Constitution

ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be The West Missouri Diocesan Branch of The Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.

ARTICLE II

Its object shall be to increase, by united effort, the interest of all Parishes and Missions of this Diocese in the missionary work of the Church.

ARTICLE III

All baptized women of this Diocese are regarded as members of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV

The head of this Auxiliary shall be the Bishop, ex-officio. The officers shall be: a President; a First Vice-President; a Vice-President from the northern and a Vice-President from the southern section of the Diocese; a Recording Secretary; a Corresponding Secretary; a Treasurer and an Auditor, all of whom, except the Bishop, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting preceding the Triennial General Convention, and shall serve three years. They shall be installed by the Bishop immediately after their election is announced. The President shall not be eligible for two consecutive terms.

The duties of these officers, other than as prescribed by the By-Laws, shall be those usually appertaining to their respective offices. The President shall appoint and define the duties of: an Educational Secretary, a United Thank Offering Treasurer, a Supply Secretary, a Finance Committee and such other committees as she may deem expedient, each to serve one year. A vacancy occurring in any of the elective offices shall be filled by the Board of Managers until the next regular meeting, when it shall be filled by election for the unexpired term.

ARTICLE V

There shall be three regular meetings during the year: an Annual Meeting on the first day of the Diocesan convention in January; a meeting the first Thursday in May that does not fall on Ascension Day, and a meeting the first Thursday in November that does not fall on All Saints' Day. The date of any meeting may be changed by vote of the Board of Managers, or in an emergency, by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI

Each Parish Branch shall be entitled to representation at all meetings by its officers and four delegates elected by itself. Each Branch shall pay in advance such Delegates' dues as shall be fixed by the By-Laws.

ARTICLE VII

This Constitution may, with the approval of the Bishop, be amended at any regular meeting of the Auxiliary, by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present, after thirty days written notice to each Parish Branch.

By-Laws

1. The Order of business at all meetings shall be as follows, except that the Secretary's report and Parish Reports shall be given at the Annual Meeting only:

1. Corporate Communion.
2. Roll Call.
3. Minutes.
4. President's Address.
5. Report of Secretary.
6. Report of Treasurer.
7. Report of Auditor.
8. Report of Corresponding Secretary.
9. Report of Educational Secretary.
10. Report of United Thank Offering Treasurer.
11. Report of Supply Secretary.
12. Reports of Parish Branches.
13. Reports of Committees.
14. Unfinished Business.
15. New Business.
16. Elections.

2. The Recording Secretary shall prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese.

3. The Corresponding Secretary shall make annually a full report of the work of the Auxiliary to the General Secretary of The Women's Auxiliary in New York.

4. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, receipt for and disburse the same under the direction of the Parish Branches and the Auxiliary. She shall render a report at all regular meetings.

5. The Auditor shall examine and audit the books of the Treasurer before each annual meeting.

6. There shall be a Board of Managers consisting of the Diocesan Officers, ex-Presidents of the Diocesan Auxiliary and the elected Officers of Parish Branches. The Board shall meet on the last Monday of each month and at other times upon call of the President. It shall be entrusted with the management of the affairs of the Auxiliary and shall have power to transact all business that may come before it. Nine members of the Board, representing at least four Parishes, shall constitute a quorum.

7. There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of the President, the First Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer, which shall transact such business as may be necessary between the meetings of the Board.

8. Parish and Mission election of Delegates shall take place during the month preceding the Annual Meeting and be immediately reported by the Branch Secretary to the Recording Secretary.

9. Delegates and Alternates to the Auxiliary Meeting held in connection with the Triennial General Convention shall be nominated from the floor and elected by voice at the May Meeting preceding.

10. Each Branch shall pay an annual fee of fifty cents for each delegate and officer, and no delegate or officer shall be entitled to vote unless the dues and assessments of her Branch have been paid in full.

11. A Current Expense Fund of not less than \$200.00 shall be provided annually for printing, postage, stationery and the expense of speakers. This amount shall be apportioned among the Parish and Mission Branches by a Finance Committee of three appointed by the President.

12. All monies shall be sent to the Treasurer one week before each meeting.

13. No part of the current expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid from funds contributed for Missionary purposes.

14. All nominations shall be by ballot.

15. Except as provided in Section 9, all elections shall be by ballot. Unless there is an election by a clear majority on the first ballot the chair shall declare the two names having the largest number of votes and subsequent ballots shall be upon them until a clear majority is reached.

16. These By-Laws may be amended or suspended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present.

17. In any contingency not covered by the Constitution and By-Laws the Auxiliary shall be governed by Roberts' Parliamentary Rules.

