CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be The West Missouri Diocesan Branch of The Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.

ARTICLE II

Its object shall be to increase, by united effort, the interest of all Parishes and Missions of this Diocese in the missionary work of the Church.

ARTICLE III

All baptized women of this Diocese are regarded as members of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV

The head of this Auxiliary shall be the Bishop, ex-officio. The officers shall be: a President; a First Vice-President; a Vice-President from the northern and a Vice-President from the southern section of the Diocese; a Recording Secretary; a Corresponding Secretary; a Treasurer and an Auditor, all of whom, except the Bishop, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting preceding the Triennial General Convention, and shall serve three years. The President shall not be eligible for two consecutive terms.

The duties of these officers, other than as prescribed by the By-Laws, shall be those usually appertaining to their respective offices. The President shall appoint and define the duties of: an Educational Secretary, a United Thank Offering Treasurer, a Supply Secretary, a Finance Committee and such other committees as she may deem expedient, each to serve one year. A vacancy occurring in these appointments shall be filled by the President. A vacancy occurring in any of the elective offices shall be filled by the Board of Managers until the next regular meeting when it shall be filled by election for the unexpired term.

ARTICLE V

There shall be three regular meetings during the year: an Annual Meeting on the Thursday following the Annual Council in January; a meeting the first Thursday in May that does not fall on Ascension Day; and a meeting the first Thursday in November that does not fall on All Saints' Day.

ARTICLE VI

Each Parish Branch shall be entitled to representation at all meetings by its officers and four delegates elected by itself. Each Branch shall pay in advance such Delegates' dues as shall be fixed by the By-Laws.

ARTICLE VII

This Constitution may, with the approval of the Bishop, be amended at any regular meeting of the Auxiliary, by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present, after thirty days' written notice to each Parish Branch.

BY-LAWS.

1. The Order of Business at all meetings shall be as follows, except that the Secretary's Report and Parish Reports shall be given at the Annual Meeting only:

2. The Recording Secretary shall prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese.

3. The Corresponding Secretary shall make annually a full report of the work of the Auxiliary to the General Secretary of The Woman's Auxiliary in New York.

4. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, receipt for and disburse the same under the direction of the Parish Branches and the Auxiliary. She shall render a report at all regular meetings.

5. The Auditor shall examine and audit the books of the Treasurer before each regular meeting.

6. There shall be a Board of Managers consisting of the Diocesan Officers, ex-Presidents of the Diocesan Auxiliary and the elected Officers of Parish Branches. This Board shall meet on the first Monday of each month and at other times upon call of the President. It shall be entrusted with the management of the affairs of the Auxiliary and shall have power to transact all business that may come before it. Nine members of the Board, representing at least four Parishes, shall constitute a quorum.

7. There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of the President, the First Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer, which shall transact such business as may be necessary between the meetings of the Board.

8. Parish and Mission election of Delegates shall take place during the month preceding the Annual Meeting and be immediately reported by the Branch Secretary to the Recording Secretary.

9. Delegates and Alternates to the Auxiliary Meeting held in connection with the Triennial General Convention shall be elected at the May Meeting preceding.

10. Each Branch shall pay an annual fee of fifty cents for each delegate and officer and no delegate or officer shall be entitled to vote unless the dues and assessments of her Branch have been paid in full.

11. A Current Expense Fund of not less than \$200.00 shall be provided annually for printing, postage, stationery and the expense of speakers. This amount shall be apportioned among the Parish and Mission Branches by a Finance Committee of three appointed by the President.

12. All monies shall be sent to the Treasurer one week before each meeting.

13. No part of the current expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid from funds contributed for Missionary purposes.

14. All nominations shall be by ballot.

15. All elections shall be by ballot. Unless there is an election by a clear majority on the first ballot the chair shall declare the two names having the largest number of votes and subsequent ballots shall be upon them until a clear majority is reached.

16. These By-Laws may be amended or suspended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present.

17. In any contingency not covered by the Constitution and By-Laws the Auxiliary shall be governed by Longan's Parliamentary Rules.

