MINUTES

THE Twenty-second Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Mission of the Diocese of Virginia, was held in Christ Church, Winchester, November 7th, and 8th, 1912.

Rev. W. D. Smith, Rector of Christ Church, welcomed the delegates, and Mrs. McGuire, welcomed them in behalf of the Woman's Auxiliary. Mrs. Culp of Richmond, responded.

Following the roll call, which showed fifty-six Senior and Junior delegates present, Mrs. Culp was appointed Secretary pro tempore, with Miss Page, assistant.

Bishop Gibson, greeted and encouraged the delegates.

The nomination of delegates to the Triennial Convention was made and Miss Stuart, Mrs. M. G. Wallace Mrs. Angus Crawford and Miss Louisa Davis, elected.

Miss Stuart announced that the apportionment had been met in full.

The Woman's Auxiliary not reaching their pledge, but the Juniors and Babies Branches exceeded theirs.

Committees on Resolutions of Sorrow were appointed by the chair, on the death of Mrs. Fannie Boykin, Dr. Moncure and Miss Louisa Smart.

Rev. Mr. Smith explained that the apportionment is used to defray all the running expenses of the Church undertaken by the Board of Missions.

Noonday prayer was conducted by Dr. Bratenahl.

Bishop Gibson spoke in regard to the apportionment and was not favorable to the Auxiliary pledging itself to give an amount that would be a burden.

Rev. Meem, presented the Woman's work in Brazil and told of the liberality of the Church in that country, the Woman's Auxiliary having given a thousand dollars in gold the past year.

Dr. Bratenahl, Third Department Secretary, made an inspiring address.

A rising vote of thanks was tendered the speakers and the meeting adjourned for lunch.

The afternoon session was devoted to the Juniors with Rev. Mr. Smith presiding.

An address of welcome was given by Miss Williams.

Miss Purcell spoke interestingly of the boys' work in St. Paul's Church, Richmond.

Miss Brock of Philadelphia, talked of Junior work and recommended Mission Study Classes.

Rev. Mr. Smith, explained the nature and interest of the Church Missions House, and the Auxiliary's relation to it.

Rev. Burleson gave a clear idea of the vastness of the Church territory and its needs, and Miss Stuart spoke of the connecting link between the Woman's Auxiliary and the Juniors, closing with

the appeal for a much needed worker in China.

Rev. Mr. Ellis presented the work of the Blue Ridge.

Bishop Gibson addressed the Juniors and the meeting was adjourned.

Quiet Hour at 7:30 P. M., was conducted by Dr. Bratenahl.

The second day's session was opened by Rev. Mr. Smith.

Invitation to hold the meeting of 1913 in Trinity Church, Fredericksburg, was accepted.

The subject of continuing the pledges for apportionment was discussed.

Alternates for Triennial delegates were elected as follows:—

Miss Lucy Gibson, Mrs. Ellis, Mrs. Smith, and Miss Crenshaw.

Mrs. Robert Barton, delegate and Miss Lancaster, alternate, were elected to represent the Juniors.

The election of a Vice-President was in order and Miss Louisa Davis of Leesburg, was unanimously chosen.

The amount of the morning offertory was given, Woman's Auxiliary, \$229.95; Juniors, \$16.35; Total \$246.30; exceeding all previous offerings.

Reports were given by Mrs. Ellis, of the Valley Convocation, Mrs. Barton for the Juniors, Mrs. Howard for the Babies Branch, Miss Gibson, Emergency Fund., and Mrs. Wallace, Church Periodical Club.

Rev. Burleson, again addressed the meeting, after which it was adjourned with benediction.

The afternoon session opened with a hymn.

Resolutions on death of Mrs. Fannie Boykin, Miss Smart, Rev. Dr. Micou and Dr. Moncure, were read.

Reports from Secretaries for Piedmont and Richmond Convocations, were read, also report of Associate Educational Secretaries, Deaconess Gibson and Mrs. Osgood.

Miss Stuart explained why the office of Educational Secretary should be abolished and appointed one woman in each convocation to take charge of the work as follows.

Miss Mildred Page, Albemarle Convocation.

Mrs. T. T. Slaughter, Piedmont Convocation.

Miss Ethel Spilman, Valley Convocation.

Mrs. Osgood, Richmond Convocation.

No appointment was made for Rappahannock Convocation.

Report of Custodian of United Offering from November, 1911, to November 1912.

Bishop Rowe's request was presented that the Auxiliary Branches try to interest their Congressmen and Senators in a Bill he is having introduced in Congress in behalf of the Indians in Alaska, and a committee was appointed to draft a resolution.

Resolutions of thanks were extended to all concerned for entertaining the delegates and contributing to the success of the meeting.

Miss Stuart stated, in addition to the amount raised for pledges, she had \$360.00 in gifts to be used as needed.

Adjournment.

At 8 P. M., a Missionary Rally was held and remarks made by Rev. Mr. Smith and Rev. Mr. Burleson, at the conclusion of which Miss Stuart detained the delegates for a few items of unfinished business.

It was moved and seconded that the President and Vice-President, assess each Branch of the Auxiliary according to their standing, for both the Board and Diocese and in a circular letter make known to each Branch their indebtedness.

The President, was authorized, with the help and advice of Mr. Burleson, member of the Board to disburse the funds, not specialized, where most needed.

The Meeting was formally closed with benediction by Rev. Mr. Smith.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

MAY 1912 MAY 1913.

To Rt. Rev. R. A. Gibson, D.D., President ex officio.

