## CONSTITUTION.

### ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be The West Missouri Diocesan Branch of The Woman's Auxiliary to the Presiding Bishop and Council.

### ARTICLE II

Its object shall be to increase, by united effort, the interest of all Parishes and Missions of this Diocese in the missionary work of the Church.

### ARTICLE III

All baptized women of this Diocese are regarded as members of this Auxiliary.

### ARTICLE IV

The head of this Auxiliary shall be the Bishop, ex-officio. The officers shall be: a President; a First Vice President; a Vice President from the northern and a Vice President from the southern section of the Diocese; a Recording Secretary; a Corresponding Secretary; a Treasurer and an Auditor, all of whom, except the Bishop, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting next after \* the Triennial General Convention, and shall serve three years. The President shall not be eligible for two consecutive terms.

The duties of these officers, other than as prescribed by the By-Laws, shall be those usually appertaining to their respective offices. The President shall appoint and define the duties of: an Educational Secretary, a United Thank Offering Treasurer, a Supply Secretary, a Finance Committee and such other committees as she may deem expedient, each to serve one year. A vacancy occurring in these appointments shall be filled by the President. A vacancy occurring in any of the elective offices shall be filled by the Board of Managers until the next regular meeting when it shall be filled by election for the unexpired term.

### ARTICLE V

There shall be three regular meetings during the year: an Annual Meeting on the Thursday following the Annual Council in January; a meeting the first Thursday in May that does not fall on Ascension Day; and a meeting the first Thursday in November that does not fall on All Saints' Day.

### ARTICLE VI

Each Parish Branch shall be entitled to representation at all meetings by its officers and four delegates elected by itself. Each Branch shall pay in advance such Delegates' dues as shall be fixed by the By-Laws.

### ARTICLE VII

This Constitution may, with the approval of the Bishop, be amended at any regular meeting of the Auxiliary, by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present, after thirty days written notice to each Parish Branch.

## BY-LAWS.

1. The Order of Business at all meetings shall be as follows, except that the Secretary's Report and Parish Reports shall be given at the Annual Meeting only:

2. The Recording Secretary shall prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese.

3. The Corresponding Secretary shall make annually a full report of the work of the Auxiliary to the General Secretary of The Woman's Auxiliary in New York.

4. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, receipt for and disburse the same under the direction of the Parish Branches and the Auxiliary. She shall render a report at all regular meetings.

5. The Auditor shall examine and audit the books of the Treasurer before each regular meeting.

6. There shall be a Board of Managers consisting of the Diocesan Officers, ex-Presidents of the Diocesan Auxiliary and the elected Officers of Parish Branches. This Board shall meet on the first Monday of each month and at other times upon call of the President. It shall be entrusted with the management of the affairs of the Auxiliary and shall have power to transact all business that may come before it. Nine members of the Board, representing at least four Parishes, shall constitute a quorum.

7. There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of the President, the First Vice President, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer, which shall transact such business as may be necessary between the meetings of the Board.

8. Parish and Mission election of Delegates shall take place during the month preceding the Annual Meeting and be immediately reported by the Branch Secretary to the Recording Secretary.

9. Delegates and Alternates to the Auxiliary Meeting held in connection with the Triennial General Convention shall be elected at the May Meeting preceding.



10. Each Branch shall pay an annual fee of fifty cents for each delegate and officer and no delegate or officer shall be entitled to vote unless the dues and assessments of her Branch have been paid in full.

11. A Current Expense Fund of not less than \$200.00 shall be provided annually for printing, postage, stationery and the expense of speakers. This amount shall be apportioned among the Parish and Mission Branches by a Finance Committee of three appointed by the President.

12. All monies shall be sent to the Treasurer one week before each meeting.

13. No part of the current expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid from funds contributed for Missionary purposes.

14. All nominations shall be by ballot.

15. All elections shall be by ballot. Unless there is an election by a clear majority on the first ballot the chair shall declare the two names having the largest number of votes and subsequent ballots shall be upon them until a clear majority is reached.

16. These By-Laws may be amended or suspended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present.

17. In any contingency not covered by the Constitution and By-Laws the Auxiliary shall be governed by Longan's Parliamentary Rules.

