Minutes.

The 21st Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Virginia was held in All Saints' Parish House, Richmond, Va., November 1st and 2nd, 1911.

The Meeting was called to order, Wednesday, November 1st at 9:15 a.m. by Rev. Dr. Downman, Rector of All Saints' Church and after a hymn, creed and prayer, a beautiful address of welcome was given by the Rector in which he likened the Woman's Auxiliary as a strong army working for the Board of Missions with their support and prayers, to the faithful women of the South who gave the enthusiasm and stood behind the soldiers in the confederate war.

Mrs. Fitzhugh Mayo cordially welcomed the delegates in behalf of the Richmond Branches and Mrs. Wilbur Reid of Alexandria, responded.

After the roll call, which showed 87 Junior and Senior officers and delegates present, Miss Stuart made her annual address.

The minutes of the last day's meeting of 1910 were read and approved.

It was moved and seconded that the chair appoint a committee to draft resolutions.

Regrets from Bishop Rowe, Spalding, Finston and Mann, and Rev. Bueleson and Dr. St. George Tucker were read, also Bishop Lloyd's acceptance of the invitation to attend the meeting.

Rev. Dr. Clarke of St. James Church, of Richmond, very clearly explained the new method adopted by the Board of Missions, pertaining to the appointment and stated that the Diocese of Virginia had been apportioned \$15,130.00 by the Board to be raised by the Church, Sunday School and Woman's Auxiliary.

Noonday prayer was conducted by Dr. Clark, following which, Bishop Gibson extended his greetings and asked especially for funds for the work at the University of Virginia, also among the colored people of the Diocese and the Blue Ridge Mountain work.

A cordial invitation to lunch was given delegates and visiting friends.

Miss Chichester thanked the Auxiliary for their generous help in building the Chapel at Falmonth, Va.

The Meeting adjourned until 2:30 p.m.

The afternoon session was opened with a hymn.

An invitation to visit the Woman's Club of Richmond, was given and accepted.

Miss Neeley, of Japan addressed the meeting and gave a most interesting account of her work.

It was resolved that a telegram be sent to the "Woman's Synod of the Presbyterian Church" holding its annual meeting in Williamsburg, Va.

After singing the Pan Angelican hymn the meeting adjourned until Thursday morning at 9:45.

The second day's session of the Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary was opened by Bishop Lloyd and the Bishop made an address, dwelling particularly on the Apportionment and the 'United Offering' and likened the latter to a golden thread running through the canvass until it illuminated the whole picture. A rising vote of thanks was given for the interesting, instructive address.

It was moved and seconded that \$50.00 be given for Dr. Claude Lee's Life Insurance, as a special.

Delegate were requested to send all contributions from their branches for apportionment through the Diocesan Treasurer, Miss Stuart.

Mrs. Robert Barton, Sec. of the Juniors, presented to Miss Stuart a beautiful traveling clock, given by the Woman's Auxiliary and the Juniors, as a token of their appreciation of her interest and work for twenty-one years.

The subject of the Apportionment was then discussed and it was agreed that \$3,000.00 should be the minimum for the year, given by the Woman's and Junior Auxiliaries and Babies Branch.

Noonday prayer was offered by Rev. Dr. Moncure.

The Convocation Secretaries reports followed:—

Mrs. Borckenbrough, of the Rappahannock Convocation tendered her resignation.

Mrs. Randolph, Custodian of United Offering gave her report.

It was decided that the morning offertory of \$175.00 be apportioned as follows:—

\$50 to Miss Neeley's work in Japan.

\$50 to Virginia Mountainwork and the remainder for the "Rest House for weary Women Workers."

Miss Towles thanked the Auxiliary for their help in the Virginia Mountains during the year.

Adjourned for lunch.

Meeting called to order at 2:30 p.m.

Report of Babies Branch by Secretary, Mrs. E. S. W. Howard.

Resolution of sympathy for Mrs. Mondecai were approved.

Mrs. M. G. Wallace, Secretary Church Periodical Club, read her report and asked for copies of the Churchman to send.

Miss Barber gave an interesting talk on her home and work in China.

Miss Lucy Gibson, Custodian of the Emergency Fund read her report.

