REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

To The Rev. William Cabell Brown, D. D., President ex-officio:

The Virginia Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary submits the following report:

Seven new branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, three of section B., and one of the Juniors were organized in 1922.

In the Diocese of Virginia there are one hundred and eighty-seven parishes and missions to which a Nation-Wide Campaign Quota was given. We feel that there should be organized missionary work for women and girls in every one to these parishes and missions. Investigation shows that many of the smaller churches have no Auxiliary; and it is our aim to remedy this condition as speedily as possible. We believe that in the smallest congregation the banding together of even two or three women or young people, to learn about the world-wide mission of the Church, to pray for its success, and to give such service as may be possible, will result not only in help outside the parish, but in quickened life within it.

In March, 1922, our branches were called upon to observe the first Friday in Lent as a Day of Intercession for Missions, and to join as far as possible with the Woman's Missionary Organizations of other Christian bodies in this observance.

In compliance with a request from the President of the National Council (then the Presiding Bishop and Council), the Virginia Auxiliary used her organization to bring quickly before the church people of this Diocese the emergency appeal for the starving children of the Near East, and forwarded many contributions to the Near East Relief Committee.

The year 1922 was marked by the effort of our Educational Department to circulate missionary information and to train new leaders. A largely attended Mission Study Institute was held in Richmond, and an effort was made to introduce mission study into every branch of the Auxiliary. As a result eighty-two missions study classes were held—besides numerous program meetings. When the new program of the Church was adopted by the General Convention, our Educational Secretary issued a series of lessons on this program, which were widely used.

We are glad to report that the amount of the United Thank Offering sent by the Virginia Branch to the presentation service in Portland was greater by over \$7,000.00 than the offering sent to Detroit in 1919. The Portland offering from Virginia, including the offering from the Virginia Juniors, was \$16,716.75. The women and girls of our Church are gradually learning to use this offering as an expression of thanksgiving and as a means of extending to others their chiefest blessings.

Five delegates from the Virginia Branch attended the Triennial Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary in Portland, Oregon. They brought back with them a deepened sense of the opportunity of our women and girls to serve the Church through our organization, which is flexible enough to permit varied forms of service, and which is safeguarded by its dependence upon the National Council.

REPORT OF CONVOCATIONAL SECRETARIES

Valley Convocation

The Auxiliary work in the Valley Convocation shows steady growth and increased interest. We have been able to gladly welcome Front Royal to our Auxiliary band—a very valuable addition to our number of branches. The work in some of the parishes has taken on new life, and we feel that our whole Auxiliary life has been quickened and aroused throughout the Convocation. Nearly all the branches report mission study work, and some of our leaders have been to Mission Study Institutes, some to Charlottesville and some to Richmond.

Auxiliary Day held on October 26th was a great success in every way. Nearly all the branches were represented by delegates and visitors, and reports showed good work done in boxes, social service, mission study, and generous contributions made to the missionary work of the Church. The United Thank Offering had received special attention; and great increase of interest was shown in the work of the Church Periodical Club. It was our great privilege and pleasure to have with us Bishop Brown, who spoke to us about the Church Schools and the Church School Service League, also about the Boys Home at Covington. Miss Davis, our Diocesan President, Mrs. Osgood and Miss Deane, all brought inspiring messages from the General Convocation which met in September in Portland, Oregon.

Mrs. Osgood's programs were carried out in some of the branches during Advent, and study classes were held on "The Program Presented". Several branches asked for and received special reports of the General Convocation.

Piedmont Convocation

The Auxiliary formed one new branch in the Piedmont Convocation in 1922, adding St. Peter's, Purcellville, to its list.

Twenty-three study classes were conducted during the year, and fourteen Auxiliary women went to Summer Conferences. The reports show that twenty N. W. C. Prayer Circles were held in the Auxiliary branches, and that eight of the branches were interested in Christian Social Service.

Sixty-four boxes were sent by the Piedmont Auxiliary, and the United Thank Offering shows a decided increase. Her Convocational Auxiliary Day in Alexandria in November was well attended, and she is conscious of increasing interest, and is looking forward to better work.

Albemarle Convocation.

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Albemarle Convocation reports as follows:

During the year 1922 there was activity along all lines of Auxiliary endeavor.

The study class work grew—many branches reporting classes—mostly on the second year of the Survey.

A large number of delegates were sent to the summer conferences—especially to Blue Ridge. All returned inspired for greater work; and the results are very noticeable in added activity.

