ANNUAL MEETING—1927

The 47th Annual Meeting of the Pittsburgh Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council was held January 13, 1927, at St. Andrew's Church.

At ten o'clock, the service of Holy Communion was celebrated by Bishop Alexander Mann with Bishop Thomas C. Darst, Dr. John Dows Hills and Rev. J. Reginald Moody, assisting.

Mr. Moody, rector of St. Andrew's Church, welcomed the Auxiliary to his Parish.

Bishop Mann made a brief address and in speaking of the Bishops' Crusade felt there was a very strong connection between the missionary work of the church and the Bishops' Crusade, the idea of the Crusade being to fill the hearts and minds of all our people with a missionary spirit.

Following the service, Mrs. Emmerling, President, called the business meeting to order.

Two hundred and thirty responded to the calling of the Roll, representing thirty-three parish branches.

The minutes of the December, 1926, meeting were read by the Recording Secretary and were approved after a correction had been made in the amount sent by Miss Marguerite Bartberger, Anvik, Alaska, to the Clara Chester Bailey Memorial Fund.

Annual reports were read by the Recording Secretary, Mrs. C. C. Burgess, the Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Robert Armstrong; the Treasurer, Miss Margaret Phillips, who reported a balance December 31st, of \$892.50; the Supply Secretary, Mrs. C. L. Peirce, Jr., the Educational Chairman, Mrs. Homer A. Flint. Under Educational Work, notices of the Institute were given by Mrs. T. J. Bigham, Chairman of the Committee on Institutes. Continuing, Mrs. E. J. Searles reported for the Social Service Department, Mrs. Hawley, Extension, Mrs. W. A. Cornelius, Treasurer, for the United Thank Offering, Mrs. Shirley P. Austin, Publicity, and Mrs. H. D. W. English, Treasurer, read her report for the Sybil Carter Memorial Fund, the Memorial Membership Fund and the Honorary Membership Fund.

Mrs. R. L. Regester reported for the Devotional and Resolutions Committee; Mrs. A. W. S. Garden, Pageantry; Mrs. George W. Ratcliffe, Literature; Mrs. S. N. Benham, the Gold and Silver Sale; Mrs. A. K. Oliver, Hospitality; Mrs. Thomas Fleming, the Church Periodical Club; Miss Lydia Fleming, the Corporate Gift, and for the Clara Chester Bailey Memorial Fund, Mrs. George A. Dickson, who reported a total of \$7,836.65.

Mrs. W. C. Hawley then offered the following resolution: Resolved, that the Pittsburgh Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary establish a Memorial Membership Fund to be used for two scholarships, one in Liberia in memory of Miss Mabel Prothero, and one in Porto Rico in memory of Miss Frances Cuddy. Any balance in this fund may be used for scholarships by vote of the Auxiliary. Mrs. Bigham moved to adopt this resolution as presented. The motion carried.

The Budget for the year 1927, was read by Mrs. Emmerling. It was moved by Mrs. Benham to accept the budget. The motion carried.

The ticket for officers to be voted upon at this meeting was pre-

sented by Mrs. Rodney Brace, Chairman of the Nominating Committee. As there were no nominations from the floor, it was moved by Mrs. G. A. Dickson that the nominations be closed. The motion carried. Mrs. Benham moved the Secretary cast the ballot for the ticket as presented. The motion carried.

The following officers were elected:

Treasurer—Miss Margaret E. Phillips, one year.

Corresponding Secretary—Mrs. Robert S. Armstrong, three years.

First Vice-President—Mrs. Shirley P. Austin, three years.

Second Vice-President—Mrs. Shirley P. Austin.

Third Vice-President—Mrs. C. L. Peirce, Jr., three years.

Members-at-Large—Mrs. Marcellin C. Adams, Miss Charlotte E. Forsyth, three years.

Mrs. Emmerling then spoke of the Bishop's Crusade, asking the women of the Auxiliary to give spiritual support to Miss Grace Lindley, who is to come here as one of the Crusaders and also to help the Crusaders by attending and urging others to attend the meetings and conferences.

The matter of a piano for Miss Skiles was brought before the Auxiliary, Mrs. Emmerling hoping support would be given to the decision of the Board to provide a piano for Miss Skiles. Immediately, sufficient pledges were given to cover the original cost of the piano and the freight to Kioto, Japan.

