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ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SECRETARY

The year 1922 shows for the Executive Board of the Woman's Auxiliary of Southern Ohio a record of four Board meetings, four Convocation meetings, and the Annual Meeting held in Trinity Church, Columbus, on May 11th and 12th, with 90 delegates representing 51 parishes. This meeting was marked especially by the presentation of the Diocesan United Thank Offering at the opening service, at which Bishop Du Moulin, of Ohio, was the speaker. Your Board wishes also to report that three members were present at the Gambier Conference, while six members of the Board attended the sessions of General Convention at Portland in September.

During the year the officers of the Board have made approximately fifty visits to parish branches throughout the Diocese.

One change in the personnel of the Board must be reported. In September your president, Mrs. Wells, received the resignation of Mrs. Stuart B. Purves as Vice-President of the Cincinnati Convocation. This resignation was received with deep regret and sincerest appreciation for Mrs. Purves' untiring and faithful service to the work of the Auxiliary. At the meeting of the Cincinnati Convocation held on November 7th, Mrs. Frank Bowman was elected to serve as Vice-President for the remainder of your present Board's term of office.

The Vice-Presidents of the three Convocations report satisfactory progress in every branch of the work.

In Cincinnati, two Convocation meetings have been held, one in May at Christ Church, Glendale, and the Fall Convocation meeting held at St. Luke's Church, Cincinnati, in November. The monthly Officers' Conference continues to serve its very useful service as a clearing house for all problems in the work. Dr. John Wood addressed the whole Convocation at a special meeting held at the Church of the Advent, Walnut Hills, and both Miss Matthews and Mr. Flinchbaugh have given addresses on the General Convention. At the Conference on the Church's Mission held at Christ Church, Cincinnati, on October 18th and 19th, the women of the church were privileged to hear Dr. Sturgis, Mr. Sargent, Mr. Franklin, Mr. Thomas, and Mr. Reinheimer.

Sixty-five of the Church Missionary Calendars were sold in this Convocation.

The Vice-President of the Dayton Convocation reports that several branch presidents have written personal letters telling of their work, a courtesy which would add much to the interest and further co-operation in the work, if followed by all branches. The Convocation meeting held at St. James' Church,

Piqua, on November 8th, was well attended and reports were given by Mrs. Wells, Mrs. Van Keuren, Mrs. McGregor, and Mrs. Norton, four of the delegates to General Convention who spoke at each of the three Convocation meetings.

The meeting of the Columbus Convocation held at St. Philip's Church, Circleville, was well attended, though the 51 members present represented only 8 of the 27 branches in this Convocation. The Conference on the Church's Mission was repeated on October 19th and 20th at St. Paul's Church, Columbus.

There are now in Southern Ohio 72 branches of the Auxiliary, 28 in the Cincinnati, 27 in the Columbus, and 17 in the Dayton Convocation, with 6 missions giving to the United Thank Offering.

By action of your Board several changes are advocated in the Constitution and By-Laws of the Auxiliary.

At the meeting of General Convention in Portland the name Presiding Bishop and Council was changed to "The National Council," by action of the Convention. In accordance with this action, your Board therefore recommends that Article I of the Constitution, which reads, "The name of this Association shall be 'The Southern Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary' to the Presiding Bishop and Council," shall be changed to read "The name of this Association shall be 'The Southern Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary' to the National Council." This action would override Article 8 of our Constitution, which states that changes can only be made after notice given at a previous meeting, but as National legislation supersedes Diocesan, such immediate action should be taken at this meeting. At a meeting of your Board held on January 17th, 1923, a motion was made and carried, that Articles 2 and 3 of Section 4 of the Financial Policy be omitted. These Articles read, 2—"After the Nation-wide Campaign Quota of the parish and the running expenses of a branch have been met, any surplus may be sent to the Diocesan Treasurer for the Discretionary Fund," and 3—"The Discretionary Fund shall be disposed of by vote at the Annual Meeting for objects, either Diocesan or General."

Your Diocesan Board also approves and asks that some action be taken by this meeting to accept a resolution passed at the meeting of the Auxiliary in Portland, namely, "Resolved—That the members of the National Executive Board who are not Diocesan Officers shall be ex-officio on the Executive Board of their Diocesan Branches."