The annual Auxiliary Day was held in Christ Church, Charlottesville, in November. There was a large attendance, and the short reports from the branches were most encouraging. Especially so was the marked increase in the amount sent in from "The Little Blue Box".

The speakers were most interesting. Several of our own Mountain Missionaries spoke of their work.

Mrs. Jacqueline Smith gave a thrilling account of the General Convention and the Rev. Cary Montague spoke on the Auxiliary's opportunity for Social Service.

These were followed by our only speaker on the work of the Church in foreign lands, Dr. Claude Lee, who told of his wonderful work in Wusih, China, and asked earnestly for our interest and prayers, as well as our gifts.

In all, 1922 was a year of growth, and gives us much hope for a better report in 1923.

Rappahannock Convocation

The Woman's Auxiliary in the Rappahannock Convocation reports as follows;

Our financial statement is not as large as that of last year, owing, I think, to the fact, that out of a possible twenty-two branches, only eight had study classes, and only eleven used the Monthly Programs. Are we forgetting that study is one of the three rules of service? Box work has increased, the branches taking more interest in the box fund, and the value and number of boxes having increased. More money has been sent through the Diocesan Treasurer; but there is room for improvement along this line. All but three branches sent in annual reports. Sixteen branches sent representatives to the Annual Convocational Day at Farnham.

This day was full of interest and instruction. Bishop Brown spoke on what the Woman's Auxiliary meant to him. Miss Davis outlined a plan for a standard branch, which I am hoping will help this Convocation very much. Mrs. Osgood gave us the educational plans for the year; and Miss Deane told us of the visiting Missionaries to Portland. All gave us interesting items from the General Convention.

Richmond Convocation.

Our Convocation Day for several years has been the finest and best thing we have to tell about; and though it came last, being held November 5th at the Church of the Holy Comforter; I will speak of it first.

Bishop McGinnis spoke to us of the many sided and difficult work in Jerusalem and throughout the Near East.

Other good speakers told us of the General Convention. Later Miss Hyarashi spoke to us at Saint James', and, both in her address, and personally, proved herself a woman doing great things in missions.

Several Branches got missionaries for themselves, and invited other branches to meet with them. Holy Comforter had Miss Cox from China to speak to them, and All Saints had a fine meeting with speakers from the General Convention. St. Paul's Branch made a personal canvass of their congregation and gained many new members. We report one new Branch at The Church of Our Saviour, Beaver Dam, Hanover County.

There has certainly been great increase of interest in all lines of Auxiliary work—so we are not idle "but still bear up, and steer right onward".

Report of Educational Secretary

The training of leaders for the Missionary education of our women was one of the main objects of the Educational Department of the Auxiliary in 1922. One well attended institute was held in Richmond, one normal class, and five N. W. C. training classes for leaders.

Eighty-two study classes using the discussing method are reported.

About one hundred women went from the Virginia Auxiliaries to the summer schools.

As a help to the parish presidents in planning their monthly meetings, the Educational Department has printed monthly programs in the Virginia Churchman; and during the autumn, three lessons on the Program of the Church were prepared and widely used.

We are urging our branches to make use of the Missionary lending library at the Diocesan office, and in every possible way to furnish the missionary information without which intelligent work is impossible.

In submitting the above report I note with pleasure fewer odd magazines being sent and more going regularly. This is a move in the right direction, showing an increase in the personal work; and I hope to see more of it.

Three years ago the C. P. C. undertook to furnish a \$15,000.00 library for St. Paul's College, Tokyo, thus enabling this college to take rank as a University, such a library being one of the requisites to that attainment. More than \$17,000 was given; so St. Paul's will not need further aid at present.

At Portland, the C. P. C. assumed the obligation to secure \$5,000.00 worth of new books, each year, for the next three years, for our Church Schools and colleges. The correspondents were asked to choose the institutions for which their Dioceses would work. Having five Church Schools in our Diocese, naturally therein lay our interests. St. Margaret's for girls, and Christ Church for Boys, should receive our first attention, as theirs is the greatest need; though the others will be helped as donors request. Books and magazines suitable for young girls and boys, as well as money for new books, will be acceptable. We hope that all persons in the Diocese, or outside, interested in these schools will aid in supplying their needs.

REPORT OF CUSTODIAN OF THE UNITED THANK OFFERING

The Diocese of Virginia, stressing the importance of prayer over and above the mere giving of money to the United Thank Offering, is happy in having every United Thank Offering worker, in the field and in training, included very definitely everyday in the prayers of certainly six or eight women of the Woman's Auxiliary. This must bring the offering closer to each woman who pledges herself in this prayer service, and must of necessity be an inspiration to the one for whom her prayers are offered. The growth of the offering is in no small measure attributable to this cause.

