REPORT OF THE SECRETARY.

*To the Right Rev. E. R. Atwill, Bishop of West Missouri, and
Members of the Woman's Auxiliary:*

Two years have passed since Miss Emery and Miss Tripplett came to organize our Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary. Much of the enthusiasm and the work already accomplished is due to their wise counsel. No one could hear one of Miss Emery's earnest, practical talks on missionary work and not feel a strong desire—for the time at least—to do more work more faithfully in the extension of our Master's Kingdom. During the year we have had three regular meetings and one called meeting.

The annual meeting was held at Grace Church Guild Hall, in May, at which time our present Constitution was unanimously adopted and where the most helpful and encouraging work of the year was inaugurated through the suggestion and promised help of Christ Church, St. Joseph. I refer to the raising of the \$300 for the Arch-Deacon's salary. The presence of Bishop Tuttle among us and his stirring sermon at the morning service was a great pleasure and a real inspiration.

The October meeting was held at St. Mark's Church. The sermon preached by the Rev. Geo. E. Gardner, then our Arch-Deacon, will not soon be forgotten; it was, for many of us, the first and last time we should hear his intensely earnest and enthusiastic words, dwelling very especially on moral courage, the courage of our convictions, so speaking for the Church whenever occasion offered. The third meeting was at St. George's Church, and the called meeting also took place there the afternoon of the 21st of April. We were most hospitably and cordially entertained at the churches above mentioned, and I think we all now feel sure we were wise in

departing from the old customs and having all day meetings.

Only one new branch has been formed this year, but we hope to add Carrollton and others to our list before our report is printed. This report should make us resolve to work more faithfully the coming year to extend the Auxiliary. There should be a branch in every parish and mission in the diocese, however small, and we should use every effort to accomplish this end.

At our called meeting the resolution offered, "That every woman communicant in the diocese of West Missouri be asked to contribute (over and above all sums now given) two cents a week, payable quarterly, the sum to be applied to the purpose of opening the closed churches in this diocese," seems a very effective means to this end, as well as to the one it was especially designed to accomplish. I am sorry to say that the amount from the mite boxes, as far as they have been returned, exceeds very little the amount of last year. The amount this year, as far as we have had reports, is \$77.22. We have not yet reached the \$100 we hoped to raise the first year. Cannot we do it next year? I know we can, and more, if we try our best. The report for the year is as follows:



CONSTITUTION
OF THE
WEST MISSOURI BRANCH
OF THE
WOMAN'S AUXILIARY.

ADOPTED MAY 14TH, 1891; AMENDED APRIL 21ST, 1892.

ARTICLE I.

This Society shall be called the West Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Missions.

ARTICLE II.

Its object is not to change the work of any Parish, but by united and sympathetic action to increase the interest, and to unite all Parishes in the Diocese in the various branches of the church's missionary work.

ARTICLE III.

All baptized women of the Diocese of West Missouri who so desire shall be regarded as members of this society.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers shall be a President, six Vice-Presidents, two Secretaries (a Corresponding and Recording Secretary), and Treasurer to be chosen at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE V.

The Diocese shall be divided into six districts, each of which shall have a President and Secretary, the President to hold the office of Vice-President in the Board.

ARTICLE VI.

There shall be a Board of Managers consisting of the President, the Vice-Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurer and

Parish Representatives. Nine of these shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE VII.

Each Parish shall be represented in the Board by its officers and not more than four delegates chosen by the Rector or if the Parish have no Rector, by the Parish Society.

A membership fee of 50 cents per year shall be paid by all delegates.

ARTICLE VIII.

The payment of \$1 per year to the Diocesan Treasurer shall constitute any one an Honorary member of the Board of Managers. These Honorary members shall be entitled to seats but not to vote and shall not be counted in making a quorum.

ARTICLE IX.

There shall be three meetings of the Board of Managers each year to be held as follows: The first Thursdays in November and February, and the annual meeting for the election of officers which shall be on the day following the Diocesan convention. The annual meeting shall be a general meeting of the society and shall be directed by the Bishop of the Diocese. The meetings shall be held in any church or chapel designated by the President.

ARTICLE X.

Special meetings may be called by the President at the request of any five of the managers.

ARTICLE XI.

1. The President shall call meetings and preside over them.
2. The first Vice-President, or, in her absence, any of the other Vice-Presidents shall take the duties of the President in her absence.

3. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the society; send notices of the meetings and shall send a full report of them annually to the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary in New York.

The Recording Secretary shall keep a record of the meetings, receive all moneys, and make a record of them before paying the same to the Treasurer. She shall also prepare an annual report for circulation in the Diocese, a review of which shall be presented to the Diocesan Council.

4. The Treasurer, under the direction of the Board, shall receive and disburse all moneys sent to the society for any branch of missionary work, and for the expenses of the society presenting a report of the same at each meeting of the Board

5. The President of each district shall call and preside over meetings in her own district and transact all business. There shall also be sent from each district a list of the delegates from each Parish in the district to the Recording Secretary ten days before the annual meeting.

ARTICLE XII.

The Parish delegates are to report to the President or Secretary of their district all work done for missions, all money raised for missions by the women of their Parishes; also all new work undertaken for missions. They are to attend the regular meetings of the Board and to carry back to their Parish societies missionary intelligence and to endeavor in every way to increase an earnest and prayerful interest in missions.

ARTICLE XIII.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any meeting of the Board, by notice having been given at a previous meeting, by a two-thirds vote of the members of the Board of Managers present.

The districts shall be Kansas City, St. Joseph, Sedalia, Springfield, Carthage and Chillicothe.
