THE FORTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT  
of the  
Women's Auxiliary to the National Council  
Diocese of West Missouri

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THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Your Board of Managers has asked that at this gathering the President discuss the work of the Auxiliary of this Diocese, especially as set forth in our pledge list, with a view to answering the questions so often asked by the interested woman: "What is the Auxiliary, and why should I concern myself with it?" Why should she? Let us use the Yankee method and answer by asking another question: What is she—what are we all, we Church women—primarily interested in? What is our great desire? In what do we most wish to have a part? Is it not in the coming of the Kingdom of Our Lord? Is that not really our motive in all these activities of ours? If we did not care about that, could we not use our time and our strength very pleasantly in our own affairs? Is it not the insistence of that interest, that desire, that hope, that makes it impossible for us to live to ourselves? Is not that the basis of our insatiable impulse to do something about things that we see need doing? I think that upon reflection any Church woman will agree that this is our underlying motive.

I spoke of our insatiable impulse to help get things done. Do you not recognize that as a true condition? Do you not find the groups of which you are a part realizing how much you could do about something or other if you all worked together? And does that group not usually start working?

Just so, Church women, long before our time, came to realize how much they, working together, could do for the Church they loved and desired to serve—and the result was the Woman's Auxiliary. So may we not answer the woman who asks why she should concern herself with the Auxiliary, by saying, "Because it is a means of working out the deepest impulse of your Christian life—the desire for the coming of the Kingdom of Our Lord—by a method peculiarly adapted to the needs of your nature."

Now the undertakings of the Auxiliary resulted from exactly the same conditions that caused its being: and it is true always of the great projects that we all share, as of the smaller ones that belong alone to us in West Missouri, that they are not something laid upon us from outside. They are the result of this gathering together in groups; thinking things over together; talking them over—and deciding to do something about them. The United Thank Offering is a perfect example of this, and the spirit that moved that first small group of women to unite their efforts has spread and grown until this offering is not only an element of beauty in the lives of thousands of women, but is also a great source of strength, both material and spiritual, in the Church. This is probably the one activity there is, in which every woman of the Church can share, and it is the aim of our Diocesan Auxiliary that every one of our women shall do so.

Another project that we have inherited from the experience of the past is the Supply work, the sending of boxes of supplies and clothing to missionaries and missions. As far as possible every woman should have a part in this, too. You will sometimes hear criticism of the Supply work; people say that we should pay our missionaries enough so that they could buy their own things. Let me suggest that you do not make this criticism until you and your friends have raised your personal pledges to the Parish Quota enough to make it possible for the parishes all to raise their pledges enough to pay all the Quota asked of the Diocese; for, until the dioceses do at least this much, the National Council will have to cut salaries, instead of raising them.

Beside these two undertakings that we share with women everywhere, we have a group of projects that have arisen because of the increased number of women who are interested in the whole program of the Church; that is, work in the five fields of parish, community, diocese, nation, and world. Learning about work in these places, the women of West Missouri, like similar groups everywhere, have found themselves impelled to do something about conditions here and there. The result is what we call our pledge list, which is printed each year in the Annual Report.

Printing expense makes it impossible to discuss here all these items. One will serve as an illustration. A few years ago, at a meeting like this, we learned that the important station of Nevada could be filled if the \$300 lacking for the minister's salary could be provided. We decided to do it, and of course we did do it. In the doing we learned more about the need of supplying ministers to places so small that they cannot possibly pay a living wage to a man. We found out that many of our great Church men and women had been trained in just such places; we realized that most of us had come from just such places ourselves—that they are the fountain head of diocesan strength. So we continue to give the diocese a fund for clergy support.

Every item on this pledge list has come about in just this way. It is not a list made up in cold blood and laid upon the women of the diocese as an obligation. It is the result of the thinking and consequent action of ourselves and women like us. It is the outcome of a desire to serve that rises from an inner passion for the coming of the Kingdom. It need be a burden to no one; understood, sharing in it will be a joy and a privilege.