We bring these three recommendations to you for your further consideration.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

The year 1922 will long be remembered by your president; because, during that year, the great work of the Church was laid before me as never before, with its wonderful accomplishments and glorious opportunities for service, first at our own conference at Gambier, then at the General Convention in Portland.

As the year 1922 dawned, the thought that it was the Triennial year was uppermost in the minds of many of us. It was our New Years eve, and we paused to look back and see what had been accomplished in the three years, and how short of our ideals we had fallen.

The past trienium has covered a period unlike any other, in the history of the world; a time when we seem to have gone mad with pleasure. Lavish extravagance, a great unrest, with no time for the serious things of life, seems to be everywhere. But as we listened to the reports at the meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in Portland, we realized that in spite of this fact, the women of the Church had responded in a most marvelous way to the call to service through the Auxiliary, giving liberally of their time and money. That, and deepening of the spiritual life, had spread through the whole organization.

But what of Southern Ohio, in this period? You have heard the reports of the chairman, all showing growth and interest. We have heard of our splendid United Thank Offering, but more important is the increase in the number of women using the Little Blue Box. Our Supply Department is like a child out-growing its clothes all the time. But is a very healthy child, if we can only keep pace with its growth. We find a good response to the Educational side of our work. More study or reading groups than ever before; a large number of Auxiliary women taking advantage of the Summer Conference at Gambier.

This year nearly every parish reports one or more Corporate Communion, showing an increase in the spiritual side, and a deeper dependence on God's mercies for the strength to carry on His work. So much for what has been accomplished.

But what of our failures? On a questionnaire I have just filled out there were two questions that I had to leave blank. One was in regards new leaders, the other the number of new recruits for the Mission field secured by the Auxiliary. To me it seems a tragic failure to have to report that we are not getting new leaders. Why is it? Are we not presenting the work of the Church in the right way to interest the women who ought to be coming into our organizations as leaders? There is no lack of material, and I am sure the task is vital enough to interest anyone. During the war I heard that there were more members of the Episcopal Church, who were holding positions at the head of women's organizations, than of any other church. Where are

those women today? Why is it so difficult to get women to attend our conferences and discussion groups? The two wonderful conferences held last fall were only fairly well attended. With the splendid leaders we had we ought to have had twice as many.

We are getting many more women to work for our Supply Department, and doing work of different kinds, but they are not willing to take responsibilities. So, as I see it, the great task before us this year is to arouse a sense of responsibility and to present our wonderful opportunity for service.

Again, why is it we are not getting recruits for the Mission Field? Have we failed to present the call, have we neglected our opportunity to speak for the Church, have we forgotten to pray, that it will be put into the hearts of the young women of our diocese to hear the call to serve the Master in the Field?

At the Triennial a new Special was undertaken. And your delegates pledged the support of Southern Ohio, in your name.

Let me give you the resolution as presented in Portland. Whereas, the Woman's Auxiliary feels a real responsibility for the further training of Missionaries on furlough, and for volunteers; Whereas, those continuing their training need to receive it wherever opportunity is offered; be it resolved that a place be provided near Headquarters, at an initial expenditure of \$65,000.00, where missionaries on furlough and volunteers may reside under the Churches' influence during a continuance of their training.

And whereas, the Woman's Auxiliary feels an equal responsibility for the training of colored women workers; be it resolved: That a minimum of \$10,000.00 be provided for the establishment of the National School for Training Colored Women Workers, already authorized by the Department of Missions, and that this school be started at St. Augustine, Raleigh.

Both of these buildings are to be used for the housing of missionaries on furlough and women workers in the field; the one for white workers and the other for colored.

In this day, when we realize that if our work is to be well done we must have trained workers, and that we must have the very best to carry the message of the Church, I am sure that every woman in Southern Ohio will feel that is one of the most important Specials we have ever undertaken.

As we start out on this campaign let us remember that these buildings are the training camps for the soldiers, who are going to the front to fight in our stead, and let us give as liberally as we did for the soldiers that fought for us in France.

I have asked three women, one in each convocation, to act as intercessors, for the success of our undertaking, that we may realize the need and the wonderful opportunity. These women will ask others to co-operate with them. But I hope every wo-

man in the diocese will pray that we may be guided to do what is right, and give of our means. No gift is too small, but we must have some large ones as well.

I have asked Mrs. Theodore Glenn, of Columbus, to act as Diocesan Chairman, and each parish will be asked to appoint their own chairman.