STANDING RULES

That there be a Missionary Sunday every year, emphasizing the United Thank Offering. (Apr. Board, 1919)

That the Memorial Roll be framed and hung in a suitable place. (May, 1919)

That each woman in the Auxiliary be taxed 5c a month to provide a fund for the traveling expenses of Delegates to the Triennial. (Nov. 1919)

That a fund be provided for the use of the Educational Secretary. (Nov. 1919)

That notices of Board meetings be sent out one week in advance; notices of Annual and Quarterly meetings, two weeks in advance. (Nov. 1919) (Jan. Board, 1920)

That a fund be created for necessary traveling expenses of Officers in the Diocese in the interest of Auxiliary work. (Nov. 1920)

THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Once more your officers wish to express to you their gratitude for the support and co-operation you have given them, and to ask you to continue to "stand by," not in the radio sense of waiting for something to happen, but in the old fashioned, active way you have always done, as we go forth on the last year of our work in our present relation.

I should like to add a personal word of appreciation for the services of two officers who have been obliged by ill health to resign during the year: the Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Annie Browne and the Educational Secretary, Miss Emma Lyall Stuart. To efficiency and faithfulness in the performance of the duties of her respective office each one of these added a devotion to the work as a whole and a kindly spirit in working with the other officers that increases our regret in giving them up, and will always make the remembrance of our work together a joyful memory.

Since it is the last year in office of the present staff, it is quite necessary for the members of the Auxiliary to keep in mind that they must make their choice of new leaders at the next annual meeting. As we are to have no nominating committee to help us with our thinking about candidates, your Board of Managers has asked the presidents of the Kansas City branches to act as a sort of lookout committee, to receive and pass on information about available women for these places. Will you not think over and talk over this matter among yourselves and with your branch president, so that all of us may know of those in other parishes than our own who would be able and willing to serve the Auxiliary as officers.

All of us who have shared for any length of time in the work of the Auxiliary know pretty well what is to be done from year to year, but because it is good for us occasionally to put our ideas into definite words, I should like to lay before you some suggestions concerning the policy of the Auxiliary for 1924:

Program for the Auxiliary

In General:

Stimulation of the spiritual life by quiet hours and days of intercession and meditation.

A special effort to reach more of the outlying places in the Diocese with personal visits by officers.

A special effort to reach the isolated Churchwomen of the Diocese, especially through the Educational Department and the United Thank Offering.

Continuance of our custom of undertaking pledges for various items of the Church's work.

Co-operation with the women of the Church in raising the Bishop Tuttle Memorial, with the women of the Province in raising a fund for St. Philip's School, and with the women of our several communities in local good works.

Readiness to meet any call for help in work for the Reconstruction in Japan, and any other emergencies that may arise.

By the Supply Department:

Completion of the Diocesan allotment.

Building up of the Supply Bureau.

By the Educational Department:

Increase in study groups.

Increase in subscribers to The Spirit of Missions.

Will you not hold all these projects in your thoughts and in your prayers, and keep yourselves ready to do your individual part in them?

ANNUAL REPORT

Of the Recording Secretary of the West Missouri Branch, of the Woman's Auxiliary to The National Council.

To the Right Reverend Sidney Catlin Partridge, Bishop of the
Diocese of West Missouri, and Women of the Auxiliary:

The year started with two January meetings, the regular Annual meeting, held at the time of Council in Springfield, and a called meeting held in Kansas City. The meeting in Springfield was most enjoyable, many friends known heretofore only by their letters were present, the hospitality of the two parishes of the city was most bountiful and the arrangements for the entertainment of the visitors were perfect.

Because of the distance, very few Kansas City people were able to go to Springfield, and on this account a called meeting was held at Grace & Holy Trinity Church for their benefit. At this meeting the Bishop was the celebrant, assisted by the Revd. Robert Nelson Spencer. Bishop Thomas Demby was the speaker, his subject being St. Philip's School.

The May meeting was held at St. Mary's, the Bishop being assisted by the Rector the Revd. E. C. Merrill. The Bishop preached the sermon, and the Rector of St. Paul's, The Revd. Benjamin Washburn, spoke on the Educational Conference at Omaha. The speaker of the day, Mrs. George Forsee, gave an address on Ecclesiastical Music.