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## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY 1931

Nineteen-thirty-one was a year of exceptional interest, because of the General Convention which was held in Denver in September. The United Thank Offering was the largest ever presented from the Diocese of West Missouri.

It also was the year for the election of officers, which took place at the annual meeting held at Grace and Holy Trinity Church, Kansas City, January 22, 1931. Corporate Communion was celebrated at ten o'clock with Bishop Spencer as the Celebrant, assisted by Mr. Trelease, rector of St. Paul's. The Bishop made a short talk on some of the Diocesan problems, the Advance Work, and the act of faith of the Diocese in increasing its quota pledge \$1,000 this year.

Following the service the Auxiliary convened in the parish house for its business session. Mrs. Benjamin S. Brown, President, called the meeting to order. There were 125 women present. The principal business of the day was the election of officers for the following three years. Those elected were: Mrs. Henry Burr, President; Mrs. Ashe Lockhart, Vice-President; Miss Henrietta Whittaker, Recording Secretary; Miss Maria Bacon, Corresponding Secretary; and Mrs. Samuel Iams, Treasurer. It was announced at this meeting that Mrs. Brown, retiring President, had been elected President of the Provincial Synod and a member of the National Board.

The May quarterly meeting was held at St. George's Church, Kansas City, in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Diocesan Convention. Holy Communion was celebrated at ten o'clock by Bishop Spencer, assisted by Mr. Tyner of St. George's; Mr. Maloney, Christ Church, St. Joseph; and Mr. Gregg, Christ Church, Boonville. Bishop Spencer gave his first annual address as Bishop of the Diocese of West Missouri. At this service the Bishop used the Communion silver given him at the time of his consecration by the women of the Diocese.

At the close of the service the Auxiliary convened in the Scottish Rite Temple for its business session. At one o'clock luncheon was most delightfully served by the women of St. George's. The afternoon meeting was given

over mostly to the election of delegates and alternates to the Triennial Convention.

The November quarterly meeting was held at Christ Church, Warrensburg. Corporate Communion was celebrated by the Bishop, assisted by Rev. Dr. Eckel. Immediately following this service, Dr. E. L. Hendricks of the State Teachers' College of Warrensburg gave a very interesting talk on India. The Auxiliary was delightfully entertained at luncheon by the women of the Christian Church at Warrensburg. The afternoon session was mostly devoted to informal talks on the General Convention by the delegates and others who had attended.

Besides these three general meetings, there were the regular monthly meetings of the Board, which were held the last Monday of each month, except during June, July, August, and September.

A Quiet Day was conducted March 25th at St. Paul's Church, Kansas City, at which time the spring United Thank Offering was presented. Mr. Trelease gave a very interesting meditation on the meaning of the words, "United Thank Offering."

The May and December meetings of the Board were held at the home of Mrs. Burr. The members were delightfully entertained by our President.

During this year Mrs. Russell's term as United Thank Offering Treasurer has transpired, and Miss Louise Howard has taken her place. Mrs. L. M. Sawyer of Springfield is the new Supply Secretary, succeeding Mrs. A. T. Waters of St. Joseph.

A class for leaders in the study of India was held each Monday during Lent at the home of Mrs. Lockhart.

## EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM OF THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

The following program has been prepared by the Educational Secretary of the Diocese and approved by the Diocesan Board of the Woman's Auxiliary:

### February-March

Lenten Study Class, based upon "Building a Christian Nation."

Six topics of study and discussion on American life of to-day. The possibilities and problems of modern life in our country.

Leader's manual may be used in connection with this study book.

### April

The Economic Problem of To-day.

A consideration of present economic difficulties and what the Christian may do to help find a way out.

Based on articles from "The Witness."

### May

Educating for Service.

The church women of to-day must be able to meet the issues of this age. Education offers the opportunity of knowing how. Some things to learn during the Summer Conference in Columbia.

### June

The Church's Ministry to the Isolated.

Based upon a booklet published by the National Council. Isolation in rural sections and small towns.

A survey of the local parish.

Are there lonely and shut-in people who need the church?

What can be done for them?

