PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

To the Tennessee Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary:

MY DEAR FRIENDS AND CO-WORKERS—Once more we are gathered together for our annual meeting, and it is with a grateful and loving appreciation of your many kindnesses in the past that I now extend to you a hearty welcome to this hospitable city, after an interval of several years, feeling confident of your able coöperation now and during the coming year.

Our Bishop highly endorses and fully appreciates your work; and it rests with you to aid him in his Diocesan Missions, as well as to assist in carrying out more extended objects, both domestic and foreign, which our duty to the Board of Missions not only expects, but requires of us. This mission work, so dear to all of us, is God's work, and deserves, yea demands, our very best efforts. It is ours to work and do what seems wisest, but results are His, and therefore, however small they may be, we should not be discouraged.

Our annual reports show steady growth, and are therefore very gratifying, as well as most helpful in aiding us to "press toward the mark of our high calling" with renewed hope, vigor and determination. We feel much indebted to our parochial officers, that band of devoted women, to whom our Auxiliary in every Diocese owes so much for their efficient work. Let us all begin this new year at once, doing what we can during the coming summer and not wait for winter, before making a start; let each of us try to interest some woman, who does not already know of our fascinating work, and thus make the coming year the banner one.

We look to our dear Juniors to aid us by sending boxes, holding study-classes, giving scholarships, and in many ways lifting some of our burdens to their young and strong shoulders. The Little Helpers' branches have been doing admirably, and, in due time, will make wise successors to us of the present day.

As our triennial meeting, in New York last October, was so ably and fully reported by our beloved Diocesan Secretary, Mrs. Loaring Clark, and published in the New York *Churchman*, it is unnecessary for me to further refer to it; and yet, I want to remind you of the fact that our United Offering then taken up, \$2,077.75, was a very considerable increase over that of 1910, which I hope will spur us on with renewed zeal.

You will probably remember that our Diocese was called upon to contribute to the testimonial to be presented to Miss Emery, on her thirty-five years of faithful and devoted service to the Woman's Auxiliary, amounting to \$16,000.00, and although Tennessee's contribution was small, I feel sure we are happy to have had the privilege of contributing.

We have with us Miss Tillotson, the Assistant Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, who will tell us all about the missionary work now being carried on; and as her interesting talks, wise counsel and helpful addresses will be of infinitely more importance than anything I could talk to you about, I will not encroach further on your time and patience.

REPORTS

SECRETARY'S REPORT

During the past year thirty-three branches have undertaken and reported their work. Five branches make no report of any active work.

In conjunction with the Archdeacon of East Tennessee, preliminary steps have been taken to reorganize or to organize branches of the Auxiliary at Jellico, Greeneville, Harriman and Etowah. It is hoped that branches will be in active work at these stations by the time of the next annual meeting.

Three hundred copies of the Annual Report were printed and distributed. These were sent to the Bishop and clergy of the Diocese, the diocesan and parochial officers of the Auxiliary, the bishops and officers of the Fourth (Sewanee) Province, and the officers at the Church Missions House.

Five hundred copies of a revised Service Book and Constitution were printed and a copy sent to each parochial President. These are for sale at one dollar a dozen. Six dozen have been sold.

Twenty-five branches report having joined in a service of Corporate Communion on the Feast of the Annunciation, and three branches set aside another day for this purpose.

Those branches which have adopted a systematic method of making their offerings report the greatest increase, both in interest and gifts.

MINUTES

TUESDAY, April 28, 1914.

The Twenty-seventh Annual Meeting of the Tennessee Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions convened at Grace Church, Memphis, on Tuesday, April 28th, 1914, at 10 o'clock.

The Rt. Rev. Thomas F. Gailor, S.T.D., assisted by the Rev. E. S. Gunn, rector of Grace Church, and the Rev. John B. Cannon, Chaplain of the University of the South, celebrated Holy Communion. The Rev. John B. Cannon preached the sermon. The offering, amounting to \$19.85, was designated for the United Offering.