#### **STANDING RULES.**

That there be a Missionary Sunday every year, emphasizing the United Thank Offering. (Apr. Board, 1919)

That the Memorial Roll be framed and hung in a suitable place. (May, 1919)

That each woman in the Auxiliary be taxed 5c a month to provide a fund for the traveling expenses of Delegates to the Triennial. (Nov. 1919)

That a fund be provided for the use of the Educational Secretary. (Nov. 1919)

That notices of Board meetings be sent out one week in advance; notices of Annual and Quarterly meetings, two weeks in advance. (Nov. 1919) (Jan. Board, 1920)

That a fund be created for necessary traveling expenses of Officers in the Diocese in the interest of Auxiliary work. (Nov. 1920)



### THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

My first thought in planning to speak to you today was of regret that there was nothing new to talk about, that we were, as is natural at this period in the Triennium, marking time until the next General Convention.

Then I remembered how little time ago it was that there was so much of change, and so many new plans that we hardly thought we should ever become quite used to them, even if we finally managed to understand them. Evidently the changes were not so radical as they first seemed, since we have managed in this time to assimilate them so thoroughly. That this was possible is due to the wisdom and foresight of former Officers of the Auxiliary in this Diocese. Every month your present staff of officers realize more clearly how much we are indebted to the predecessors who gave this Auxiliary a background of such training that it is prepared to progress intelligently as new plans are made.

But having progressed as we should, there are no new and startling things to think of at present, and we have an opportunity to enjoy the unaccustomed luxury of a little extra time in which to think of our own personal affairs. It has, therefore, seemed wise to your Board of Managers and to your Pledge Committee to ask you to consider at this meeting the advisability of increasing two funds that are used in our own Diocese. These are the Educational Secretary's Fund and the Diocesan Travelling Fund.

Your Committee has given you an explanation of these pledges in the list found in your Year Book. You are urged to read this carefully and to consider whether your gifts to them cannot be increased this year. As you consider will you not think of these funds as monies invested in, not spent on, the Auxiliary's work? If we can teach our own people, through literature and the work of our Educational Secretary, and if we can go to them and make them realize that we feel them to be essential parts of our organization, surely the outlay will be more than justified.

I spoke a moment ago of the Board of Managers. I want to remind you that this Board meets monthly, and therefore the officers of your Parish branches are kept in constant touch with headquarters at the Missions House and your Diocesan officers are informed more promptly than ever before of your sentiments and activities. Please see to it that your officers give you a full account of every Board meeting. We question them about you; make sure that they bring back to your branch all the benefit possible.

The Board without exception is made up of extremely busy women. They feel that these frequent meetings are of great assistance in making the government of this Auxiliary truly representa-



tive and democratic. They do not take time in their busy lives for these Board meetings from any wish to "run" the Auxiliary but from a real desire to serve you, our superior officers, and the Lord and Master of us all.

I hope none of you thought that in speaking of our having time to think of our own affairs I implied that there was nothing else for us to do. There are tasks awaiting us, which, while not new, are none the less very definite and very important. Surely we all realized that when we heard the Bishop's sermon this morning.

I hope we all stopped to think how fortunate we were to hear that sermon and to have a part in that service. I confess my heart ached to think how many faithful Churchmen and Churchwomen live and die without hearing anything so beautiful. Our presence there, as an organization, was an experiment, you remember. It is a question, and a question that needs careful consideration, whether, if we hold our Annual Meeting on Tuesday, with its longer service, we shall have time to finish our business. But this year at least, it must, I think, have seemed good to everyone that we should be there. I can think of no business we could have transacted in that time that could have meant so much to us as the inspiration of that service; inspiration rising both from the beauty of the service itself and from the fact that it was a Corporate Communion of the active workers of the Diocese, both men and women.

Yet had the Bishop been speaking to the Auxiliary alone, he could hardly have had a more direct message for us, and it is that which I wish to emphasize today.

You remember he set before the Diocese two aims for the year; first the deepening of its spiritual life through increasing knowledge, and second the widening of its opportunities for service through the completion of St. Luke's Hospital.

In this second aim, every Auxiliary woman will wish to have a part. For organized assistance, however, there is another body—the Woman's Diocesan Society—whose privilege it is to stand at the Bishop's right hand in this matter.

But the first aim, that of deepening spiritual life through increasing knowledge, is the peculiar province of the Auxiliary. Shall we not, therefore, take this as our especial mission for the year? As we have been taught so long, no woman can be expected to love, to pray for and to work for, the Mission of the Church, unless she knows about it. Let it be our business this year to see to it that those women in our Diocese who do not already know, begin to learn, and that those who do know, learn more fully, about the Church's Mission.



To accomplish this we should read Church books; read Church papers; promote, encourage and attend, study classes; think about it and talk about it and pray about it. Then we should see to it that this increased knowledge works out in some simple but definite way, such as sharing in the United Thank Offering or the Box work. Every single woman in the Diocese can have a part in these whether she can belong to a regularly organized branch or not.