The Executive Board recommends that our goal be set at \$2,000.00. This amount ought to be easily raised, when we realize that through this Special we are having a part in what is the greatest challenge of the Church today, the colored question. Many new leaders are needed right now to carry on the work for the colored people. What greater share could we have, than to help erect a place where colored women could be trained to lead their own people? The first ten thousand undesignated will be used to build this house at Raleigh. The hostel in New York will make no less of an appeal.

The raising of money was only one of the things that we pledged your support to in Portland. The Woman's Auxiliary again promised its efforts in prayer and service toward maintaining a high moral standard in our homes and in society.

The plan of the Prayer Partnership, as used by the Woman's Auxiliary of Canada, was highly commended to our use. A number of parishes have started this new work, and report much help and renewed interest in this new close partnership with our missionaries.

One other resolution, in regard to the men who fought in the World War, and who are now disabled and without adequate care. It was recommended that the parishes do all in their power to care for these men as a part of their Christian Social Service work.

We had hoped to give out the annual reports at the close of this meeting, but the replies to the questionnaire were so slow in coming it has been impossible to do so. There are one or two suggestions that I would like to make, that I think will make it easier to get the reports in on time. First, now that our year runs from January to January, it would greatly simplify matters if the new parish officers could be elected in December, to take office in January. Then you would not have to wait till they were elected to send in your report.

The other suggestion is that we borrow the plan of the Church School, and use a chart of the five fields of service. I find one parish is doing this with good result, filling in each field of service as the work is done, with the kind of work and its value, so that when the report is asked for, we will have it at a glance. With the small parish where the same women do everything, I know it is very hard to decide what belongs to the Auxiliary and what does not. Especially is this true in the parish field. I have been asked by a number of women to again outline what work we may do. There is so much to choose from, I

think it would be easier to say what we ought not to try to do. There are a few suggestions I would like to make. First, that when we undertake some piece of work for the community, we find out what form of work our Church is doing and co-operate, rather than start something new. If you are in doubt, I am sure you could receive much assistance by communicating with the chairman of the Christian Social Service committee of the Church Service League. Especially is this true of the churches in Cincinnati. And in our community work we must not forget the In-As-Much Guild.

As our Diocesan piece of work, I recommend that we again undertake the Scholarship for the Bethany Home Boy.

This is the first time the Woman's Auxiliary has held an annual meeting at this time of year, and it was with fear and trembling that your board set this date. But this splendid meeting shows it takes more than a change of date to effect the loyalty of the women to the Auxiliary.

We have planned to hold spring Convocation meetings in each Convocation, and we hope to make these meetings so interesting that they will help to make up for the change, as I know many women look forward from year to year to the spring meeting of the Auxiliary.

Another change will have to be made this year. The annual meeting that should be held in January next, will have to be held in November of this year. The reason of this is the fact that we elect a new president at our next meeting. And you will remember that we only elect the president, and she appoints the other officers with the exception of the three vice-presidents. If our meeting is held in January, the new president would have to take office at once without any time to prepare herself or appoint the other officers. The executive board feels that the work of the Auxiliary would suffer if that was done; but if the election takes place in November the new officers will be ready to take over the work the first of the year, and there will be no time lost. So if there is no serious objection the next annual meeting and election of a president will take place in November.

We are beginning a new year, and I want to present a program of work in the five fields.

1. We will support, by our prayers and co-operation, any undertaking in our parish, especially the Nation-wide Campaign and the Church School.
2. We will do all in our power to care for the men who fought in the World War, and are now disabled and without adequate care. And will try to support any activity undertaken by the Christian Social Service Committee of the Church Service League, and where possible, will form a branch of the In-As-Much Guild.
3. We will assist in raising the \$300.00 Scholarship for the Bethany Home Boy.

4. We will help to raise the \$2000.00 fund for the two homes for missionaries.
5. We will form a Prayer Partnership with some missionary in the field.

And at all times we will labour diligently, give liberally and pray fervently to make Christ known to all the world.

If our work is to be of any real value, we must pray that we be led aright, that we may know what we should do, and be given strength to perform the same. As we begin our winter's work next fall, I hope that every parish will have a Woman's Auxiliary Corporate Communion, on or about the first Sunday in October, a time when we will again dedicate our lives to serving the Master, through this organization. And this spring, in May, could we not have a special day throughout the diocese, when we lay our winter's work as an offering on God's altar, and ask His blessing on it? We may not be able to have the actual work there at the time, but we can offer our grateful hearts for the wonderful opportunity for service, and ask God's blessing on our work.