STANDING RULES

That there be a Missionary Sunday every year, emphasizing the United Thank Offering. (Apr. Board, 1919).

That the Memorial Roll be framed and hung in a suitable place. (May, 1919).

That each woman in the Auxiliary be taxed 5c a month to provide a fund for the traveling expenses of Delegates to the Triennial, and that this fund be used first for the expenses of the Diocesan President when acting as a delegate. (Nov., 1919, Jan., 1925.)

That a fund be provided for the use of the Educational Secretary. (Nov., 1919.)

That notices of Board meetings be sent out one week in advance; notices of Annual and Quarterly meetings, two weeks in advance. (Nov., 1919.) (Jan. Board, 1920.)

That a fund be created for necessary traveling expenses of Officers in the Diocese in the interest of Auxiliary work. (Nov., 1920.)

That all ex-Presidents of the Diocesan Auxiliary shall be members of the Board of Managers. (1921.)

That during the year preceding the election of officers, the presidents of the parish branches shall act as a Lookout Committee. The duties of this committee shall be to bring before the Board of Managers from time to time, suggestions as to possible candidates for Diocesan officers. (1924.)

THE THIRTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT
of the
Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of West Missouri

President's Address

To the Rt. Rev. Sidney C. Partridge, D. D., Bishop of West Missouri, and the members of the Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of West Missouri:

Another year has gone swiftly by and we are again come to the time for a review of the past year's work and a look forward into the next twelve months.

It is a grave responsibility and a rare privilege to be the president of the Woman's Auxiliary just at this period in the history of the Church, when so many unusual undertakings are being presented.

The year 1926 has been full of opportunities, but all of these have not been pushed to the fullest extent.

The visit of our Presiding Bishop, The Most Rev. John Gardner Murray, D. D., to Kansas City early in February and the meeting in St. Paul's Church under the auspices of the Woman's Auxiliary was a most favorable beginning for the new year. The "Quiet Day" conducted by The Rev. T. R. Ludlow, Dean of Grace Cathedral, Topeka, Kan., on the Feast of the Annunciation, March 25th, was also a "red letter" day. Our May meeting held in Christ's Church, St. Joseph, is another happy day on our memory calendar, and the November meeting in St. George's Church was most inspiring. At this meeting the first note for the Bishops' Crusade was sounded by the Rev. Geo. St. George Tyner, brother of the rector of St. George's.

The women of the Diocese have tried to co-operate with the National Office and follow all suggestions as nearly as possible.

A day of intercession was held in several of the Churches on Oct. 15th and again on St. Andrew's Day, Nov. 30th.

Visits have been made by your president to Springfield, Lebanon, West Plains, Monett, Nevada, St. Joseph and Carthage. A regional conference was held in Carthage on Oct. 22nd, 1926. Miss Grace Lindley, Executive Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary, and Mrs. E. F. Cushing, of St. Louis, Provincial Representative for the Corporate Gift, were the guests of honor. Women from four Churches in this section of the Diocese were present to greet and hear Miss Lindley and Mrs. Cushing.

Seven women from the Diocese attended the Provincial Synod held in Tulsa, Okla., Oct. 19-21st. This most inspiring meeting was conducted by the Provincial President, Mrs. J. C. Tolman.

Your president attended the National Educational Conference held at the National Center of Conference and Devotion in Racine, Wis., the last of September. At this meeting there were more than thirty delegates representing Dioceses from the Atlantic to the Pacific.

In the midst of our busy days we were called upon to pause and mourn for the taking from us one of our most ardent and loyal members—Mrs. Minnie A. Reeves. Mrs. Reeves at the time of her death was the Diocesan Corresponding Secretary and a member of St. John's parish.

"Make her to be numbered with thy saints
in glory everlasting."

And now for a glance into the future.

The Bishops' Crusade, the very heart of "The Message," will be uppermost in our minds during the coming year. The objects of the Crusade are all spiritual and which are intended to create in the hearts of the Church people the attitude which will have the result in the recognition of our responsibility in our personal relation with God and also the recognition of our individual responsibility for the sins of social injustice, crime, oppression and division.

The Bishops are leading, but as Bishop McDowell has said, "It may begin at 'The Bishops' Crusade,' but it will not end until it has become 'The Peoples' Crusade'." The question is asked, "What is the part of the Woman's Auxiliary in the Crusade? The part of all members of the Church must be to rededicate themselves to Jesus Christ and then live for Him in service to Him.