At the conclusion of the service the meeting convened for organization. Mrs. John Shortridge, President of the Auxiliary, took the chair.

Eight officers and heads of departments, and thirty-four delegates representing eighteen branches, responded as follows:

Mrs. R. G. Walker of Grace Church very cordially welcomed the representatives of the Auxiliary to Grace Church, and Mrs. Tyler Calhoun of Nashville cleverly responded.

The President delivered her Annual Address, which will be found printed herein.

Miss Emily C. Tillotson, of New York, Assistant Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, was presented to the meeting.

Reports of the work accomplished during the last year were received from the Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Custodian of Specials, Custodian of United Offering and the Educational Secretary. These reports will be found printed herein.

The Secretary announced that, by order of the Board of Managers, all reports of gifts, other than those given for strictly missionary purposes, would be eliminated from this year's printed report. This is to be construed to mean that no gifts can be credited as Auxiliary work which are applied to objects not under the jurisdiction of the Board of Missions or the Bishop of the Diocese.

Miss Tillotson then gave an initial talk on Study Classes and the value of systematic work.

St. Paul's, Chattanooga, presented, by Mrs. B. T. Howard, an amendment to Article IV of the Constitution, by adding the words: "Together with the heads of such departments as may be formed from time to time,"—making the article to read:

"The officers of this Association shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. These officers, together with the heads of such

departments as may be formed from time to time, with the Bishop as Chairman, *ex officio*, shall constitute the Board of Managers. The President and any one member of the Board shall be counted a quorum for the transaction of business."

After discussion, the acceptance of the amendnent was duly proposed, seconded and unanimously adopted.

The meeting adjourned to accept the invitation of the ladies of Grace Church for luncheon.

TUESDAY, April 28, 2:15 P.M.

The delegates reassembled and an impressive service, conducted by the President, was held in memory of deceased officers and members of the Auxiliary.

Miss Tillotson conducted a study-class session, using "The Why and How of Missions" as her text-book. The lesson dealt with organization, ideals, and methods.

The report of the work of the Junior Auxiliary was made by Mrs. B. T. Howard. This will be found appended. Mrs. Howard also reported for the Babies' Branches, now known, by order of the last Triennial, as the Little Helpers, and the appointment was announced of Mrs. Haskell Rightor of St. Ann's, Nashville, to fill the vacancy left by the death of Mrs. S. S. Roche, for many years the esteemed Secretary-Treasurer of the Babies' Branches.

Bishop Gailor gave a forceful and appealing address on Christian Education as an absolutely necessary factor in the life of to-day. He asked the Auxiliary to help him in his educational work in the Diocese. Firstly, to give their financial support to the diocesan school, St. Katherine's, Boliver, which, by reason of the small charge made for education cannot be entirely self-supporting; and, secondly, to assist in his educational work amongst the colored people.

At the conclusion of the Bishop's address the meeting adjourned.

SECOND DAY

WEDNESDAY, April 29, 9:30 A.M.

The meeting was called to order and a study-class session conducted by Miss Tillotson, the subject under consideration being "Foreign Missionary Administration." A live discussion ensued and was participated in by many.

The meeting adjourned at 10:45 in order that the delegates might attend the opening service of the Diocesan Convention.

WEDNESDAY, April 29, 2:15 A.M.

The President called the meeting to order in the auditorium of the Parish House of Calvary Church, and opened in the usual way.

The Chair appointed as Committee on Courtesy, Mrs. E. L. Hampton, Nashville; Mrs. H. P. Cochrane, Franklin; Mrs. Charles S. Ware, Bolivar.

Parish reports were read and accepted.

On motion of Mrs. B. T. Howard the following was adopted:

Resolved, That the Tennessee Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary join in a campaign to extend the circulation of the *Spirit of Missions*, and that as far as possible this work be done on June 1 and June 2, Whit-Monday and Whit-Tuesday.