The President reported on Central Fund.

A letter was read requesting assistance in buying a lot to erect a Chapel at Bowling Green, Va.

The subject of an Educational Secretary was discussed and approved and the President authorized to appoint the same.

Mrs. Lloyd's resignation as Vice-President was accepted with regret and resolutions to that effect offered by Mrs. Lancaster.

All officers were re-elected with exception of Vice-President, which was postponed.

The work among the colored people was presented by Rev. Dr. Moncure, soliciting assistance.

Mrs. Howard read resolutions thanking all concerned for entertaining the delegates and contributing to the success of the Annual Meeting.

An invitation to meet in Winchester in 1912 was given by Mrs. W. D. Smith and accepted.

Hymn, "Blest be the Tie that Binds," was sung and the meeting closed with the benediction by Rev. John Moncure.

President's Address.

May 1911—May 1912

To Rt. Rev. R. A. Gibson, D. D., President, ex-officio.

The "coming of age" of the Virginia Branch—June 1911—put new zeal and courage into the parish branches, which joined its ranks, as the years passed on, till we begin to see the day, when all the parishes and missions will be in line, numbering on their roll every woman, every young girl, every baby, within the bounds of their parish, not alone for the material gain such a force would give, but for the personal, reflex benefit in the parish, or mission.

Yet, we do not sound a discouraging note in the face of so much accomplished this past year. The Virginia Branch is a vine of God's own planting, and become a vigorous power in the Diocese and in the domestic and foreign fields, as with new life pulsing through its arteries, it extends its work, bringing in new members, organizing new junior branches, gathering a fresh supply of babies, stimulating interest in the Church Periodical Club, the Emergency Fund, the boxes for missions and missionaries, planning study classes (a new venture), while over and above all, keeping true with increasing effort, to the united offering, which supports "women workers in mission fields," many of whom are our Virginia women.

Thus having felt the tonic of "doing well," the Virginia Branch marked the starting point of the new year with a bold step, "forgetting the things behind," save, "to cherish their past for the sake of their future," for they voluntarily assumed \$3,000.00 as their share of Virginia's apportionment to the Board of Missions, "the juniors and babies, uniting generously in this pledge. Well done, good and faithful members! Your reward here is not in praise, but in the consciousness of loyal duty to your diocese, to the General Board, and to the work of your Lord left in your charge, for so you find "joy in service" as you enter into the larger life of missionary interests. From the heads of the different departments you will hear, today, of the work accomplished during the past year—so it is for me, simply, but earnestly to make a few suggestions, for the year to come. First, Calling attention to Leaflets Nos. 23 and 14, sent to each parish secretary, next, Who are we? What is our aim? How shall we accomplish it?

We, the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese of Virginia, are a body of women, over two thousand strong, with an earnest active band of Juniors, united with us, baptized in His Name, "children of God, citizens of His Kingdom," pledged to fight under His banner, so believing, we want the world to share our joy.

What our aim? To pass on to others, what we know is their priceless heritage, awakening them to the consciousness, that the real and only object of man's life, it to "know God," and "believe on Jesus Christ whom He hath sent," How shall we accomplish? By faith in the reality in the thing we hope for, the bringing to our vision, the things not seen, when Christ shall reign over all the world—ours, such a little life—yet full of grand possibilities for God—if we will!

To the Bishop and to each parish rector, who has the honor of a branch of the Woman's Auxiliary, we extend most grateful thanks for courtesies and appreciation, as we ask for their renewed support.

Report Junior Auxiliary, 1911-1912.

The work of the Junior Branch in Virginia goes steadily on. Forty-three branches are now on the active list; three have joined the Woman's Auxiliary, and several have disbanded, due to a condition in our rural districts, which sometimes prevails, when the young people go off to boarding school.

The interest of the branches has been greatly stimulated by Mission Study Classes: and the different fields to which money and boxes have gone are evidence of their more varied knowledge and sympathy.

We feel that there are many advantages in our printed reports. A healthy rivalry can be developed among the branches by comparisons, and the work of the different years may be noted with benefit and profit. There will be interest in seeing just what has been done for individuals and fields, and whether any one point claims too much of our attention, not that our help is not always needed, but to the exclusion of other fields, which would have a broadening influence on our work.

