REPORT OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

To The Rt. Rev. William Cabell Brown, D.D., President ex-officio:

The Virginia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary submits the following report:

During the year 1921 we formed nine new branches of the Woman's Auxiliary and Section B, and two of the Junior Auxiliary, giving us on December 31, one hundred and forty-six branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, sixty-six of the Junior Auxiliary and forty-six of the Little Helpers.

In October the Woman's Auxiliary was fifty years old, and celebrated her semi-centennial by special services and by the raising of a fund for Missionaries on Furlough. Virginia's contribution to that fund, which was called the Emery Fund, was \$1,082.77.

At the request of the Nation-Wide Campaign Committee of this Diocese, the Woman's Auxiliary undertook last autumn the training of the women who were to lead the Nation-Wide Campaign Prayer and Discussion Groups in Virginia.

Ten training classes were conducted by Auxiliary officers at different points; and one hundred and forty-one of the Parish Prayer and Discussion Groups were led by Auxiliary women.

Our Educational Secretary reports two Mission Study Institutes, and eighty-five Mission Study Classes in 1921.

One hundred and thirty-six of our members went to Summer Conferences last summer; and it is impossible to estimate the far-reaching influence of this expenditure of time and money.

Our branches are using better business methods. A larger proportion of the money contributed by the Woman's Auxiliary in 1921 went through our Diocesan Treasurer; the Secretary of Box Work has been consulted before the sending of boxes; and most of the branches are paying in the United Thank Offering twice a year.

One is struck with the varied interests of the Auxiliary, ranging from the Mission School in the home parish to the great Missionary Universities in the East, and from the local hospital to St. Luke's Hospital, Tokyo.

Our parish records show an encouraging growth in Christian Social Service work. One Section B reports that in 1921 her members ministered to one thousand one hundred and fourteen patients in the Richmond hospitals. We find a number of young women giving several afternoons a week to dispensary work, and at Christmas many Convict Camps and State Institutions were gladdened by gifts sent by our branches.

The practice of holding Corporate Communions for the Auxiliary is growing in this Diocese, many branches having celebrated our semi-centennial in this way, and quite a number of others having established the custom of presenting their United Thank Offering at a Communion Service before sending it to the Custodian.

Our Gift of Life Committee reports that in 1921 one of the Section B leaders went as a Missionary to China, and two of our young people took up work in the Virginia Mountains, and it also reports that at the present date we have five volunteers for the foreign field.

REPORT OF THE CUSTODIAN OF THE UNITED THANK OFFERING FOR 1921

The United Thank Offering for 1921, it is hoped, is prophetic for that of 1922. It considerably more than doubled the offering of the corresponding year of the last triennium, being sufficient to overbalance the slight deficit for 1920 in doubling 1917.

The beginning of the final year finds the Diocese of Virginia having fulfilled her aim!

Knowledge of what the United Thank Offering stands for is necessary for its growth. To see that this knowledge is widely circulated among all women of the church is the duty of the parish custodians, for to them is given the opportunity of bringing to those who know it not, a blessing which only comes with the knowledge of, and having a part in, the "Woman's offering for woman, and through woman, for the world."

"A peculiar blessing seems to rest upon it," was said of it. Without it how could such unprecedented results have been accomplished? The second offering was ten times the first. The tenth was more than two hundred times the first! This in itself is sufficient evidence that this "peculiar blessing" does rest upon it, and only with that blessing can it attain that power which we daily pray may follow our United Thank Offering.

Seven new branches of the Woman's Auxiliary have been added to my books, and three Sections B, during 1921. In one instance a parish in which there is no Woman's Auxiliary contributed. Ninety of the Branches of the Auxiliary contributed, and seventeen Sections B.

The Bishop thanked the Juniors with all his heart for helping him with the Emergency Fund and the Portuguese literature he is translating for the Brazilian missions. \$75 went to Alaska, and nearly every branch has been able, with the help of the Sunday schools, to send splendid Christmas boxes to specified mission stations. And last, but almost best, the branches have raised over \$600 towards the United Thank Offering. That offering will be taken next September to Portland, Oregon, and the goal set by the Juniors is \$1,000 for the tri-ennial. So much for the work done during 1921.

It is quite impossible to tell what the quiet influence of the Junior training has meant in so many lives: the leading and guiding of fresh enthusiasm into unselfish thought and deeds for others, the developing of character and usefulness, and the broadening of vision in our young church people. Each Junior during 1922 is asked to hold the standards up. Is not that alone worth while in these days of vague and lax moral ideas?

Another objective is to follow the new programs with a constructive plan of advance, definite aims suited to the needs of each meeting, and checked up at the end of each year to find out if they have been carried out, and, if not, why not.