In November St. Andrew's Branch welcomed the Auxiliary in the new church. In the absence of the Bishop, The Revd. James Pernette DeWolfe was the celebrant, and Dr. Edwin Wilcox was the preacher.

Changes in officers during the year are as follows: the vacant post of secretary was filled by the election of Mrs. Arthur C. Everham of St. Andrew's, the resignations of Miss Stuart and Mrs. Annie Browne, both caused by ill health, were regretfully accepted, and Mrs. L. C. Reeves of St. John's was elected Corresponding Secretary. The office of Educational Secretary was still vacant at the close of the year, but has since been filled by the appointment of Mrs. J. P. Newell of St. Paul's.

During the year our vice-president, Mrs. Bland, was honored by being asked to be Miss Lindley's personal representative at an important inter-racial conference held in Kansas City.

Increased responsibilities have come to two of our officers, Mrs. Burr having been made Provincial representative on the Bishop Tuttle Memorial, and Mrs. Brown, Provincial Supply Secretary.

Visits out in the Diocese have been made by Miss Stuart, Mrs. Burr, Miss Howard, Mrs. Brown, Deaconess Bedell and Miss Aimee Drake.

In Kansas City we have had Miss Boyer's long anticipated Institute, visits from Miss Drake, Deaconess Bedell and our Provincial President Mrs. Dix, who was the guest of honor at a delightful luncheon at the University Women's Clubhouse.

The Auxiliary acted as publicity agent for the Bishop in connection with the fund for Japanese relief and co-operated in raising that fund. A gift of bedding was sent to Tokyo from the funds of the Supply Department.

Beside meeting the emergency call from Japan, the Supply Allotment was filled, and all pledges paid in full. The full amount asked from this Diocese for the fund for the Hooker School, undertaken by the women of the Province for three years, was given. Money for the pledges came in more promptly than ever before, much to the joy of the treasurer who for the first time was able to close her books on time.

The interest of the Auxiliary in the new hospital was made manifest by a gift of curtains for the nurses' home, while members of the Board of Managers donated a sewing machine and a porch swing.

Other civic enterprises were shared with the members of the Women's Missionary Council of Kansas City, Mrs. Abbott having helped with relief work, Mrs. Woodhouse with the Girls' Home. During the month of December transportation to the Parental Home was furnished for Sunday School teachers.

The Auxiliary was asked to furnish speakers for the Regional Meetings held this fall by the Board of Church Extension. Mrs. Burr attended those held in Kansas City and St. Joseph, Mrs. John Howard the one at Chillicothe, Mrs. John Dalton, that at Joplin and Mrs. Benjamin Brown, that at Sedalia.

The Synodical Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Province of the Southwest was entertained by the Churchwomen of Kansas City at Grace & Holy Trinity Church in October. On account of the sudden death of her father, the president, Mrs. Dix, was unable to attend, and the duty of presiding fell upon our own president. All the delegates rallied to her support in the emergency, and the meetings went through on the three days of the Synod, without a hitch. The high spot of the meetings, was, perhaps, the inspiring address by Mrs. E. C. Cushing of St. Louis on the Memorial to Bishop Tuttle. The women who heard her were so impressed that Mrs. Cushing was asked to return in January, 1924, to speak at our own annual meeting. A full report of these meetings will be found in the President's address. We felt especially proud of our one Provincial officer, Mrs. Benjamin Brown, whose interesting report showed how very well the Supply work is being handled.

The supply work done during 1923 by the various parishes in the Diocese of West Missouri has been in many different fields of service. The largest share of this work going to St. John's Mission, Hendersonville, N. C., most of the parishes outside of Kansas City working on this allotment. One personal box went to Virginia, a mission box to Georgia, box to be used for social service work in White Bluff, Tenn., personal Christmas boxes to China and Alaska and altar supplies, blanket, sheets and pillow cases to Tokio, Japan.

The women of the Diocese are to be congratulated on their splendid work during the past year. They may feel sure, considering all things, they are second to none in the Province of the Southwest.

The Central fund is used to buy articles that are cheaper purchased wholesale and in large quantities. This fund is made up from contributions from the various parishes.

