CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be The West Missouri Diocesan Branch of The Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.

ARTICLE II

Its object shall be to increase, by united effort, the interest of all Parishes and Missions of this Diocese in the missionary work of the Church.

Article III

All baptized women of this Diocese are regarded as members of this Auxiliary.

ARTICLE IV

The head of this Auxiliary shall be the Bishop, ex-officio. The officers shall be: a President; a Vice-President; a Recording Secretary; a Corresponding Secretary and a Treasurer, all of whom, except the Bishop, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting preceding the Triennial General Convention, and shall serve three years. They shall be installed immediately after their election is announced. The President shall not be eligible for more than two consecutive terms.

The duties of these officers, other than as prescribed by the By-Laws, shall be those usually appertaining to their respective offices. The President shall appoint an Educational Secretary, a U. T. O. Treasurer, a Supply Secretary, a chairman for the Department of Missions and Church Extension, a Chairman for the Department of Social Service, a chairman for the Department of Publicity and such other committees as she may deem expedient.

ARTICLE V

There shall be three regular meetings during the year: An Annual Meeting on the first day of the Diocesan convention in January; a meeting the first Thursday in May that does not fall on Ascension Day, and a meeting on the first Thursday in November that does not fall on All Saints' Day. The date of any meeting may be changed by vote of the Board of Managers, or in an emergency, by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VI

Each Parish Branch shall be entitled to representation at all meetings by its officers and four delegates elected by itself. Each Branch shall pay in advance such Delegates' dues as shall be fixed by the By-Laws.

ARTICLE VII

This Constitution may, with the approval of the Bishop, be amended at any regular meeting of the Auxiliary, by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present, after thirty days written notice to each Parrish Branch.

BY-LAWS

1. The Order of business at all meetings shall be as follows, except that the Secretary's report and Parish Reports shall be given at the Annual Meeting only:

2. The Recording Secretary shall prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese.

3. The Corresponding Secretary shall make annually a full report of the work of the Auxiliary to the General Secretary of The Woman's Auxiliary in New York.

4. The Treasurer shall be chairman of the Department of Finance shall receive all monies, receipt for and disburse the same under the direction of the Parish Branches and the Auxiliary. She shall render a report at all regular meetings.

5. "The Educational Secretary shall be the chairman of the Department of Religious Education."

6. "The Departments through which the Auxiliary works, namely, Missions and Church Extension. Religious Education, Social Service, Finance and Publicity, shall co-operate with the corresponding departments of the Bishop and Council."

7. There shall be a board of Managers consisting of the Diocesan Officers, ex-Presidents of the Diocesan Auxiliary, the elected Officers of Parish Branches and the Diocesan President of the Girls Friendly Society. This Board shall meet on the first Monday of each month and at other times upon call of the President. It shall be entrusted with the management of the affairs of the Auxiliary and shall have power to transact all business that may come before it. Nine members of the Board, representing at least four Parishes, shall constitute a quorum.

8. There shall be an Executive Committee consisting of the President, the First Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer, which shall transact such business as may be necessary between the meetings of the Board.

9. Parish and Mission election of Delegates shall take place during the month preceding the Annual Meeting and be immediately reported by the Branch Secretary to the Recording Secretary.

10. Delegates and Alternates to the Auxiliary Meeting held in connection with the Triennial General Convention shall be nominated from the floor and elected by ballot at the May Meeting preceding.

11. Each Branch shall pay an annual fee of fifty cents for each delegate and officer, and no delegate or officer shall be entitled to vote unless the dues and assessments of her Branch have been paid in full.

12. A Current Expense Fund of not less than \$200.00 shall be provided annually for printing, postage, stationery and the expense of

speakers. This amount shall be apportioned among the Parish and Mission Branches by a Finance Committee of three appointed by the President.

13. All monies shall be sent to the Treasurer one week before each meeting.

14. No part of the current expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid from funds contributed for Missionary purposes.

15. All nominations shall be by ballot.

16. Except as provided in Section 10, all elections shall be by ballot. Unless there is an election by a clear majority on the first ballot the chairman shall declare the two names having the largest number of votes and subsequent ballots shall be upon them until a clear majority is reached.

17. These By-laws may be amended or suspended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present.

18. In any contingency not covered by the Constitution and By-Laws the Auxiliary shall be governed by Roberts' Parliamentary Rules.

