionary's wife returning from Alaska, and on one afternoon the ladies of Trinity Parish served tea in honor of Miss Thackera who was with us to speak of her work at Fort Defiance.

On November 15th the Annual Meeting was held at the St. Mary Memorial Church, Pittsburgh, Rev. Mr. Steele of Cuba and Rev. Mr. Claiborne of Tennessee being the Missionary speakers.

Despite unfavorable conditions of weather and walking the meeting was largely attended, and at the business session delegates representing 25 parishes were present, and pledged \$1080.00 with the hope that the full amount of the usual \$1200.00 pledge for Joint Work and Specials might be made up before June.

In this however, we have met with disappointment, and could only pay \$100.00 to the Board of Missions for general distribution instead of the \$200.00 given last year.

During the past year each department of the Auxiliary work has been faithfully carried on, sometimes in the face of adverse circum-

stances occasioned by ill health or absence. Our Treasurer has cheerfully borne the discomfort of an empty treasury and unpaid pledges, hoping for better things in the future when the Auxiliary in its buoyant faith will not call upon her to disburse \$1200.00 when only \$1080.00 is pledged.

Every year the labors of the Corresponding Secretary increase, since each new branch means additional work in sending out notices, but all such work means progress, and she willingly assumes new responsibilities when an increase of results is obtainable.

The work of the Church Periodical Club deserves more than passing notice, since its unobtrusive ministry is easily overlooked. The women who are interested in this department of Auxiliary activity are not concerned with gathering money, but with regularity and system they send magazines and papers to those whose small incomes will not permit such luxuries, yet who from their isolated positions, need the mental stimulus more than those who enjoy the social privileges of the town.

Miss Carter is still laboring for the Indians in her lace schools, and looks for encouragement and financial support to the Pittsburgh Branch where she has never looked in vain, and again this year the Treasurer of the fund for her salary reports the annual task as practically completed.

The Directors of the Junior Auxiliary have been unwearied in their labors, and the work has prospered greatly under their diligent oversight. They feel that much work done among the children of the different parishes is not reported to them, and yet there are distinct advantages in coming in touch with a central organization. Children respond readily to appeals for help and are so easily interested, that it could not be a great tax on any woman to gather a little band of children on her own porch during the summer afternoons, to make Christmas gifts for the Missionary Boxes.

Would it not be a worthy tribute to the faithfulness of the Treasurer of the United Offering if we could give her the joy of presenting \$2500.00 as the Pittsburgh share in the offering taken at the time of the General Convention in October?

More than \$1800.00 has already been given in five semi-annual collections, and could not \$700.00 more be raised in the next five months? Think of the object, and then count your mercies which are

as boundless as your opportunities, and give pennies if you cannot give dollars, and if you cannot give pennies, give your prayers.

We dwell with pleasure on the growth of the Missions Study Class, organized only three years ago. During the past year, four meetings have been held with an average attendance of thirty members, and twelve original papers have been read on Japan, its past, present and future.

The Missions Study Class has, of necessity, only interested the parishes in and about Pittsburgh; but the chairman, Miss Wade, is already the possessor of many really fine papers written by the women of our own diocese, which she is very glad to lend to any parish desirous of giving an afternoon to the study of Missions.

Our blessings have been many during the past year, but we feel that the crowning one has been the rare privilege to send a greeting to our beloved Bishop on the twenty-fifth anniversary of his consecration to the office of the Episcopate. Such a favor of God's Providence is granted to but few dioceses, and while acknowledging this privilege, the Auxiliary desires to extend its thanks to the Bishop for his sympathy and helpfulness during all these years, and pray that he may be spared to direct the work of the diocese for many years to come.

In conclusion, the members of the Auxiliary in the Southern Convocation desire to send a greeting to their fellow-workers now assembled at Erie.

We who live in the most populous center of the diocese feel that your faith and works have greatly abounded under conditions less favorable than we enjoy.

We hold in grateful memory the number of branches which have helped to make our United Offering a matter of pride to the whole diocese. And we pray God's blessing on all the consultations and plans to further the growth of our beloved Church in every town and hamlet in the Northern Convocation, holding the sure conviction that each enlightened and instructed soul will be one more to spread the Gospel.

Diocesan Missions, Domestic Missions, Foreign Missions—the three steps in the progress of the Kingdom to come, where harvest follows seed time and praise will follow prayer.

At the June meeting 1907, the Treasurer reported that pledges had been paid to the amount of \$1000.00, leaving the pledge of \$200.00 to the Board of Missions still unpaid, and a balance of about \$100.00 in the treasury. Accordingly, the Treasurer was instructed to pay \$100.00 to the Board of Missions for General Distribution which made a sum of \$1100.00 paid to Joint Work and Specials.

Report of Missions Study Class

The Missions Study Class has held four meetings during the year with an average attendance of thirty. Three papers have been read at each meeting making twelve in all. These papers have been on Japan, its past, present and future, with sketches of the work being done by our own Church and other Christian organizations.

At the last meeting, held April 25th, it was decided to study the "Strategic Points of our Domestic Field" at the four meetings which are to be held next year on the second Thursday of November, January, March and May. It was also decided to form the nucleus of a real Missions Study Class by getting as many women as possible to pledge themselves to read at least one hour each month on the subject selected for the year's work. The Class in the past having been a Mission Program rather than a Missions Study Class it is hoped to thus gradually introduce a desire to study as well as listen to the papers. However, the meetings next year will be the usual Program Meeting which it is hoped the women of the Church will feel that it is a privilege as well as a duty to attend.
