MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING

The twenty-ninth annual meeting of the Pittsburgh Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions was held on October 28th, in Calvary Church and Parish House.

Wednesday evening, October 27th, at eight o'clock a meeting was held in Trinity Church at which Miss Julia Emery and Dr. Irwin Correll were the speakers.

Miss Emery spoke of the susceptibility to good influences of the youth in foreign countries she had visited and Dr. Correll spoke of the progress of Christianity in Japan during the past 200 years and the opening of all cities to Christian missionaries under the new treaty.

Thursday morning, October 28th, at 10 A. M. there was a celebration of the Holy Communion in Calvary Church with mission hymns rendered by the vested choir.

This was followed by a sermon by the Bishop of the Diocese on the lesson of St. Simon and St. Jude as bearing on the working together of the women in the Auxiliary.

The meeting was then adjourned to the Parish House to hear the speakers of the day.

Dr. Correll told of the elevation of women in Japan under the Church's teaching and made a very earnest appeal for the purpose for which he was remaining in this country, i. e., to raise \$12,500 to buy a lot on which to build a church, parish house, rectory, and native workers' residence in the city of Isu.

Miss Emery spoke on various aspects of the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, the Triennial Offering, the training of women missionaries and the need of fuller consecration of our time and gifts.

A bounteous luncheon was served at one o'clock and the well known hospitality of Calvary Parish was extended to guests numbering 250.

The business meeting was called to order at two o'clock, Dr. Correll opening the meeting with the missionary prayers.

The roll call was responded to by 193 women, delegates being present from 32 parishes with several visitors from other Dioceses.

After the payment of yearly dues was made, the pledges from the various parish branches were received and the amount pledged justified the following motion, i. e., that we pledge for the following year the sum of \$1,050.00 for joint work and specials. This motion was seconded and carried.

The resignation of Mrs. Duroe was accepted with regret and there being no nominations from the floor the ballot as prepared by the nominating committee was accepted by a rising vote.

MISSIONS STUDY CLASS

The four meetings of the Class were held as planned: At St. Stephen's, Wilkinsburg, November 11th, 1909; St. James' Memorial, January 13th, 1910; Trinity, March 10th, and St. Andrew's, April 29th, 1910. The attendance was very good, considering the inclement weather on several of the days. The subject studied was China—the country and race, their strength and weakness, the work and methods of the Christian Church and some of its workers. Instead of sending at once the offering received at each meeting, they were reserved until the last meeting, when it was decided to send the whole to the Rev. John W. Nichols, for the Catechists School in Shanghai. The amount, \$13, was gratefully acknowledged by Mr. Nichols. The annual meeting at St. Andrew's was well attended in spite of a rainy day. The plans for the coming year were adopted. The subject of study: "The Church's Mission to the Mountaineers of the South." First meeting, November 10th, 1910, Emmanuel Church, Allegheny, "The Southern Mountaineer, Characteristics and Conditions"; second meeting, January 12th, 1911, St. Peter's Church, "Work in the Mountains of Virginia;" third meeting, Christ Church, Allegheny, "District of Asheville, North Carolina"; fourth meeting, St. James' Memorial. As this will be the annual meeting there will be a business meeting at 10:30. Lunch will be served at 12, and at 2:30 papers will be read on "Kentucky and Tennessee Mountaineers."

The president has appointed the usual committees: Missions Study Class—Miss E. S. Wade, chairman, Mrs. W. L. Fickes, vice chairman; Mrs. Chas. Bragdon, secretary; Programme Committee—Mrs. W. L. Fickes, chairman; Mrs. D. L. Ferris, Mrs. M. L. Slicer, Miss Mary Burgwin.

HOW TO FORM A PARISH BRANCH OF "LITTLE HELPERS" OR "BABIES BRANCH."

There should be two meetings a year—spring and fall. The first meeting each year may be in the form of a little party. Invitations are sent out to the little children in the parish asking them to come and bring their mothers, little sisters and brothers—the date and hour given. Mention in the invitation that the object of the party is to enroll every child in the parish, eight years and under, a member of the "Little Helpers." The meeting is opened with a short service by the Rector. A talk follows by the Diocesan or Parish Secretary. Then the children are entertained by games, refreshments, etc., or whatever form of entertainment individual leaders may suggest. The membership cards are shown to the mothers present who are asked to read carefully and sign for their children, thus making the mothers responsible for their little ones—as at baptism—when they are introduced to their missionary responsibility. The mite boxes are then distributed with a leaflet which tells the mother the full meaning of the Branch.

The second meeting may be a children's service—when the offering is made—afterwards games, etc.

The membership card for which the mother is responsible says, "I wish to become a 'Little Helper' and promise to say the prayer and to take care of my box." The little prayer—"God bless all of the missionaries all over the world and all of the Little Helpers, for Jesus sake," said each day by the little child or mother cannot but awaken a desire to know more of the work the Master has for us to do. The Sunday School primary classes that have the "Little Helpers or Mission Sunday" are not only creating interest for themselves but for the mothers. Prayer for missions is emphasized—the little prayer is said each time an offering is put in the box. Parishes are beginning to awaken to the importance of this branch of the work. There are four organized branches in the Diocese of

Pittsburgh; viz., St. Thomas, Oakmont; St. Peter's, Pittsburgh; St. Luke's, Pittsburgh; St. Stephen's, Wilkinsburg.

Three of these four branches met the apportionment of \$50, which shows the power of small things and represents many prayers from infant lips and renewed consecration of many mothers.
