## MINUTES

THE 23rd Annual Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Virginia was held in Trinity Church Fredericksburg, Va. and was called to order at 9:30 November 5th, 1913, by the President, Miss Sallie Stuart and Rev. Dr. Barber heartily welcomed the delegates. Miss Shepherd, welcomed them in the name of the Auxiliaries, and Mrs. W. J. Morton of Alexandria responded.

The roll was called by Mrs. E. S. W. Howard, showing 64 delegates and 30 Juniors present.

Miss Mary Moncure, elected assistant Secretary.

A prayer was offered by Rev. Dr. Barber, for Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Richards, the faithful Secretary of the Trinity Branch and her husband, both of whom were ill.

The minutes of the last days meeting at Winchester in 1912, were read by Mrs. W. J. Morton.

Bishop Gibson, addressed the delegates and explained the Woman's Work in the Diocese. A resolution of thanks to the Bishop was given and a pledge to help in the work.

Bishop St. Geo. Tucker of Japan made an interesting address. A resolution of thanks was given the Bishop and a pledge was made of \$169.00 for a Church building at Osago, Japan and a motion made and carried that an additional pledge be made.

Noonday prayer was conducted by Rev. J. J. Lanier, after which Rev. Mr. Watson of Mexico, was introduced by Bishop Gibson and made an address upon his work in that country.

Bishop Rowe, then spoke of his work in Alaska.

Committees were appointed by the President, as follows:

For resolutions of sympathy to the Rector—Rev. H. H. Barber, of Trinity Church for the great sorrow and loss of Mrs. Barber, Chairman, Mrs. Barton, Miss Lucy Gibson, Miss Sallie Braxton, Miss Nancy Tackett.

For resolutions expressing regret and sorrow for the illness of Mrs. W. H. Richards, and Mr. Richards. Chairman, Mrs. Howard, Mrs. Slaughter, Mrs. Wallace, and Mrs. Crawford.

Also for the loss of the United Offering of Monumental Branch, Chairman, Mrs. B. M. Randolph, Miss Norwood, Miss Lancaster, Miss Sallie Coles.

The meeting adjourned for lunch.

The afternoon session was devoted to pledges for Bishop Rowe and Mr. Watson's Work, which resulted in \$75.75, for the former and \$99.75 for the latter.

The Junior meeting was called to order by Rev. Mr. Barber.

Quiet Hour at 7:30 P.M., was conducted by Bishop St. Geo. Tucker of Japan.

The Second days session was opened at 10 A.M.

The President gave her report and made an address.

The report of the Custodian of the United Offering was given which showed the amount for the three years to be \$4863.98.

Report of Committees of Resolutions. The Vice-President, Miss Davis, of Leesburg, gave most interesting echoes of the Triennial as did also Mrs. Angus Crawford, of the Theo. Seminary.

Addresses were made by Rev. Mr. Watson and Bishop Rowe.

Miss Packard, spoke of the work in Brazil and a rising vote of thanks was given.

Noonday prayer, was conducted by Bishop Rowe.

Mrs. Funsten, wife of the Bishop of Idaho, thanked the Auxiliary for the Virginia room in the Hospital and stated that many things therein needed replenishing.

Meeting adjourned for Lunch.

Business session resumed at 2:15 P.M., Appeals were made for Dr. Teusler's Hospital, Japan; St. Mary's School, China; and for Diocesan Missions.

Mrs. E. E. Osgood made an address upon the subject of Mission Study Classes. Suggesting a Secretary in every branch and the Convocation Secretaries to act as Educational Secretaries and to be the leaders.

The offertory of the morning was announced as, \$304.74.

Letters were read from Bishop Atwood, Arizona, Bishop Huntington, China, and others.

Miss Katherine Stuart of Alexandria was elected custodian of United Offering for the coming year. Mrs. B. M. Randolph having resigned. A vote of thanks was given Mrs. Randolph for her long and faithful services as custodian of the United Offering.

Dr. Bratenahl, then addressed the meeting, and a vote of thanks was given him.

An appeal was made for the work of the Church Periodical Club, and collection taken, \$15.00

A motion to continue Miss Wheat's salary as a part of the Auxiliary work was carried, and also to pledge at least \$200 additional for Woman's Work in Virginia.

Miss Davis', invitation to meet in St. James' Church Leesburg, in 1914 was accepted with thanks.

Officers re-elected.

Resolution of thanks to all concerned for entertaining the delegates and contributing to the success of the meeting.

The meeting closed with benediction by Rev. Mr. Barber.

At 8 P.M., a Missionary Rally was held.

To Rt. Rev., R. A. Gibson, D. D., Pres., ex officio.