There can be no thought of failure, when we take up these reports and see how loyally those who are enlisted have stood to their guns and have sent out re-inforcements in money and boxes wherever help was promised. We see every pledge again fulfilled, and each junior leader upholding and helping on those in authority, both at home and at the Mission Houses.

But oh! It makes one long more and more for an active branch in each parish of our dear old diocese. What are our young church people doing, if they are not helping on the mission work of the Church? Many of the guilds, so busily at work, only call for efforts at home, and the higher privilege and broader training of the Junior is left out. I feel appalled when I look over the field and realize that forty-three branches cover the Junior work.

We are very grateful to every officer in the branches. It is not known to all what difficulties they encounter and overcome. The Richmond branches have been true to their far away leader, and very very helpful to me, continually enlisting new members, and new branches.

We feel that the United Offering in the hands of our efficient custodian will develope into an offering worthy of the name.

And we hope that the meeting in Winchester, in the Church that dates back to Lord Fairfax, may give a wonderful vision of future service to the young people of our old State and carry out to the limit, if limit there can ever be, the traditions of those who laid its foundations.

Report of Babies' Branch.

It was only recognition of, and obedience to, a closer duty that made me leave home for my long journey to the Pacific coast, instead of attending the annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary last November. It was a keen disappointment not to be at home to help welcome the many friends and workers gathered there—to lose such a golden opportunity to try, face to face, to persuade other women to see this work as I see it and the privilege of having a part in teaching the babies of the Church to pray and work for Christ's Kingdom and His little ones.

With sorrow I report the death of a faithful secretary, Miss Larkin, of Manassas. To the interest of the senior secretary there, the Church owes it that another faithful woman was found, willing to do a little more work, and make greater self denial for the sake of The Master. Are there not among all these workers for The Christ, other women willing to follow her example and help the children? Our President tells me there are about ninety branches entitled to representation at this meeting, with fourteen in Richmond. There are amongst all these, only twenty-six Babies Branches, with six in Richmond. Does the Woman's Auxiliary call this faithful care of one of its richest asset? If one Church claims that given children for the first nine years, it has no fear for the future, the same rule must prove good in other Churches:—so again I appeal to every delegate here to look after the babies in her parish.

Many a parent has been led by the little child to the Light and come to realize not only the blessedness of helping but learned to reach out with service and prayer to the ends of the earth, to all men made in God's image, and with us, children of Our Father in Heaven. I feel it to be my duty to remind the secretaries that when they ask for boxes and literature—and they neither make use of them nor reply to notices sent, and often repeated, they are wasting not only the money of the Board of Missions treasury, which meets the cost of boxes and literature but also the money of the children, given through self-denial and trusting it to be rightly used, not thrown away on postage for those who do not value it. Remember, I, as diocesan secretary, have no choice but to send boxes and literature when and where requested, trusting that they will serve to teach the children to

love and spread the "old old story of Jesus and His love"—The money entrusted to me has been distributed as follows:

Report of the Church Periodical Club of Virginia.

This report of the C. P. C. is the record of eleven months' work. As reports were called in by the Central Office, N. Y. one month earlier than usual.

We now have twenty-five Branches and in all some work has been done showing an increase of activity and interest.

Statistics as follows:—

363 magazines and papers mailed regularly, 31 bundles of miscellaneous literature sent for distribution in our Diocese, West Virginia, North Carolina and Army posts in Texas and Kansas.

3,700 magazines and 276 books distributed by Librarians and their friends.

Total amount of money received by Librarians and correspondents, \$40.00 of which amount \$20.00 was sent to the Central Office, N. Y.

There are constant demands for magazines and Church papers especially the Southern Churchman and to meet them the Club needs the help of all Church people.

Convocation Secretary's Report.