The Woman's Auxiliary opens the door to many joyful opportunities to serve the Master. May you all know the joy of service and fellowship one with the other, in the coming year, as I have with you all in the past.

In addition to the above financial report, your treasurer desires to call your attention to the following statement.

The financial obligations for the year 1923 are: 1st, the Central Expense Fund; 2nd, Supply Department; 3rd, Nation Wide Campaign; 4th, Bethany Home Scholarship; 5th, Training School Specials.

The first and second are necessary for the upkeep of the organization; the third is our obligation as stated in our Financial Policy; the fourth and fifth were assumed by vote of the delegates at our last annual meeting.

Contributions of money for the Supply Department are urgently requested. The money is used to buy, in wholesale quantities, drugs and other hospital supplies, shoes, rubbers, stockings, underwear, and other things which cannot be made, and to pay freight, express, and parcel post charges. The overdraft reported in the Bethany Home Scholarship Fund for 1922 has been made up since the Annual Meeting. Contributions to this fund for 1923 should be sent to the treasurer by September 1st, as the tuition at St. Alban's School is payable in advance. Our pledge is for \$300.00. The variety of objects, outside of specific Auxiliary appeals, to which our branches contributed during the year 1922, is revealed in the reports of the parishes. Such contributions may be sent through the Diocesan Treasurer if the Parish Treasurer so desires.

Report of the Supply Department of the Diocese of Southern Ohio, January 1, 1923

The success of any new venture can only be determined by the results, and judged by this rule, the re-organization of the Supply Department amply justifies itself. Our interest has been stimulated and our imagination stirred by the new presentation of the Church's needs and of our own relationship to them.

There are now 70 Parishes and Missions contributing to the Supply Department instead of 51, under the old plan, and the value of our work has increased from \$5959.00 in 1920 to \$8975.00 in 1922, a remarkable increase. Best of all, this increase, in numbers and value, shows a real desire to do our

share in carrying out the Church's program of helping the unfortunate.

We are today working together harmoniously, setting aside personal preferences and accepting and filling allotments as received. The quality of the work is admirable, both as to material and workmanship, resulting in garments which must be a real joy to the Missionaries who receive them.

In addition to the allotments, extra Summer contributions have been made, showing our continued interest throughout the year. These have amounted to more than five hundred garments, with a value of more than \$700.00. As they were mainly knitted garments, they were sent to the Seamen's Mission, to Alaska, and to our Mission at Glen Alpine as Christmas gifts, and very appreciative acknowledgments have been sent to us.

We begin the new year with the work for St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Shanghai, China, a large but interesting task, with practically the whole Diocese at work upon it. We are now working for three Hospitals, two in China and one in Porto Rico, one in China and the one in Porto Rico being Parish ventures. So far have we progressed beyond our old limitations.

REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

The educational work shows an encouraging growth over previous years, although there is still much to be done. Twenty-seven parishes and missions report having had one or more discussion groups on either "The Survey" or "The Task of the Church." These parish classes were preceded by three interparochial classes, which served also as training classes for leaders. Two conferences on the Church's mission were arranged this fall in connection with the program of the Nationwide Campaign, and these afforded an opportunity for women of the diocese to hear some of the most able workers of the General Church. The recent questionnaire has brought to light some interesting facts; namely, that seventy-one groups have been privileged to hear speakers from the mission field, that missionary pageants have been presented in ten parishes, and that twenty-nine parishes have had regular program meetings. These statistics are of no value in themselves, but if properly interpreted may point the direction for our future work. We are at the beginning of a new year, during which we should increase

our work, particularly in the matter of program meetings. Only fifty per cent. of our branches report using this excellent method of putting missionary information before the whole group of women workers, and we can not be content until every branch is having at least four good program meetings each year.

CHURCH SCHOOL SERVICE LEAGUE

It is impossible, at this early date, to have a full report of the Christmas box work done by the church schools.

At present the report is as follows:

72 schools in diocese, 65 pledging Christmas box work, 1 doing other missionary box work. Reports received from 44 schools show boxes sent to the value of \$1220.04 for the Christmas box work; \$342.00 for other missionary box work.

Fourteen more schools pledged boxes this year than had any share in the work last year.