REPORT OF THE PLEDGE COMMITTEE

In formulating pledges for the year 1924 your committee is ever mindful of the struggle of all church organizations to meet their financial obligations and realizes that the discriminate giver is always the cheerful giver, and, for this reason, the pledges have been reduced just as far as possible consistent with the carrying on of our Auxiliary work.

In the next two years all our efforts must be directed toward the completion of our Auxiliary Special, The Tuttle Memorial, or National Training Houses for Woman Workers. The latch to this Open Door to Women's Service we have hardly raised this year; in 1924 we must give at least \$340.00 and in 1925 the same amount, if we are to meet the quota of \$750 allotted to West Missouri. We have no fear but that it will be done, we must not fail. No gift will be too small if accompanied by a prayer, and none so large that it will not need an earnest prayer to help it accomplish its purpose.

Our second duty is to the Provincial Special, St. Philip's Industrial School for Negro Girls, our share as one of the larger dioceses in the province being \$200 per year for three years.

Taking all these facts into consideration, we beg to submit the following list of pledges for 1924:

Pledges of the Woman's Auxiliary, 1924

1. A definite pledge to your parish quota for
Missions.....No specified amount

(As loyal Churchwomen we have an obligation to the general work of the Church. Each of us should make her personal gift for this, through the "red" side of the duplex envelope, or any other method used by her parish, but unless the parish quota is raised in full by the individual contributors, every woman's organization should also make a pledge to it. Consult your parish treasurer and pay this pledge to him promptly. If you are not a member of a parish, remember this is the work of YOUR CHURCH just as much as if you attended the greatest cathedral in America, and you should have a share in it. In this case or if your parish treasurer is not co-operating in raising the quota, you may send this money through our own treasurer, Miss Louise Howard.)

2. The Bishop Tuttle Memorial Houses for Women
in Training.....\$340.00

(Every Churchwoman in the Diocese should have a share in this fund. We recommend that you ask your individual members to earn or give a sum of money, large or small, for this, so that each may feel that she has her individual part in the Memorial to our great Presiding Bishop.)

3. The Provincial Special—St. Philip's School for
Negro Girls.....\$200.00
(Every group of women doing Auxiliary work should have a part in this work, undertaken for the next three years by the women of the Province.)
4. National and Provincial Fund.....\$50.00
(This is our share of the running expenses of the National and Provincial organizations. If your Branch realizes it is a part of one of the greatest organizations in the world, it will want to pay part of these dues.)
5. Hooker School for Girls in Mexico.....\$50.00
(This is a special fund to make it possible for Deaconess Newell to do some particular thing that her expense money does not cover.)
6. Supply Work—Central Fund.....\$150.00
(This is to buy blankets, overalls and other things we cannot make for the boxes we send.)
7. Triennial Delegate's Fund.....No specified amount
(Some time ago the members of the Auxiliary voted to tax themselves 5c a month to send a woman to the Triennial meeting. Most of the Branches just add this amount to the monthly dues and turn it in once a year.)
8. Current Expense Fund.....\$200.00
(This pays for postage, printing the Year Book, Expense of Speakers, etc.)
9. Diocesan Travel Fund.....\$50.00
(This is to enable our own officers to reach our own people. Would you like to have an officer visit you occasionally? Someone has to pay her carfare.)
10. Educational Secretary's Fund.....\$25.00
(This gives the Educational Secretary literature for free distribution.)
11. Membership in Women's Missionary Council of
Kansas City\$50.00
(This is a Social Service pledge for Kansas City Branches only.)
12. A pledge for Social Service in your community.....
.....No specified amount
(Make a contribution to some institution or work in your own town, as Churchwomen, letting those in charge know that you feel an obligation to share in community betterment because of the teachings of your Church.)

REPORT OF THE SYNODICAL MEETING.

A meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Province of the Southwest was held at the time of the meeting of the Synod, October 21, 22, 23, 1923.

The gathering was saddened at its coming together by the announcement that the sudden death of her father had prevented Mrs. Dix, the president, from being here to preside at the sessions. This was doubly unfortunate, because no one knew just what Mrs. Dix had planned, and this is a meeting of women from scattered points, unaccustomed to working together, and with no very clear idea of the work of the Province as a whole.