The announcements were made by the President of the All Day Sewing at the St. Margaret Memorial Hospital on Shrove, Tuesday, March 1st; Institute, January 18th at St. Peter's Church; Missionary Training Classes, February 15th and 16th, at St. Peter's Church, and Miss Grace Lindley's visit to the Auxiliary, February 3rd.

This concluded the business for the day.

Noon-day recess followed. Lunch was served in the Parish House.

Following the recess, Mrs. Emmerling introduced the Rt. Rev. Thomas Campbell Darst, D. D., the sponsor and originator of the Bishops' Crusade and Chairman of the National Commission on Evangelism, who addressed the Auxiliary.

The afternoon session was brought to a close with the singing of a hymn, prayers and benediction.

ANNUAL REPORT OF RECORDING SECRETARY

— 1926 —

The Woman's Auxiliary held their Annual, regular monthly meetings, Two United Thank Offering Ingatherings, a special meeting in the interest of Kuling School, Missionary Training classes, Institute, Missionary Current Events classes and Two Quiet Days during the year 1926.

The Annual meeting was held at St. Luke's Church. It was at this meeting that Bishop Mann expressed his hope that a memorial fund be raised to perpetuate the memory of Mrs. Charles Bailey, this Fund to be held in trust in this Diocese.

The Rt. Rev. Walter H. Overs, formerly Bishop of Liberia, Mr. E.

Walter Roberts, the originator of the little blue boxes, Rev. J. O. Blanton, Principal of the Voorhes School, Bishop and Mrs. N. S. Thomas of Wyoming, the Rev. E. D. Kizer, formerly of South America, Mrs. P. G. Kammerer, Trinity Church, Miss Mary Austin, Ex-Secretary for Pennsylvania on Penal Affairs, Mrs. Charles Pan-coast, Philadelphia, Miss Charlotte Forsythe, Superintendent of the Department of Religious Education, Miss Marjorie Nutall, President of the Whitehead Club, the Rev. and Mrs. John Magee, of Nanking, China, Miss Helen Skiles, Missionary from Kioto, Japan, Dr. Homer Flint, Executive Secretary and Treasurer of the Diocese, Dean White, of Trinity Cathedral, Cleveland, and the Rev. Edgar Jones, Rector of St. Thomas Church, Oakmont, were the special speakers.

In the death of Miss Jane Cuddy, the Auxiliary suffered a great loss on November 8, 1926. Miss Cuddy was the United Thank Offering Treasurer for many years.

The average attendance for the year was 114, an increase over the preceding year. Forty-five parish branches were represented, four names being added to the Roll, the Junior Circle of St. Ann's Guild, Calvary; St. Mary's, Braddock, St. Paul's Monongahela, and St. Paul's, Mt. Lebanon.

THE UNITED THANK OFFERING

This great gift of the Women of the Auxiliary is presented every three years, at the time of General Convention. The offering is given through the blue boxes and the contents gathered by the Parish Branch Treasurers, just before the Diocesan In-gatherings in May and November. It is the hope of the Auxiliary that every Parish treasurer of the United Thank Offering will try to give every woman in her Parish an opportunity to share in this Offering.

CORPORATE GIFT

The Corporate Gift is the \$100,000 Gift, which the Woman's Auxiliary at New Orleans, voted to give toward the advance work of the Church during the next three years. It will take the place of the old Auxiliary Special and will benefit the following Institutions:

CLARA CHESTER BAILEY MEMORIAL

This unique, perpetual memorial to Mrs. Charles Bailey, the beloved President of the Auxiliary, who died October 23, 1925, when

completed, will amount to \$20,000.00, and is a joint gift of Mrs. Bailey's children and the women of the Auxiliary. The Fund will be held in trust by the Diocesan Board of Trustees and the interest will be voted annually for the missionary work of the Church to which Mrs. Bailey during her lifetime contributed so generously.

MEMORIAL MEMBERSHIPS FUND

At the Annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, held January 13, 1927, the following resolution was passed:
"Resolved: That the Pittsburgh Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary establish a Memorial Membership Fund, to be used for two scholarships, one in Liberia, in memory of Miss Mabel Prothero, and one in Porto Rico, in memory of Miss Frances Cuddy. Any balance in this Fund may be used for scholarships by vote of the Auxiliary."

These Memorial Memberships, of five dollars a year, are taken out by women of the Auxiliary and sometimes by Parish Branches in memory of some dear one, who has passed into Life Eternal. This fund creates a beautiful memorial, while at the same time supports through its scholarships the education of youth in the mission fields. Mrs. H. D. W. English, 5462 Fair Oaks Street, is Treasurer of this Fund, and gifts to it may be sent to her.