### September-October

The Home of To-day.

Its changing conditions.

New problems to meet.

Opportunities to make the home happy and effective in life to-day.

## **November**

The Parish Finds Its Community.

Co-operation with Social Service projects in the community.

Keeping in touch with members of the parish who need the service of the church.

## **December**

The Parish and Christmas.

Real significance of Christmas.

Its spiritual values.

Bringing the Christmas spirit to every member of the parish.

Each subject will be approached from three angles:

1. A study of the topic of the month.
2. Suitable prayers and suggestions for devotions.
3. Some definite things to do each month in connection with the topic.

It is hoped that through this program the members of the Auxiliary will be helped through information gained; that the spiritual life may be enriched; and that by doing and serving, a contribution to the work of the church and its membership may be made.

Some other books recommended for study and reading are: "The Challenge of Change" (a study of Home Missions), "The City's Church," "The Kingdoms of Our Lord," "America Comes of Age."

Some of these may be borrowed from the Church Missions House or ordered through the Educational Secretary.

Each month the topic of study will be briefly outlined in the Diocesan Bulletin. Lists of books and suggestions will be added from time to time.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF SUPPLY SECRETARY 1930—1931 Allotment

The supply work done by the various parishes has been in many different fields.

Personal boxes were sent to Greenwood, S. D.

Boxes of clothing and household supplies were sent to St. Mark's Mission, Dante, Va.; Easter School, Baguio, Philippine Islands; Good Shepherd Mission, Colleemee, N. C.; and St. Katherine's School, Bolivar, Tenn.

St. Mark's Mission, Dante, Va., were grateful for seven boxes of used clothing.

Two branches of the Girls' Friendly Society filled an assignment of one personal box and one mission box.

## CONSTITUTION

### ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be The West Missouri Diocesan Branch of The Woman's Auxiliary to the National Council.

### ARTICLE II

Its object shall be to increase, by united effort, the interest of all Parishes and Missions of this Diocese in the missionary work of the Church.

### ARTICLE III

All baptized women of this Diocese are regarded as members of this Auxiliary.

### ARTICLE IV

The head of this Auxiliary shall be the Bishop, ex-officio. The officers shall be: a President; a Vice-President; a Recording Secretary; a Corresponding Secretary; and a Treasurer, all of whom, except the Bishop, shall be elected at the Annual Meeting preceding the Triennial General Convention, and shall serve three years. They shall be installed immediately after their election is announced. The President shall not be eligible for more than two consecutive terms.

The duties of these officers, other than as prescribed by the By-Laws, shall be those usually appertaining to their respective offices. The President shall appoint an Educational Secretary, a U. T. O. Treasurer, a Supply Secretary, a Chairman for the Department of Missions and Church Extension, a Chairman for the Department of Social Service, a Chairman for the Department of Publicity, and such other committees as she may deem expedient.

### ARTICLE V

There shall be three regular meetings during the year: An Annual Meeting on the first day of the Diocesan Convention in January; a meeting the first Thursday in May that does not fall on Ascension Day; and a meeting on the first Thursday in November that does not fall on All Saints' Day. The date of any meeting may be changed by vote of the Board of Managers, or in an emergency, by a unanimous vote of the Executive Committee.

### ARTICLE VI

Each Parish Branch shall be entitled to representation at all meetings by its officers and four delegates elected by itself. Each Branch shall pay in advance such delegates' dues as shall be fixed by the By-Laws.

### ARTICLE VII

This Constitution may, with the approval of the Bishop, be amended at any regular meeting of the Auxiliary, by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present, after thirty days' written notice to each Parish Branch.