The Secretary of the Valley Convocation begs leave to say that she has no new branches to report within the bounds of her Convocation. This is disappointing but no extra-ordinary effort has been made to arouse interest in those parishes having no branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. A personal visit from your Secretary might have aroused some interest, but such visits were not deemed practical, so the Annual Meeting was arranged with the Convocation as has already been reported. The Valley Convocation at the suggestion of your Secretary invited all of the parishes within its bounds to send a delegate appointed by their Rector, whether they had a Branch of the Auxiliary or not, generously adding to such invitation that they would defray the expenses of such delegate attending the Convention. Thus it was hoped that each parish would have a representation at this meeting and that their interest would be sufficiently aroused to bring about the desired result. But though invited, none of this class came. They made excuses and did not come. But all of the parishes having branches responded and the second annual meeting which was held in Christ Church, Winchester, was a marked success.

Only five parishes were represented at Harrisonburg and in Winchester there were eight present besides a number who came at their own charges and gladdened us by their presence. The after effect was gratifying as word has reached us from more than one Rector that the returning delegates went back to their work with renewed zeal and energy. The second annual meeting heard with pleasure of the work being done at home, each delegate giving an informal report of work being done by their respective Branches and all most encouraging.

Mrs. Gibson, Educational Secretary in the Diocese of Virginia, gave an instructive talk on her special line of work. Miss Barber told most charmingly of her interesting work in China, thus calling the delegates to a clearer and fuller realization of the great need of their organization, even a better knowledge of the work being done and the pressing needs of the Foreign field. A delicious lunch was served by the ladies of Christ Church.

Report of Associate Educational Secretaries

In presenting my report as Educational Secretary in that section of the Dioceses appointed me by the Bishop, I would state that I, have visited twenty-two places in pursuance of my duties.

Wherever the work has called me, there has been a cordial reception, and a kindly and hospitable welcome on the part of the clergy and the people.

"Post cards, letters, and literature, have been sent to all Branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in my part of the Diocese, supplying needed information for enkindling interest in Missions, and to inform the Branches as to practical methods of work.

...In each of the twenty-two Parishes visited, I held an Organization Meeting of a Mission Study Class, giving a talk on general mission work, and specializing the chief points of interest in "The Conquest of the Continent," closing each meeting with an outline plan of work for the regular conduct of a Mission Study Class.

As far as the facts can be gathered, the results have been satisfactory. Over twenty classes have reported as studying "The Conquest of the Continent," reading about Missions with regularity and preparing papers on Missionary subjects.

In some Branches I have not met with the results expected. In some instances there is marked indifference as to methods suggested by Missionary leaders, and unwillingness to take time and labor for study. Only by study will a marked advance in missionary interest be realized, and liberality secured.

During the summer I have attended schools in the North organized for advancing the Missionary movement in the Sunday Schools, and for furthering the Missionary programme. At Lake George I gave ten days to the endeavor to fit myself for better service in the missionary cause.

The distinctive duty of the Educational Secretaries is to arouse a deep and vital interest amongst all the women of the Church, in this great and stupendous task.

The Mission Study Class, by its more educational methods, has special advantages for the accomplishment of this purpose. It aims to train a corps of enthusiastic individuals who will come into personal contact with the constituency which we wish to reach. By its regular and frequent meetings, its concentration upon a definite subject for a period of five or six weeks, the informal discussions, and the social atmosphere, it can exert a greater influence, on a wider circle in less time than any other force. Its purpose is not to supplant other agencies but to supplement them, on their weakest side.

An aggressive campaign was begun in the diocese last fall which has yielded some rich results.

We realized in the beginning that many of the Auxiliaries would not be able to conduct a regular study class on account of the scattered population and, bad roads. But we tried to keep them informed of our plans, feeling that they would like to keep in touch with us, even though they could not be one of us.

Some who were not able to join a class bought the text-book and studied at home.

In some instances the Study Class was the means of increasing the membership and creating new energy in the Auxiliary.

A large Normal Class was held in Richmond during the Lenten season. Study Classes were organized in all the churches but one, and a great deal of interest was manifested. One leader was instrumental in having some good missionary literature put in one of the libraries.

A class was formed in Ashland, led by the Rector, also one in Tappahannock.

The classes were few but the results were practical and permanent. We trust that there will be a deeper and more wide spread interest in Mission Study throughout the diocese in the coming years.
