DECEMBER

Make effort to be present at all Christmas services and make a special offering. Study China and the American Indians.

JANUARY

Read letter of Greeting from Diocesan President. Order manual from Book store, 281 Fourth Ave., New York. Use appropriate prayers, as united thanks offering, Woman's Auxiliary etc.; for devotion, study manual. Make plans for raising apportionment. Read program for year's work and change to suit own parish. Subscribe to Spirit of Missions, for \$1.00.

FEBRUARY
