

With the enthusiasm that I feel sure all of you bring, let us endeavor to make *this* meeting one of a re-dedication of ourselves to the work of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions, in order that we may prove ourselves a more vital force in the missionary life of the Church than ever before.

The work of the past year will be presented to you through the diocesan officers during our business meeting, and it will be helpful to us all to have your criticism and advice, relative to the various departments represented.

As we have but this *one* opportunity during the year, when we can meet together in conference, it is expected that the representatives of the different branches will realize that the meeting is *theirs* as much as that of the *officers*, whose duties it is to guide the work to the satisfaction of the branches, and in accordance with the wishes of the delegates.

The close of a year is always a time for deep searching of the heart. We recall many things we had hoped to accomplish and see many things which remain undone; and therefore it is difficult to resist giving way to the temptation to indulge in self-reproach and sadness.

I have served the Diocese of Tennessee, as President of the Woman's Auxiliary, twenty-eight years, beginning at its foundation in St. Paul's Church, Chattanooga, in the year 1888, at the earnest solicitation of the much-beloved Bishop Quintard. I wish to express my most hearty and cordial approbation of all your efforts and faithful coöperation in the upbuilding of this most noble work, begun with only *five* members and *now*

represented by thirty-seven branches. These figures will present to you much more of the growth and efficiency of the work, the result of your own efforts, than any words I may lend to a description of its development. And now, on behalf of the Woman's Auxiliary, I wish to extend to the Bishop of this Diocese, the Right Reverend Thos. F. Gailor, S.T.D., my own and their most cordial and hearty appreciation of *his* interest and assistance in the work of this organization.

With my most loving thanks for all the help you have been and are to me, I can only say—I thank you.

Addresses of Welcome were made by Mrs. Caroline E. Richmond on behalf of the Parish, Mrs. Fletcher B. Martin on behalf of the Federated Missionary Societies of Chattanooga, and Miss Helen Wright on behalf of the Juniors.

Mrs. W. Haskell DuBose, of Sewanee, happily responded.

The President read her Annual Address, which will be found printed herein.

Reports were made by the Treasurer, Custodian of Specials, Educational Secretary, Custodian of United Offering, and Correspondent of the Church Periodical Club.

Mrs. C. W. Starr, of Nashville, gave an account of the meetings of the Auxiliary in the Province, held at Sewanee in October last.

The Secretary read a telegram from the Rev. Mercer P. Logan, D.D., announcing the Summer School to be held at Se-

wanee, August 8th to 15th, and a communication from Miss Claudia Hunter, Educational Secretary of North Carolina, giving particulars of the Blue Ridge Conference to be held June 24th to July 6th.

The Meeting adjourned for luncheon.

---

TUESDAY, May 9, 2:15 P.M.

After the usual opening by the President, reports were read by the Secretary for Missionary Boxes, and the Secretary of the Auxiliary. Parish reports and pledges were made.

At 3:15, the order of the day being called for, the Junior Session was opened by Mrs. Haskell Rightor, who reported for the Little Helpers.

Miss Laura Bassett spoke on Junior work and read the financial report of the Juniors. Junior delegates, or their representatives, made reports of the work accomplished.

The Juniors of St. Paul's presented the missionary sketch "Tired of Missions" to an interested gathering of both Juniors and Seniors.

---

WEDNESDAY, May 10, 9:30 A.M.

The meeting was called to order in the Second Presbyterian Church and opened with a prayer by the President. Minutes of the previous session were read and approved. The unfinished parish reports and pledges for the ensuing year were made.

An invitation to visit Signal Mountain during the afternoon was extended to the visitors by the Rector of St. Paul's.

Mrs. Bolton Smith, of Memphis, gave a full and interesting account of the work carried on at the Keeling Industrial School for Negro Girls, and asked each branch of the Auxiliary to form a section of the Bishop's Guild,—which has been organized by the Bishop to interest Church people in his work amongst the Negro race. Members of the Guild are asked to subscribe ten cents monthly. On motion of Miss Oehmig, duly seconded, it was

*Resolved*, That all funds contributed by the Auxiliary for Colored Work in the Diocese be forwarded to Mrs. Bolton Smith.

Discussion of this resolution brought out the fact that if the Bishop wishes his Guild to be a part of the legitimate work for the women of the Auxiliary, he would probably appoint Mrs. Bolton Smith in charge of funds for Colored Work and a Diocesan officer of the Auxiliary.

A telegram of greeting was ordered sent to Miss J. C. Emery.