"Realizing that only through personal dedication to Jesus Christ, our Lord, can we hope to bring to fruition our human endeavors, we rededicate ourselves to the services of our Lord Jesus Christ; to making the strength of our deeds the measure of our faith; to a sincere and simple effort in our daily living to follow with humility the example of our Saviour."

Report of the Recording Secretary

The close of the year is the time of reckoning the activities of the Woman's Auxiliary and I beg to submit the following report from January 1, 1926, to January 1, 1927:

The annual meeting was held in St. Andrew's Church January 12, 1926.

A "Quiet Day" was held in St. Paul's Church March 25, 1926, conducted by the Rev. T. R. Ludlow, Dean of Grace Cathedral, Topeka, Kansas.

The May meeting was held in Christ Church, St. Joseph, Missouri, May 6, 1926. Mrs. J. C. Tolman, Provincial President, was the guest of honor at this meeting and gave an interesting account of her work as provincial representative on the National Executive Board.

Some changes have taken place in the officers during the year. Mrs. Eugene Clarke was elected corresponding secretary at the May meeting to fill the unexpired term left vacant by the death of Mrs. Louis H. Reeves. Recently Mrs. Clarke tendered her resignation on account of illness and Mrs. Samuel Iams has been acting corresponding secretary.

The Auxiliary has co-operated with the Woman's Interdenominational Missionary Council in community work. The following women have served on committees: Mrs. W. A. Pitrat and Mrs. D. H. Oldham, the Department of Missions; Mrs. A. L. Abbott, the Relief committee; Mrs. Theodore Naish, the Patriotism committee; Mrs. C. E. Roberts, Finance committee; Mrs. C. L. Sanford, the Hospitality committee, and Mrs. Leonard Woodhouse and Mrs. Carl Stowell on the committee for the Interdenominational Home for Girls.

During the month of May the members of the various branches of the Auxiliary visited the sick in the General Hospital. Each Sunday during October transportation was furnished Sunday School teachers for

the Parental Home. In December the Auxiliary assisted in investigating families for the Mayor's Christmas Tree.

During the Clergy and Lay conferences held in St. Paul's Church October 22nd and 24th under the auspices of the Field Department, the luncheons were served by the Auxiliaries.

We are much gratified over the unusual interest created in the U. T. O., and much credit should be given the treasurer, Mrs. F. A. H. Garlish, for her untiring efforts in this work.

A new departure this year in the Educational work of the Auxiliary was a Diocesan Study Class held in St. Paul's Church each Monday during Lent, conducted by Mrs. Phillip Elliott.

The fall meeting was held in St. George's Church, Kansas City, Missouri, on November 1, 1926. The Rev. George Tyner of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, spoke on the Bishop's Crusade at this meeting.

There have been eight regular board meetings and one special meeting. All pledges paid and all obligations met.

The annual meeting was held on St. Luke's Day at the hospital. Rev. James De Wolfe of St. Andrews was the celebrant at the corporate communion service at 8 o'clock. A breakfast was served by our hostess, Miss French. The annual meeting and election of officers followed. We have nine meetings a year attended with an average of 25 members. There are fifty active members in our auxiliary. In October a benefit bridge party was given at Mission Hills Country Club, which netted \$479.20. In November another bridge party was given at Mission Hills and cleared \$447.35. Total on both parties \$926.55.

In November the Chapel committee was appointed to investigate the probability of providing a Chapel. Mr. Poindexter of the Men's Board also spoke at one of our meetings in regard to the Chapel and said the Men's Board had voted to build the Chapel at the cost of about \$35,000 with the Auxiliary's help. The president appointed a committee of seven ladies; one from each parish, to confer with the Men's Board in regard to raising funds for the Chapel—at present we have \$686.50 in the Chapel Fund. We have a donation to be used for the Chapel from the Mary Whiting Atwill Society of St. Paul's \$25.00.

The vanishing luncheon, proposed by Mrs. A. W. Peet, netted us \$661.50; this was voted to be given to the Chapel Fund. All active members' and associate members' dues were voted to be given to this fund and also all cash donations.

Mrs. E. C. Wright, chairman of the Courtesy Committee, reported she had made 98 calls, had a watch donated to Norman, a boy patient, sent number of cards and letters to patients in hospital, also numerous flowers.

A flower fund was started after the death of Mrs. Sallie Belle Pugsley, Mrs. McKinney Grier, Mrs. Pugsley's sister, has given a permanent box for voluntary contributions to be called the "Sallie Belle Pugsley Memorial Fund." When the hospital built the addition on the top floor for Dr. Dixon's patients, our Auxiliary gave \$300.00 toward furnishing the rooms. 2,028 articles were made and considerable mending was done for the hospital.