Adopting this suggestion of the Bishop's, let each one of us feel responsible for seeing that every Churchwoman she can influence becomes this year more intelligently informed than ever before. Let each one begin with herself. Then she will have done what she could to help the Bishop realize his hope of a deeper spiritual life for the Diocese, and to make this a good year for our Auxiliary, for our Diocese and for our Church.

#### **ANNUAL REPORT**

**of the Recording Secretary of the Diocese of West Missouri Branch  
of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Presiding Bishop and Council.**

To the Right Reverend Sidney C. Partridge, Bishop of the  
Diocese of West Missouri, and Women of the Auxiliary:

With the coming of the new year we are confronted with the thought of the past—can we give a good account for the reason of our existence—have we made any growth—briefly: the monthly board meetings which were an experiment last year have been held regularly, and have proved invaluable—each parish has been well represented, the detailed work and places of the various needs are fully considered—suggestions offered and welcomed,—and the result is an awakened enthusiasm, and a development of plans which are worked out so that we can more intelligently pursue our work—the only regret is that the parish branches outside the city are not able to have the benefit of these monthly meetings.

The Auxiliary was represented by a full delegation at the Synod in St. Louis. Our President, Mrs. Burr, was chosen to lead one of the conferences and our Treasurer, Miss Howard, brought back such a full and glowing report that it made us all wish we had been able to attend.

At the May meeting we had as speakers Miss Marsh, Field Secretary of the G. F. S. A., Mr. Krohlich of the Americanization work of Junior College and Mrs. McDonald, Educational Secretary of the Cathedral Parish in St. Louis, who gave us a paper on the history of the Church and our Woman's Auxiliary to the present time.



At the November meeting, Father Anderson of the Order of the Holy Cross was the speaker. He gave an inspiring address and meditation urging all to be more constant in the use of daily prayer and more earnest in our Church work, placing it on a higher plane.

A Day of Devotion was held December 2nd at St. George's, with an early celebration of the Holy Communion. The Meditations were led by our own Bishop.

Miss Ridgeway, one of our missionaries, formerly of Alaska, spoke before several of the city branches and expects to be with us again in the spring. She told of her work in Alaska and its needs, and gave a word picture of the missionaries and their surroundings.

We cooperated most successfully in the sale of China Life Saving Stamps throughout the Diocese.

The fiftieth anniversary of the Woman's Auxiliary was celebrated in several of the parishes in the Diocese. In Kansas City the celebration took the form of a very successful silver tea which was held at St. Paul's Church. There were also corporate communions and special sermons in practically every parish in recognition of this anniversary.

We can also report the cooperation in the presentation of the official pageant in the celebration of the 100th anniversary of the missionary society of the church, which was held at Grace and Holy Trinity November 6.

Concerning our Box allotment for the Pocason Mission, we were able to complete it to our great delight and surprise. This is due to the splendid aid of our women throughout the Diocese under the leadership of our Supply Secretary, Mrs. Benjamin Brown.

We are glad to report concerning the work on the Emery Fund. As may be seen by referring to the Signet for a detailed report of the several parishes, we more than raised our quota of the \$500.00 allotted to us in which we take great pride.

This report would be incomplete without a word concerning the leadership of our President. She has been ready at any and all times for the grasping of every opportunity for the advancement of the work in the Diocese, and to her vision and ability we feel that much of the success of the work this year is due.

### REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY.

Your Educational Secretary is decidedly short on figures. She has an indistinct memory of long and frequent conferences over the telephone and of many hours spent at the desk writing to the Church Missions House, to various publishers, to local Educational Secretaries and other individuals until it seemed that a private secretary was almost a necessity.

The record for five months shows a postage and paper bill of \$17.00, some of it for containers and for packages of literature, but much of it, too, for letters.

In addition to attending and presenting the educational work at the regular Board Meetings and the Quarterly Meetings a visit was made to Excelsior Springs and an extended trip including St. Joseph, Savannah, St. Oswald's, Plattsburg, Cameron, Trenton, Chillicothe, Brookfield and Carrollton, in behalf of the educational work in general and the proposed Institute to be conducted by Miss Boyer.

Though that Institute had to be indefinitely postponed on account of Miss Boyer's illness, the knowledge gained of general conditions of the field and the mutual interest developed well repaid the expense and effort.

Your Secretary was also fortunate enough to have the privilege of attending the Conference for Church Workers held at Wellesley College, Mass., last July, and to have the opportunity of taking special work in Discussion Groups and Methods, under both Mr. Piper of the Church Missions House and under our own Miss Emily Tillotson. The experience was of the greatest benefit and let us hope will be reflected in the planning and better furthering of the work the coming year.