THE close of the twenty-third year of the "Virginia Branch" brings to us an encouraging note as to faithful endeavor along all the missionary lines for which it stands pledged, whether that be to live up to the responsibilities resting upon it as an "Auxiliary to the Board of Missions," in its foreign and domestic work, or to the "United Offering," which holds such an immense power as a factor for woman's share in the work, at home and abroad, or to its own dear, diocesan obligations, which must and should be paramount, and which would have been more largely contributed to had the plan for a diocesan apportionment met with the approval of our honored Bishop, for women love to work up to a high standard, and in view of the needs and the fact that the Bishop had withdrawn all help from the board for both mountain and colored work, the President feels it a duty to give this "foreword" by way of explanation as to any seeming falling off in gifts, and to present a wider survey of the field than can be given in the detailed reports of our devoted diocesan and parish officers.

We hope it may prove a better way to let the branches give

their apportionment to the Board of Missions through the Parish Treasurer, to be credited to the branch in his report to Mr. King, Treasurer for Board. This plan is tentative.

The "specials" assumed at the annual meeting have been paid, as pledged, the delegates stirred thereto by the earnest appeals made by Rev. Mr. Meem, Brazil, for Miss Packard, and funds for a small church at Santos, where the Braziliams are pleading for the church's care. He secured the pledge for an "organ" from one earnest auxiliary woman, and other amounts to be paid on demand.

The Rev. Mr. Burleson (more than "half" a domestic missionary) roused great interest as he told the story of the needs of Northern Texas and the "Gospel Tent" as a missionary success for "Migratory Villages," or as he pleaded for Eastern Oklahoma and Arizona for "Tuberculosis Hospitals" for both the white man and the Indian.

Dr. Bratenahl, Secretary, 3rd Department, told of what he knew of diocesan need, both in Virginia and other districts.

Rev. Mr. Ellis asked and received help for extending his work, as did Mr. Semmes for "Homeless Boys."

In some ways this last annual meeting will be far-reaching in results as to the future of the work. A Vice-President was added to the staff of diocesan officers. The appointment of an Educational Secretary in each of the five (5) convocations, which can bring the leader into closer touch with the several study classes, seems to work fairly well, and will prove more and more a success as the plan is fully worked out. Four delegates were elected to represent the Virginia Branch at the Triennial, with alternates, also one delegate and alternate from the Junior Department, who this year will have a voice in all legislation of the Woman's Auxiliary. Thus are we learning the value of co-operation, that only in working together, each and all in the several departments, can we hope to make the Virginia Branch the strong support it should be to our Church Mission Boards, "Diocesan" as well as "General."

Each diocesan and parish officer in her special department deserves high praise for good and faithful work. Let our aims be high, knowing "Whom we serve," and that His promise stands sure for each worker—"I am with you always," to help and bless.

We again thank our Bishop and each one of our clergy, whose continued support and interest has made our year's work a great pleasure. We renew the pledge of the support of the Virginia Branch, working with more intelligent zeal the coming year.

Report of Junior Auxiliary, 1912-1913.

THE Virginia Juniors are still gaining on their own efforts. The total in boxes and gifts for the year, May 1912 to 1913, amounted to \$2,620.27, the highest yet, attained, and that means, besides contributing to many other appeals, more and better boxes; contributions to both Diocesan and the General apportionment, and a deeper interest, by most of the branches, in the United Offering. We hope, under our custodian, Miss Purcell's, efficient management, that not one branch will fail to respond next year.

The Mystery Plays, given by many of the Juniors, have been educational to old and young, to those participating and to those looking on.

The "World in Baltimore," where on Episcopal day, I met many of my Juniors, has deepened the interest and awakened a desire to learn about people and countries so as to help those less fortunate, and this desire has lead to the formation of many Study Classes. China, the subject chosen for the study classes this winter, we hope will prove as delightful as Japan; it cannot fail to fill us with an earnest desire to help those teeming millions, though none may be as attractive to us as "The Honorable Little Miss Love." Altogether the prospect this year seems brighter than ever before: We are forty-four branches, eager to work, and with every help to do it given by the Church's Mission House, so that no Junior need feel inefficient.

The Auxiliary of the Valley, meeting together with the Convocation in the spring and fall, are bringing the Juniors in closer touch with the Women, and if other convocations could follow Mrs. Ellis; the Valley Secretary's lead, a closer link would be forged between the women and the Juniors, many of whom could never otherwise be present at a meeting, and bring about a more natural step into the Womans Auxiliary, for those older girls, who mean so much to church work, and yet whose relation to it is difficult to put under one head or the other.

It is rarely the Juniors have had a loss so vital and personal as that in the death of Mrs. Barber, the president of the Junior branch of Holy Trinity, Fredericksburg. Her loving influence will never be forgotten and we each individually feel deeply her loss. May our efforts hereafter attain in some measure, to her high and beautiful ideal of what each Junior's life might be.

Thanking my dear superior officer, Miss Stuart, all my officers and all my Juniors, for all they mean to me in my work among them.

The work of the Church Periodical Club in Virginia during the past year has shown an encouraging increase in usefulness.

Three New Librarians have been added, making 26 in all; through their efforts:

Three Hundred and Forty-seven Magazines and papers are mailed regularly.

Thirty-three barrels of literature sent to the Country for distribution.

Thirty-five Bibles and Four Hundred books of all kinds given away.

Eight Hundred and Seventy-nine Picture Cards and games.

Thirty-nine Dollars and Eighty-two cents expended by Librarians and correspondents.

Twenty Dollars sent to the Central Office.