STANDING RULES

That there be a Missionary Sunday every year, emphasizing the United Thank Offering. (Apr. Board, 1919). Gifts to the U. T. O. shall be presented, wherever possible, at a corporate communion of the parish branch on March 25, (Feast of the Annunciation) and on November 2nd, (All Saints' Day) and shall be sent immediately to the Diocesan U T. O. Treasurer. (November, 1926.)

That the Memorial Roll be framed and hung in a suitable place. (May, 1919).

That each Branch of the Auxiliary be asked to pledge to provide a fund for the traveling expenses of Delegates to the Triennial, and that this fund be used first for the expenses of the Diocesan President when acting as a delegate. (Nov., 1919, Jan., 1925.)

That a fund be provided for the use of the Educational Secretary. (Nov., 1919.)

That notices of Board meetings be sent out one week in advance; notices of Annual and Quarterly meetings, two weeks in advance. (Nov., 1919.) (Jan. Board, 1920.)

That a fund be created for necessary traveling expenses of Officers in the Diocese in the interest of Auxiliary work. (Nov., 1920.)

That all ex-Presidents of the Diocesan Auxiliary shall be members of the Board of Managers. (1921.)

That during the year preceding the election of officers, the presidents of the parish branches shall act as a Lookout Committee. The duties of this committee shall be to bring before the Board of Managers from time to time, suggestions as to possible candidates for Diocesan officers. (1924.)

THE THIRTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council Diocese of West Missouri

THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

To the Rt. Rev. Sidney C. Partridge, D. D., Bishop of West Missouri, and the members of the Woman's Auxiliary, Diocese of West Missouri.

We come to the close of another year and at this time the end of my three year term as your president. It was in this Church that I took office three years ago and what a short time it seems. What a privilege and a pleasure it has been to serve.

The past year we have kept steadily on the course set forth for us by the triennial meeting in New Orleans in 1925; keeping in mind always the "Message" and its eight objectives.

1. The payment in full of all Church quotas.
2. The overcoming of luke-warmness by deeper spiritual understanding, and great consecration through prayer and the sacraments.
3. The awakening of the women of the Church to more effective service for Christ.
4. United parish effort.
5. The strengthening of our rural and foreign-born work.
6. Closer friendship with the missionaries in the field.
7. Furthering in every way the spirit of united Christian effort.
8. The carrying out of a constructive program of education for peace and the use of our best efforts and strongest influence toward the promotion of international and inter-racial good-will.

All of these objectives have been presented to the women of the Diocese in various ways and we have done definite aggressive work in behalf of several of them and we feel that the women have caught the spirit underlying the very personal ones.

We have very definite accomplishments with which to measure our progress in the past year. The Corporate Gift, the gift of the women of the Church for advance work, has reached the minimum of \$500.00 pledged here in this Diocese, for the three year period and we have another year in which to work. It is hoped that the total amount will reach the sum given for the Bishop Tuttle Memorial, which was \$840.00.

The U. T. O. under the capable guidance of the Treasurer, Mrs. F. A. H. Garlichs, is now nearly as much as it was at the close of the last triennium and very close to the goal of \$3,000.00 set for this triennium and only two of the three years have passed—the last is always the best.

The women of West Missouri have always done splendidly with the Supply Work and this department has been especially successful under Mrs. David Winton's enthusiastic direction.

Our outlook was broadened and interest stimulated by the program carried out by the educational department, including the series of talks during Lent using "The World Call of the Church" as the topic for discussion.

An outstanding day during the past year was March 25th. At a corporate communion of the women of the Diocese, held in St Paul's Church, the Spring collection of the U. T. O. offering was presented. The Rt. Rev. A. A. Gilman, of Wuchang, China, was the preacher on this occasion. Following this service our own Bishop Partridge conducted a "Quiet Hour".

We are in closer touch with the National Council, to which we are auxiliary, and our own Bishop and Council, since the establishment of the departmental and regional plan of work. This new departure comes as a direct result of the visit of Mrs. D. D. Taber, to this Diocese. Mrs. Taber is a field worker sent out under the direction of the National Council and supported by the U. T. O. The first regional division was established last May at a meeting in Pleasant Hill. At this time Miss Janet Vandewater was appointed director of this region. Within the coming year there ought to be five regional divisions established in the Diocese. A new departure of this kind is naturally of very slow growth but holds wonderful opportunities when each department is in working order. The plan includes the following departments; Missions and Church Extension, Religious Education, Social Service, Publicity and Finance.

I close this period of three years of service with a feeling of gratitude and pride—gratitude because I have been permitted and privileged to serve the women of the Diocese of West Missouri as their president—pride in the fact that we have gone forward as the reports you will hear later will show. The close association and helpfulness of the Diocesan Officers have been appreciated beyond my words to express.