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP FUND

This fund is made up of gifts of \$5.00 a year by those women of the church, who are unable to do active work in the Auxiliary, and wish to support its activities. This Fund is part of the Contingent Fund.

THE SYBIL CARTER MEMORIAL FUND

Among the many beautiful stories of love and sacrifice of self for others, that fill the Missionary pages, none is more interesting than that of Miss Sybil Carter who, filled with the love of Christ, went abroad and through many weary months of earnest work, fitted herself to teach the making of lace. All this was done that she might by establishing schools and teaching lace-making to the Indian Women of Minnesota, show her loving sympathy for them, and while teaching them the beautiful stitches, weave into their lives the wonderful story of the Christ Child and His love for them.

During her life it was the privilege of our Branch to pay Miss Carter's salary, and after her death to pay that of Miss Hemmingway, her successor. When the nation-wide campaign took over this work among the Indians, the Pittsburgh Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary felt unwilling to discontinue this Fund, so it has remained one of our Special Funds, through the channels of which extra help and comfort go to women workers in the Indian field.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL DEPARTMENT

The path of the Educational Department has been far from smooth during the past year. That the educational work of the Auxiliary has not only held its own, but even made some measure of progress during the period of temporary leadership, testifies somewhat strikingly to a fine spirit of loyal co-operation on the part of the Auxiliary members in general. It testifies even more glowingly, however, to the sound foundation laid so painstakingly by the former Chairman, Mrs. Adams.

Following her custom a Lenten Information Leaflet, describing the places to benefit by the Supply Department, was prepared for distribution early in the year.

A Training Class for Leaders of Discussion Groups was ably conducted by Mrs. Wishart on January, 19-21. Forty women from fourteen congregations were enrolled, Calvary, Pittsburgh, and Christ, New Brighton, sending seven each. Two members of the Lutheran Missionary Society were also present for three sessions. The text-book used was "That Freedom", dealing with the problems of the Church in Latin America. While the "follow-up" was not conducted systematically, reports indicated that a definite attempt at parish study of Latin American problems and opportunities was made by seventeen Branches.

On February 11th, at St. Peter's Parish House, eighty-one women representing twenty-six congregations, attended a most satisfactory institute for Parish Branch Officers, arranged by Mrs. Bigham. In addition to the sectional conferences for the various officers, Mrs. Emmerling conducted a general conference with the subject, "Lining the Program of the Parish with the Diocesan Program", while Mrs. Hawley conducted a similar conference dealing with "The Auxiliary's Part in the Church's Program."

To avoid crowding the monthly meetings of the Diocesan Auxiliary, but two Current Events classes were conducted during the year, and these where no scheduled speaker had been provided. The two were cared for by Mrs. Hawley and Mrs. Bigham.

Several Books essential to Missionary study have been added to the Diocesan Lending Library.

A contribution of \$25.00 was made by the Department toward the expenses of a Mission Study Leader at the Conneaut Conference; and

one of \$60.00 toward the expenses of a young woman student from the University of Pittsburgh to the National Student Conference at Chicago in December.

SPEAKERS' BUREAU

A growing enterprise is the Speakers' Bureau, which aims to develop a corps of specialists, each of whom shall be capable of handling one or more subjects as called for. The card index contains at present eighteen names, and during the year the Bureau has responded more or less directly to between twenty-five and thirty calls.

Two meetings of the entire Department were held, one in May, after Mrs. Adams' return to the Diocese, the second in December.

REPORT OF CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB

The Church Periodical Club of this Diocese now has only 33 active branches. During the year they raised \$85.00 for the medical library at St. Luke's, Tokyo; \$21.00 for Fort Valley School for Negroes; \$15.00 for the Hooker School, Mexico City; and \$12.00 for St. James' School, at Wuhu, China, for their libraries. These were the objects selected by headquarters.

Through gifts from individuals we sent a direct magazine subscription to each of the 16 deaf and dumb Episcopal clergymen; and to 25 forest rangers' wives, in especially lonely stations; as well as \$13.00 to the Rev. R. Thornton, of Cuba. The regular work of supplying old periodicals to missionaries, isolated people and local institutions has continued. We sent 16,000 old and 1,000 new Christmas cards.

The \$100.00 from the diocese was used for postage, scrap-books and for magazine subscriptions for 6 missionaries formerly from here. We also sent from this fund \$25.00 to Bishop Campbell, and \$10.00 to Bishop Carson.