## BY-LAWS

1. The Order of Business at all meetings shall be as follows, except that the Secretary's report and Parish reports shall be given at the Annual Meeting only:

2. The Recording Secretary shall prepare an Annual Report for circulation in the Diocese.
3. The Corresponding Secretary shall make annually a full report of the work of the Auxiliary to the General Secretary of The Woman's Auxiliary in New York.
4. The Treasurer shall be chairman of the Department of Finance, shall receive all moneys, receipt for and disburse the same under the direction of the Parish Branches and the Auxiliary. She shall render a report at all regular meetings.
5. "The Educational Secretary shall be the chairman of the Department of Religious Education."
6. "The Departments through which the Auxiliary works, namely, Missions and Church Extension, Religious Education, Social Service, Finance and Publicity, shall co-operate with the corresponding departments of the Bishop and Council."
7. There shall be a Board of Managers, consisting of the Diocesan Officers, ex-Presidents of the Diocesan Auxiliary, the elected Officers of Parish Branches, and the Diocesan President of the Girls' Friendly Society. This Board shall meet on the first Monday of each month and at other times upon call of the President. It shall be entrusted with the management of the affairs of the Auxiliary and shall have power to transact all business that may come before it. Nine members of the Board, representing at least four Branches, shall constitute a quorum.
8. There shall be an Executive Committee, consisting of the President, the First Vice-President, the Recording Secretary, the Corresponding Secretary, and the Treasurer, which shall transact such business as may be necessary between the meetings of the Board.
9. Parish and Mission election of Delegates shall take place during the month preceding the Annual Meeting and be immediately reported by the Branch Secretary to the Recording Secretary.
10. Delegates and Alternates to the Auxiliary Meeting held in connection with the Triennial General Convention shall be nominated from the floor and elected by ballot at the May Meeting preceding.
11. Each Branch shall pay an annual fee of fifty cents for each delegate and officer, and no delegate or officer shall be entitled to vote unless the dues and assessments of her Branch have been paid in full.
12. A current Expense Fund of not less than \$200.00 shall be provided annually for printing, postage, stationery, and the expense of speakers. This amount shall be apportioned among the Parish and Mission Branches by a Finance Committee of three, appointed by the President.
13. All moneys shall be sent to the Treasurer one week before each meeting.
14. No part of the current expenses of the Auxiliary shall be paid from funds contributed for Missionary purposes.
15. All nominations shall be by ballot.
16. Except as provided in Section 10, all elections shall be by ballot. Unless there is an election by a clear majority on the first ballot, the chairman shall declare the two names having the largest number of votes, and subsequent ballots shall be upon them until a clear majority is reached.
17. These By-Laws may be amended or suspended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the Delegates present.
18. In any contingency not covered by the Constitution and By-Laws, the Auxiliary shall be governed by Roberts' Parliamentary Rules.

## STANDING RULES

That there be a Missionary Sunday every year, emphasizing the United Thank Offering. (April Board, 1919.) Gifts to the U. T. O. shall be presented, wherever possible, at a corporate communion of the parish branch on March 25 (Feast of the Annunciation), and on November 2 (All Saints' Day), and shall be sent immediately to the Diocesan U. T. O. Treasurer. (November, 1926.)

That the Memorial Roll be framed and hung in a suitable place. (May, 1919.)

That each branch of the Auxiliary be asked to pledge to provide a fund for the traveling expenses of Delegates to the Triennial, and that this fund be used first for the expenses of the Diocesan President when acting as a delegate. (November, 1919; January, 1925.)

That a fund be provided for the use of the Educational Secretary. (November, 1919.)

That notices of Board meetings be sent out one week in advance; notices of Annual and Quarterly meetings, two weeks in advance. (November, 1919.) (January Board, 1920.)

That a fund be created for necessary traveling expenses of Officers in the Diocese in the interest of Auxiliary work. (November, 1920.)

That all ex-Presidents of the Diocesan Auxiliary shall be members of the Board of Managers. (1921.)

That during the year preceding the election of officers, the presidents of the parish branches shall act as a Lookout Committee. The duties of this committee shall be to bring before the Board of Managers from time to time, suggestions as to possible candidates for Diocesan officers. (1924.)

Those who are members of the Interdenominational Missionary Council are representatives to the Board of the Woman's Auxiliary. (April, 1928.)

That a copy of the minutes of the Board meetings be sent to each branch of the Auxiliary. (May, 1931.)

That all motions shall be submitted in writing. (January, 1932.)