The meeting adjourned to attend the opening service of the Eighty-fourth Diocesan Convention.

---

THURSDAY, May 11th, 9:30 A.M.

The President called the meeting to order, and Dr. E. A. Elmore, pastor of the Second Presbyterian Church, offered the opening prayer, and welcomed the women of the Auxiliary to his church.

Mrs. W. H. DuBose acted as Chairman and presided throughout the session.

Minutes were read and approved.

Reports were unanimously accepted from the Committee on Courtesy, through Mrs. B. D. Bosworth, and from the Committee on Credentials, through Miss Oehmig.

Miss Harris spoke of our diocesan paper, *The Diocese of Tennessee*, and urged each branch to appoint a representative to secure subscribers.

Archdeacon Demby gave an interesting account of the work at the Industrial Home for Negro Girls at Keeling, and on motion of Mrs. Richard McCargo, seconded and carried, it was

*Resolved*, That the Auxiliary in this Diocese raise at least \$50.00 to provide for the education of a Negro girl for the current year at Keeling School.

Pledges were taken and \$63.00 was promised by eighteen branches.

Miss Whitmore, of Monterey, told of the work being carried on in that section of the State, and asked for the continued practical assistance of the women.

Report of the work at Paradise Ridge was read by the Secretary.

Mrs. J. Craik Morris read Miss Emery's Annual Letter to the

diocesan branches. This was ordered distributed through the parish branches.

Mrs. John Shortridge paid a loving tribute to Mrs. J. K. Gale, who entered into rest in February last and who was sometime President of this Auxiliary. A page in the Year Book was ordered devoted to her memory.

Mrs. Shortridge announced that Bishop Gailor had appointed Mrs. Wm. E. Barnes of the Cathedral, Memphis, as Secretary of the Junior Auxiliary for the year 1916-1917, Miss Bassett having undertaken the work for one year only.

The election of five delegates to the Triennial Meeting was the next order of business. Nominations were received from the floor and the election proceeded by ballot. The following were declared elected: Mrs. W. J. Loaring Clark, Mrs. John Shortridge, Mrs. W. E. Barnes, Mrs. E. D. Richards, and Mrs. W. H. DuBose.

Miss Ava Wright opened a Conference on "Home Missions in Action." The value of the book as an educative factor, particularly on the spiritual side of the work of missionary workers, was emphasized.

The tellers, being ready, announced the election as alternates to the Triennial Meeting of Miss Laura Bassett, Mrs. Frank Gifford, Mrs. J. C. Morris, Mrs. Thos. F. Gailor, and Mrs. Haskell Rightor.

Mrs. Chas. H. Drane, of Clarksville, lead a Conference on "The Apportionment." This subject was dealt with very fully and provoked much discussion.

It was moved by Mrs. Frank Gifford, duly seconded and carried, "That the delegates of this Auxiliary pledge themselves to do all in their power to pay the apportionment for General Missions *in full* for the ensuing year.

Mrs. Richard McCargo led a Conference on "The One-Day's Income."

It was moved by Mrs. Tyler Calhoun, seconded and carried, "That the Auxiliary in Tennessee, in view of the fact that its apportionment is not yet paid in full, and that the Emergency Fund met the emergency for which it was created, does not endorse the One-Day's Income Fund."

Mrs. E. D. Richards led a Conference on the United Offering and an offering was taken from those present. Mrs. Richards will receive gifts until October 1st for presentation at the Triennial Meeting in October next.

Mrs. W. Haskell DuBose gave an earnest talk on "The Gift of Life."

It was moved by Mrs. Chas. H. Drane, seconded and carried, "That the women be asked to follow the plan adopted by many dioceses and to pray regularly for volunteers from Tennessee for missionary service."

It was moved by Mrs. Jaquess, seconded and carried, "That the Bishop be asked to compile a prayer for this object to be inserted in the Year Book."

Mrs. C. W. Starr spoke on "Provincial Organization," stressing its value in united effort.

Mrs. B. D. Bosworth led a Conference on section 'B,' or a Second Division of the Auxiliary, and informed the delegates of the plan adopted by St. John's, Knoxville, in the formation of its Second Circle.

Mrs. Chas. H. Drane spoke on points of interest adopted at the Provincial Meeting held at Sewanee last fall.

Miss Helen Wright announced that the next meeting of the Diocesan Convention and of the Auxiliary will be held at The Cathedral, Memphis.

Mrs. Haskell Rightor spoke of the Little Helpers and stressed the importance of this branch of the work.

The minutes were read and approved, and the meeting adjourned *sine die*.
