MINUTES.

The 25th annual meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Virginia, was held in Christ Church, Alexandria, Va., November 3, 1915.

After a short service and an address of welcome by Rev. W. J. Morton, rector, Mrs. Albert Bryan, President of Christ Church Branch, welcomed the delegates in the name of the three Auxiliaries, and Mrs. Sterling Murray, of Leesburg, responded.

The business meeting was called to order by Miss Louisa T. Davis, Vice-President.

The roll was called by the Assistant Secretary showing 50 delegates present. Mrs. Barton called the roll for the Juniors, 22 present, and Section B was represented by 7 delegates.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. On motion, the appointment of committees by the chair was then made and carried.

Nominating Committee—Mrs. E. S. W. Howard, Mrs. T. T. Slaughter, Miss Rebecca Norwood.

Committee on Resolutions—Mrs. M. G. Wallace, Mrs. Morton and Miss Powers, with the request that they report at 4 P. M. Thursday.

Mrs. Howard moved that the Committee on Resolutions wire Bishop Gibson at once tendering sympathy and congratulations.

The report of the Assistant Treasurer was received and, at her request, a committee was appointed to audit the same. The committee appointed consisted of Mrs. E. S. W. Howard and Mrs. Meade Clarke.

Mrs. E. S. W. Howard, Secretary of Little Helpers, submitted her report, which was approved.

The report of the Church Periodical Club was read by the Secretary, Mrs. Mary G. Wallace, and approved.

Archdeacon Stuck, of Alaska, paid a tribute to the C. P. C. and spoke of the good done by periodicals and the help brought by them in the long winters in Alaska.

Miss Stuart's appeals were as follows: Pews for Dr. Moncure's Memorial Colored Church, to be built in Stafford county; Rev. Mr. Mason's automobile; Dr. Teusler's Hospital, Japan. The pews in the church above mentioned to cost \$124.80. Mrs. E. S. W. Howard offered to give a Font for said church for her grand-daughters, and Mrs. William Hammond the communion service.

Miss Crenshaw then read a letter stating that the automobile for Rev. Mr. Mason would cost \$520.00, of which \$264.00 had been given, leaving a balance due of \$256.00.

The reports of the Assistant Educational Secretaries, Mrs. Rutter Miss Powers and Mrs. Chichester, were read and approved.

Reports were closed to hear a short address by Bishop Brown.

The chair gave instructions as to time of election of Parish Officers, and stated they should take place at the April or May meeting, in order that the Year Book would have a correct list of officers.

Noonday prayer was conducted by Bishop Brown.

Discussion on the Central Fund—Mrs. Barton referred to the deficit in the account and asked that all the branches make contributions to this fund. Mrs. Mordecai called attention to the fact that at the meeting last year all delegates were requested to bring this to the attention of their branches. Miss Davis asked that the delegates explain to their branches the necessity for contributions to this fund.

An Educational Question Box was conducted by Mrs. E. E. Osgood, the Educational Secretary of the Diocese, and answers to a number of questions were given, particularly in regard to conducting Mission Study Classes.

The meeting then adjourned for lunch.

The afternoon session was called to order at 2:30, when there was a conference on auxiliary boxes, and where to send them. Mrs. H. W. Mordecai resigned from the Box Committee, and the President, Miss Stuart, announced she would make an appointment the following day for an assistant to Mrs. Wallace.

A discussion on summer conferences was held, there being six present, who had attended. Miss Davis spoke about Silver Bay, Blue Ridge and Cambridge, also Mt. St. Albans, which latter was not strictly a missionary conference, but all gave inspiration.

Miss K. H. Stuart, Custodian of United Offering, reported 50 branches having responded.

The Junior meeting was then called to order by Rev. W. J. Morton. Quiet Hour, at 8 P. M., was conducted by Rev. R. H. McKim.

Thursday, November 4, 1915, meeting opened at 9:45 A. M., with prayer by Rev. Mr. Brydon.

Minutes of Wednesday read and approved.

Moved and seconded, that amount to credit of Pocosom Water Pipe Fund be transferred to Central Fund. Motion carried.

Remarks by Rev. Mr. Brydon, in reference to the Woman's Auxiliary having a page in the "Diocesan Work," also colored work, asking for personal help from the Auxiliary to start the work in each locality. Bibles, prayer-books and Sunday School literature to be furnished on application.

Miss Stuart reported letter from Spirit of Missions asking for local canvass for Virginia Branch. Mrs. W. S. Hammond, of Berryville, was asked to serve.

Miss Stuart appointed Mrs. Wm. G. Stanard to take Mrs. Mordecai's place on Box Committee with Mrs. M. G. Wallace.

Miss Stuart resigned as Treasurer.

Archdeacon Stuck made an appeal for a hospital in Alaska, and requested that the pledges be made annual to give regular support for the work. A gift of \$100.00 was offered by Section B to the hospital in Alaska, as a "Memorial to Miss Louisa Smart."

Miss Lucy Gibson delivered a personal message from Bishop Gibson bringing congratulations and good wishes on the occasion of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and also the eighteenth anniversary of his consecration and a tribute to the President of the Branch.

Address by Miss Stuart, response by Bishop Brown, and a "package

of pure gold" presented by him, on behalf of the Auxiliary, as a personal gift.

Noonday prayer conducted by Rev. Mr. Morton.

Notices given, followed by an address by Mrs. Letcher, President of the Woman's Auxiliary of Southern Virginia.

Bishop Brown introduced Bishop Kinsolving, of Southern Brazil, who made an appeal for a school for boys at Porto Allegre, and paid a tribute to Miss Stuart.

Miss Davis read a tribute to Miss Stuart and her work, and asked for prayers for Trinity Church, Fredericksburg, which had been damaged by storms, etc.

Recess for lunch.

Bishop Brown introduced Miss Grey, Division of Washington, Correspondent of C. P. C., who urged librarians for every parish, and requested the city branches to collect books to send to country parishes and a library started at each church. Also each librarian should secure one Bible and one prayer book to be sent to the State correspondent.

A motion by Miss Powers, that Mrs. Barton and Mrs. Woodward be empowered to appoint, respectively, a representative, should they and their elected alternates find themselves unable to serve, was carried.

Resolutions of thanks to all concerned in entertaining the Auxiliary were passed, and Miss Stuart requested that a special vote of thanks be sent Mrs. Morton for her work in locating and meeting delegates, &c.

Mrs. Clarke extended an invitation for the next meeting at St. James' Church, Richmond.

On motion, the meeting adjourned.

A Missionary Rally was held in the evening with addresses by Archdeacon Stuck, of Alaska; Dr. Tensler, of Japan, and Bishop Kinsolving, of Brazil.

REPORT OF PRESIDENT MISS SALLIE STUART FOR YEAR
ENDING MAY 1, 1916.

REPORT OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

To the Right Reverend Robert A. Gibson, D. D., President ex-officio:

In reporting the condition of the Virginia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary at the close of its twenty-sixth year, we have much that is encouraging to tell.

Our pledges have been paid. Each year we give \$100.00 towards the salary of Miss Barber in China, and the same amount towards that of Miss Mann in Japan. We are also responsible for the life insurance of Dr. Claude Lee, in China; for several hundred dollars towards the salaries of Women Workers in Virginia, and for the Emergency Fund, which we place in Bishop Gibson's hands to be used at his discretion. Our branches contribute towards their parish apportionment for General and Diocesan Missions and lay aside each year gifts that go to swell the great Triennial United Offering.

At our annual meeting in Alexandria last November appeals were made by Bishop Brown for Portuguese literature for Brazil, by Bishop Kinsolving for a Boy's School in Brazil, by Archdeacon Stuck for help for an Alaskan hospital, and by Dr. Teusler for St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo. The amounts pledged to these objects by the delegates present have been forwarded to their destinations, as well as special contributions to the Moncure Memorial Chapel and the Mountain Workers' automobile.

Since our last report we have joined our sister branches in the neighboring Dioceses in the formation of a Provincial Auxiliary; and already we are gaining through it new working ideas, new zeal, and new courage.

Our staff of workers has been strengthened by the election of Mrs. Geo. S. French as treasurer, Mrs. John M. Johnson as assistant secretary, and Mrs. W. M. S. Hammond as "Spirit of Missions" secretary, and by the appointment of Mrs. C. W. Culp and Mrs. D. G. Trevillian as director of box work in the Virginia Branch, and of Miss Kate Powers as "Our Diocesan Work" correspondent.

To mark our twenty-fifth anniversary as a Diocesan Branch, we have set aside our invested funds, amounting to \$2,700.00, as a Silver Anniversary Rest Fund, and have arranged to use the interest therefrom in paying the board of a succession of tired missionary workers at the country home of the Summer Rest Association of Henrico Parish.

Through the kindness of the editor of "Our Diocesan Work," our Diocesan officers have been able to keep in touch with all the Branches through the Woman's Auxiliary page in that paper. This has meant much to us in the past year, and will mean more as the members of the Woman's Auxiliary learn to rely on "Our Diocesan Work" for their Auxiliary notices.

After a careful investigation of the two years' work of Section B, we are able to say that this new department of the Woman's Auxiliary has in Virginia the cordial approval both of the Woman's Auxiliary and of the Juniors, enlisting, as it does, in the missionary work of the Church young women who are too old to be Juniors, and whom the older organization has not been able to persuade to join it. There are now ten Branches of Section B in the Diocese; and we believe that they are saving for the Church's work many valuable women, who, without it, would give their best energies to civics and clubs, which, however good, should not be first.

It is our great privilege to report that four young women from our Junior Auxiliary are volunteering to go to the mission field. The Secretary of the Juniors and her parish leaders are presenting to the young women and girls of the Diocese the urgent need for more women to go as missionaries, and are teaching them the blessedness of offering their lives to the service of the King.

The Secretary of the Little Helpers is most anxious to establish her department of the Auxiliary in every parish and mission station within our boundaries. At present we have this missionary work for little children in only twenty-two places. Some of the weaker parishes hesitate to undertake work which they feel may be beyond them; but surely there is no parish in which there cannot be found one baby and one woman who will teach it to pray: "God bless all the missionaries all over the world, and all the Little Helpers, for Jesus Christ's sake."

Under our Educational Secretary and her assistants the number of Study Classes has largely increased, and we note that our Secretary is this year being called upon to teach the subject of Missions in four of the summer schools for Sunday School teachers.

The Church Periodical Club has thirty-four librarians in the Diocese, and is enlarging its usefulness each year. This is a good work in which everyone may share, for its opportunities range from the sending of a Christmas card to the gift of a traveling library.

We are planning an advance along all the lines indicated in this report, our object being to have an active Woman's Auxiliary in every parish.

At the present time the Woman's Auxiliary is established in eighty-eight congregations in the Diocese of Virginia. One-half of these congregations have a Junior Auxiliary, one-fifth of them a Band of Little Helpers, and one-tenth of them a Section B.

From this statement it will be seen that much remains to be done before our purpose is accomplished. We feel that just now the thing that is most needed is for all of the clergy to be familiar with the details of our work in each department, as we are dependent upon them for permission to begin it in a parish, and for advice, encouragement, and help in its prosecution. We earnestly beg, therefore, the continued assistance of our honored Bishop and Bishop-Coadjutor, and for the many Virginia clergymen who have made possible the things that have been done; and we also ask that those of the clergy who are not yet in close touch with our organization, will make a study of its aims and methods; so that, with the co-operation of their spiritual leaders, all the Church

women in the Diocese may be banded together in the work that is at once their common task and their highest privilege.

REPORT OF THE JUNIOR AUXILIARY 1915-1916.