There was no Normal class for 1921. Several of the study classes were in places where the Rector was the leader and didn't need help. In other cases it was impossible for the women leaders to attend. There were eight classes or program meetings based on the survey and one based on Alaska.

Efforts were conscientiously made to arouse interest in study and discussion groups more generally throughout the Diocese but though the value of some educational work was recognized and in many places carried out it was difficult to secure regular study groups in most places. Efforts are being made to have more generally appealing books for study during the coming year. There has been a steady and growing demand for and sale of religious and devotional books, but not, it is to be regretted, of Church papers.

We send the Spirit of Missions to the Nettleton Home and in April presented each member of the Confirmation class at Boon-



ville with The Rev. Mr. Wilson's "What A Churchman Ought To Know."

One of the most encouraging features of the year was the greatly increased sale of the Church Missionary Calendar. 140 were sold as against 40 last year. If they are used as they can be, it represents a larger gain than the mere figures indicate.

One must not forget, either, the Educational exhibit at the meeting of the Council in January. Efforts were made to make this exhibit as complete as possible along all educational lines, and they were apparently appreciated by the visiting Clergy and Delegates.

Thanks to the work of our President, Mrs. Burr, and assistance from every Parish in the city, the One Hundredth Anniversary of the Church Missionary Society was fittingly and appropriately observed by the presentation of a most instructive Pageant.

In summing up the year's progress in educational lines, figures represent most inadequately the work accomplished. They may mean much or little. What does count is whether leadership has been developed, whether the few have been greatly added to and strengthened and whether the many are getting increasingly informed and educated in constantly growing numbers.

Measured by these standards, the educational work of the Woman's Auxiliary of West Missouri has certainly gone forward during the year 1921, and it can be expected that 1922, with its great Convention at Portland, will find the ground better prepared for sowing, looking toward the harvest than ever before.

## **THE UNITED THANK OFFERING OF 1922.**

---

### **Resolution Adopted in Detroit, October 20, 1919.**

**RESOLVED:** That the United Thank Offering of 1922 be given to the Board of Missions or any organization which has succeeded, or may hereafter succeed to its functions, for women's work in the mission field, including the training, sending and support of women workers and the care of such workers when sick or disabled—provided that one-tenth of the offering be set aside as a permanent trust fund to be invested and administered by the Board of Missions, or any organization which has succeeded or may hereafter succeed to its functions, the income to be applied to the support of retired United Thank Offering workers,—also provided that the sum of not less than \$10,000 be devoted to the erection, completion or renewal of a building or buildings approved by the Board of Missions on the recommendation of the President of the Board of Missions and the Executive Board of the Woman's Auxiliary.

**Also Resolved:** That to our united gifts shall be added our united and earnest prayers that God will put it into the hearts of many faithful women to give themselves or of their substance to the work of the Master in the mission field.

### **THE UNITED THANK OFFERING PRAYER.**

O Lord, our Heavenly Father, we pray Thee to send forth more labourers into Thy harvest, and to grant them Thy special grace for every need. Guard and guide the workers in the field, and draw us into closer fellowship with them. Dispose the hearts of all women everywhere to give gladly as Thou hast given to them. Accept from grateful hearts, our United Thank Offering of prayer and gifts and joyful service; and bless it to the coming of Thy Kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

 This fund goes to St. Mary's Hall, Shanghai, China.
6. A Memorial to Mrs. Mary Emma Turner.....\$50.00  
 This fund goes for work in Alaska.
7. National Executive Committee.....\$70.00
8. Educational Secretary's Fund.....\$50.00  
 Miss Stuart has done such wonders in the past with a very small fund that we would like to see what she can do with one a little more nearly adequate to present prices.
9. Current Expense Fund and Delegates Dues.....\$200.00

It is a privilege to share in the national memorial to the founder of the Little Helpers. The fund is to establish a much needed kindergarten among the Navajo Indians. This pledge should be made for three years.

12. Building Fund, St. Luke's, Tokio, Japan.....\$50.00

This great hospital is one of the most important projects the Church has on hand. We all know about it from our Church papers.

13. St. Philip's Industrial School.....\$50.00

This School for Negro Girls at San Antonio, Texas, is helping solve the Church's negro problem in just the right way. It has been taken over by the Synod as a part of the work of this Province. It has a claim on this Diocese both on this account and because we have been in the past somewhat neglectful of this phase of the Church's work.