Two years ago in New Orleans, your Diocesan officers pledged, with the following statement, for themselves and for the women of the Diocese of West Missouri to do all in their power to help extend the Kingdom of God—to rededicate themselves to Jesus Christ and then live for Him in service to Him. Let us make this pledge anew.

"Realizing that only through personal dedication to Jesus Christ, our Lord, can we hope to bring to fruition our human endeavors, we rededicate ourselves to the services of our Lord Jesus Christ, to making the strength of our deeds the measure of our faith; to a sincere and simple effort in our daily living to follow with humility the example of our Savior."

Annual Report of the Recording Secretary

From January, 1927 to January, 1928

The annual meeting of the Women's Auxiliary of the Diocese of West Missouri was held in St. Paul's Church, Jan. 13th, 1927. Beginning with the Holy Communion, celebrated by the Bishop of the Diocese, the Rt. Rev. Sidney C. Partridge, assisted by the rector, the Rev. B. M. Washburn. Owing to the inclement weather very few attended this meeting. Delegates were present from Marshall, St. Joseph and Chillicothe. Representatives from the Woman's Auxiliary attended the Diocesan convention which was held in Chillicothe on Jan. 18th and 19th, and a meeting of the women present was held on Tuesday afternoon.

The May meeting was held in Christ Church, Lexington, Missouri, May 5, 1927. The Holy Communion was celebrated by the Rev. W. T. Travis, priest-in-charge, assisted by the Rev. Henry Neale Hyde, executive Secretary of the Diocese. Mr. Hyde preached the sermon.

Mrs. J. C. Tolman, Provincial President, was a guest of honor and speaker at the afternoon session. Mrs. D. D. Taber, Field worker, sent out by the National Council, who was in the Diocese for a period of six weeks was also an honored guest and speaker. At this meeting she presented the departmental and regional plan of work. This program of work was unanimously adopted at this meeting.

The Board of Managers met the last Monday of each month during the year except July and August. The fall meetings of the Board of Managers opened with a corporate communion on September 29, 1927, in St. Paul's Church.

Representatives went from the Diocese to the Summer conference at Evergreen, Colorado.

At the meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary held at the time of the Synod in San Antonio, Texas, Mrs. Benjamin S. Brown, president of this Diocese, was elected Vice-President of the Provincial Woman's Auxiliary.

The November meeting of the W. A. was held in St. Mary's Church, November 10, 1927. The Bishop was the preacher for the day and the Rev. J. P. DeWolfe was the celebrant for the Holy Communion.

In looking back over the past three years, we have every reason to be thankful for the increased interest in the work of the Woman's Auxiliary and we look forward with the hope for continued enthusiasm and may we feel it as a privilege and an honor to work for the coming of the Kingdom of Christ.

Report of the Pledge Committee

Year of 1928

In the year of 1847 the head of the United States Patent office resigned, giving as a reason that all possible work on inventions had been completed; that nothing more would be done save routine work connected with the office. We know now that the work had just commenced.

In Detroit in 1919 it was said that the Woman's Auxiliary had outlived its usefulness and that aside from contributing to the Nation wide campaign, our work was done. And yet the work of the Auxiliary is heavier than ever before.

While many changes may be made in the coming year in our organization your committee feels that in order to be prepared to meet new demands and to complete work already undertaken, our pledges should remain practically the same.

West Missouri's share of the great Corporate Gift must be paid in by next October, in time for the Triennial meeting. This sum is well in hand but will require another year's hard work by the various Branches. We must do our part in this great Corporate Gift which will provide the six most pressing needs in the advance work of the church.

Then, there is the Provincial Special, our share being \$200 per year. This is the second year. This amount has never been fully pledged, although always fully paid. Let's pledge it in full for 1928.

Next fall we shall be sending our delegates to the General Convention in Washington and we always want a full delegation. The Triennial Delegates Fund is now about \$150. This should be at least doubled before that time.

While we could easily use more money in our work we can not do with one single cent less. Hence we feel that the remaining pledges should remain about the same, leaving the Branches free to devote more effort to paying their respective Parish Quotas.

Altogether, we have every reason to look back with thanksgiving on the work done by the Auxiliary in West Missouri during the past year, and to look forward with hope and increased enthusiasm to larger opportunities ahead of us because of our growing interest and zeal for the service of Christ and His Church.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following list of pledges for the year 1928:
