WOMAN'S AUXILIARY AND SECTION B.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT.

To the Rt. Rev. William Cabell Brown, D. D., President ex-officio:

The Virginia Branch of The Woman's Auxiliary begs to present its annual report:

During the year 1918, The Woman's Auxiliary was urged to do its utmost to help the Board of Missions to keep the Missionary Work of the Church before the women of the Church, lest in the turmoil of war conditions it should be forgotten. To this end the Auxiliary in Virginia has directed special efforts towards the formation of new branches, the awakening of dormant branches, the securing of Missionary speakers for meetings in all sections of the Diocese, and the distribution of Missionary literature. Our Educational Department has organized and conducted forty Mission Study Classes, five reading circles, two normal classes and two Mission Study Classes for Sunday School teachers, besides arranging for a number of lectures and program meetings. And our Secretary for the Spirit of Missions has written personal letters to almost every Church and Chapel in Virginia in her efforts to increase the circulation of that magazine.

In regard to the gifts of the Auxiliary and its Junior Department, the Virginia Juniors report that all their pledges have been paid. They have added to their staff of workers a Treasurer, and a Box Secretary.

The Little Helpers have put more pennies than usual into their tiny boxes; and their leader is enlisting new interest in this work for the babies of the Church.

Owing to repeated outbreaks of Influenza, it was impossible to have our regular Annual Meeting in 1918. In view of this fact, we are glad to find from the reports of the parish branches of The Woman's Auxiliary and Section B., that there has been no falling off in contributions, but rather an increase.

Our work is threefold. It is easy to tell what has been accomplished in the way of study, and to make tables of our gifts; but the prayers of the Auxiliary, though they are the most important part of our work, cannot be

tabulated. For six months before the Armistice was signed, intercessory war prayer-meetings were held every week in many of our branches; and almost all of the Auxiliaries took part in the Advent Call. We find that the use of the Noon-Day Prayer for Missions is growing, and are encouraged to hope for spiritual as well as for material progress.

REPORTS OF CONVOCATIONAL SECRETARIES

Valley Convocation.

In making my ninth annual report as Secretary of The Woman's Auxiliary in the Valley Convocation, I look back over the years, and find they have not been lacking in progress and encouragement, in spite of many difficulties, and the want of interest in some of the branches.

Each year shows growth in interest and gifts in the various branches. The past year has been one to test peculiarly the loyalty and zeal of the members of The Woman's Auxiliary. The many war activities, and the demands of all kinds which the cruel and unhappy war laid upon us, have been enthusiastically carried out, all doing their part in so noble a cause. But these have at no time interfered with or lessened the splendid enthusiasm for the work of the Woman's Auxiliary, which the branches in the Valley Convocation have ever before them.

We could not forget our boys in France, but we did not fail to remember the call for work in the Mission fields of the Church.

In every department of the work, the branches have maintained their usual high standard of Missionary zeal. Mission Study Classes have been held in nearly all of the parishes. Pledges have all been met. One parish sent one of its members to Silver Bay.

Our Annual Auxiliary Day held at Berryville on April 26th, was one of the most interesting we have had, enthusiastic and inspiring speakers making it a success.

We were privileged to have in our Convocation one of the several meetings held in the Diocese to emphasize and set forth the Advent Call. Many women availed themselves of the opportunity to respond to the call of the Woman's Auxiliary, and to consecrate themselves to the effort of awakening the latent spiritual power of the women of the Church.

Piedmont Convocation.

The Piedmont Auxiliaries report a year of increased activity, and a deepened sense of the necessity for redeeming the time by buying up the opportunities for service.

Our second Auxiliary Day, held in Grace Church, Alexandria, was a day of blessing. Miss Davis presided over the business sessions. There was an attendance of about one hundred, among them five missionaries from the foreign field.

The addresses were made by the Rev. Hubbard Lloyd, of Kyoto, Japan, and Mrs. Lloyd. Mrs. Lloyd's address embodied an appeal to Piedmont to interest itself in two young Japanese girls, graduates of St. Agnes School, Kyoto, who were then at Chatham, and who were to remain in this country

for five years to be educated. Mrs. Lloyd asked for friendship as well as funds for these girls; and there was instant response. Three homes were opened to them for September and October, and eighty dollars in money pledged. Mrs. Lloyd in going back to Japan last August, left these girls as a legacy to all Virginia. To help train them here for service in their own country is a happy combination of Domestic and Foreign Missions which will make its appeal to us all.

Albemarle Convocation.

In the Albemarle Convocation are fifteen (15) branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, and reports to date are gratifying in that they show no diminution in interest and effort, despite the unusual conditions of war and epidemic, although in some sections there is a small decrease in membership no doubt on this account. In two of the larger branches, Charlottesville and the University, new members have supplied the places of those called to their final reward during the past year, thus maintaining the average membership list. Pledges have been fulfilled, and generous contributions made, to both our local mountain missions and those over seas.