Miss Margaret Rogers spoke on the work amongst the colored people, initiated and carried on by Church women of Memphis, and urged the Auxiliary to take active interest in this work.

Miss Tillotson conducted a study session, dealing with "The Missionary Enterprise and its Critics."

The meeting adjourned in order that the delegates might attend the dedication of the new wing at the Church Orphanage.

THIRD DAY

TUESDAY, April 30, 10:00 A.M.

The meeting was opened by the President in the usual manner.

A study session was conducted by Miss Tillotson, "The Home Church and the Foreign Missionary Enterprise" being the topic.

As an outcome of Miss Tillotson's instructions and addresses, practical suggestions were made for increasing interest in missionary work. Amongst these were: (1) Increase the subscriptions to the *Spirit of Missions*; (2) Each woman should know the exact amount of her parish apportionments; (3) Each Auxiliary officer should pledge herself to do all in her power to see that the apportionment is paid in full by August 31st; (4) Interest should be awakened in every Sunday School by instruction in Missions; (5) Sunday Schools should use the Duplex Envelope; (6) Sunday School Institute to be held in August at Sewanee should be asked to stress Missions, and should be widely advertised and used by Auxiliary women; (7) Earnest and systematic prayer.

On motion of Mrs. Loaring Clark, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That in view of the serious financial condition of the Board of Missions the parochial officers of the Auxiliary in this diocese pledge themselves: (1) To find out the amount of the parish apportionment for General Missions; (2) To do all in their power to see that the amount of their own apportionment is paid in full by the end of the Board's fiscal year, August 31st, 1914.

A committee, Mrs. J. Craik Morris, Chairman, was appointed to interview Dr. Logan, Secretary of Sunday School Commission for the Fourth Province, in order to see if arrangements could be made to hold a Normal Study Class during the Institute to be held in August. The committee reported favorably on this point and it was announced that Dr. Logan had received Miss Tillotson's promise to conduct such a class.

A rising vote of thanks was accorded Miss Tillotson for her earnest, helpful and thorough work during the sessions of the Auxiliary.

On motion, it was resolved that pledges should be made as requested by the Bishop for educational work in the Diocese.

Parish pledges for the work of the ensuing year were then taken.

Miss Elizabeth D. Whitmore, in charge of the mountain mission station at Monterey, Tenn., and Mrs. Walworth, in the interest of St. Andrew's Mission, Memphis, spoke of their work and asked for the practical interest of Auxiliary women.

The report of the Committee on Courtesy was received with rising vote, and the Secretary ordered to forward same to proper persons.

After a lengthy discussion of Diocesan Missions, it was moved, seconded and carried:

"That if it meet with the approval of the Bishop, the fund now known as 'Missionary in Tennessee' be merged with Diocesan Missions." [The Bishop prefers that this fund be not distured.—SECRETARY.]

Mrs. B. T. Howard, as Secretary-Treasurer of the Juniors, and Mrs. Haskell Rightor, as Secretary-Treasurer of the Little Helpers, were authorized to receive and disburse funds sent to them.

The President appointed the following named ladies as delegates to the next meeting of the Fourth Province: Mesdames Thos. F. Gailor, E. S. Gunn, B. T. Howard, John Shortridge. Alternates: Mesdames W. D. Buckner, Tyler Calhoun, Loaring Clark, Richard McCargo.

The Minutes were read and approved.

The President made appropriate closing remarks in which she urged increased zeal in the great cause of Missions. She asked that checks be sent promptly on each quarter day, and that a separate check be made out for each separate object. All moneys to be forwarded to the Diocesan Auxiliary Treasurers, except in the case of funds for the Board of Missions, which may be sent direct and a voucher forwarded to the Treasurer. Gifts cannot be recorded that are not sent in this manner.

The President thanked the women for their loyal support and asked for a continuance of their love and loyalty. With touching and earnest prayer, Mrs. Shortridge, who completes her twenty-seventh year of service as President, closed the twenty-seventh annual meeting of the Auxiliary in the Diocese of Tennessee.