The very fact, however, that their sympathy for Mrs. Dix was aroused, and that they clearly realized that the presiding officer was taking over the meetings entirely without preparation, seemed to bring them closer together, and to bring out a spirit of kindness and co-operation that was a wonderful thing to see. You probably know that your president was the presiding officer, and I can not express in stronger terms my appreciation of the consideration shown me than by saying that I should almost have thought the women were all from West Missouri.

Nine of the eleven dioceses in the Province had representatives present, which was a really remarkable showing.

The principal legislation was the adoption of a revised Constitution and By-Laws. The most important change made was the provision that the president shall also serve as the representative of the Province on the National Executive Board, and the one that the vice-president shall be the president of the branch in the Diocese that is entertaining the Synod.

Another important action was the adoption of a common undertaking for the women of the Province for the next three years—the raising of a fund for St. Philip's School. This showed very clearly that the women are not afraid to function as a province.

The women had for some time realized that some specific action should result from the inspiration that comes from a gathering such as this, and had already undertaken the Provincial special for Mexico. Neither the Auxiliary nor the Province had disintegrated in consequence of this action, so this time we went on and undertook another.

Probably the most interesting feature of these meetings was the group of reports from all the dioceses. These reports, read by the various representatives, gave us a view of the work of women in the Province as a whole, such as most of us had never had before. Our own report was, I thought, one of the very best. It was almost exactly what you have read—I hope—in the last year-book, and is a record of which any Diocese might well be proud. I assure you I was proud to have the privilege of presenting it.

Speaking of reports, the report of our Supply Secretary, Mrs. Benjamin Brown, who is also supply secretary for the Province, was especially interesting and showed that she is as efficient in handling large matters as we know her to be in our own.

One of the most helpful things we did was to break up into small groups for conferences on various phases of our work. There were conferences on the United Thank Offering, the Supply Work, Church Schools, Altar Guilds, Daughters of the King, and other activities, and everyone seemed to like having just the people who were interested in that particular thing and having time really to talk over their common problems.

We had splendid speakers: Mrs. Putnam, Deaconess Newell's sister, who made us feel as if we had seen the Hooker School; Miss Marsh of the Girls' Friendly, who comes to us now as an old friend; Miss Bowden of St. Philip's, a really remarkable speaker; Miss Mabel Schaeffer, who is back on furlough from Tokyo and who brought us the latest news from that stricken district; and Mrs. E. C. Cushing of St. Louis who was the speaker at our own little service in memory of Bishop Tuttle and who impressed us so profoundly that we hope to have her come back for one of our own meetings soon, that you may all hear her. To open or close our sessions we had Bishop Johnson, Bishop Quin, Bishop Capers and our own Bishop Partridge. Then of course we had the benefit of the other speakers at the Mass Meeting and the Joint Session.

I hope I have made those of you who did not come realize that you missed something. It was most interesting to meet so many of the finest women of our Province—which means of the Church, and of the world. And to see them so united, so harmonious, so intent on doing the thing that was needed, was truly an inspiration. While I am sorry that it was not possible for every one of you to share this, I was pleased that all the Kansas City branches were represented, and that women from three other places came—Excelsior Springs, Sedalia and Warrensburg.

In closing I want to express my warm appreciation of what our own women in Kansas City did to make this meeting a success. You opened your homes, you gave up the use of your cars and in all sorts of ways you made our guests feel truly welcome. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the women who headed the various committees: Mrs. Reid of St. Andrew's who handled the transportation, including gathering the many cars needed to drive everybody around the city the last afternoon; Mrs. Brown of St. Paul's who found shelter and food for everybody, men as well as women, and somehow managed that all the hosts were delighted with their guests and all the guests seemed pleased with their hosts; Mrs. Abbott of St. George's, who with others from that parish, met all the trains, and gave everybody information about everything both at the station and the church, and who had, perhaps, the most tiresome and trying task of all; and Mrs. John Neal, who, with other members of St. Margaret's Study Club cared for the exhibit and sale of literature.

Without all this it would have been impossible to care for the Synod—with it we had what everyone said was the best one yet.