The missionaries write that never before have the children of their schools had such a wonderful Christmas.

Public schools and church schools are well filled with children, whose attendance is made possible by the gifts of clothing by the children of S. O.

MINUTES OF THE FORTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING

The 47th Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of Southern Ohio was held in the Church of the Good Shepherd, Norwood, on January 24, 1923. The opening service of Holy Communion was held at 10:00 A. M. with Bishop Reese, celebrant, and the Rev. Chas. Reade and the Rev. George H. Hills assisting. About 180 made their communions at this service.

Bishop Vincent gave an informal meditation preparatory to the communion service, using as his text, 1 Corinthians XI, 26, "For as often as ye eat this bread and drink this cup ye do shew the Lord's death till He come." In showing the special intention which the Woman's Auxiliary can always find in this text, Bishop Vincent pointed out the memorial and prophetic aspect of these words. He said we dare not interpret the final meaning of the words "Till He come," but we can always see a constant pledge of the final fulfillment of these words, and in remembrance of the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross we come to the Eucharist to renew our personal pledge with God and the Christian Covenant, and to reconsecrate ourselves to the work of the Auxiliary.

The business session of the meeting opened at 11:30.

The Rev. Dr. Lawton, rector of the Church of the Good Shepherd, being ill, the Rev. Dr. Hills welcomed the Auxiliary in his behalf.

Notices of the meetings of the Diocesan Convention and of the House of Churchwomen were then given by the Rev. Mr. Symons.

The annual report of the secretary was read and approved.

The report of the Diocesan Treasurer, Mrs. Hubbard, was given and the different items explained. The report shows in totals: Balance, \$931.63; Receipts, \$3375.89; Disbursements, \$3503.72; Balance, January 1, 1923, \$803.80.

Noonday prayers were then read by the Rev. Dr. Hills.

Mrs. Norton moves that the report of the treasurer be accepted. Motion seconded by Mrs. Chauncey and carried.

Mrs. Hubbard then read a letter from one of the Sisters of the Bethany Home, which told of the successful work of the two boys from the Home who are now attending St. Alban's School.

An incomplete report of the Committee on Credentials was given by Mrs. Ledding showing 77 delegates representing 37 parishes have registered.

Mrs. Wells announced the appointment of the following Committee on Resolutions, Mrs. McCaw, Chairman, Mrs. Larcomb, and Mrs. Hubbard.

Mrs. McGregor, Educational Secretary for the Diocese, gave the report of the work under her direction. She stressed particularly the importance of the program meeting.

In the absence of Mrs. Van Keuren, Treasurer of the United Thank Offering, the report of the offering was read by Mrs. W. E. Loose. This shows \$22,184.00 officially credited to the United Thank Offering of 1923, with \$14.42 credited to the 1925 offering.

Miss Matthews moves that the report of the United Thank Offering treasurer be accepted and filed. Motion seconded by Mrs. Stimmel and carried.

Mrs. Wells then gave her annual address. She spoke first of the realization of the splendid work of the women of the church brought forth by the reports given at Portland. She spoke of the encouraging growth in some phases of our work, but the most discouraging aspect is in the lack of leaders at home and of volunteers for the mission field. She brought to us a resolution to be acted upon later, as to the "special" to be raised for the training schools for women workers. Mrs. Theodore Glenn, of Columbus, has been appointed Chairman of the Committee for this special work. Mrs. Wells suggested ways in which the Auxiliary may serve and further the work in the 5 Fields of Service and told of plans for the coming year.

Mrs. Glenn, Chairman of the Training Schools Special Committee, was then introduced and spoke a few words giving her reasons for accepting this chairmanship.

Luncheon was served at 12:45 in the parish house.

The business session was resumed at 1:45.

Mrs. Stimson, Box Secretary of the Church School Service League, gave an illustrated report of the increase in the number of church schools now sending boxes to our missions at Christmas time.

Mrs. Wells then introduced the Ven. W. S. Claiborne, Arch-deacon of Tennessee, who told of the need of workers, men and women of practical common sense, who, through simple individual teaching of the Bible, the Prayer Book, and of the real meaning of the church, might help to develop the great potential possibilities of this simple rural people.

Mrs. Norton, Secretary of the Supply Department, gave the annual report of the work of the department, showing a money value of \$8975.00 for the year 1922, a gain of 17 per cent. over that of 1921.