Throughout the Diocese, as far as possible, has been instituted the service, with Holy Communion, for the presentation of the offering, both spring and fall. In Richmond the individual Auxiliaries have their service in the fall. In the spring, before the annual meeting, there is a Corporate Communion of the Richmond Auxiliary, at which time she presents on the altar her gift of thankfulness for what the Divine Gift has meant to her, with her prayer that through her offering others may share with her the privileges that have been hers. The Service is in itself an inspiration.

At the exact time—allowing for the difference in time between Richmond and Portland—of the presentation of the United Thank Offering in Portland, a service with the Holy Communion was held in St. Paul's, Richmond, and in many other churches in the Diocese.

Nine branches of the Woman's Auxiliary, two of Section B. and our Business Woman's Auxiliary have been added to our list of contributing branches during the year 1922, making a total of one hundred and thirty branches contributing.

The outstanding interest of the Juniors this year has been the information gained and put to use, through the summer conferences at Blue Ridge and Charlottesville. New ideas, new plans, wider knowledge and bigger vision have been brought home to the branches. We should have the attendance at a summer conference of at least one delegate from each branch.

The box work has been very remarkable. Miss Kate Mason Brown, Chairman of our Box Committee, reports that through the united efforts of the Juniors and the Sunday Schools, 25 mission stations in Virginia were supplied with Christmas boxes, the number of gifts reaching 2,935. Do you realize what that means? At the earnest request of other dioceses this work will be shared with them another year.

In Japan we will still help Miss Williams and Miss Ambler. To China we will send as usual \$150.00 to Miss Barber for our three little Chinese babies, and the same amount for the support of our boy, Yang Yu Wen, who was selected by Mrs. Woodward. We must never forget that we have four Virginia Juniors working in China; Miss M. K. Monterio, a United Thank Offering Missionary, who is at Wuhu; Miss Mary Jacqueline Smith at Yangchow; Miss Stephanie Bradford and Miss Elizabeth Deahl at Nanking. Let them know we are thinking of them.

In Alaska we are going to educate a boy at Tortella Hall, St. Mark's Mission, Nenana, Bishop Rowe himself asking us to do it. Our United Thank Offering went over \$1,000.00 in the past three years; and we have reason to be thankful, not proud, that our Virginia Juniors sent more than the Juniors of any other diocese to the beautiful United Thank Offering service.

I feel that we have done steady work in 1922, with a very distinct advance in methods and enthusiasm. We are recognizing the fact that we are a very definite organization with a definite aim and scope. As I wrote each branch in the fall, when they took up the study class book, "Heroes of the Black Continent," every child in our churches should be brought to realize that children's lives must be influences for good in their communities, and that their talents are for God's service. They must stand ready to take up the work of the present leaders, and carry on; and in the meantime, they can help by letters, gifts, study, and prayer.

LITTLE HELPERS OF VIRGINIA

Report of the Secretary—Treasurer for 1922

Although the same apathy that has been permeating the work of the grown people has apparently affected the work of the Little Helpers, it is with thankfulness that the re-establishment of one parish branch can be reported.

Little people are sensitive, and feel quickly the pulse and interest of those in charge of them. It is, therefore, our great responsibility that no influence adverse to the following of The Master, touch, or even cast its shadow over, the hearts and minds of His little children.

Because the times are so hard to reckon with, we need to watch just that much more carefully and prayerfully, never doubting that according to our faithfulness shall we wrest wonderful blessings from our difficulties.

With faith and prayer for stepping stones, we need never fear lest He will always guide and bless.

One parish Leader has prepared fifteen of her older boys and girls for promotion. Of them seven boys are ready for St. Paul's Brotherhood, but there is no organization in her parish for boys of even twelve to fourteen. Shall these boys, just at a critical age, when they are beginning to watch and imitate grown men be allowed to drift from the church and its influences? They have been taught and trained in the younger organization, shall they be turned adrift? The time comes when boys, sometimes as young as eight years need the companionship and influence of worthy men.

The crying need for clergymen and for earnest working laymen is heard on every side. Here is one man's opportunity in every parish. Hold on to our boys, only men can do this. All young people must have work and active amusement of some healthy kind held out to them in the home church, or the probability is, the older people may have cause for bitter regret, and this may God forbid.