THE twenty-fourth annual report of the 'Virginia Branch' must be brief and bare of statistics which have marked each year of advance in all lines of work—for which the women stand pledged—but there is much to encourage—as we find the faithful, efficient diocesan and parish officers, have carried on the work, with a zeal and devotion—most satisfactory and praiseworthy—as their reports show—the practically without their leader—who has been providentially laid aside the past year, from active oversight. The enthusiastic annual meeting, in Fredericksburg, marked an epoch in the history of the Branch, by a large attendance of delegates and visitors, who were so deeply thrilled by the appeals of each speaker, as our own honored Bishops, who asked the Branches to take, as special work, "Woman's Work for Women, in the Diocese," which was gladly pledged. A vote of thanks was given the Bishop for his gracious words, and the congenial work suggested. Then came, Bishop Tucker, Kyoto, Japan, who also conducted the "Quiet Hour," He first pleaded for "St. Luke's Hospital, Tokio," then modestly for a Parish Hall at Osaka, in his own jurisdiction. Rev. Mr. Watson asked for a pulpit for his empty church, in Mexico, with an earnestness that secured the amount needed, and he left in three days, for his mission, carrying his pulpit in his pocket, in the form of a check. Then the enthusiasm reached the high water mark, when Bishop Rowe, arrived, Virginia's ever welcomed friend, who appealed for a gift to add a Hall for general use, to the Church at Awik, Dr. Bratenahl, sec. 3rd., Dept., spoke of the need of diocesan mission everywhere, and all hearts were moved to do their best, so that in cash and pledges, the total amount reached the goodly sum of about \$1,000.00. This has been paid and acknowledged. The Branches gave \$50.00, for St. Mary's School at Shanghai. Well done, faithful women of Virginia, your gifts have carried cheer over our own continent, from Alaska to Mexico, and across the country, and over the seas. So you have circled the world in answer to "God's Call," from the east to the west, at home, and the call of Heathern Lands, afar, to win the Kingdom for the Christ. The best thing the Branch ever did was to give themselves their splendid Vice President, who has ably filled the office. Mrs. Osgood. "The Educational Sec.," with her zealous methods, has created a new interest and zeal for organizing sturdy classes all over the diocese. Indeed time and space fail to tell of each one; the reports as printed,

will show what Mrs. Barton and the Juniors have done. The Baby Branch under Mrs. Howard, The Emergency Fund, the United Offering, the C. P. C., and all the rest of the departments have been active. I refer to their reports, for General Facts. We cannot close without a cordial expression of gratitude that we have been granted our choice in the election of the "Bishop Co-Adjutant," who will relieve Bishop Gibson of a part of his care of the diocese, who also will be a great support in the Auxiliary work. We thank the Bishop for his every-ready help and encouragement. We thank each Rector, whose interest in the Parish Branch, has made it a success. We ask for continued endorsement while in different work we are united as one, in a great cause.

**T**HE Junior Branch had hoped to send \$3,000.00 in gifts to the Mission Field this year. I am quite sure they did, though I have'nt the figures to show it, for seven good, strong branches failed to report and the figures I am presenting you show only a slight increase over last year's. If this failure came from lack of interest, I should more than regret it, I should feel discouraged, but never before has intelligent interest and energetic work gone so hand in hand., We must keep this in mind, as we re-organize for the winter. But what we especially want to do now is to so organize that all the young people of our churches, work in some personal, vital way for missions, in a way by which there will be brought home to each one, the realization of her own undeveloped power to help and therefore, of her responsibility, Let each leader strive for the awakening of each individual to a real understanding of what a Junior's work is and of a desire to see that each year means progress and development. I am sorry when a whole year's work seems only a bit beyond that of the year before. Sorry because there is now more than ever before, so much need of our efforts. and if the vision is caught in youth, young strength and enthusiasm and influence counts for so much more, and sorrier, still because, in those latent unprofitable years, those who are not moving on, are blocking the way, or going back.

As we send our older girls into the Woman's Auxiliary, we must see to it that the younger ones fill up the ranks. Our aim

must be kept as high, as high in every way; in the numbers in our branches, in the gifts, we make, in personal service, and in the dedication of our talents, humble though they be, to their utmost capacity—in conquering sin and helping suffering, and in opening out bright hopeful futures, to those who are in the shadow and darkness of heathen lands.

N CONSEQUENCE of the pressure of high prices, sickness, in the homes of the parish secretaries and amongst the children, as well as loss in the branches because of the age limit, the offerings this past year have been much smaller than usual, besides only 14 branches have reported so far. I fear too that the continued ill health of your diocesan secretary has not tended to forward the work. But truly, this year again has the work been blessed, for what the little children have not been able to do, has been made up by substantial gifts to this department from a friend who loves little children, and has seemed more than glad to divide with them, what God has entrusted to her. These gifts have enabled the Little Helpers treasury to make good the pledge made in its name at the General Convention and to send gifts outside the debt of the Apportionment for the necessary expenses of the work in the field.