Mrs. Wells announced that the amount of the offering at the morning service was \$69.38.

Miss Morrison moved that the offering be given to Arch-deacon Claiborne for his work in Tennessee. Motion seconded by Miss Halstead and carried.

The Committee on Credentials reports that there are now registered 124 delegates representing 56 parishes, with 91 visitors.

The report of the Committee on Resolutions was then given by the Chairman, Mrs. McCaw. These resolutions were acted upon separately.

The adoption of Resolution 1 was moved, "That the goal for the Special for the Training Schools be set at \$2000.00 for Southern Ohio, and that the Auxiliary pledge \$300.00 for the Scholarship Fund for St. Alban's School." Motion seconded by Miss Matthews and carried.

The adoption of Resolution 2 was moved, "That Article 1 of the Constitution be changed to read, 'The name of this Association shall be The Southern Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.'" Motion seconded by Miss Halstead and carried.

The adoption of Resolution 3 was moved, "That the Woman's Auxiliary of Southern Ohio approves the Resolution passed by the National Auxiliary at Portland, namely, 'That the members of the National Executive Board who are not Diocesan Officers shall be ex-officio on the Executive Board of their Diocesan branches.'" Motion seconded by Mrs. McGregor and carried.

The adoption of Resolution 4 was moved. "That Articles 2 and 3 of Section 4 of the Financial Policy be omitted. Motion seconded by Mrs. Bowman and carried.

The adoption of Resolution 5 was moved, "That greetings be sent from the members of the Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of Southern Ohio to the Rev. Dr. Lawton with regrets that he could not be present today and the earnest hope of his speedy recovery. Also that thanks be expressed to the Woman's Auxiliary of the Church of the Good Shepherd for the delightful meeting held with them." Motion seconded by Mrs. Chauncey and carried by a rising vote.

The minutes of the meeting were read by the secretary and approved on motion.

After the reading of the prayer for the Woman's Auxiliary, the meeting was adjourned on motion.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

Name.—The name of this Association shall be "The Southern Ohio Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council."

ARTICLE II

Object.—The object of this Association is to carry out in the Diocese of Southern Ohio, by united and systematic effort the three great aims of the Church, namely: Missions, Religious Education, and Christian Social Service, in the five fields of service, namely, Parish, Community, Diocese, Nation and World.

ARTICLE III

Membership.—Membership in this Association shall consist of those baptized women of the Diocese who agree to share in the work of the Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV

Officers.—The officers of this Association shall be the Bishop, a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, a Secretary of the Supply Department, a Treasurer, a Treasurer of the United Thank Offering, and an Educational Secretary. These officers, with an appointee of the Church School Service League of the Diocese, shall constitute the Executive Board of the Association.

ARTICLE V

Duties.—Section 1. The Executive Board shall, subject to the Association, direct the active work of the Association, and have power to adopt by-laws for the Association.

Section 2. The Bishop, when present, may preside at meetings of the Association and of the Executive Board.

Section 3. The President shall be elected at the second Annual Meeting next after the General Triennial Meeting, to serve for three years, but shall not be eligible for two consecutive full terms. She shall, with the Bishop's approval, appoint all other Diocesan officers, except the Vice-Presidents, to serve for three years. She shall call meetings of the Association and of the Executive Board, and shall, in the Bishop's absence, preside at them. She shall exercise a general supervision of the work and further it in every way by her interest and advice, and especially by an address at the Annual Meeting. In case of a vacancy in the office of President, such vacancy shall be filled until

the next Annual Meeting, by appointment made by the Bishop and a committee of two selected by the Executive Board.

Section 4. Each Vice-President shall be elected as soon as possible after the Annual Meeting at which the President is elected by the members of her own Convocation, to serve for three years, but shall not be eligible for two consecutive terms. An election, either for a full or unexpired term, shall be held at a Convocation meeting called for the purpose by the retiring Vice-President or by the President. A Vice-President, with the approval of the President, may appoint any other Convocation officers in her own Convocation, and prescribe their duties. She shall preside at all meetings in her own Convocation. She shall co-operate with the President in promoting local intelligence and interest, and in directing local organization and work in her own Convocation.

Section 5. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Executive Board and of the Annual Meeting. She shall conduct all correspondence of the Association and of the Board, except as provided for in Section 6 of this article. She shall also make an annual report of the work done from data furnished by the other officers.