The Advent Call was heartily heeded, beginning with an all-day service at Christ Church, Charlottesville, November 29th, conducted by Rev. W. Roy Mason and Miss Sallie Deane, of Richmond, when representatives from many of the convocation branches united with enthusiasm in the concerted effort to fling wider the banner, and fight harder the good fight. Proper literature was distributed, and judging from subsequent requests for additional supplies, it must have proven interesting and effective. Holy Communion was administered every morning during the week (except Monday) at St. Paul's Memorial Church at the University, and intercessory prayer continued during each day until eventide, the time having been divided into half hour period by a schedule arranged by the rector in charge, Rev. Roger A. Walke, for any in and out of town who cared to participate.

Richmond Convocation.

In the Richmond Convocation, the Woman's Auxiliary has 23 branches, 14 in the city and 9 in the country, with a membership of about 900.

St. Phillip's, the colored church, is not on our list now, as it has been included in a convocation of its own; but while we lost that branch—and they were earnest workers—we gained a new branch at Columbia, and hope for other new branches next year.

During Epiphany we had our All-Day Convocation Meeting. It was largely attended and proved a great help to us. We had our Diocesan President with us and a fine Foreign Missionary speaker, and several speakers on Home Missions. In the afternoon, Mrs. Barton held a meeting for the Juniors. We intend to have a Convocation Day every year, but have not set any regular time for it. By request the Secretary held a conference with two of our branches.

In the spring we had Miss Littell to speak to us. She is a most interesting speaker, and had a most interesting subject. At that time, seven of our branches gave \$336.00 to the Church General Hospital, Wuchang, China.

And now we come to the Advent Call. Though much hurried in our preparations, owing to the influenza cutting off our meetings, we carried it out as planned. We had 282 Messengers, and all attended the instruction classes held for us by the Reverend Mr. Cox, of Holy Comforter. The service for the Messengers, the Communion and charge from the Bishop, on Monday morning at St. Paul's Church, was a wonderful occasion; and from that hour prayers from the Intercessors were constantly arising in all our churches. The Holy Communion was celebrated in some churches every day. The country churches had the literature and explanatory letters sent them, and no doubt carried out the program as far as possible.

For our encouragement I would say, that not many of our woman have allowed the pressing claims of the Red Cross or United War Work to interfere with our Auxiliary work.

For the Year Ending December 1, 1918.

The Educational Department has just closed its seventh year of work. As we look back over these years to the beginning we can see that we have come a long way. Each year there has been a gradual increase in interest and in the scope of work. Today we stand second on the list of Dioceses in the Province. We have five Convocational Secretaries who are making strenuous efforts to send their Convocations over the top next year. And it is because of their splendid spirit and enthusiasm we are able to report the encouraging results seen in the statistics below.

We would remind you that the influence of this department has been far greater than the figures would indicate. The leaders know many who got their *first vision of the Church's Program of Missions* from the Mission Study class; and they know more who received their *first interest in the Cause of Missions* in the Mission Study class.

We are anxious now to have an Educational Secretary in every Parish branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to keep her Auxiliary in touch with the general work of the Church in Missionary Education through the Convocation and Diocesan Secretaries. With such a chain of Secretaries, reaching from the General Board of the whole Church to your own Parish branch, surely we ought to be able to do great things to hasten the Kingdom of our Lord on earth.

**REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BOX WORK FOR THE YEAR ENDING
DECEMBER 31st, 1918.**

Though the report is smaller than usual, we think that considering the many unusual demands occasioned by the strenuous war time, our branches have done reasonably well; and we trust that with the coming of peace we may swing back to normal conditions, and take up our work with renewed interest and enthusiasm.

While fewer boxes have been placed, our branches are beginning to grasp the importance of the Box Fund. The report testifies to the co-operation of the rural branches, in whose interest the Box Fund was specially created, and for whom it fills many emergencies, and is a source of satisfaction and real hope.

We would urge closer consideration of our semi-annual letters, which are always explanatory of the work in hand, and are designed to avoid any unnecessary correspondence and delay.

Your Box Work Committee is perfectly willing and anxious to help you in any difficult situation, and will respond promptly to your letters.

We thank you for your growing interest and co-operation in systematic work, and will say that our relations have been pleasant and gratifying to the Committee.

REPORT OF LITTLE HELPERS—1918

The past year has been full to overflowing with work of every kind for men, women and little children.

For little children have learned self-denial in many ways, in order to have a helping hand in winning this war for righteous freedom.

Conditions being what they were, and knowing how the men and women in the Church were falling short of their obligations, is it any wonder that I feared for my own little department, the nursery? With thankfulness, I can report that of the twenty-three branches reporting, sixteen sent their offering without any reminder. To me this seems a promise of increased interest, and gives fresh courage.

At our President's suggestion, an appeal was sent in this spring to every branch in the diocese, with the view of setting clearly before the women of our Church, why this nursery department had a *right* to live in every parish.

Our men are returning, thank God, from the battle-front in France, and I am wondering how many homes are ready for them.

Over there our boys have more than once seen The Christ on the battlefield; will they find He has been in the homes too while they were away?

Each year an effort is made to increase a little the offering for the general apportionment.

I am glad that the money received from the little boxes has again showed a small increase.

In response to the appeal came five requests for instructions and supplies; but that seems to have satisfied them. There are two new branches; but I am sorry to report the silence of four.

You see from this report that the women of the Auxiliary seem to grow weary, and the little children cannot do this work alone.