The officers of the Junior Auxiliary are most enthusiastic over the year's work. When the older girls and the young married women, in many of the branches, were organized into Section B of the Woman's Auxiliary, under Mrs. Woodward, we were very fearful that the work done by the Juniors without their help, would in no way measure up to that of former years. To our intense gratification the report of money and boxes (only three branches failing to report) amounted to \$2,320.06.

Last year, our banner year, we raised \$3,040.00, but that meant our combined work, so that this first year of our separation, with \$2,320.06 to the credit of the Juniors, and \$1,500.00 to that of Section B of the Woman's Auxiliary, we do, indeed, feel that this important change means a growing success. Other things show steady growth.

Miss Purcell succeeded in interesting almost all the branches in the United Offering, and we felt that our part in the great Triennial was not unworthy. Miss Meade, with her fine corps of assistants, directed so wisely and well the work of the Richmond Juniors, to them is due our thanks that the division did not cause consternation and almost disorganization, for it shows able leadership to take away the props of years and teach people to rely on their own strength and the division affected many of the Richmond branches.

Miss Hughes developed a line of work that was a wonderful assistance, and it will prove a steady help, as the branches realize its usefulness.

When Dr. Brydon, editor of "*Our Diocesan Work*," offered us part of his paper every month, Miss Hughes was asked to be the Junior editor, and she proved herself so capable, your Junior secretary was relieved of much extra work and every branch, every month, was kept in touch with what was going on.

During the year Junior branches were formed at Haymarket, Luray, Scottsville and White Post, with earnest, consecrated leaders.

The new report blanks have been most helpful in getting at conditions in the branches. Of 47 branches, 44 sent in reports, and there have been 22 study classes. All this leads up to what is most gratifying of all. There were five volunteers for mission work from among the Juniors, showing that these twenty-five years of work along Junior lines, with Junior training in prayers, work and gifts has at least reached its ideal—the giving of self. As we realize the latent possibilities in each young

girl and as we put before them such ideas, surely the work of our regular meetings will be lifted out of material conditions and this spiritual development will mean an uplift never to be measured.

Mission study has become such a matter of course with some Auxiliaries that they see no need of reporting, while others undervalue their work to such an extent that they feel it is not worth reporting. Though notwithstanding these facts, we believe the work of this year exceeds the past years. Incidentally, we have heard of many new classes held in new places and have been encouraged by inquiries as to text-books and missionary libraries.

The diocese was well represented at the normal classes held in Richmond last fall during the synod. The new interest aroused at that time was spread far and wide by those attending.

Your secretary conducted a number of classes on missionary instruction in the Sunday school at the summer normals and institutes for Sunday school workers. The result was very encouraging. Most of our teachers feel that the teaching of missions should be a part of the Sunday school curriculum and will make an effort to introduce it into the curriculum hereafter.

We hope in another year that every parish in the diocese will have some form of missionary education and will report same to the secretaries that we may know just where we stand on this most important part of the Church's work.

It is however, a vital and growing force not to be withstood.

Mission Study Work in the Valley Convocation.

I am sorry to say that it has not been possible for me to visit the branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Valley to work up mission study classes. I have tried to create interest in the matter by writing to each branch urging the members to form a class if they did not have one. In the Valley we have an Auxiliary Day every spring at the meeting of the convocation. At the meeting this year, which was held in Luray on May 4th, reports from all branches showed a decided increase in mission study classes. We have nine branches of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Valley Convocation, and eleven classes were reported against five reported last year. In four parishes, namely, Winchester, Berryville, Wickliffe and Grace Memorial, Lynnwood, there were two classes held in each parish, one in the Woman's Auxiliary and one in the Junior. There were three other classes reported in Woodstock, Harrisonburg and Luray. I have not given the names of leaders of these classes because in most of them reported to me a leader was appointed for each meeting. In regard to the books used, as there was no special book recommended for last year each class studied what they chose, most of them studying missions in different countries. In Winchester and Woodstock there were illustrated lectures given during Lent and the members of the Auxiliary studied our missionary work in those countries, which was the subject of the lecture.