Section 6. The Box Secretary shall receive and distribute all information relating to the missionary boxes, and shall report annually to the Secretary the work done.

Section 7. The Treasurer shall record, receive, disburse, and keep account of all money distributed, except that from the United Offering; and shall also make an annual report of the same.

Section 8. The treasurer of the United Offering shall, under the direction of the Executive Board, promote this interest locally by correspondence or visitation, and shall report annually the amount in hand, and forward the Triennial offering.

Section 9. The duties of the Educational Secretary to be a general supervision of all Missionary Education work of the Diocese, carried on under the auspices of the Woman's Auxiliary.

ARTICLE VI

Meetings.—Section 1. There shall be an Annual Meeting of this Association, or there may be semi-Annual Meetings. Every parish branch may send three delegates, including an executive officer; and every mission branch one delegate. Except in the election of a President, Executive Officers, when not delegates, may vote on all questions before the house.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall meet at least twice a year. Five officers shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. Convocation meetings may be held on the call of the Convocation Officers.

Section 4. Delegates to the Triennial shall be elected from

the active membership of the Auxiliary, by a majority of the delegates of the Annual Meeting next before the Triennial Meeting. Nomination of delegates to the Triennial may be made by any delegate to the Annual Meeting, and must be sent in, in writing, not later than the morning session of the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VII

Mode of Election.—Section 1. In the election of a President any delegate may nominate; all nominations must be written; all elections must be by ballot, and each Parish or Mission shall cast but one vote.

Section 2. Unless there be an election by a clear majority on the first ballot, the Chair shall declare the two names having the largest number of votes, and subsequent ballots shall be upon these two names until a majority vote is reached.

ARTICLE VIII

Amendments.—This Constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote of the whole number of delegates at any Annual Meeting, notice of such proposed amendment having been given at the previous meeting.

BY-LAWS

The Executive Board shall determine the time of and place for the Annual Meeting.

1. The Order of Business at any Annual Meeting shall be:

- (1) A Service of Holy Communion.
- (2) Roll Call.
- (3) The Annual Report of the Secretary.
- (4) Annual Report of Treasurer.
- (5) The President's Address.
- (6) New Business.
- (7) The Election of President.
- (8) Minutes.

2. Parish election of delegates shall take place during the month preceding the Annual Meeting, and be immediately reported by the local Secretary to the Diocesan Secretary.

3. A Central Expense Fund shall be provided for printing, postage, stationery and traveling expenses of officers and speakers.

4. Local receipts for the United Thank Offering shall be remitted to its Treasurer in April and October except triennially in September.

5. The accounts of the Treasurer and of the Treasurer of the United Thank Offering shall be audited and certified in the printed annual report of the Association.

6. These By-Laws may be altered or amended by a majority vote at any regular meeting of the Executive Board.

FINANCIAL POLICY

I

1. The Auxiliary should be the Educational and Inspirational force in a Parish.
2. It should be the duty of the Auxiliary to educate its members, and through its members the parish, to believe that the Nation-wide Campaign Quota is the least amount each parish should give.

II

1. It shall be the duty of every branch to aid in raising the Nation-wide Campaign Quota of the parish.
 - (a) By urging an every-member canvass and assisting in carrying it out.
 - (b) By giving through the Duplex Envelopes, or in any other method in use in the parish.
 - (c) By giving when necessary as an organization.

III

1. The funds of each parochial branch shall be raised at the discretion of the branch.
2. Diocesan Central Expense Fund shall be raised in the following manner:
 - (a) There shall be fourteen classes paying as follows:

A—\$75.00	H—\$20.00
B—\$60.00	I—\$15.00
C—\$50.00	K—\$10.00
D—\$40.00	L—\$ 7.50
E—\$35.00	M—\$ 5.00
F—\$30.00	N—\$ 3.00
G—\$25.00	O—\$ 1.00
 - (b) Each branch shall decide to which class it will belong.
 - (c) Each Parochial Treasurer shall yearly notify the Diocesan Treasurer to which class the branch belongs.
 - (d) The Central Expense shall be the first obligation of each branch, and shall be paid for the current year during the month of January.

- (e) Payment of the Central Expense is necessary for memberships in the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary.
- (f) Diocesan Dues to the National Organization shall be paid from the Central Expense.

IV

1. Specials assumed at the Annual Meeting are the responsibility of parochial branches.

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
